City of Sacramento COVID-19 Resident Survey Report of Results

September 2020



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Survey Background

National Research Center, Inc. (NRC)/Polco developed a survey designed to be administered to residents about the impact of COVID-19 on themselves and their families, as well as how responsive they feel government has been during the pandemic. The City of Sacramento customized the survey for their community.

The survey was hosted on the City's Polco online civic engagement platform and was open from July 28, 2020 through August 13, 2020. A total of 1,208 responses were received. When a survey is administered to a sample of randomly selected recipients of the larger population being studied (known as a "probability sample"), a margin of error can be calculated that estimates the precision of the survey results based on that sample. This margin of error quantifies what is known as the "sampling error," A margin of error at the 95% confidence level can be calculated for any sample size, and indicates that in 95 of 100 surveys conducted in a similar manner, a result would be found that is within the "margin of error." However, for nonprobability sample surveys such as the City of Sacramento COVID-19 Resident Survey, a margin of error should technically not be calculated, as survey respondents were not recruited using a random sample approach. For non-probability samples, precision is generally described with a credibility-interval and there are a variety of approaches to its calculation. Practically speaking, the error bands are wider than a margin of error from a probability-based sample of a similar size. A common method uses the same margin of error calculations would be used for a simple random sample and multiplies this margin of error by an inflator. With 1,208 responses, the traditional margin of error at the 95% confidence level would be ±2.9 percentage points around any particular estimate. The credibility interval might be considered to be two times as wide, so could be considered ±5.8 percentage points.

The dataset of survey responses was analyzed using the Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS). The demographic profile of respondents was compared to that for the adult population of Sacramento as described in the 2018 American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by U.S. Census Bureau. The table below shows the ACS for Sacramento, followed by the unweighted demographic profile and the weighted profile. The full frequencies of responses to each survey question are presented in *Appendix A: Frequency of Responses to All Questions*. Breakdowns of selected survey results of by respondent characteristics can be found in *Appendix B: Breakdowns of Selected Survey Responses by Respondent Characteristics*.

Key Findings

The coronavirus pandemic has been very disruptive to most residents.

- Seven in 10 respondents said their life has been disrupted a great deal or a lot, and another 2 in 10 had experienced a moderate amount of disruption.
- The impact on household income has been severe for some residents; 15% of respondents said their household income had been more than halved during the stay-at-home order. About one-quarter of respondents had experienced decreases in income of 11% to 40%.
- About 4 in 10 respondents reported having lost their job or had their work hours reduced because of the pandemic.
- About 7 in 10 respondents were optimistic that they could maintain their arrangements for dealing with the stay-at-home order for three or more
 months. However, about 1 in 10 said the situation was already not sustainable for them, and another 1 in 10 thought they could sustain for only a
 month or less.

While the financial impacts are severe for some households, many residents are struggling with mental and emotional health during the pandemic.

- About 7 in 10 survey participants consider not knowing when the pandemic will end an extremely serious or very serious problem.
- Feeling nervous, anxious or on edge; not feeling in control; or feelings of loneliness or isolation are each a serious problem for about 5 in 10 respondents.
- For about 4 in 10 households, reduction in employment income or unemployment are serious problems. For 3 in 10 households the loss of income from retirement savings is a serious problem.

For many families, making arrangements for children is a serious problem.

- Lack of childcare is a serious problem for 3 in 10 respondent households, while helping children with online schooling is a serious problem for 4 in 10 respondent households.
- For summer childcare, respondents in many households were working from home in order to do "double-duty" of child care and working (29%), while another 27% were relying on family support for childcare. About 22% were not sure how they would handle summer child care.

While many residents and households are struggling, many are also taking actions to help the community during this difficult time.

- Seven in 10 respondents reported calling to check in on friends and neighbors, and 4 in 10 respondents made donations to help those impacted by COVID-19.
- Nearly all respondents (93%) said they are staying at home except for essential needs, and 93% said they support the government requiring masks in public.

Many feel it is important for the City of Sacramento to provide assistance to community households.


- The most important assistance desired from the City of Sacramento to help residents cope with the impacts of the pandemic was the provision of timely and accurate information, considered very or extremely important by 84% of respondents. About three-quarters of respondents also desired enforcement of safety guidelines.
- Support for small businesses was a high priority for about 8 in 10 respondents. Six in 10 respondents thought making assistance available for housing payments was an important need, while 6 in 10 also wanted to see the City provide financial assistance for food purchases.
- Continued uninterrupted public safety services were also given high priority (71%) as were mental health services (64%).


Feeling Informed about the Coronavirus Pandemic

Please indicate your level of agreement with the following statements about the coronavirus pandemic:








COVID-19 Symptoms and Testing

About 3 in 10 respondents reported that they and/or someone in their household had experienced the symptoms of COVID-19 since January 2020; 45% of respondents reported that they and/or someone in their household had been tested for the coronavirus.

Most of those who had been tested had a negative result, but 2% of all respondents reported a positive test, 3% were still waiting for results at the time they completed the survey, and 8% were presumed to be positive.

The symptoms that generally define COVID are fever, dry cough, and shortness of breath. Since January 2020 have you or someone in your household experienced fever, dry cough, and/or shortness of








Disruption Due to COVID-19 Outbreak

Very few respondents reported having been **un**affected by the pandemic; 7 in 10 said their life has been disrupted a great deal or a lot, and another 2 in 10 said they had experienced a moderate amount of disruption. Fewer than 1 in 10 had experienced only a little or no disruption.

The impact on household income has been severe for some residents; 15% of respondents said their household income had been more than halved during the stayathome order. About one-quarter of respondents had experienced decreases in income of 11% to 40%. About 4 in 10 households had not seen any impact on household income.

How much, if at all, has your life been disrupted by the COVID-19 outbreak?






How Long Can Sustain During Pandemic


About 7 in 10 respondents were optimistic that they could maintain their arrangements for dealing with the stay-at-home order for three or more months. However, about 1 in 10 said the situation was already not sustainable for them, and another 1 in 10 thought they could sustain for only a month or less.

For those with children requiring childcare, about 3 in 10 were planning to address summer child care by continuing to work from home, while another 3 in 10 were anticipating relying on family support. About 2 in 10 were uncertain of what arrangements they would make.

If children requiring childcare live in your household, how will you address summer childcare?






Employment Impacts of Pandemic


About 4 in 10 respondents reported having lost their job or had their work hours reduced because of the pandemic.

One-third of respondents said they had been able to work remotely 100% of the time, and an additional 1 in 10 could work remotely some days of the week. Nearly 2 in 10 were considered essential workers and could not work from home, while 1 in 10 had been laid off.

During the stay-at-home order, have you been able to work remotely?






Unemployment Assistance

About one-quarter of respondents had applied for unemployment assistance. Most of those had received unemployment assistance, or were waiting a decision, but 4% of respondents had had an unemployment application denied,

Impact of Pandemic on Residents


The mental health aspects of the consequences of the pandemic are impacting the greatest proportion of residents. About 7 in 10 consider not knowing when the pandemic will end an extremely or very serious problem.

About 5 in 10 report that feeling nervous, anxious or on edge; not feeling in control, or feelings of loneliness or isolation are an extremely or very serious problem for them.

For about 4 in 10 households, reduction in employment income or unemployment is an extremely or very serious problems. For 3 in 10 households the loss of income from retirement savings is an extremely or very serious problem. Helping children with online schooling is an extremely or very serious problem 4 in 10 households, while lack of childcare is regarded as an extremely or very serious problem for 3 in 10 respondents.



Please rate how much of a problem each of the following are for your household:






Actions to Assist Community with Impacts and/or Risks of COVID-19

In addition to the negative impacts of the pandemic, residents can make positive contributions to help the community deal with the effects of the coronavirus.

Over 9 in 10 respondents said they are assisting the community by staying home except for essential needs. About 7 in 10 are checking in on their friends and neighbors. Four in 10 have donated to assist those harmed by the pandemic, and 14% are volunteering with a local organization.

Which of the following actions, if any, have you taken to assist your community with potential impacts and/or risk of COVID-19?






Government Handling of Pandemic

Only 13% of respondents approved of the job that the Federal Government was doing in handling the pandemic. Much more positive ratings were given to the job being done by the California State Government and the City of Sacramento, with approval from about 6 in 10 respondents and disapproval from 4 in 10 respondents.




Sacramento City Government Performance

Please indicate whether you are satisfied or dissatisfied with Sacramento City government's performance in each of the following areas:.






Assistance Desired from the City of Sacramento

The most important assistance desired from the City of Sacramento to help residents cope with the impacts of the pandemic was the provision of timely and accurate information, considered very or extremely important by 84% of respondents. 





The figures on the following pages display the demographic profile of the survey respondents.

Housing tenure (rent or own)




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
About 3 in 10 respondent households had one or more children, and about 2 in 10 respondent households included an older adult.

Survey results were weighted on three categories of age, 18-34, 35-54 and 55+, so the more granular breakdowns may not match Census data precisely.







Annual household income of respondents



Educational attainment of respondents










Have you ever served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces?




Employment status of respondents






With which ethnic group(s) do you identify yourself? (Select all that apply.)

Appendix A: Frequency of Responses to All Questions

The full set of responses to each survey question from respondents to the City of Sacramento COVID-19 Resident Survey are displayed in the tables in this appendix. Some of the survey questions included a "don't know" response option. The analyses in the body of the report were for respondents who had an opinion as eliminating "don't know" responses allows for easier comparison between evaluative responses. For questions that included a don't know response, two sets of tables are provided in this appendix; the first with the "don't know" responses excluded, to show the proportion of respondents with an opinion giving a response; and the second with the "don't know" responses included, to allow examination of the magnitude of unfamiliarity with certain items. These tables show the *weighted* percent and *weighted* number of respondents (see Table 1 in the *Survey Background* for the weighting variables). Several questions were included where respondents could provide an answer or an "other response" in their own words.
