Sacramento General Plan Update and Climate Action Plan Pop-up Series | Summer 2019

Introduction

During August and September 2019, more than 150 people participated in a series of Pop-up workshops as part of the Sacramento General Plan Update and Climate Action Plan. The Pop-up Workshops were held in conjunction with three Citywide Workshops in April 2019 to supplement the public outreach effort and reach a wider audience. The Pop-up workshops provided an opportunity for the project team to engage with all segments of the community including hard-to reach groups (e.g. youth, seniors, low-income residents, individuals with disabilities, and ethnic communities). The process emphasized "meeting people where they gather" in order to elicit participation at existing community functions and get their input on how the General Plan should shape the future of Sacramento.

Project Overview

The 2040 General Plan is the City's blueprint for how and where Sacramento will grow over the next 20 years. It will contain policies that will guide everything from transportation, jobs, entertainment, and public safety, to the type of homes available and much more.

In 2019, the City initiated an update to the General Plan to ensure it remains responsive to the challenges of the coming years. Along with updates to the General Plan, the City is also preparing an ambitious Climate Action Plan that outlines a community-wide framework for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and establishes Sacramento as a climate leader.

Purpose, Format, and Schedule

The Pop-up workshop series engaged Sacramento residents in a conversation about what they like, want to change, or see more of in their City. At each Pop-up workshop, the project team engaged community members to provide their input on what should change or be improved on in Sacramento.

The interactive activity consisted of a hanging clothesline where community members could add their responses to three essential questions on an index card:

- What do you like about Sacramento?
- What do you wish you could change about Sacramento?
- What do you want to see more of in Sacramento?

Community members wrote their answers on color-coordinated postcards and hung up their answers with clothespins. Additionally, the project team took pictures with a polaroid camera and hung up the photos of community members along with their answers. To encourage participation and have some fun, the project team also brought a prize wheel where community members could spin the wheel and win prizes.



There were six Pop-up workshops throughout the months of August and September. The table below shows the dates and locations of each workshop:



The 2040 General Plan Update project team received more than 200 responses from community members. Below is a compilation of feedback the project team received, separated by the location of each Pop-up workshop.


Overall Findings

The input collected from the 5 interactive pop-up workshops is summarized in the graphs below:

What do you like about Sacramento?




Of the 82 responses to the question, "What do you like about Sacramento?", most respondents wrote that they like the people in their neighborhoods and the diversity and culture of the various communities around Sacramento (26%). Community members also like the natural resources available for the public like the rivers, parks, and tree canopy (23%). Additionally, workshop attendees said that they like the various entertainment, shopping, and retail options (22%) and the public amenities like the assistance programs, transit options, and size and location of Sacramento (21%). Finally, some respondents wrote that they like everything about Sacramento (5%), the housing options (2%) and the projected growth of Sacramento (1%).



What do you wish you could change about Sacramento?

Of the 90 responses to the questions, "What do you wish you could change about Sacramento?", most respondents wrote that they want to see a reduction in homelessness and other social issues and for the City to invest in vulnerable communities more (28%). Workshop attendees also want to see improved mobility and transportation options (24%), improved public resources like law enforcement and street infrastructure (20%), and development of vacant or defunct areas (10%). Finally, some respondents mentioned that they want to see improved natural resources like the cleanliness of parks and rivers (8%), more affordable housing (7%), changes in City leadership (1%). Only 2 respondents said that they would not change anything about Sacramento (2%).






Of the 81 responses to the question, "What do you want to see more of in Sacramento?", most respondents wrote that they want more entertainment, amusement, retail, and shopping options (35%). Community members also said that they want to see more public resources, particularly for youth and for the homeless (19%), more affordability and employment options (15%), and better transportation options (14%). Finally, some workshop attendees said that they want to see more green spaces and tree canopy (11%), resources for animals like dog parks (5%) and more use of renewable energy (1%).

See below for a breakdown of the findings, separated by location of the pop-up workshop, in chronological order.

National Night Out

On August 6, the project team held a pop-up workshop from 5:00 – 8:00 p.m. during the National Night Out event located in the Franklin Boulevard Business District, at 5383 Franklin Boulevard. National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police/community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie. The project team received approximately 48 responses from community members attending the event. Additionally, there were informational boards with an overview and timeline of the General Plan Update. Workshop materials were available in both English and Spanish.

What do you like about Sacramento?




Positive qualities of Sacramento, according to community members

When asked what they like about Sacramento, community members commonly listed the rivers, access to water recreation, the diversity in cultures and ethnicities, and the abundance of parks throughout the City. Additionally, they like the public art, the Capitol Mall, the food culture, opportunities for recreation, the abundance of trees, and the small town feel that the City has compared to other large cities.

Qualities of Sacramento that should change, according to community members


When asked about they would like to change about Sacramento, community members commonly listed the need for improved resources and shelter for individuals who are homeless, more resources and activities for youth, and improved mobility and transportation (i.e. more light rail lines, more parking, improved bikes lanes). Additionally, community members mentioned they want to see more recreational activities and community events, improved parks, and more tree canopy. Community members also would like to see better employment opportunities, and improved cleanliness along Franklin Boulevard.

What community members want more of in Sacramento

When asked what they want to see more of in Sacramento, community members most commonly

listed the need for more affordable housing (i.e. tiny homes), resources and activities for young people (particularly in Marina Vista), resources for animals (i.e. dog parks, pet adoption programs), community events and activities, employment opportunities and resources for disadvantaged communities (i.e. rehabilitation centers, programs for single mothers). Additionally, community members mentioned a need for more bike lanes, public gathering places, parks, restaurants with outdoor seating, JUMP bicycles (particularly on Franklin Boulevard), and traffic calming measures. Community members also would like to see a larger and more expansive tree canopy, more people living in the City (and not commuting), as well as more retail development on Capitol Mall.



Valley Mack Farmer's Market


On August 30, the project team held a Pop-up workshop from 9:00 - 11:00 a.m.at the weekly Valley Mack Farmer's Market located at 6700 Mack Road in South Sacramento. The project team received approximately 29 responses from community members at the market. Workshop materials were available in both English and Spanish.

When asked about what they like about Sacramento, community members most commonly listed Old Sacramento and its unique businesses and history. Other things that community members like are the ways Sacramento has grown and developed, the Downtown area, the farmer's markets, parks, people and trees. Community members also appreciate that Sacramento is relatively slow paced and affordable compared to other cities.



What do you wish you could change about Sacramento?


Qualities of Sacramento that should change, according to community members

When asked about what they could change in Sacramento, community members most commonly mentioned a desire for less traffic and more resources for the homeless. Additionally, a few community members mentioned they would like wider sidewalks that are ADA accessible, more shopping malls and less people commuting in and out of the city. Community members would also like to see more parking, community gardens, cleaner streets in the Downtown and enforcement of bicycle laws.





What community members want more of in Sacramento

When asked about what they would like to see more of in Sacramento, community members most commonly listed the need for a more unified community. They wish there was more love, patience, and understanding between neighbors. Additionally, community members wrote about a need for improved mobility (i.e. encouraging more active transportation and improving road safety for all modes of transportation), more shopping malls and farmer's markets. Community members would also like to see more public resources for parks in South Sacramento and children's programs, mental health resources, as well as and cleaner streets.





Qualities of Sacramento that should change, according to community members




When asked about they would like to change in Sacramento, community members most commonly mentioned having more public resources (i.e. for youth and homeless), less traffic, less people and changes to the businesses (i.e. more amusement, no casinos on Stockton Boulevard). Additionally, a few community members listed their desire for better weather, improved laws, less pollution and less crime.



Grocery Outlet Bargain Market



What do you wish you could change about Sacramento?



When asked about what they would like to change in Sacramento, members community most commonly listed a desire for better mobility and transportation (i.e. more transit stops and lines, more law enforcement roads, more light rail lines). They would also like to see homelessness addressed, improved City assistance and services and more grocery stores. Additionally, a few community members mentioned they would like more affordable housing, no more redlining, less crime, and changes in City leadership.

What community members want more of in Sacramento

When asked about what they would like to see more of in Sacramento, community members most commonly listed the need for more transportation related solutions (i.e. more stop signs, more public transit) as well as, more employment opportunities. Additionally, community members wrote about the need for more grocery stores and shopping, a larger police presence, more community gardens, entertainment options and better City services (i.e. hotline for Public Works issues).





What do you like about Sacramento?




Positive qualities of Sacramento, according to community members

When asked about what they like about Sacramento, community members most commonly listed the diverse and supportive communities in the City, the abundance of trees and options for mobility (i.e. bike lanes, relatively less traffic than other cities). Other things that community members mentioned were the rivers and parks, the variety of housing options, the weather and the size of the City. Community members also like the grocery stores, the schools, the location, and Old Sacramento.

Qualities of Sacramento that should change, according to community members




most commonly listed a desire for more solutions and resources for homelessness, improvement in mobility (i.e. less traffic, better safety, more bus lines, improved road infrastructure), affordable housing options and more law enforcement. Additionally, a few community members mentioned they would like better building and home infrastructure, more development on vacant lots, cleaner rivers and more diversity. They also expressed having a stronger more unified community. Some community members said that they wouldn't change anything about Sacramento.
