### **UPDATE ON CORE APPLICATIONS**

- ❖ CORE Graduates = 169
- Graduates without BOP applications = 132
- 37 CORE graduates have submitted 52 BOP applications
  - ❖ 14 CORE graduates have been issued 12 BOPs
  - 23 CORE graduates have 40 pending BOPs

# UPDATE ON REIMBURSEMENTS (BCC Grant)

- 47 requests received
- 30 reimbursements paid
- 6 pending finance division approval
- 4 awaiting information from applicant
- 7 going through verification process
- 47 = \$1,067,074.48

## UPDATE ON LOAN PROGRAM (GO-Biz Grant)

- CORE Capital
  - ❖Interest-free loan
  - ❖ 6-year term
  - For Classification 1, 2 or 3 CORE participants
  - Cannabis businesses (no ancillary businesses)

## UPDATE ON LOAN Program (GO-biz Grant)

- \* How can funds be used?
  - First survey soliciting input received approximately 25 responses
  - Second survey soliciting input on use of funds emailed out Wednesday on Survey Monkey

- Program details still being solidified, but we need to get it up and running, so please provide feedback!

### UPDATE ON LOAN PROGRAM (GO-biz Grant)

#### Current Working Draft

- Funds available in 3 Phases:
  - ❖Phase 1 Up to \$30,000 for the purpose of achieving the following milestones:
    - ✓ Maintaining a business location
    - ✓ Submitting a CUP application and completing all required documents
    - ✓ Submitting a BOP and/or state cannabis license application

## UPDATE ON LOAN PROGRAM (GO-biz Grant)

#### Current Working Draft

- ❖Phase 2 Up to \$50,000 for the purpose of achieving the following milestones:
  - ✓ Obtain a Certificate of Occupancy
  - ✓ Obtain a BOP
  - ✓ Obtain a state license
  - ✓ Open for business
- ❖Phase 3 Up to additional \$25,000 for the purpose of achieving the following milestones:
  - ✓ Expanding/sustaining a permitted and operating business
  - ✓ Supporting operational needs

# UPDATE ON LOAN program (GO-biz Grant)

\*Application process and requirements for each tier will be discussed in detail at a future CORE stakeholder meeting and information will be available on our website.

### Cannabis Storefront Dispensary

#### \* RFQ process of issuing permits

- Approved by L&L on 9/29/20
- ❖ Will be heard by City Council on 10/13/20
- \*Request for Qualifications (RFQ) vs. Request for Proposals (RFP)?
  - For our purposes, no real difference
  - ❖ Better fit with City's RFQ procurement policies and procedures

#### RFQ general criteria (ordinance)

- Whether applicants will be able to successfully submit a complete application for a storefront dispensary permit
- Whether applicants will be able to successfully operate a storefront dispensary permit
- Utilize criteria reasonably necessary to protect public health, safety and welfare

### **Cannabis Storefront Dispensary**

- RFQ specific criteria (what should be included in each proposal?)
  - Solicited input at September 2 CORE stakeholder meeting
  - That input was compiled and sent out as a survey to find out which specific criteria CORE members thought should be used in the RFQ
  - \*81 responses received


## Cannabis Storefront Dispensary RFQ Criteria Survey Results



## Cannabis Storefront Dispensary Highest Rated Criteria

- CORE Participant
  - ❖ Graduate; Certified; Prior to June 30<sup>th</sup>
- Business Plans and Qualifications
  - Description of how proposer will succeed and sustain the business; list of all owners and investors; timeline; qualifications and experience; marketing plan, budget, previous success
- Helping CORE and the Community
  - Dedicated shelf space; economic inclusion plan; community enrichment; plans to help other CORE members/CORE businesses

### Cannabis Storefront Dispensary RFQ Criteria Survey Results



### Cannabis Storefront Dispensary Lowest Rated Criteria

#### Status

Victim of police or gang violence; Spouse/child of someone arrested for cannabis; previously arrested/incarcerated for cannabis; veteran; female

#### Property and Money

Signed lease; approved CUP or applied for CUP; Proof of investment; minimum amount of investment; plan to operate without investors or CORE-only investors

#### Business and Qualifications

Membership in cannabis and business organizations; resumé; networking efforts; plan to form partnerships with CORE members; letter of recommendation; enhanced learning

## Cannabis Storefront Dispensary RFQ Process

- \* RFQ criteria:
  - Items from CORE's highest-rated criteria AND
  - City Code requirements
    - Ability to successfully apply for and operate a storefront dispensary AND criteria must be reasonably necessary to protect the public health, safety, and welfare.
  - Criteria Example: A description of classes, trainings and workshops completed to prepare the applicant to successfully apply for and operate cannabis business

## Cannabis Storefront Dispensary Who will Evaluate?

- Evaluation/scoring by an unbiased and neutral review panel consisting of individuals who:
  - \*Have some level of expertise in economic or business development; or
  - Have an active involvement in social equity matters; or
  - ❖ Is a cannabis regulator from another jurisdiction; and
  - ❖ Is not an employee or a contractor of the City of Sacramento or affiliated in any way with the cannabis industry in Sacramento.
  - Send suggestions of potential evaluators!

# Cap on Delivery-only Dispensaries in Southeast Industrial Area (PIA)

- ► To be heard by L&L at 1pm on 10/13/20
  - ❖ Discussion on whether to: 1) reinstate the cap which expired on 10/1/20; 2) conduct a traffic study; 3) use a different method to evaluate impact to area
  - ❖Cap of 50 Delivery businesses in Southeast Industrial Area:
    - 31 BOPs issued (19 still available)
    - \$21 BOPs pending (including 5 CORE) + 6 other CORE applicants with pending CUP issues
