Update on CORE Applications

Individuals have graduated from the program = 173

Graduates without applications = 136

Graduates who have submitted BOP applications = 37

CORE BOP applications submitted = 55

Approved CORE Businesses = 13

Pending CORE BOP applications = 42

Update on Policy Items

DELIVERY IN SOUTHEAST INDUSTRIAL AREA:

- Ordinance adopted by Council on 11/10/20 limiting cannabis delivery businesses in Southeast Industrial Area to 50
 - ❖ BOPs issued = 32
 - Available = 18
 - Pending = 20 (not including 6 CORE applicants working on CUP issues)
- Cap will sunset on March 31, 2021.
- Traffic study underway; results to be presented to L&L in Feb 2021.

Update on Policy Items

1-YEAR MORATORIUM ON OWNERSHIP INTEREST CHANGES FOR STOREFRONT DISPENSARIES

- Adopted by Council on 11/10/20
- Council direction:
 - Address ambiguities in current Code/policy
 - Examine implications for CORE applicants
 - Bring forward options to L&L
 - Present options to Council in a workshop (tentative date: Q1 2021)

Update on Reimbursements (BCC Grants)

AS OF 11/19/20:

- 47 reimbursement requests received
- 33 requests have been paid
- 4 requests ineligible
- 9 in process (waiting for further information from the business)
- 1 request pending payment

- Total reimbursements if all eligible requests are paid = 985,875.08
- Remaining funds = \$91,532.33

Update on Reimbursements (BCC Grants)

Reopening Reimbursement Program to Pay Out Remaining Funds

Reimbursement requests will be accepted on a first-come-first-serve beginning Monday, November 23, 2020 until the funds are exhausted.

Open only to those:

- who have submitted a valid BOP application (has a valid CUP) since the 8/7/20 deadline
- who have received under \$25,000 per BOP in reimbursements (difference only)
- whose requests were denied due to missing the deadline. MUST submit a new reimbursement request to be eligible. Valid BOP application required.

Update on Loan Program (Go-BIZ grant)

- CORE Capital = 6-year interest free loan to Classification 1, 2 or 3 applicants
- To be serviced by Elevate Impact
 Sacramento
 - Initial loan up to \$50,000
 - Follow-on loans in increments of up to \$25,000 (subject to certain conditions)
 - Total loan amount of up to \$125,000

RFQ CRITERIA/ STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS (SOQ)

- Combination of criteria approved by Council in 10/13/20 resolution and input from stakeholders received through September 2020 survey
- Social equity criteria/questions not included on SOQ but proposers <u>may</u> choose to include related information under the "Miscellaneous/Other Relevant Information" of the SOQ

DRAFT STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS (SOQ) – cont.

- Introductory Letter with the following information:
 - A. Information about the applicant(s)
 - B. Relevant information related to qualifications under classification 1 or 2 of the CORE program
 - c. Applicant's interest in a cannabis storefront dispensary, highlighting any relevant qualifications.
 - D. Certification that for a period of 10 years from the issuance of the permit that:
 - At least 51% of the ownership interest in the storefront cannabis dispensary will be held by one or more CORE Program participants in classifications 1 or 2
 - 2. Owner(s) of the dispensary who are CORE Program participants will receive at least 51% of the storefront cannabis dispensary's profits.

DRAFT STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS (SOQ)-cont.

II. Qualifications/Experience Portfolio

A detailed yet concise narrative discussing applicant's business-readiness, focusing on qualifications and experience necessary to operate a successful storefront cannabis business in the city of Sacramento.

A. Background, Training and Education

- Professional experience including any relevant background in the areas of business management/administration, general leadership, accounting, inventory management, etc.
- 2. Professional certifications, classes, trainings and workshops specific to the cannabis industry
- Informal trainings and/or previous experience in the cannabis industry
- Leadership or membership in business and/or cannabisrelated organizations

DRAFT STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS (SOQ) – cont.

- B. A business plan focused on a strategy for achieving success and sustainability and contains that following components:
 - A mission statement
 - 2. Business structure, the key players and their roles
 - A projected timeline that covers the period from RFQ to opening
 - 4. A detailed budget with a proposed funding strategy
 - 5. An operational plan
 - 6. A workforce development plan
 - 7. A marketing plan

DRAFT STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS (SOQ) – cont.

C. Miscellaneous/Other Relevant Information

- Examples of successful projects completed and the applicant's role in its/their success
- Statement addressing how the applicant's proposed storefront dispensary will be unique or different from others
- 3. Any other relevant information
