Criteria and Measurements for City-wide Inclusive Economic and Community Development Strategy

This document is to serve as a guide to the community and businesses to align projects seeking investment with the economic and community development goals of the City of Sacramento. Each line represents criteria to utilize in evaluating City investment decisions.
