The mission of the Sacramento Police Department is to work in partnership with the community to protect life and property, solve neighborhood problems, and enhance the quality of life in our city.

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Introduction

On September 30, 2021, California Governor Gavin Newsom signed into law Bill 481, requiring all California law enforcement agencies to obtain approval prior to the use or acquisition of military equipment from the applicable governing body, by ordinance adopting a military equipment use policy at a regular meeting of the governing body.

The governing body may approve the funding, acquisition, and use of military equipment within its jurisdiction, after a law enforcement agency under its supervision submits a proposed military equipment use policy and makes those documents available on the agency's website at least 30 days prior to any public hearing concerning the military equipment at issue.

The governing body is required to annually review the military equipment use ordinance and determine, based upon an annual military equipment use report ("annual report"), compliance with the standards for approval of each type of military equipment under AB 481.

The annual report must be publicly available on each agency's website and, at a minimum, contain information for the preceding calendar year for each type of military equipment. This information includes:

- (1) A summary of how the military equipment was used and the purpose of its use.
- (2) A summary of any complaints or concerns received concerning the military equipment.
- (3) The results of any internal audits, any information about violations of the military equipment use policy, and any actions taken in response.
- (4) The total annual cost for each type of military equipment, including acquisition, personnel, training, transportation, maintenance, storage, upgrade, and other ongoing costs, and from what source funds will be provided for the military equipment in the calendar year following submission of the annual military equipment report.
- (5) The quantity possessed for each type of military equipment.
- (6) If the law enforcement agency intends to acquire additional military equipment in the next year, the quantity sought for each type of military equipment.

In addition, within 30 days of submitting and publicly releasing an annual military equipment report, the law enforcement agency must hold at least one well-publicized and conveniently located community engagement meeting to discuss and ask questions about the report and the law enforcement agency's funding, acquisition, or use of military equipment.

All details pertaining to Assembly Bill 481 have been codified within Government Code §§ 7070-7075.

Definitions

Annual costs – The approximate and applicable total of acquisition, personnel, training, transportation, maintenance, storage, upgrade, or other ongoing costs.

Consumable equipment – Equipment that is typically used once, depletes with use, and requires replenishment regularly. Items include, but are not limited to, ammunition, chemical agents, diversionary devices, and other munitions.

Governing body – The elected body that oversees a law enforcement agency or, if there is no elected body that directly oversees the law enforcement agency, the appointed body that oversees a law enforcement agency. In the case of a law enforcement agency of a county, including a sheriff's department or a district attorney's office, "governing body" means the board of supervisors of the county (Government Code § 7070[a]). For the purpose of this report the Sacramento City Council is the governing body for the Sacramento Police Department.

Maintenance costs – The cost of routine preventative maintenance, replacement parts, software, licensing, contract fees, and outside vendor services (e.g., labor, parts, and materials). Maintenance completed by employees includes employee salary costs calculated utilizing the average of all employees' pay scales.

Non-consumable equipment – Equipment that may be used repeatedly and for longer periods of time without substantial wear. Typically serialized and requiring periodic maintenance or repair to ensure functionality. Items include, but are not limited to, vehicles, firearms, and less-lethal munition launchers.

Personnel and training costs – The total of an employee's salary incurred during military equipment usage and training. This includes, but is not limited to, course tuition and materials, travel and lodging expenses, certification and licensing, and portions of an employee's salary that is calculated utilizing the average of all employees pay scales.

Reportable use of force – Reportable use of force that involves any military equipment listed in category 10, 12, or 14, in accordance with General Order 580.02

Reporting period – This report captures inventories, costs, and usage information from May 1, 2025, to April 30, 2026.

Use – The activation, discharge, detonation, or operation of individual pieces of military equipment utilized on a person or object during an incident.

Categories

Hereinafter, this report will reference equipment categories that correspond to the definitions of military equipment in accordance with Government Code § 7070(c)(1-15).

1. Unmanned, remotely piloted, powered aerial or ground vehicles.
2. Mine-resistant ambush-protected (MRAP) vehicles or armored personnel carriers. However, police versions of standard consumer vehicles are specifically excluded from this subdivision.
3. High mobility multipurpose wheeled vehicles (HMMWV), commonly referred to as Humvees, two and one-half-ton trucks, five-ton trucks, or wheeled vehicles that have a breaching or entry apparatus attached. However, unarmored all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) and motorized dirt bikes are specifically excluded from this subdivision.
4. Tracked armored vehicles that provide ballistic protection to their occupants and utilize a tracked system instead of wheels for forward motion.
5. Command and control vehicles that are either built or modified to facilitate the operational control and direction of public safety units.
6. Weaponized aircraft, vessels, or vehicles of any kind.
7. Battering rams, slugs, and breaching apparatuses that are explosive in nature. However, items designed to remove a lock, such as bolt cutters, or a handheld ram designed to be operated by one person, are specifically excluded from this subdivision.
8. Firearms of .50 caliber or greater. However, standard issue shotguns are specifically excluded from this subdivision.
9. Ammunition of .50 caliber or greater. However, standard issue shotgun ammunition is specifically excluded from this subdivision.
10. Specialized firearms and ammunition of less than .50 caliber, including assault weapons as defined in Sections 30510 and 30515 of the Penal Code, with the exception of standard issue service weapons and ammunition of less than .50 caliber that are issued to officers, agents, or employees of a law enforcement agency or a state agency.
11. Any firearm or firearm accessory that is designed to launch explosive projectiles.
12. "Flashbang" grenades and explosive breaching tools, "tear gas," and "pepper balls," excluding standard, service-issued handheld pepper spray.
13. Area denial electroshock devices, microwave weapons, water cannons, long-range acoustic devices, acoustic hailing devices, and sound cannons.
14. The following projectile launch platforms and their associated munitions: 40mm projectile launchers, "bean bag," rubber bullet, and specialty impact munition (SIM) weapons.
15. Any other equipment as determined by a governing body or a state agency to require additional oversight.
16. Notwithstanding paragraphs (1) through (15), "military equipment" does not include general equipment not designated as prohibited or controlled by the federal Defense Logistics Agency.

Equipment: Inventory, Proposed Acquisitions, and Annual Costs

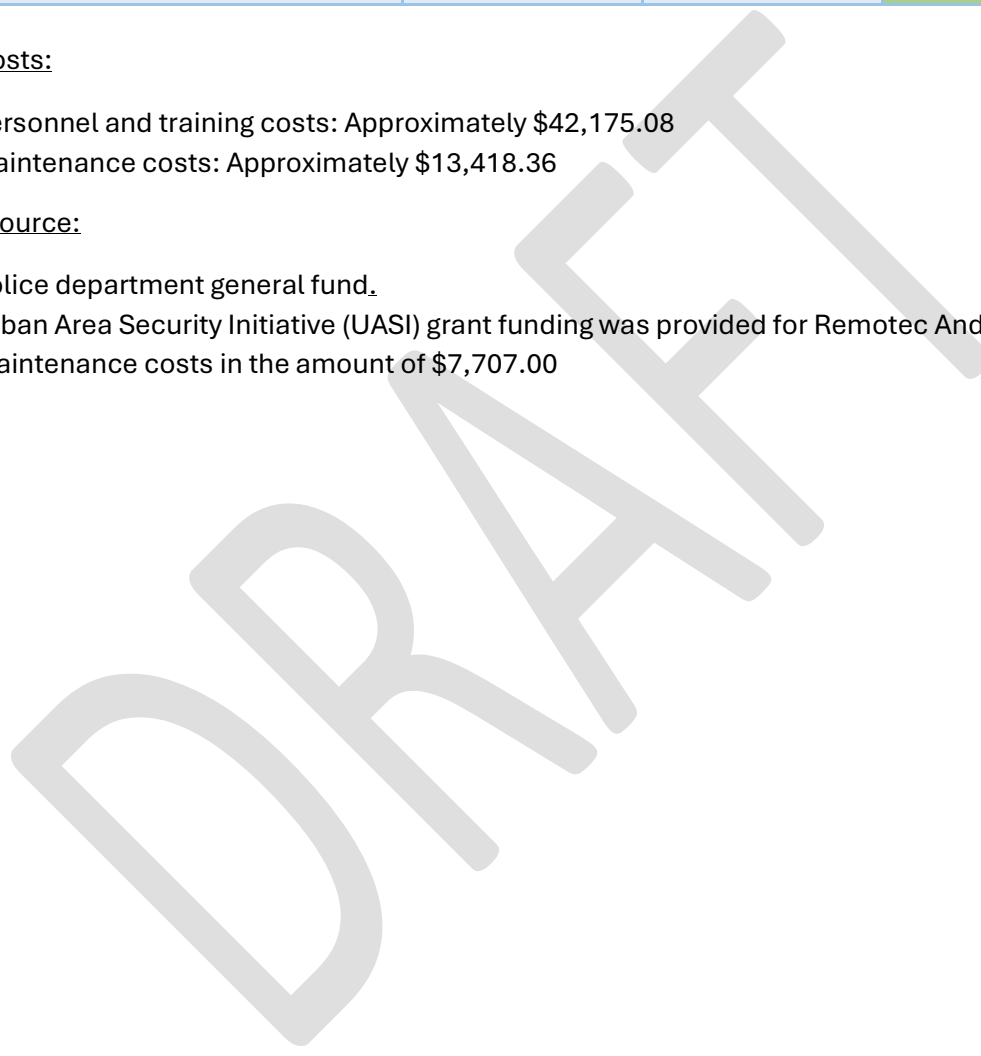

 - o These UAS models will be used to remotely gain visual-only data (color video) of confined spaces to check on a person or identify hazards before entry into an area.
- DJI Matrice 4TD
 - o This UAS model will be used to remotely capture video or photo for department digital content.
- Skydio X10
 - o Used for Drone First Responder program. This equipment is included in the pending SPD Axon contract at no additional cost.

Basis for Proposed Acquisition

- Dyno Nobel Inc. Blasting Caps Model: PL0450061011114040
 - The SPD has consumed some of its blasting caps and requires replenishment. This blasting cap is utilized to initiate an instantaneous, controlled detonation for explosive breaching or demolition of other dangerous explosives encountered during Explosive Ordnance Disposal call outs.
- Dyno Nobel Inc. Blasting Caps Model: PL0450062011114080
 - SPD has identified an additional model (PL045006211114080) of blasting cap which affords a longer lead of 80 feet which would allow officers greater stand-off from the charge to enhance officer safety in certain situations. This blasting cap is utilized to initiate an instantaneous, controlled detonation for explosive breaching or demolition of other dangerous explosives encountered during Explosive Ordnance Disposal call outs.
- Dyno Nobel Inc. Primacord 10, 50 Grain Detonating Cord
 - The Sacramento Police Department has consumed some of its 50-grain detonating cord and requires replenishment. The explosive is used solely for explosive breaching and demolition of other dangerous explosives encountered during Explosive Ordnance Disposal call outs.

- Royal Arms International MB-70S 12 Gauge Muzzle Blast Flash Bang Soft Breaching Round
 - The Sacramento Police Department has consumed some breaching munitions and requires replenishment. This breaching round is designed and utilized as a less lethal diversionary round that can breach light wood doors, interior doors, windows, sliders, and automotive glass.

- Federal American Eagle .223 Remington, 55 Grain Rifle Round TMJ w/Lead-Free Primer
 - The Sacramento Police Department is exploring a transition to “lead free” training rifle ammunition. The proposed acquisitions will be used for testing prior to a larger order to replace the existing model of training ammunition.
- Hornady .308 WIN TAP
 - The SPD has consumed some of its SWAT ammunition through on-going training and requires replenishment for upcoming training and qualifications.
- Hornady 5.56 and .223 ammunition
 - The SPD SWAT team will be transitioning to this round of ammunition for their precision rifles in an effort to improve performance and accuracy.

The proposed acquisitions will be used by SWAT and the Canine Unit to distract a subject during SWAT hostage rescues, room entries, or other high-risk situations. Capable of producing atmospheric over-pressure and bright light that produces a short-term disorientation of subjects.
- Royal Arms FBG MK3 Flash Bang Kit
 - The proposed acquisitions will be used by SWAT and the Canine Unit as a reusable device designed for training.

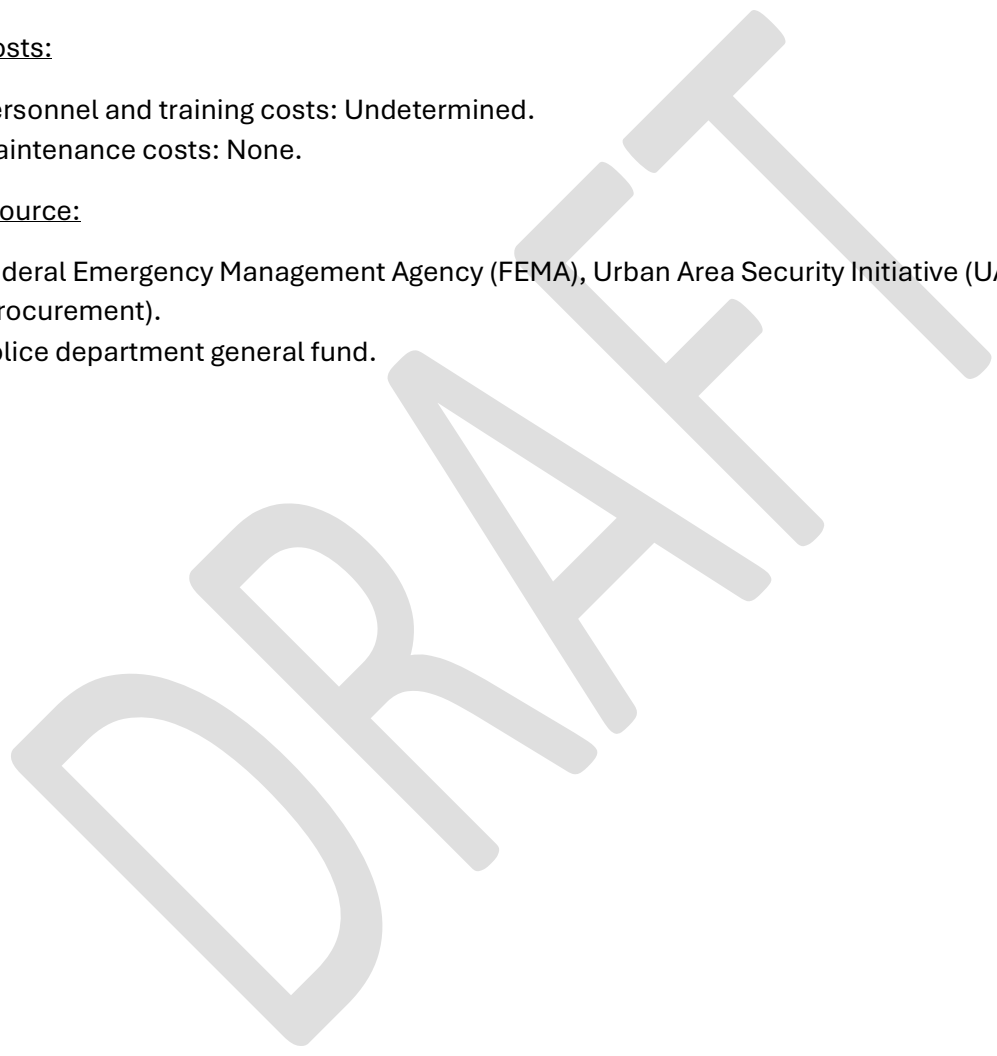

Inspections and Standards Team

The Inspections and Standards Team is comprised of one sergeant, one administrative analyst, one administrative technician, and one reserve officer.

The team's military equipment responsibilities include, but are not limited to, collecting and organizing all department military equipment usage and demographic data, conducting and reporting on regular inspections and audits of the department's military equipment, coordinating procurement information amongst all department offices, and drafting this report.

During this military equipment reporting period, the total salary cost of the Inspection and Standards Team for the department's military equipment inspections, coordination, and reporting was approximately \$163,523.57.

Department Armorer

The Department Armorer is assigned to the Evidence and Property Section and is comprised of one senior evidence and property technician.

The armorer's military equipment responsibilities include, but are not limited to, maintaining the inventory of department firearms, ammunition, and munitions, completing repairs of multiple categories of department military equipment, and assisting the Inspections and Standards Team with regular department inspections and audits.

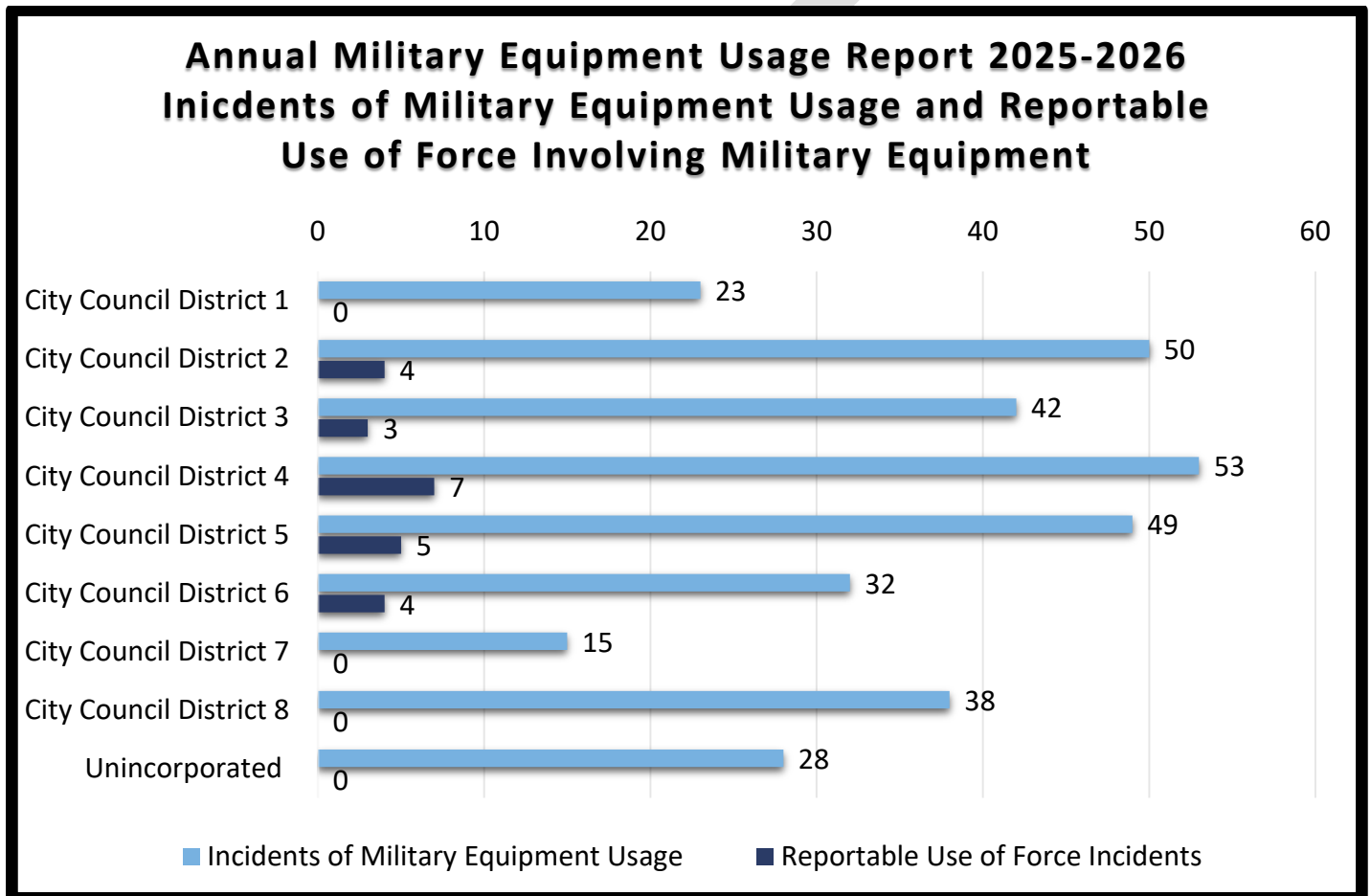
During this military equipment reporting period, the total salary cost of the Department Armorer for the department's military equipment was approximately \$17,975.68.

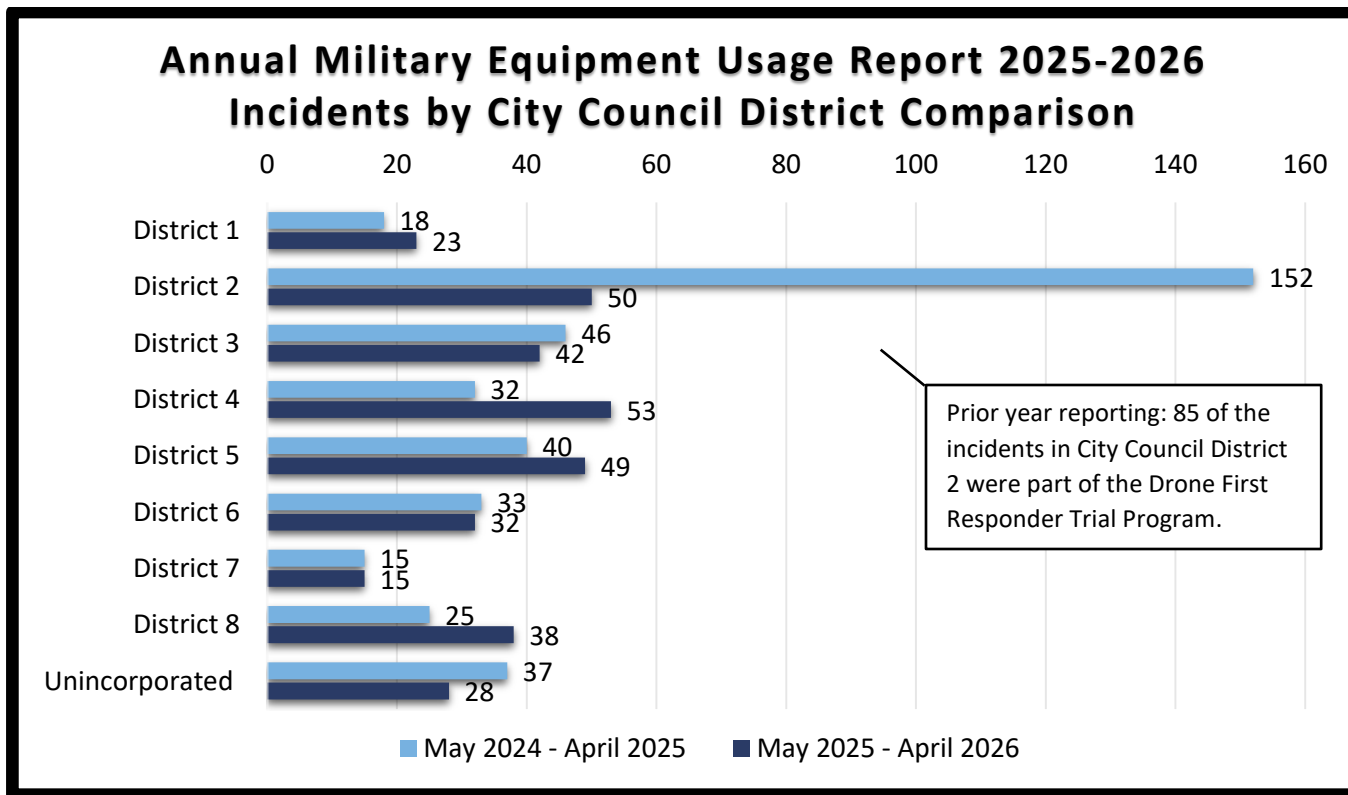
Military Equipment Use

During the current reporting period of May 1, 2025, to April 30, 2026, the department responded to 133,069 calls for service where an officer arrived at the scene and handled 58,656 officer-initiated contacts. Department military equipment was utilized during 330 incidents, which includes use at multiple locations of the same incident. During the 330 incidents there were 23 incidents were a reported use of force incident occurred.

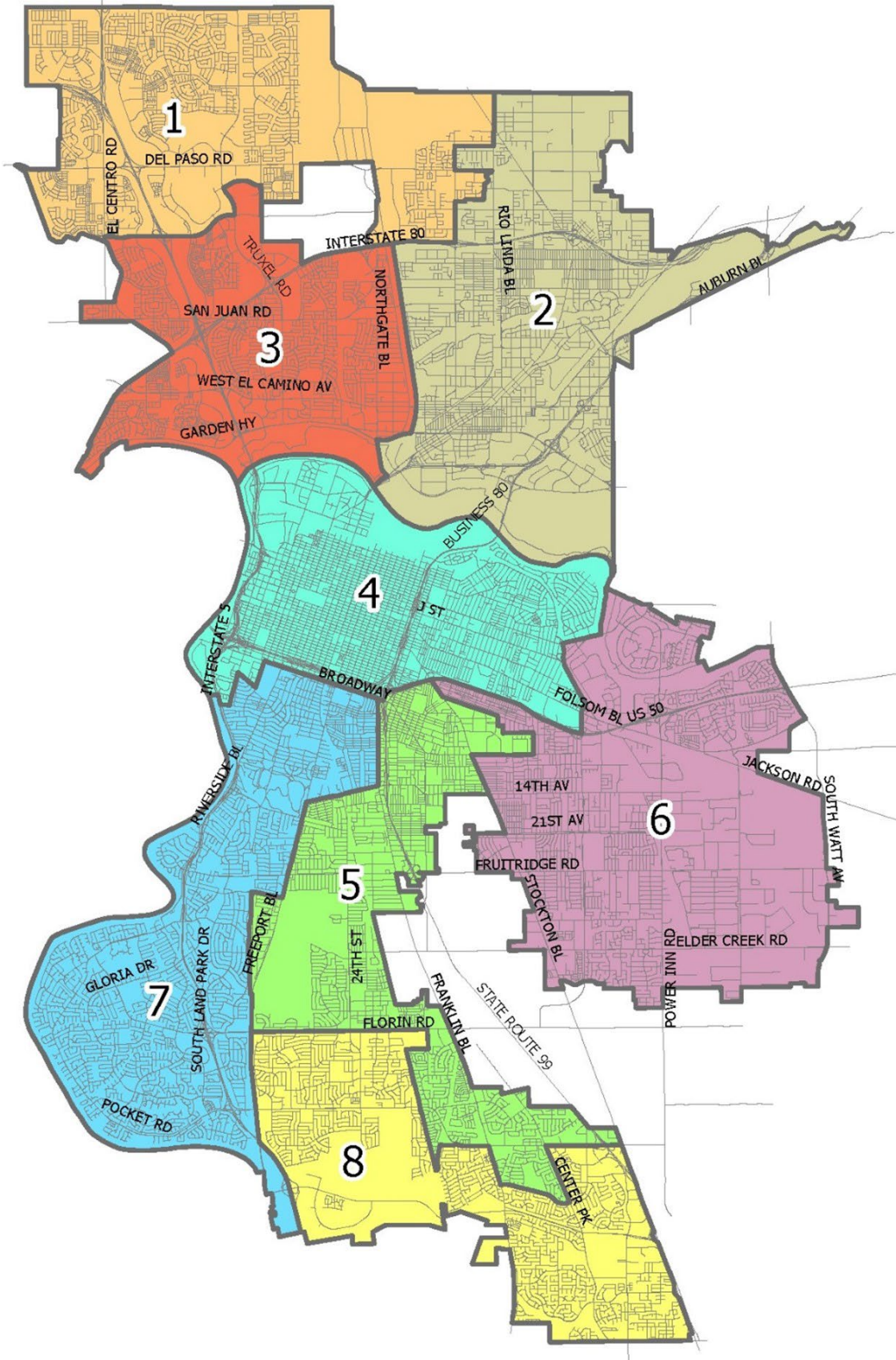

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City Council Districts Map



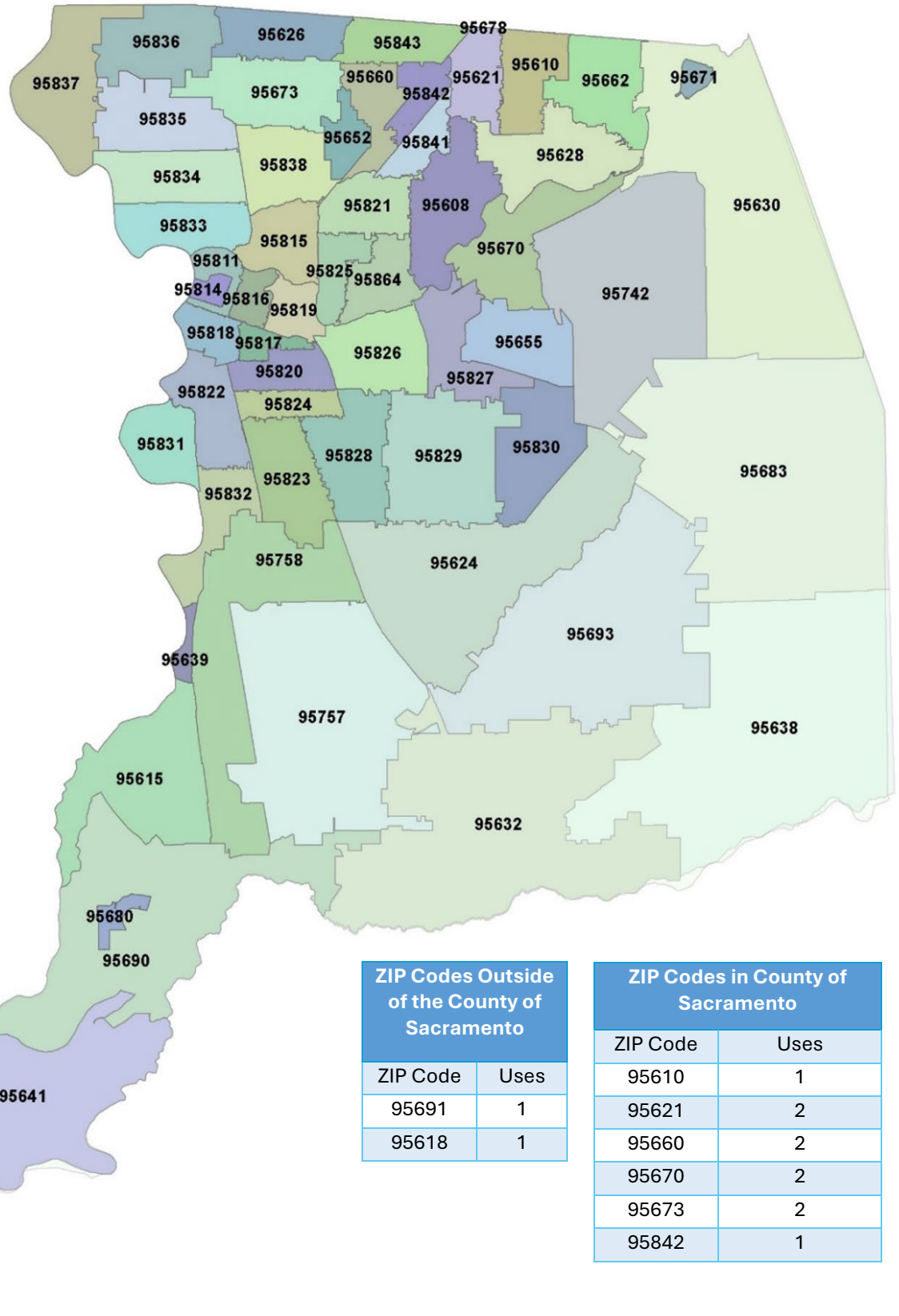

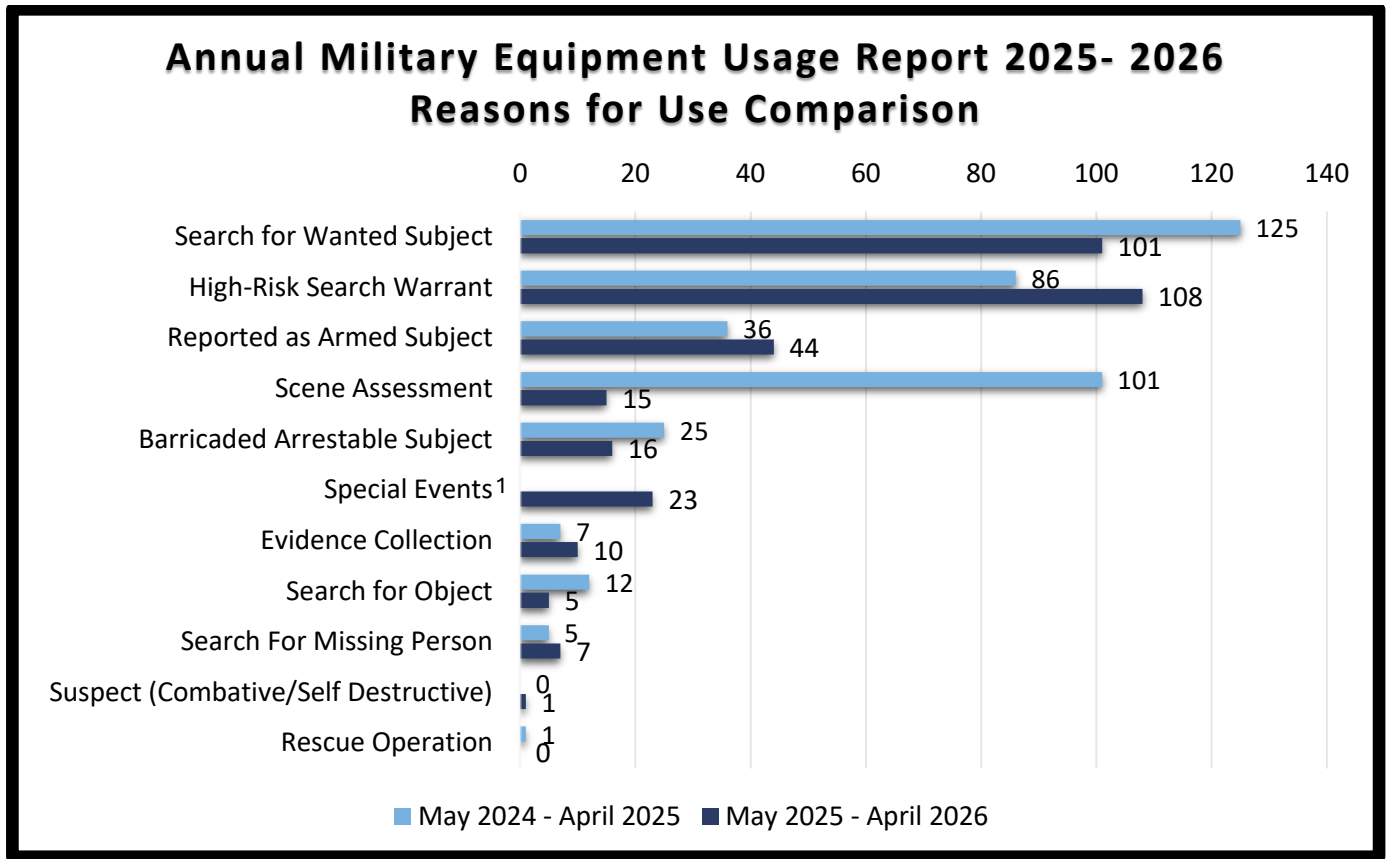

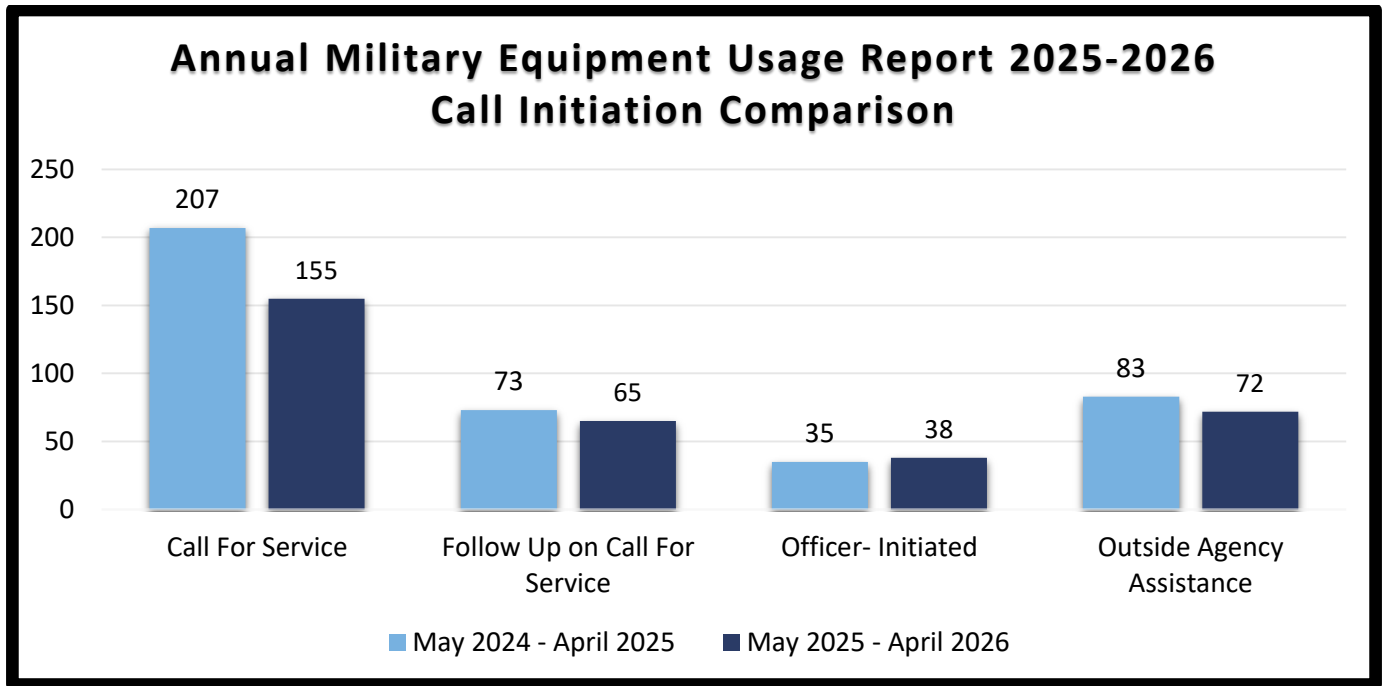

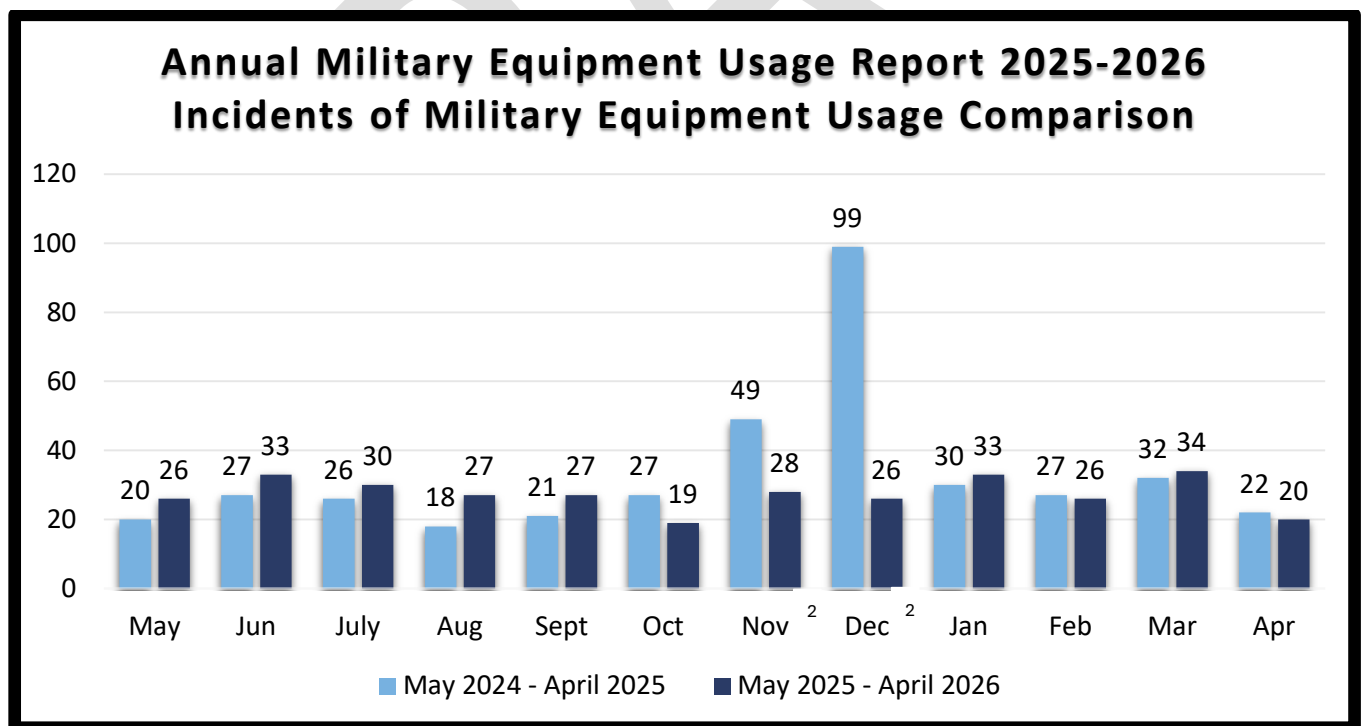

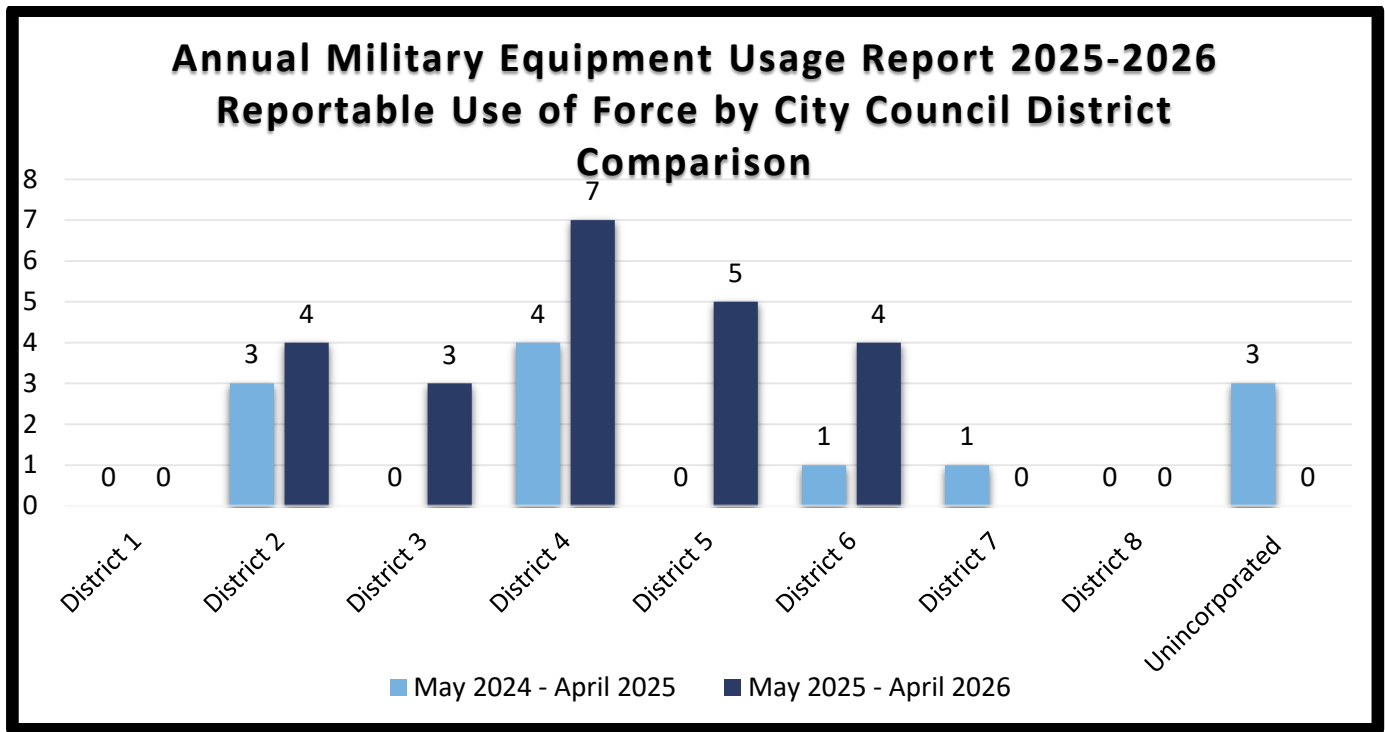

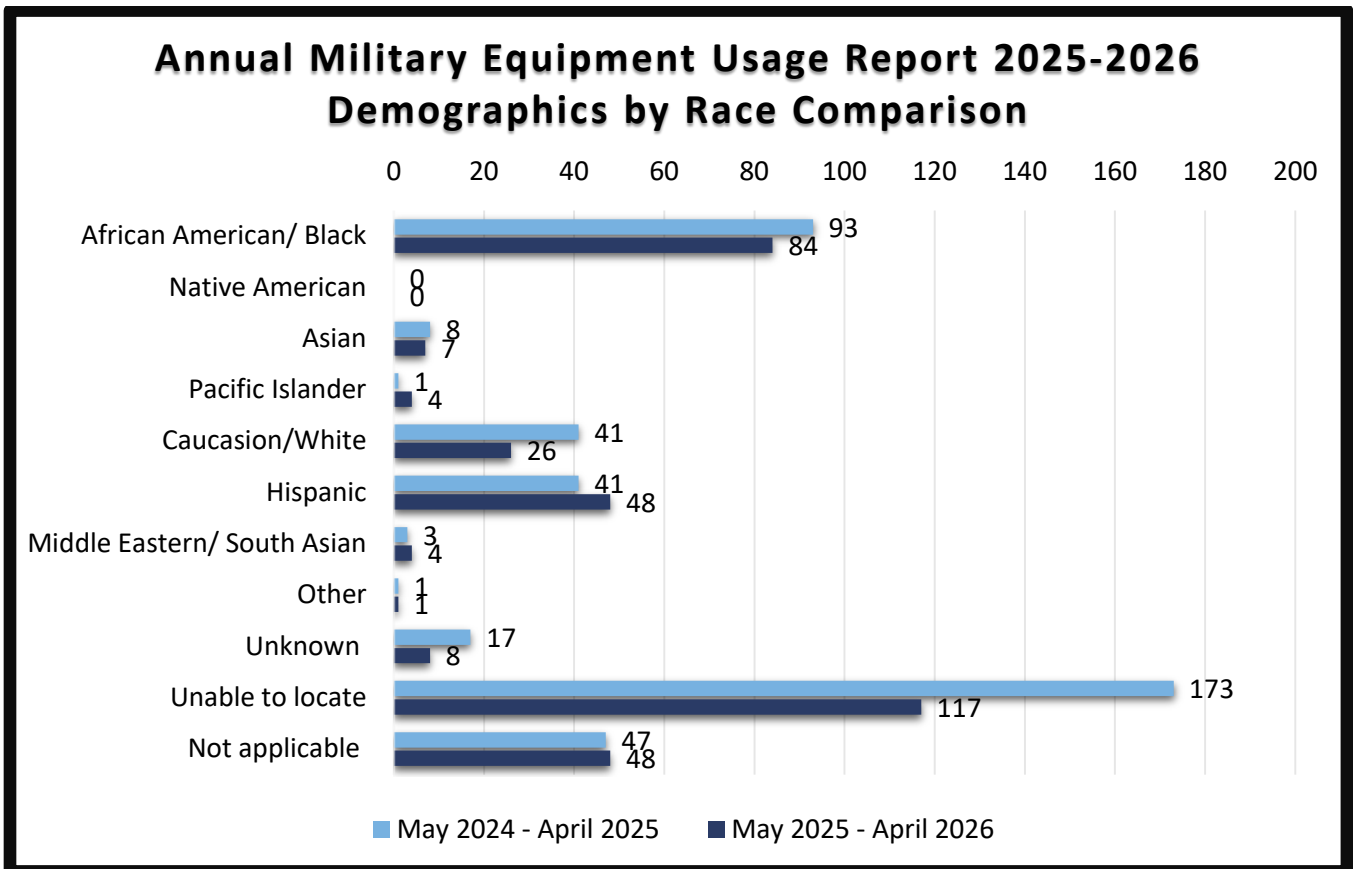


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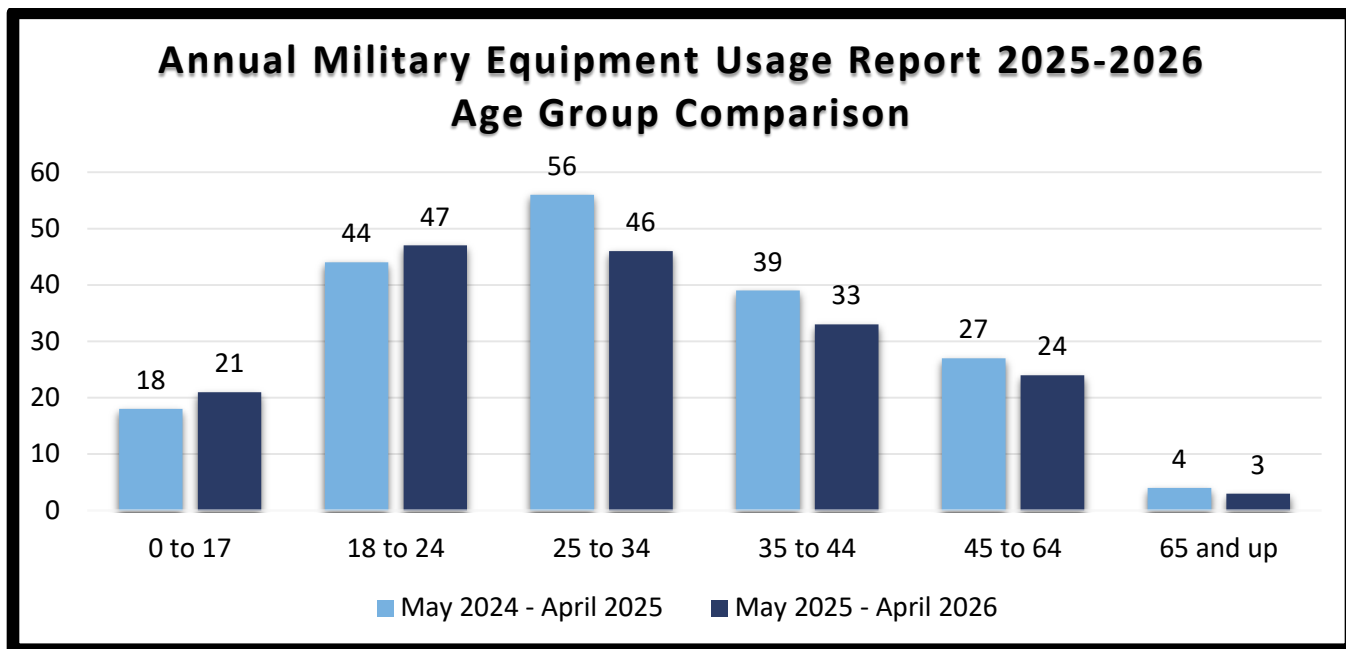
From May 1, 2025, to April 30, 2026, department military equipment was utilized to locate, detain, or arrest 182 individuals. The reporting officer was able to provide the demographics for 174 of these individuals. The Inspections and Standards Team was unable to determine the demographics of the remaining 8 individuals.

Officers were unable to locate the suspect, subject, or victim 117 times. Forty-eight times department military equipment was used in a manner not applicable to a person, such as evidence collection or searching for an object. 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Complaints or Concerns

Internal Affairs Division

The Sacramento Police Department is committed to service, protection, and dedication. Portions of our commitment are focused on accountability, transparency, and trust building through the Internal Affairs Division's employee misconduct investigation process. The division receives, documents, and investigates all complaint allegations of employee misconduct.

Supervisory Staff

Department policy requires every supervisor to receive, document, and report complaint allegations of employee misconduct to the Internal Affairs Division. As such, all complaint allegations pertaining to department military equipment are fully investigated.

Community members may also express concerns related to department policy, procedures, and practices to any supervisor. Department policy also requires every supervisor to receive, document, research and log these concerns as supervisory messages.

The Inspections and Standards Team conducted 12 audits or inspections which include, but are not limited to:

- Inspection of Internal Affairs Division complaints.
- Audit of City of Sacramento, Office of Public Safety and Accountability (OPSA) complaints.
- Audit department computer-aided dispatch, supervisory messages.

Based on the Inspections and Standards Team's completed audits and inspections, the department did not locate any Internal Affairs complaints pertaining to the department's military equipment from May 1, 2025, to April 30, 2026. Appendix C: Response to Sacramento Community Police Review Commission Questions

On August 28th of 2024, during the adoption of the 2024 Annual Military Equipment Use Report (AMEUR), members of the Sacramento City Council directed the Sacramento Police Department to address questions from the Sacramento Community Police Review Commission (SCPRC). The Sacramento Police Department is prepared to answer each question as it pertains to proposed acquisitions of items of military equipment within their respective category.

Category 1: Robots and Uncrewed Aerial Systems

Question #1:

What situations is the requested equipment necessary for safeguarding the safety of both officers and members of the public? How will its deployment or use accomplish this objective?

SPD Response:

Category 1 equipment is used in accordance with General Order 525.09 (Uncrewed Vehicle Systems (UVS)). General Order 525.09 states “It shall be the policy of the Sacramento Police Department to utilize UVS for official law enforcement purposes to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of public safety efforts, while safeguarding the privacy of our community. Safety and privacy shall be the primary concern in every operation. Use of a UVS will be in strict accordance with state and federal laws and in compliance with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and city regulations. For this order, the designee for the chief of police shall be the Metro Division captain or lieutenant.”

Question #2:

Why is this equipment necessary to purchase within the current fiscal year? How many times was this type of equipment used within most recent annual reporting period?

SPD Response: The proposed acquisitions serve to replace items that have reached or exceeded their service life. Some of the proposed items are new acquisitions with updated technology that would replace the aging fleet of current UVS models. The updated technology that allow them to function for longer durations, with enhanced capabilities allowing SPD to better serve the public.

Category 1b items were utilized 501 times during the current reporting period of May 1, 2025 to April 30, 2026.

Question #3:

What, if any, reasonable alternatives to this equipment were explored that may achieve the same objective of both officer and civilian safety? What were the costs compared with the requested equipment?

SPD Response:

Category 1 systems are constantly improving and growing more technologically advanced. In coordination with department subject matter experts and best practices, the SPD continuously evaluates available Category 1 systems available to purchase from a variety of vendors. The items proposed in this year’s AMEUR represent items the SPD has determined to be capable of effectively fulfilling the authorized deployment situations outlined in General Order 525.09.

The annual cost for Category 1 systems can be seen in the AMEUR (Category 1) along with a breakdown of the initial cost, current cost and how many proposed acquisitions there were of each item.

Question #4:

What Police Department policies govern the deployment or use of the requested equipment? How do these policies serve to safeguard the public's civil rights and civil liberties from potential misuses of the equipment?

SPD Response:

Deployment of Category 1 items are in accordance with General Order 410.06 (Military Equipment Use) and General Order 525.09 (Uncrewed Vehicle Systems). Per General Order 410.06 "It shall be the policy of the SPD to utilize military equipment to ensure the full protection of the public's welfare, safety, civil rights, and civil liberties. All military equipment shall be used in accordance with this order and other associated SPD orders and manuals that provide greater detail of authorized uses of department military equipment." Per General Order 525.09, "It shall be the policy of the Sacramento Police Department to utilize UVS for official law enforcement purposes to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of public safety efforts, while safeguarding the privacy of our community. Safety and privacy shall be the primary concern in every operation. Use of a UVS will be in strict accordance with state and federal laws and in compliance with Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and city regulations."

Question #5:

What (if any) complaints or misuses related to the requested type of military equipment have been reported to the Police Department or the Office of Public Safety and Accountability? Is there any pending litigation that has named the Police Department concerning the misuse of this equipment?

SPD Response:

SPD did not receive any complaints pertaining to the use of this category of equipment (See 2025-2026 AMEUR, Audits and Inspection). Requests regarding pending litigation regarding the Police Department and any misuses of this equipment can be made to the Sacramento City Attorney's Office.

Question #6:

In response to sustained complaints or litigation settlements, what changes, if any, were made in Department policies to prevent misuse? How will these changes ensure future compliance?

SPD Response:

SPD cannot comment on sustained complaints or litigation settlements. Any additional requests or details regarding sustained complaints or litigation settlements should be made to the Sacramento City Attorney's Office. The SPD is continually updating its policies and inspections related to MEU in accordance with state law and best practice.

Category 7: Explosive Breaching Apparatuses

Question #1: What situations is the requested equipment necessary for safeguarding the safety of both officers and members of the public? How will its deployment or use accomplish this objective?

SPD Response:

Category 7 equipment is utilized for explosive breaching by the departments EOD and SWAT team during critical incidents, and for demolition of other dangerous explosives encountered during EOD call-outs in accordance with department General Orders 580.15 (Special Weapons and Tactics), Reference Manual 532.16 (Bomb Squad Manual), and Reference Manual 532.08 (SPD Hostage Manual)

Question #2: Why is this equipment necessary to purchase within the current fiscal year? How many times was this type of equipment used within most recent annual reporting period?

SPD Response:

Many of the proposed acquisitions serve to replace items that have been depleted during training. SPD is endeavoring to utilize new models of explosive breaching apparatuses in order to further ensure public and officer safety.

Category 7b items were utilized 4 times during the 2025- 2026 AMEUR period.

Category 7c items were utilized 8 times during the 2025-2026 AMEUR period.

Question #3: What, if any, reasonable alternatives to this equipment were explored that may achieve the same objective of both officer and civilian safety? What were the costs compared with the requested equipment?

SPD Response:

In coordination with department subject matter experts and best practices, the SPD continuously evaluates available Category 7 equipment available to purchase from a variety of vendors. The items proposed in this year's AMEUR represent items the SPD has determined to be capable of effectively fulfilling the authorized deployment situations outlined in General Orders 580.15 (Special Weapons and Tactics), Reference Manual 532.16 (Bomb Squad Manual), and Reference Manual 532.08 (SPD Hostage Manual).

The proposed acquisitions allow SPD to remain in compliance with the national and regional standards for this equipment type use.

Question #4: What Police Department policies govern the deployment or use of the requested equipment? How do these policies serve to safeguard the public's civil rights and civil liberties from potential misuses of the equipment?

SPD Response:

Deployment of Category 7 items is in accordance with General Order 410.06 (Military Equipment Use) and General Order 580.15 (Special Weapons and Tactics).

SPD Bomb Squad Manual (RM 632.16) states, "All explosives shall be handled by members of the Department Bomb Squad. The Department's goal is to protect lives and property and to minimize the impact these incidents have on the community."

SPD Hostage Manual (RM 532.08), "It is the policy of the Sacramento Police Department to maintain training, policy, and procedure to ensure hostage incidents are handled in a safe and professional manner. Our goal is to save the lives of officers, citizens and suspects involved in these incidents.

Additionally, our goal is to minimize the impact these incidents have on the community. With periodic training and reference to this manual, hostage incidents should be easier to control.”

POST mandated training cycles and industry standards dictate a large portion of the annual consumption of ammunition. Additionally, the SPD is exploring a transition to “lead free” training rifle ammunition.

SPD General Order 580.02 states, “The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) values the sanctity of human life and the freedoms guaranteed by the United States and California constitutions. Use of force (UOF) by peace officers is of important concern to the community. The role of law enforcement is to safeguard life, dignity, and liberty of all persons, without prejudice to anyone. Peace officers shall carry out duties, including UOF, in a manner that is fair and unbiased. This policy will be regularly reviewed and updated by the Professional Standards Division to reflect developing practices and procedures. It is the policy of the Department that a peace officer is justified in using deadly force upon another person only as a last resort when reasonable alternatives have been exhausted or are not feasible and the officer reasonably believes, based on the totality of the circumstances, that such force is necessary.”

Question #2: Why is this equipment necessary to purchase within the current fiscal year? How many times was this type of equipment used within most recent annual reporting period?

SPD Response:

Many of the proposed acquisitions serve to replace items that have been depleted during training. No new rifle makes or models are proposed for acquisition. New ammunition acquisitions are for testing prior to a large order to replace the existing model of training ammunition.

Category 10a items were utilized 1 time during the current reporting period of May 1, 2025, to April 30, 2026.

Category 10b items were utilized 3 times during the current reporting period of May 1, 2025, to April 30, 2026.
