2027 Open Enrollment Information

Open Enrollment is October 5 – October 30, 2026

It's time for the City of Sacramento's 2027 Retiree Open Enrollment. This is your annual opportunity to review your health benefit options and make changes if needed.

Key Dates:

- Open Enrollment Period: October 5 – October 30, 2026
- Changes Take Effect: January 1, 2027

What You Can Do During Open Enrollment:

- Review your current health coverage
- Change your City medical, dental, and/or vision plan enrollment
- Add or remove dependents
- Confirm no changes are needed for 2027

COMPLETE YOUR OPEN ENROLLMENT FORM ONLINE

Complete your Open Enrollment form online starting Monday, October 5, 2026, at

www.cityofsacramento.gov/retireeOE. If you submit your form online, do not mail the paper form to the City.

Completing your form online will also allow you to save a copy of your completed form for your records. **Only submit one online form if you choose the online option.** If you do not use the online enrollment form option, your paper Open Enrollment form must be postmarked by October 30, 2026.

COMPLETE YOUR OPEN ENROLLMENT FORM TO CONFIRM YOUR 2027 ELECTIONS

All retirees/beneficiaries need to complete an Open Enrollment form to confirm their elections for 2027, even if you are not making any changes, or you are waiving all coverages. Submitting the form ensures your elections are recorded for the upcoming year. IMPORTANT: If you will have a qualifying life event (QLE) in October, November, or December, you need to contact us immediately to process your QLE *separate* from Open Enrollment so that your QLE changes will be effective prior to 01/01/2027.

OPEN ENROLLMENT ASSISTANCE

IN-PERSON PAPERWORK LAB, OCTOBER 14 FROM 9:00 A.M. – 2:00 P.M. AT HISTORIC CITY HALL

Benefit Services will be available to assist retirees with their Open Enrollment paperwork at Historic City Hall (915 I Street) in the Benefit Services office (Plaza level) on October 14, from 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. No appointment is necessary for this lab. If you change coverage for 2027, you will also be able to complete carrier enrollment forms, if needed, at the same time.

- Please note the Benefit Services Office is closed to walk-in customers except during our in-person paperwork lab on October 14 from 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. If you need in-person assistance at another time, an appointment is required.

2027 MEDICARE PART D ANNUAL MAX OUT-OF-POCKET LIMIT

The 2027 annual maximum out-of-pocket cost for Medicare Part D covered prescriptions will be \$2,400 per enrollee. *The City's Medicare advantage plans include Medicare Part D.*

SPLIT PLAN ENROLLMENT

If enrolling/enrolled in a City medical plan and one enrollee is Medicare eligible and the other enrollee on your plan is not Medicare eligible, this is referred to as split plan enrollment. There are two options available for split plan enrollment:

1. Kaiser Senior Advantage (KPSA) \$20 copay plan with Kaiser HMO \$40 copay plan; or
2. UnitedHealthcare® Medicare Advantage PPO \$15 copay plan *and* either the Sutter Health Plan or Western Health Advantage copay plans.

PROOF DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED IF ADDING DEPENDENTS TO BENEFITS

If you are adding eligible dependents to your medical, dental, and/or vision plan(s) in 2027, you are required to submit proof of dependent eligibility to Benefit Services **by November 13, 2026**. Examples of required proof include birth certificate, marriage certificate, or a legal document such as a court order. We do not need original documents; legible copies are acceptable. Proof should be sent via mail to: **City of Sacramento, Benefit Services, 915 I Street, Plaza Level, Sacramento, CA 95814.**

PAYMENT OF PREMIUM

Out-of-pocket costs for your January 2027 health premiums (if applicable) will be deducted from your February 1, 2027, pension check. Please note that the January 1, 2027, pension check pays for December 2026 benefits. For CalPERS retirees, your City retiree health contribution is applied in the following order: vision, then dental, then medical (if you are enrolled in all three types of coverage). Any remaining balance not covered by the City contribution will be deducted directly from your monthly pension check.

MEDICARE ELIGIBILITY

All retirees and dependents must enroll in Medicare Parts A & B once eligible and must keep that enrollment active. When you first enroll, you must send a copy of your Medicare card to Benefit Services. Medicare Part B (and sometimes Part D, depending on your retirement income) has a monthly premium. These premiums must be paid directly to Medicare and must be paid on time. If they are not, Medicare will cancel your City Kaiser Senior Advantage or UnitedHealthcare® Group Medicare Advantage plan, and you will lose your City-sponsored medical coverage. If you are not eligible for Medicare Parts A & B, you must provide a Benefit Verification Letter from Social Security or Medicare confirming your ineligibility.

CITY CONTRIBUTION

Effective January 1, 2027, the City's contributions toward retiree health insurance premiums for those qualified to receive the benefit are:

* Employees hired *prior* to the cutoff date for the City's retiree health contribution, and who retire due to industrial disability retirement, are eligible for up to 100% of the City's retiree health contribution, in accordance with their applicable labor agreement.

CASH-IN-LIEU

If you purchase an **individual** medical plan, you might be eligible to receive your City retiree health contribution as Cash-In-Lieu (CIL). The City will not reimburse group medical premiums (such as coverage through a spouse or another employer) and will not reimburse for Medicare Part A and B premiums. Only premiums for **individual** medical insurance are reimbursable.

If you plan to receive CIL in 2027 for your individual medical coverage, mark the Cash-In-Lieu box on your

form. Around mid-November, the City will mail you CIL paperwork to complete. If you currently receive CIL in 2026, your renewal packet for 2027 will be mailed to you in mid-November.

COMPLETING YOUR OPEN ENROLLMENT FORM FOR 2027

1. Complete the online Open Enrollment form at www.cityofsacramento.gov/retireeOE; or
2. Complete the enclosed enrollment form and mail it to Benefit Services:
 - i. **City of Sacramento, Benefit Services, 915 I Street, Plaza Level, Sacramento, CA 95814**
3. Your paper enrollment form must be received by 5:00 p.m. or postmarked by Friday, October 30, 2026, for changes to be made for the 2027 plan year.
4. PLEASE NOTE: **Returning your Open Enrollment form may not complete the process.** Some plans **REQUIRE** the health carrier's enrollment form to also be completed to enroll in their medical plan. *Benefit Services will mail you any required carrier forms to complete based on your 2027 open enrollment elections. Any additional required forms, such as the health carrier's enrollment form, are due to Benefit Services by December 1, 2026.*

WHEN CAN I MAKE CHANGES TO MY BENEFITS OUTSIDE OF OPEN ENROLLMENT?

You can only change your benefits outside of the Open Enrollment period if you have a Qualifying Life Event, such as marriage, divorce, Medicare eligibility, or a change in other coverage. Paperwork must be submitted to Benefit Services within 30 days (60 days for birth/adoption) of the date of your qualifying life event.

HEALTH EXCHANGE MARKETPLACE – CALIFORNIA OR OUT OF STATE

If you prefer an individual plan, Covered California offers non-Medicare coverage options for you and your family. For more information, visit www.coveredca.com or contact them by phone at 1-800-300-1506. For marketplace options outside of California, visit <https://www.healthcare.gov/> or call 1-800-318-2596. You can also purchase individual Medicare or non-Medicare medical plans, dental, or vision insurance by going directly through a carrier. For free assistance finding an individual plan in California, either through the Health Exchange Marketplace or directly with a carrier, you can contact eHealth at 1-844-298-4334 or <https://www.ehealthinsurance.com/individual-family-health-insurance>. The City retiree health contribution cannot be used for a non-City dental or vision plan.

DURABLE POWER OF ATTORNEY

If you have a durable power of attorney in place regarding any decisions or communication related to your health benefits, please make sure the City receives a copy of the legal document for your file. WHY CAN I ONLY MAIL FORMS OR COMPLETE THE ONLINE ENROLLMENT FORM?

Mailing the paper form or using the online enrollment form provides a level of security appropriate for the personal information contained in your forms.

I AM NOT ENROLLED ON ANY CITY HEALTH PLAN. WHY DID I RECEIVE THIS?

The City mails Open Enrollment materials to all benefit-eligible retirees with a mailing address on file. We ask that you still complete and return the form (by mail or online), so we can keep your benefits and contact information up to date.
