Reuniting Lost & Found Pets

Whether your pet has gone missing or you've found a wandering pet, make sure to check with local animal shelters, submit a lost or found report, scan for a microchip or notify your microchip company (if your pet is microchipped), post on social media (Facebook, NextDoor, Craigslist), hang flyers in the neighborhood and nearby public spaces, and contact your neighbors.

Our website refreshes every 30 minutes with photos of lost pets, the location they were found at, and the date they arrived at the shelter.

Protecting Your Pet

There are precautions you can take to protect your pet if your pet ever becomes lost, whether your pet sneaks out through an open door or unlocked gate, or gets scared off by fireworks, or escapes after the fence is knocked down during a storm.

- License If an animal control officer finds your pet wearing a license tag, we will give your pet a free ride home.
- Microchip This is a permanent identification inserted under the skin. It cannot be misplaced or forgotten like your pet's collar and tag can.
- Personalized Tag Include your pet's name, your address, and at least 2 phone numbers.

We provide licensing for pet owners who reside within the city limits of Sacramento as well as microchipping for pet owners from any residence.

Becoming A Foster Parent

A foster parent provides a home environment that is preferred for most animals who find themselves at the shelter. A foster parent can devote the time, attention, care, and socialization that an animal needs before finding a forever home. Fostering helps to avoid overcrowding in the shelter and creates space to help animals who need to be there. All different types of animals need fostering, so if you're interested, we can help find one that fits into your home, and we will provide all the necessary pet supplies.

Volunteering Your Time

We are always looking for volunteers who want to help at the shelter. You can be involved with the pet food pantry, walking the dogs, socializing the cats, fundraisers, adoption events, vaccination clinics, special projects, and much more. We simply couldn't do everything that we do without our committed team of volunteers!

Taking A Dog Out For The Day

The **Doggie Day Out** program lets you take one of the shelter dogs and go on a field trip, such as a quick jog, a lunch date, or even a sleepover. This helps dogs that might be experiencing stress in the shelter and is a great way for dogs to burn off energy, socialize, and get more exposure to possible adopters.

Serving The Community

The Homeless Outreach and Assistance Program provides veterinary services and pet supplies to pet owners experiencing homelessness in Sacramento.

The **Pet Food Pantry** provides a free bag of dog food and cat food to pet owners in need and is available every Tuesday from 10:00 am to 11:30 am in the shelter parking lot.

The **Vaccination and Microchip Clinic** is a free public event for dogs and cats and is held one weekend day each month. Check the website for time and location.

The Community Spay and Neuter Program offers low-cost, appointment-based spay and neuter surgery for pets belonging to owners who reside within the city limits of Sacramento and meet household income requirements.
