The following external examination:

0820 hours 40-17-90 R/O arrived at the Sacramento County Pathology Lab and contacted Doctor Schmunk. R/O observed the victim to be nude and laying on a slab. The victim's hands were handcuffed behind him.

Doctor Schmunk had removed the following items of clothing from the victim:

- #1 - One (1) short sleeved white color t-shirt that was pinkish red in color, apparently soaked by the victim's blood.
- #2 - One (1) pair of white undershorts
- #3 - One (1) brown colored terry cloth type bathrobe

The above clothing had numerous holes in it and when placed back on the victim, were consistent with the holes in the victim's body.

R/O noted the following trauma to the victim's body:

- #1 - Several bite marks that were deep and had an average length of 1-1/2 inches. These apparent bite marks were concentrated on the victim's left outside and inner forearm.
- #2 - There were approximately fifteen holes in the victim's body, most of them concentrating on the upper left shoulder and upper left side of the victim. Several holes were also observed on the upper right top portion of victim's shoulder and side. One hole

was observed somewhat of a glancing blow across the upper chest of the victim, entering from left to right.

#3 - R/O also noted numerous red staining on the victim's forehead, neck and leg areas. This staining had the appearance like mercurochrome.

#4 - R/O observed a claw like laceration on the victim's upper right portion of his lip and right side of his face, that was consistent with trauma obtained from an animal.

INTERIOR EXAMINATION:

Doctor Schmunk removed five copper jacketed slugs out of the victim's body. One of them had pierced the heart. Another fragment pierced the left lung of the victim.

Doctor Schmunk advised R/O that the appearance of the victim's liver indicated that the victim was suffering from an advanced stage of cirrhosis.

R/O also visually examined xrays of the victim's body, which displayed at least four, and possibly five lead objects, mostly concentrated in the middle and upper portion of the body.

In summary, most of the bullets that entered the victim were observed to have entered in the upper left side and the lower left side of the body. Two entry wounds were noted to be at the upper right back, and one grazed across the upper part of the chest.

It is apparent at this time that there was a through and through wound at the upper right shoulder; however, difficult to determine whether this was a different caliber other than the 9mm consistent slugs that were removed from the victim's body.

HOMICIDE SUPERVISOR'S SUMMARY:

2255 hours (Monday) 4-16-90 I was contacted at home by Police Communications and advised that Homicide Detectives were requested for an officer involved shooting at [redacted] 2nd Avenue. I gave my ETA as approximately 20 minutes and directed Communications to contact Homicide Detectives Adam and Lee, on call IIS Investigators and on call DA Investigator. Prior to leaving for the scene I telephoned Captain Sam Somers of the Detective Division and advised him of the incident and Homicide's response.

2315 hours I arrived at [redacted] 2nd Avenue and was briefed by Lt. Frank Silva, who was the incident Commander. In summary Lt. Silva said that police officers responded to a domestic dispute at approximately 1430 hours this date and upon their arrival, heard gun shots coming from within the home. Officers sealed off the area and contacted the victim, [redacted] FW, 46. She informed the officers that her husband, James Collins, MW, 40, was despondent because of a terminal illness and an anticipated surgery. This provoked an argument during which Mr. Collins cut his wife's arm with a knife and put a handgun to her throat.

[redacted] told the officers that her husband had a shotgun, three to four handguns and lots of ammunition.

Lt. Silva advised that during the police command post operation, numerous attempts were made to talk Mr. Collins out of the house. At one point Mr. Collins started a small fire in the kitchen that apparently went out by itself. After several hours, the SWAT Team used 12 37 CS ferrets and a mace fogger to gas the suspect's residence. After waiting approximately an hour, or slightly longer, for the suspect to exit, with negative results, the SWAT Team was directed to enter and arrest Mr. Collins. Inside the house, Mr. Collins refused to surrender to the officers and pointed two guns, one in each hand, at the three officers who were approaching him in his bedroom. When Mr. Collins failed to drop his guns as he pointed them at the officers, Officer Dan Schiele fired four to five rounds with his 9mm semi-automatic, police issued firearm and officer Jarosick fired one round with his 223 caliber SWAT issued rifle.

0110 hours 4-17-90 R/O interviewed the above officer in the Homicide Interview room, #5, Hall of Justice. The following is a summation of an audio/video tape recorded statement:

Officer Schiele advised R/O that he has been a Sacramento Police Officer for the past seven years and is currently assigned to the K-9 Unit. Schiele was working in full uniform, assigned to K-9 50, 1600 to 0200 hours.

At approximately 2200 hours 4-16-90, Schiele received a call to respond to [REDACTED] 2nd Avenue regarding a 273.5. Upon arriving, Schiele contacted Sergeant Roth and Lieutenant Twilling, who advised him that a subject was barricaded in his residence after assaulting his wife. In addition, the subject was believed to be armed with several weapons and is believed to be the only subject in the residence.

Schiele was also advised that several rounds, 12 rounds, of tear gas were fired into the residence in addition to at least two flash bang canisters.

Officer Schiele was advised that the following plan was to be taken into affect: That Schiele would enter through the front door, along with SWAT Officers, and that he was to send his dog into the residence, hopefully to contact the suspect, which would allow enough time for the SWAT Officers to apprehend the suspect. Prior to entry, Schiele stated that a flash bang canister was tossed into the residence and his dog was ordered to proceed into the bedroom. Officer Schiele related that he was still in the dinning room when he re-ordered his dog to re-enter the bedroom as it came out. Officer Valdez and his partner, Garosick, members of the CSU SWAT Team were also nearby. Officer Schiele stated that he noticed that the door leading to the bedroom where the suspect was

occupying, was open. Schiele could see the suspect on the bed and further, that his dog Hans, was making contact with the suspect.

Schiele was asked if he could see whether the suspect was armed, and he replied that the suspect was armed with a sawed off shotgun in one hand and a semi-automatic pistol in the other. Suspect did not appear to have a shirt on. The suspect was mumbling something but he could not understand what was being said.

Officer Schiele, who was in full uniform and wearing a gas mask, advised that all the SWAT Officers were also in uniform. Several officers ordered the suspect to drop the gun at least five or six times. Other commands were also being shouted out.

Suddenly Schiele stated that he fired approximately five rounds at the suspect, who was holding both guns in his hands and was starting to point them towards his direction. Schiele stated that he was in fear of his life, and felt that he was going to be shot; therefore, fired several rounds at the suspect. Schiele was approximately seven feet away from the suspect and was at the doorway leading into the bedroom. At this point the dog, who had clamped his jaw onto the suspect's hand, which was holding a pistol, was still in the bedroom at the time Schiele began firing his weapon. Officer Garosick fired one round from his rifle and the suspect fell limp and motionless.

Schiele stated that he took the dog out of the bedroom.

R/O questioned Schiele as to the suspect's demeanor prior to the shooting. Schiele replied that it appeared that the suspect was under the influence of some type of drug or liquor, or at least this was the impression that he received. Schiele had no knowledge that the suspect fired any rounds.

R/O questioned Schiele about the lighting conditions in the house

Garosick advised that he has been a Sacramento Police Officer for the past eight years, and has been assigned to the Crime Suppression Unit, which he was currently working at the time of the incident, for the past one and a half years. During the evening of the incident, Garosick was assigned to Union 25.

The following is a summation of a video/audio tape recorded statement.

At approximately 1500 hours 4-16-90, Garosick received information that a subject was barricaded at [REDACTED] 2nd Avenue, and that a SWAT Team was requested. Garosick stated that his team 20 began preparing for the operation.

Garosick related that he was dressed in a black fatigue outfit and was armed with his departmental service automatic pistol, along with an HK53 rifle, 223 caliber, semi-automatic weapon. The command post was located approximately one hundred yards west of the residence, [REDACTED] 2nd Avenue.

Garosick advised R/O that his Commander, Sergeant Roth, and the rest of the team responded to the above address. Upon arriving, Garosick was advised that a male white subject (suspect) was barricaded inside the residence after a disturbance with his wife. Shots were fired inside the residence and the suspect's wife provided information that her husband was armed with several weapons, including a shotgun and pistols. The suspect also had very serious illness. Furthermore, the suspect was the only subject in the residence.

Garosick stated that he and his team members secured the inner perimeter and relieved patrol officers from that responsibility. The suspect's residence was noted to be a single story residential dwelling located on 2nd Avenue, and in addition there was a small detached structure located to the rear of said residence.

Officer Garosick advised R/O that his team members consisted of his superior, Sergeant Roth, and co-workers, Officer Valdez, Louie, Camp, Weinrich and himself.

Garosick was asked about his initial assigned position and he replied that he was initially positioned at the northeast corner of the above residence where he made his observations and maintained his positions for three to four hours. During this time Garosick could hear glass breaking inside the residence; more particularly towards the southeast portion of it. Garosick was positioned in the residence next door, to the east. Garosick could see the suspect's back and it appeared that he was wearing a gray colored or light colored sweat shirt, but could not see any weapons at this time. Garosick could hear the suspect mumbling to himself and singing songs. At one point Garosick could hear the suspect making a remark similar to that he wanted to end it.

At the interim, Sergeant Reedy, the negotiator, made several attempts to make contact with the suspect. A phone was thrown into the residence by Sergeant Roth, and though contact was made via phone, the suspect would not cooperate. At one point the suspect was agreeing to come out of the residence but wanted to bring his

guns with him. After several attempts to persuade the suspect to come out of the residence with his hands up, the suspect could still be heard dry firing his weapons.

During this time several distracting devices, (flash bang canisters) were detonated and thrown into the residence. Unfortunately, though two of them were thrown into the bedroom where the suspect was observed, the suspect failed to give himself up. The suspect continued to mumble to himself and dry firing his weapons, and also became upset and was cussing over the distraction devices that were thrown into his bedroom. Eventually Sergeant Roth and his CSU team members regrouped to discuss the next option.

Officer Garosick related that he could hear the suspect commenting, "now I'm really pissed" as he continued to chant to himself at this time.

R/O asked Garosick if any of the rooms in the residence were illuminated. Garosick replied that at one time the living room and bedroom were illuminated by lamps; however, one of the officers in his team cut off the electricity.

Garosick also advised that prior to this stage of the incident, that the suspect attempted to start a fire in the kitchen; however, though he did not actually observe the suspect doing this, flames and smoke were observed coming from within the structure. The fire however, died out.

Sergeant Roth and Officer Weinrich shot as many as twelve canisters of gas into the residence. This apparently did not affect the suspect much, and the only affects that were noticed, was that the suspect coughed a little. The suspect remained in the bedroom for the most part during the entire ordeal.

Another option was discussed regarding sending in a K-9 Unit. Team

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10 took the perimeter over while Garosick and his team consider a plan to enter the residence along with a K-9 Unit.

Garosick stated that eight officers were to enter the residence and Officer Valdez and Weinrich were to use large body shields. Officer Camp and Garosick were to arm themselves with HK53 assault rifles with lighting devices.

Garosick stated that he was the third officer to enter through the front of the residence, which the door was unlocked. Garosick stated he first entered the living room and they proceeded towards the rear of the residence. Several distraction devices were thrown into the bedroom at this time, while the officers were able to maneuver themselves toward the bedroom where the suspect was located. Garosick stated that he was just behind Officer Valdez as they proceeded to the right portion of the hallway which led to the bedroom. At this point Officer Schiele ordered his dog into the bedroom. Growling could be heard and the dog returned to Officer Schiele's location. Garosick stated he illuminated the suspect's bedroom with his weapon. While positioned in the hallway just behind officer Valdez, Garosick stated he could hear the K-9 dog barking and retreating. The suspect could be heard mumbling but he could not decipher what was being said. The residence was totally dark, with the exception of the light that was coming from their weapons, from an illumination device.

Officer Schiele was to Garosick's left, about 1/2 foot away. Garosick stated he could see the suspect seated partially on the bed, and armed with a sawed off shotgun in one hand and a semi-automatic gun in the other hand. Garosick stated he was about 12 feet away from the suspect. The suspect was ordered to drop the gun several times; however, he did not comply. Officer Schiele ordered the dog to retreat and then ordered the suspect to put his gun down. The suspect again refused and began turning around with his guns in his hands, and pointing the weapons at the officers.

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Officer Schiele fired five to six shots from his semi-automatic pistol, at the same time, yelling at the suspect to put his gun down.

Garosick stated that he was concerned for Officer Valdez' safety, as Valdez was crouched down just below him, and in front. The suspect was still pointing his weapon at them. At this point Garosick stated he fired one round from his rifle at the suspect and the suspect fell limp and motionless. At this point, all firing of weapons ceased. Garosick stated that he told Officer Schiele to remove his dog out of the bedroom, while Officer Garosick provided cover with his weapon, aiming it at the suspect. Officer Valdez approached the suspect with his shield and cuffed the suspect while the suspect still remained on the water bed. The suspect laid motionless on the bed and did not say anything or move at all. At this point Sergeant Roth yelled for someone to summon medical assistance.

R/O questioned Garosick about the suspect's weapons, and Garosick replied that he could see the suspect's guns were underneath his body.

Officer Garosick advised R/O that during the entire incident, he was wearing a gas mask. When asked if any other shots were fired at the suspect, Garosick replied in the negative. Garosick was asked if he recalls whether the suspect discharged his weapon at them and he replied that the suspect did not fire his weapon at him and does not have any knowledge of whether the suspect fired his weapon at all.

Garosick stated he has never seen the suspect before, or responded to this location in the past.

0205 hours 4-17-90 R/O contacted Officer Valdez in the Homicide interview room, Hall of Justice. Valdez advised R/O that he has been a Sacramento Police Officer for the past eight years, and is currently assigned to the CSU/SWAT Team for the past two years. Valdez was assigned to the Swing Shift, 1500 hours to 2300 hours, during the incident. The following is a summation of an audio/video tape recorded statement.

Officer Valdez related that as he arrived at work, he was notified that a SWAT operation was to take place at [REDACTED] 2nd Avenue, as he and his team responded to this location. Upon arriving, he and his team mates took over an inner perimeter from the Patrol Officers and was advised that the suspect, who was the only subject in the residence, had injured his wife during a dispute and was armed with a sawed off shotgun as well as several hand guns. Further, that the suspect had discharged his weapons inside the residence.

Initially, Valdez stated that he was positioned at the southeast corner of the residence, and during this time he had a visual contact with the bedroom. Valdez was dressed in a black fatigue uniform and armed with his semi-automatic pistol (Departmental issue) and a 9mm semi-automatic assault rifle.

Valdez related that he provided cover for the east side of the residence, and at this time he saw the suspect on two different occasions. The suspect appeared to be looking into a mirror and was concerned about his appearance as he was patting his hair. Valdez stated that he also could see what appeared to be a shoulder holster, worn by the suspect; however, he could not see a weapon at this time. When asked what sounds or comments he could hear the suspect make, Valdez replied that he could hear what sounded like the suspect was dry firing a weapon.

Valdez stated that during this time he was elected to disable the electricity current to the residence as well as cutting off the gas. The only lights that were provided were those attached to their weapons upon entering the residence. Prior to entering there was also lights provided by their vehicles.

Officer Valdez stated that at one point he was positioned on the roof on the next door residence, approximately fifteen to twenty feet from the suspect. At one point Valdez could see flames and smoke coming from the residence in question; however, this fire eventually subsided.

Several attempts to get the suspects to give himself up, were made. The suspect failed to cooperate after a police negotiator contacted the suspect by phone, which was provided to the suspect. Furthermore, several flash-bang devices were tossed into the residence in order to confuse the suspect; however, this was unsuccessful. At one point Valdez could hear the suspect making a remark similar to, "why don't you guys come in and we will end this all."

Eventually, after several hours of unsuccessful attempts to get the suspect to come out of the residence without his weapons, tear gas canisters were projected in to the residence in an attempt to immobilize the suspect; however, the suspect appeared to be only slightly effected by it.

Valdez stated he proceeded to the rear yard and after disabling the electrical box as well as the gas leading to the residence, Valdez returned to his assigned position. Sergeant Roth also made attempts by using the bull horn to talk to the suspect; however, the suspect ignored all orders.

Sergeant Roth re-grouped Valdez and his team and the next option

was to enter the residence through the front, along with a K-9 Unit. Prior to any contact with the suspect, distracting devices were again to be used, followed by the K-9 Unit and then the SWAT Officers.

Entry was made through the front door, which was unlocked. Sergeant Roth and Valdez were assigned to carry the body bunker shields. Upon entry into the residence which was dark, they proceeded to the hallway after the K-9 Unit was sent in. Officer Schiele was to Officer Valdez's left, and Garosick was behind him. (Garosick was behind Valdez). Valdez stated that he did not have his weapon out, as he was assigned to carry the shield and provide protection. As they reached the doorway leading to the suspect's bedroom, Valdez was crouched down with the shield in front of him. Officer Schiele sent his dog into the bedroom twice. Growling could be heard coming from this room. Officer Valdez stated that he could see through the clear plastic window like portion of his body shield, that the suspect, who was sitting partially on the bed, was armed with a shotgun in one hand and a semi-automatic handgun in the other. The suspect continued to mumble something, but Valdez could not understand him. At this point, the suspect began to move around with his weapons pointing towards them and valdez stated that he was definitely afraid for his life and felt that the suspect was going to shoot them. Officer Schiele continued to yell at the suspect to drop his guns, as well as Garosick yelling similar orders. At this point, Officer Schiele fired his weapon at least four to five times. Valdez thought that he heard one other shot that was coming from Garosick's weapon. The dog was then removed from the bedroom after the suspect was apparently hit by the gun shots. Valdez rushed the suspect with the body armor in front of him, and placed it on the suspect as he cuffed the suspect's hands behind him. Valdez also removed a small handgun from the area underneath the victim's body.

Valdez then pulled the victim's head out from the water bed, which

A distraction device was thrown into the bedroom and right after detonation, the dog was released. The dog went into the hallway towards the bedroom then immediately came back into the living room. Officer Schiele, the dog's handler, began moving forward as though attempting to direct and encourage the animal. From my position I could only see them enter the hallway. Officer Valdez with the shield and Officer Jarosick with a light equipped weapon followed. I no longer had visual. Several shots were fired by Schiele and one by Jarosick. Suspect was apparently propped up on a waterbed with weapons in his hands. The guns were pointed at the officers and they fired in self-defense. Suspect died on the scene.

Police shoot man to death after nine-hour standoff

Bee Metro Staff **4-17-90**

An Oak Park man, apparently distraught over his terminal illness, was shot to death by police late Monday night after he barricaded himself in his own house for more than nine hours.

James Dean Collins, 40, was shot after he pointed weapons at the officers, said Sacramento Police Capt. Jerry Ledbetter. Police said Collins had a pistol in one hand and a shotgun in the other.

Officers were called to the home in the 4000 block of 2nd Avenue about 2:45 p.m. after Collins allegedly stabbed his wife in the arm, police said.

Police said Collins was terminally sick with liver disease and was distraught over the illness.

When police arrived in the afternoon, they heard two or three shots. The woman, who was treated at the scene, said her husband had a gun with him.

A police SWAT unit was called and the house was surrounded. At one point, police talked to the man by telephone and he sounded disoriented, officers said.

During the nine-hour standoff the man started fires inside the house, but the flames went out. Ledbetter said police were concerned with the safety of the neighborhood.






The following is an overview of the SWAT call-up at [REDACTED] - 2nd Avenue, April 16, 1990. All involved SWAT officers are submitting separate supplements.

Both SWAT Teams responded to a Command Post at 2nd Avenue and Santa Cruz Way at 1455 hours. Sgt. Pete Reedy briefed us on the circumstances which led to the SWAT call-up. James Collins a MW, age 40, lives at the above address. Collins' wife had called police at 1425 hours. She related that her husband had just cut her with a knife and had held a gun to her throat. Mrs. Collins also related that her husband is suffering from a chronic liver disease. Mrs. Collins also related, although not usually violent, that her husband has numerous guns inside the house. Initial responding patrol officers heard shots from within the residence and did not attempt contact. SWAT called. Patrol had established a perimeter, traffic control was in place and evacuations were in progress.

SWAT Team 20 had inner perimeter at 1535 hours. Sgt. Reedy, a department hostage negotiator, then began to try and talk Collins out of the residence using a loud hailer. SWAT perimeter officers reported the sounds of breaking glass at several locations within the home.

At approximately 1640 hours, I could hear the distinctive sound of firearm dry fires coming from a bedroom, southeast portion of the home. I tried using the loud hailer from near that position. Although I could hear the suspect mumbling, I received the same response as Sgt. Reedy, which is no response. suspect has caused his phone to be inoperative.

At 1755 hours, the hostage negotiation phone was tossed into the residence via the front door. Some conversation was had with suspect but most of his talking was not able to be understood. Glass was occasionally heard breaking and suspect went frequently to southeast bedroom where he continued to dry fire a weapon.

At approximately 1955 hours, one distraction device was introduced into the living room of the home. The purpose was to possibly scare suspect into coming out. As I tossed the device into the living room I could see a small fire going in the kitchen. The fire emitted a considerable amount of smoke but was then out within five minutes. The distraction device had no apparent effect on suspect. Continued attempts with the loud hailer had no effect. At one point when I was near the window of the southeast bedroom, I could see the suspect from the shoulders up. Suspect appeared to be preening himself and appeared to be wearing a shoulder holster. I attempted to communicate with suspect. He looked in my direction and then pointed what appeared to be a shotgun barrel at me. Obviously the attempt at communications from this location ceased.

At 2028 hours, gas and electricity were turned off.

At 2057 hours, the decision to introduce chemical agents was made. The decision making process in this, as well as all other decisions, involved Captain Ledbetter, Lts. Twilling and Silva, and Sgts. Roth and Dowden. Twelve 37mm liquid chemical agents are fired into the home. Each room was highly contaminated. With the exception of the suspect coughing, sneezing and yelling obscenities, the introduction of the chemical agents accomplished nothing.

2125 hours, suspect was again in southeast bedroom. He was again dry firing a weapon. Two more distraction devices and then one-half canister of mace were put into this room. Negative results. considerable discussion was then had by the above mentioned supervisors. Suspect was continually dry firing weapons, he had already brandished a weapon at one officer. Suspect had started two fires which could have easily engulfed his older wooden home as well as that of his neighbors. Suspect needed to be apprehended and the danger to all involved ended. It was decided that a police dog could possibly be of use, the plan was then formulated. A distraction device would be tossed into the southeast bedroom where we knew suspect would be by Officer Weinrich.

All six members of Team 20 would enter the residence via the front door. Team 10 had taken inner perimeter. Officer Schiele with his dog would enter behind SWAT. After the distraction device detonated, the dog, as trained, would go directly to the explosion as if a gunshot and attack the source. After the dog distracted suspect, SWAT would enter the bedroom and subdue suspect hopefully with less than deadly force. The dog handler would be able to call the animal off. Assignments were Officers Jarosick and Camp as cover officers and would provide illumination. Officers Weinrich and Valdez would provide protection with ballistic shields. Officer Louie, the battering ram in case bedroom door was locked, and then as needed. I carried the 37mm gas gun loaded with a blast type cartridge which could disable without killing suspect. It was decided that electricity would remain off to prevent suspect from seeing the dog coming.

2300 hours 4-16-90 R/O received a call from Dispatch while at home, requesting R/O to respond to [redacted] 2nd Avenue in regards to an officer involved shooting, fatal.

Upon arriving at the scene, R/O contacted Lt. Walker, who briefed R/O as to the circumstances of the shooting. R/O was advised that a subject who was distraught about his possible terminal illness, was engaged in a spousal argument with his wife and threatened her with a gun. The suspect was the only subject in his own residence, who eventually barricaded himself, and after several hours of negotiations and non-threatening options, the SWAT officers and K-9 Units entered the residence and shot the suspect dead after he refused to drop his weapons, which he pointed at the officers.

R/O was instructed to respond to the Hall of Justice to initiate interviews with the officers that were involved in the shooting, as well as in the operation.

Upon arriving at the Hall of Justice, R/O met with Deputy District Attorney's Criminal Investigator Frank Dale, whose purpose at the Hall of justice was to monitor the interview in another room. R/O allowed the officers involved in the shooting to consult with the attorney, as well as the SPOA president prior to being interviewed.

4/16/90 @ 2204 hrs. Officer Schiele (K9-50) and I (K9-22) were dispatched to [redacted] 2nd Ave regarding a subject that had barricaded himself in his residence after a 273.5/245 PC (stabbing) of his wife.

2212 hrs. Officer Schiele and his K9 (Hans) and I went into the house (living-room) along with SWAT Officers. (gas mask were being worn) The suspect was known to be in the front bedroom. A SWAT Officer on the outside threw a Flash-Bang device into the suspect's room as a distraction. Immediately thereafter, Officer Schiele sent his K9 in after the suspect. The K9 entered the room but then returned to Officer Schiele. Officer Schiele then redirected the K9 back into the room after the suspect. The K9 apparently located the suspect in the room. (At this point, I did not see the following but heard) Officer Schiele said "Good boy - get him out of there. That a babe, get him." I then heard Officer Schiele say "Drop the gun! I said, drop the gun!" He repeated this two or three times. I then heard four to six gun shots (pos 9mm) and then heard one louder gun shot (pos. 223 cal.). At this point, I moved in to assist. Officer Schiele took his K9 and exited the house. I observed the suspect laying down on a punctured waterbed - apparently unconscious. A SWAT Officer and I moved in while the others covered us. The suspect was still holding a sawed-off shotgun in his right hand and a semi-automatic handgun in his left hand. He was disarmed and handcuffed by the SWAT Officer. An EMT II came in shortly thereafter and pronounced the suspect dead. I then secured the crime scene.



2312 hours, 4/16/90, Detective Adam received a telephone call from police radio. R/O was directed to respond to [redacted] 2nd Avenue regarding an officer involved shooting.

R/O responded to the Hall of Justice and obtained a police vehicle and went to 4065 2nd Avenue.

2359 hours, 4/16/90, Detective Adam arrived at the scene. On the scene was Detective Lee, Lt. Walker, Capt. Ledbetter, Lt. Silva, CSI Bauer, CSI Snow and Officer Lagrassa, who had been assigned as crime scene recorder.

Lt. Walker briefed R/O. He stated that there had been a barricaded subject at [redacted] 2nd Avenue since approximately 1430 hours, 4/16/90. The S.W.A.T. Team had been summoned and had made numerous attempts to talk the person out of the residence to no avail. When the attempts failed tear gas was entered into the residence.

Approximately 2300 hours, 4/16/90, the S.W.A.T. Team entered the residence. Officer Dan Schiele along with his police dog and Officer Joe Jarosick confronted the subject in the northeast bedroom. The suspect produced an automatic pistol and a sawed off shotgun. He was ordered to put the guns down but refused. Officer Schiele by then released his dog which attacked the suspect. Officer Jarosick fired one shot from his HK53, 223 rifle. Officer Schiele then fired eight shots from his service weapon (9mm Sig Sauer). The suspect then stopped resisting and was handcuffed by officers.

Lt. Walker directed Detective Lee to respond to the Hall of Justice to interview officers and witnesses. Detective Adam was advised to cover the crime scene.

0614 hours, Deputy Coroner Brian arrived.

0656 hours, 4/17/90, coroner left the scene.

2nd Avenue between Santa Clara & 41st Street. There is a small alley separating [redacted] 2nd Avenue and the residence to the west. The residence faces south onto 2nd Avenue.

There is a small porch on the front south of the residence with a window facing south. The window was broken at the top and where tear gas had been entered into the residence.

Along the sides of the residence were numerous windows that had been broken from gas being entered into the residence.

R/O entered the residence living room which is located on the southwest corner of the residence. The front screen door which was glass had broken out and were lying both inside and outside of the residence. The room appeared to be ransacked as there were items scattered throughtout the room. There was a small coffee table in front of an L-shaped sofa which was located on the south wall. Lying in front of the sofa on a table was a portion of a .37 mm gas cartridge. The living room is separated from the dining room by an archway. Under the archway was a wad from a .37 mm gas cartridge.

The dining room contained a table in the center (south) portion of the room. There was a rectangular shaped table against the west wall of the dining room. At the south end of the table was a set of magazines. The top magazine was a Reader's Digest which had what appeared to be blood drops on it. On the floor to the north of the dining table were several .32 caliber auto casings and one slug (possibly .32 caliber). Against the west wall of the dining room and on the floor was another .37 mm gas cartridge.

The kitchen is located in the northwest portion of the residence. There is a stove to the east of the entrance and against the south wall. There was an area in front of the stove that appeared to have been burned. The refrigerator was located next to the stove and was open. Nearly all the food had been removed from the refrigerator and was lying on the floor. Some of the kitchen drawers had been removed and were lying on the floor. Against the northwest wall was a kitty litter box. Inside the box was a portion of a .37 mm gas cartridge.

Lying on the floor of the entrance to the back porch was a wad from a .37 mm gas cartridge.

OUT OF SEQUENCE: (First paragraph only)

At the north wall of the dining room was a china hutch with the glass broken out. On the floor to the south of the china hutch was a broken mirror. There was a small hole in the wall of the dining room which appeared to be a gunshot.

There is a small hallway to the east of the dining room. On the floor in the hallway were five 9 mm casings and a portion of a .37 mm gas cartridge.

The bedroom which is located at the southeast corner of the residence and entered through the hallway. On the floor directly inside the doorway were several .32 caliber cartridges and one .32 caliber casing. There was also three 9 mm casings on the floor intermingled with the .32 caliber casings. There were numerous live rounds scattered around the bedroom floor. CSI took two of the shells for comparison. There was a shotgun blast in the ceiling above the bed.

On the floor under the foot of the bed was a vinyl gun case. On the top of the foot of the bed was an SPD distraction device. On the bed, where the suspect was located, was a .32 caliber automatic pistol and a sawed off shotgun.

On the floor to the left (east) of the bed was a holster with an automatic pistol inside. Lying next to the pistol and under the bed was a pellet pistol.

R/O checked the closet and found a .357 caliber revolver and holster on the top shelf.

R/O had spoken with [REDACTED], the suspect's wife, and she stated that there was possibly a gun in a blue cosmetic case in the closet. R/O located a blue cosmetic case on the floor in the left (east) side of the closet. R/O opened the case and observed a weapon and several other items inside the case.

R/O also checked behind the door of the bedroom and found a pellet rifle. Also

R/O located a .37 mm gas cartridge protruding from the west wall of the bedroom.

The suspect, a male White adult, was lying on a waterbed in the bedroom. The top of the bed was covered with water and bed clothing. The victim was wearing an off colored terry cloth robe. The suspect was removed by the coroner. R/O observed several what appeared to be bullet wounds on the left upper torso. He also had an abrasion on the face.

After the suspect was removed from the bed, R/O removed the bed clothing from the bed. R/O observed what appeared to be a 9 mm slug lying on top of the waterbed liner. R/O checked the waterbed for bullet holes. R/O could find no bullet holes; however, there was a slug in the upper left (east) side of the liner. The liner was kept by the R/O. R/O observed the liner to have a large white foam rubber type material in the bottom of the liner. R/O observed a slug on the top of the foam rubber. The slug appeared to be a 9 mm. The second slug was photographed by CSI Officer Cowan and booked as evidence. All other items were booked by CSI Officers Bauer and Snow.

REPORT RE COLLINS MEDICATION:

1010hrs, 4-23-90, R/O contacted [REDACTED] by phone for the purpose of discussing her husbands medical condition and the medications that were prescribed to him.

COLLINS related that her husband, James had physical problems last June which resulted in seeing a physician. The doctors discovered that her husband had a very serious problem with his liver. James had drank a lot, at least a large bottle of hard liquor a day. He started to swell up, which is common for heavy drinkers with liver problems. The physicians prescribed the three kinds of medication: [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. The medication, except for the [REDACTED], made him very sleepy. The doctor then prescribed the [REDACTED] which caused James to be wired up and could not sleep much. When he complained about not having enough sleep, his physician recommended that he get out of the house and exercise which would make him tired enough to get some sleep. However, James was so upset and concern about his appearance that he did not leave the residence. The doctor could not prescribe any medication to offset his condition, because it would counteract his liver condition and may result in a comatose state.

The surgery that he was scheduled to have the following week involved installing a drain tube to drain the fluid that his liver condition was making and hopefully that this would improve his mental conditon concerning his appearance. However, his "wired" condition caused him to became angry, upset and his mood swings unpredictable.

Thus, James physical condition which was very serious required the above medication with side effects that the doctors could not eliminate due to his rapidly deteriorating condition and to change his medication for the sake of lessening his mood swings would have hassen his liver condition from bad to worst.

Dear Lieutenant Walker:

The above referenced case was submitted to this office for review of the shooting incident involving officers Jarosick and Schiele. I have concluded said review, and am writing to advise that it is our opinion that the conduct of officers Jarosick and Schiele in this incident was reasonable and legally justified under the circumstances presented to them.

In brief, the events leading up to the shooting are as follows. On April 16, 1990, at approximately 2:20 p.m., there was a domestic disturbance at [redacted] Second Avenue, Sacramento between [redacted] and James Collins. [redacted] escaped from the home and summoned police assistance. She reported that her husband James Collins was depressed due to cirrhosis of the liver. He was taking medication and was acting irrationally. He broke the T.V., V.C.R. and punctured the waterbed. He pointed a sawed-off shotgun at her and she heard it click. She told him she was going to call the police. He followed her to the phone with a knife in one hand. He put a handgun to her throat and pushed her away from the phone. They wrestled and he cut her arm with the knife and also he jabbed her in the right hip with the knife. The gun fell to the floor. [redacted] went to a neighbors house to call the police.

[redacted] stated that her husband had 1 shotgun, 3-4 handguns, 1 Bowie knife and a lot of ammunition in the house.

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When Police arrived at the scene, at approximately 2:30 p.m., officers were told by a neighbor that Mr. Collins was firing off round in the house. Officers could also hear the gunfire. Officers set up a perimeter around the house. At approximately 3:30 p.m., the SWAT Team arrived and took over the perimeter.

Officers could hear shots being fired from within the house and glass breaking. A fire was observed in the kitchen which apparently burnt out. From approximately 3 p.m. until 10:50 p.m., extensive efforts to negotiate with Mr. Collins were made without success. Tear gas and flashbang devices were introduced into the house to distract Collins, also without success. Mr. Collins could be heard cursing and mumbling. Officer Jarosick heard him saying something about wanting to end it, and singing and chanting. At one point Collins agreed to come out of the house with his guns. Sgt. Roth saw a gunbarrel at a window at another point.

Finally, the SWAT Team decided to enter the house and use a dog to distract and subdue Collins so that the officers could disarm him. At approximately 10:50 p.m., the team entered the house and the dog entered the bedroom where Collins was located. The dog came back out of the room and was directed back inside. Officer Dan Schiele approached the bedroom door and saw his dog contacting Collins. Collins held a shotgun in one hand and a semi-automatic pistol in the other.

Schiele was in full uniform and wearing a gas mask. To his right, was Officer Dave Valdez, who also was in uniform and wearing a gas mask and was crouching holding a body bunker. Officer James Jarosick was also in SWAT uniform, wearing a gas mask and was behind Valdez.

Schiele yelled at Collins 4-6 times to drop the guns. Collins pointed the guns at the officers in the doorway. Schiele fired about 5 rounds from his service revolver at Collins and continued to yell at him to drop the guns. He could not tell if he was hitting him since Collins continued to hold up the shotgun. Then Jarosick fired one round at Collins and Collins went limp.

Schiele stated that he fired at Collins because he feared for his life. He could clearly see the shotgun from illumination provided by Jarosick.

Jarosick said he fired one round from his rifle at Collins because he was in fear for his life as well as for that of Schiele and Valdez. Since Collins slumped down, he did not fire a second round.

Valdez, who was holding the body bunker and who had an earmike in one ear and an earplug in the other said he heard some

yelling about guns and realized Schiele was firing shots. Valdez could see Collins with the guns through the glass plate of the bunker. Valdez did not carry a gun in his hand since his job was to provide cover. Valdez did not know if Collins shot at the body bunker. After Collins slumped down Valdez entered the room and handcuffed Collins and the dog was removed from the bedroom. The two guns were moved away from Collins' body by Officer Weinrich. There was a bullet in the chamber of the handgun but not in the shotgun. Two other guns were found next to the bed. One of these guns had 5 rounds in the magazine. Two other loaded guns were found in the bedroom closet. Detective Adam examined the body bunker and saw no signs that a bullet struck it.

There was a possible shotgun blast in the ceiling of the bedroom. It was undetermined if Collins fired at Schiele, Valdez or Jarosick. None could say that he did.

Medical assistance was summoned and Collins was pronounced dead at the scene. Collins died from multiple gunshot wounds to his upperbody. He had dog bite marks on his left arm and dog scratches on his face.

It is clear from the facts outlined above, that officers did everything they could to try to get Collins to surrender peacefully. Officers ultimately decided to enter his house with hopes of distracting Collins, subduing him and disarming him. Collins refused to cooperate with negotiators and he refused to drop his weapons when officers entered his home. When he held guns in both hands and pointed them at Schiele, Jarosick and Valdez, he created a situation of great danger to these officers.

Where an officer reasonably believes that a person poses a threat of serious physical harm to another, it is not unreasonable for the officer to use deadly force to prevent or halt an attack (Tennessee v. Garner, (1985) 471 U.S. 1; Penal Code Section 694). When Collins refused to drop his weapons, Schiele, Jarosick and Valdez were justified in being in fear for their lives. Under these circumstances, both Schiele and Jarosick acted reasonably in firing in self-defense and defense of others.
