Equity Program

- ➤ Small business support center
- ➤ Mentoring program for minorities, women, and veteran owned businesses
- ➤ CUP and BOP fee deferral system for qualified participants
- Priority CUP and BOP processing for qualified participants
- ➤ Provide Non-Operational BOP to participants who have completed program
- ➤ Community Outreach
- ➤ Priority Processing of CUPs & BOPs

Equity Program Eligibility

INDIVIDUALS:

Type 1: Residing in a zip code of a priority neighborhood for at least 7 years, between 1994 and the date of application, or from most negatively impacted zip code

Type 2: Economically disadvantaged status, as marked by income below 200% Federal Poverty Level and net worth below \$250,000

Type 3: A women or veteran-owned business

BUSINESSES:

Type 4: Commitment to employ 51% transitional workers.

Type 5: Business with equity incubator or Cannabis Social Enterprise. A business that hosts an equity business, Type 1,2, or 3.

Equity Program Benefits

Type 1:

- Eligible business support center services:
- expungement of criminal records,
- priority CUP and BOP processing and fee waiver/deferral

Type 2 & 3: Eligible for services offered by business support center, priority CUP and BOP processing and fee deferral.

Type 4 & 5: Eligible for priority CUP and BOP processing.

Ethanol in Nonvolatile Manufacturing

➤ Ethanol defined in State Emergency Regulations released on 11/16/17 as a non-volatile substance

➤ Fire Marshal Approval Required

Tiered Manufacturing

By Gross Receipts:

- Class A Under \$100,000
- Class B Under 1,000,000
- Class C Under 3,000,000
- Class D Over 3,000,000

By Type:

- Type 1: Non-Volatile Manufacturing (all aspects)
- Type N: Production of Edibles, Topicals and Other Products.
- Type P: Packaging and Labeling

Removing CUP Requirements

A. For Small Manufacturers:

- \$100,000 or less in gross receipts
- Producers of edibles and topicals
- Packaging and labeling
- Will not apply to extractors
- Includes Council Call-up Provision of BOP

Removing CUP Requirements (cont.)

B. For Testing Facilities

- ➤ Will allow testing as a by-right activity in C-2, C-4, M-1, M-1(S), M-2, M-2(S), MIP and MRD zones
- ➤ Similar laboratories in Sacramento do not require a CUP
- Establishes Council Call-Up Process of Testing BOPs

Production CUP

- ➤ Single CUP for:
 - Cultivation
 - Manufacturing
 - Distribution
- Adding new uses requires Modification of CUP and Public Hearing
- Less expensive means to do business
- ➤ Council Call Up provisions still apply.

Distribution

2 Types of Permit:

Distribution Center

 Over 2,500 sq. ft. with sole function of distributing and transporting cannabis products

Distribution Service

 2,500 sq. ft. or less intended as an add-on or secondary permit to allow a cannabis business to transport/distribute their own cannabis products

Adult Use Retail

A. By Permitted Storefront Dispensaries

- ➤ Must Modify CUP and BOP
- ➤ CUP Modification Requires Neighborhood Responsibility Plan
- ➤ Pre-qualification from Office of Cannabis and Enforcement to ensure dispensary is in good standing for 30 days

B. By New Non storefront Delivery-only Dispensaries

- Must obtain a CUP for brick-and-mortar location
- ➤ Must apply for BOP for a dispensary

Delivery

A. By Permitted Storefront Dispensaries

➤ Must Modify BOP

B. By New Non storefront Delivery-only Dispensaries

- ➤ Must obtain a CUP for brick-and-mortar location
- ➤ Must apply for a BOP for a dispensary

Background Check Requirements

- ➤ Definition of Interested Parties = Owners, Managers and 20% share in the business
- ➤ Background checks for Interested Parties only
- ➤ No background checks for employees
