He was identified by co-workers and he he gave me the information as shown on the witness page.

He stated that he was on his way to work, and was in his veh. stopped at the red light Gloria Dr. at Florin Rd. facing East toward Kennady High School. He saw the truck coming toward him on Florin Rd. from the vicinity of Riverside B1. The PU turned right onto Gloria and went past him, and the driver looked at him. The light turned Green and he made a left turn onto Florin Rd toward Riverside. As he got a block down Florin, he noticed the same truck coming back onto Florin from a different side street. The PU then followed him into the parking lot, and he noticed an "LTD" following the PU. Both vehs. continued toward the corner of Riverside and Florin in the parking lot. Then went into his office, and later noticed the commotion in the parking lot, so he walked over to see what was going on.

2-7-91. Detective's Kirrene and Anderson were assisting in the investigation and surveillance of an ongoing extortion investigation.

1025 hours. Officers were driving into the parking lot of a shopping center located at the southest corner of Greenhaven and Florin Road. Anderson's attention was drawn to a white and yellow pickup which was in front of Officer's vehicle and was also driving into the parking lot. Anderson noted that the vehicle contained one male driver and had a white tonneau cover over the bed. The pickup was observed by Officers going eastbound through the lot toward the Luckys Market. Officers did not observe any suspicious activity by the driver of the pickup. Officers attention to the truck was only due to the clean appearance of the pickup.

1027 hours. Officers had left the parking lot and were driving west on Florin Road when IVY 96 advised over the radio that the suspect in the extortion had phoned the victim and made arrangements to meet her at the IGA Market at Florin and Riverside. Kirrene and Anderson, subsequently followed the victim when she left her residence, and drove toward the meet location.

1029 hours. Kirrene advised other Officers involved in the surveillance that the victim was driving into the parking lot of a shopping center, toward the IGA Market. Other Officers then advised that they had the victim in view. Kirrene and Anderson then positioned their vehicle near the southwest corner of the parking lot to await the arrival of the suspect.

1032 hours. Anderson observed a white/yellow pickup drive east from the west end of the parking lot and noted that it was the same pickup that Officers had seen minutes before at the shopping center at Greenhaven and Florin Road (possibly the location where the phone call to the victim had been place).

Kirrene and Anderson did not have sight of the victim and did not observe any meeting between the suspect and the victim. Kirrene and Anderson, subsequently heard an Officer calling for cover and the fact that shots had been fired. Kirrene and Anderson responded to the north side of the parking lot and observed the suspect vehicle going west through the lot, and simultaneously crash into a parked vehicle. Kirrene and Anderson approached the pickup with other Officers and observed that the male occupant was slumped over the seat and was bleeding from the head area. Officer Provencher was standing near the left side of the pickup and was bleeding from the right hand.

R/O, Reporting Officer made contact with the above witness who had been working at Swansons Cleaners and had been looking out the window into the parking lot. She told me she saw a male subject pointing a gun at someone, who had been blocked from her view by a pickup truck (suspect vehicle). She heard the subject with the gun yelling, and remembers hearing "Stop, freeze," she saw someone run to the truck and she was only able to see the feet of this person as the pickup was blocking her from viewing the rest of this person. She then saw the suspect with the gun, run towards the truck and there was a struggle between the two persons. The truck accelerated and took off very fast and appeared to hit someone who was standing on the passenger side of the vehicle, in the parking lot.

stated the truck continued on with two persons struggling inside. At this time, she saw one person fall from the truck and the truck came to a stop after hitting a parked car. She stated she never heard any of the shots being fired.





I contacted Officer Provencher in room #1013, in the Nurses Trauma Center Section, at the UC Davis Medical Center, to interview him and obtain his statement regarding this shooting incident. Present at the time of the interview were Kasey C. Clark, Attorney at Law representing Provencher through the Sacramento Police Officers Association and Carole A. Petty, Criminal Investigator for the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office. The interview was tape recorded with Provencher's knowledge and the following statement is a synopsis of that interview. Refer to the tape for a verbatim interview.

Officer Provencher has been employed by the Sacramento Police Department for twelve years. He has been assigned to the Selective Enforcement Section for the past four years and working on Crime Suppression Team Thirty during that period. On the morning of 2-7-91, Provencher and his partner, Ronnie Soohoo, were assigned to meet with Lieutenant Enloe and Sergeant Cordova, of the Flex Unit, and assist in a surveillance operation. They were briefed by Sergeant Cordova and Detective Yeager regarding the extortion of approximately forty thousand dollars by subjects from a female White adult approximately eighty years old, stemming from a car accident.

Provencher and SooHoo were assigned to set up and conduct surveillance at the IGA Market located at Riverside Boulevard and Florin Road, the site of the drop location. The suspects in this investigation were described as two male Whites, in their forties, one was 6'0, 200 lbs., and the other was 5'6 to 5'7, 150 lbs. There were several possible vehicles involved: A white pickup truck, a black pickup truck, a tan pickup truck, and a small red car.

Soohoo and Provencher went to their assigned location and parked their car in the parking lot to the east of the Great American Bank. From their location they had a view of the IGA Market and of the pay phone on the west side of the market. That pay phone was the only one in the shopping center complex. Other officers were across the street in the area of the Nuggett or Bonanza Market next to Shakey's Restaurant. Detectives Yeager and Granrud were in that area, as well as other officers. Detective Barton was with the victim of the extortion at her residence, awaiting a call from the suspects.

At approximately 0945 hours, Detective Barton advised over the police radio he had received a call from the suspects and advised that there would be a returned call.

At about 1015 hours, Detective Barton advised over the police radio that the meet was at the IGA Market and that the suspect vehicle was a black pickup truck with a white camper shell. Soohoo and Provencher were monitoring both police channels 2 and 6. Sergeant Cordova ordered all units to operate on channel 2 when the operation went down. Patrol Units and Patrol Sergeant Richer were advised of the operation and were in the area to assist. The plan was for officers to follow the victim to the meet site. Detective Kirrene advised that he was following the victim to the site. She was suppose to park by the IGA Market.

Provencher and Soohoo saw a pickup truck, with a white top, white on the bottom, goldish/bronze body and white tonneau cover on the bed, enter the parking lot. The truck drove eastbound in the parking lot like it had come off of Riverside Boulevard. They put out a description of the truck but could not see the license Provencher told Soohoo to watch the truck because it looked suspicious plate. to him. Provencher had the feeling, from his experience, that this was possibly the suspect that they were watching for, in this case. The truck drove eastbound through the parking lot, past the market, then turned around and came westbound in the lot next to Florin Road. It drove up the center aisle facing toward the market and stopped in the traffic lane facing the market. Provencher assumed the subject was looking for the victim by his actions. The subject drove westbound toward the Great American Bank. Provencher and Soohoo ducked down in their car to avoid the subject. The subject stopped on the south side of the bank and got out of the truck, but left the driver's door open. He was looking around for the victim.

Provencher and Soohoo then saw the victim drive directly in front of them. They recognized the victim's vehicle description and realized it might go down right in front of them. The subject saw the victim and he drove his truck over to her car and stopped in the aisle, not in a parking slot but behind her car. He got out of the truck, leaving the driver's door open, and went around to the side of her car.

Provencher and Soohoo got out of their car and drew their handguns. Soohoo walked around the front of the suspects pickup truck and was in between the truck and the victim's car. He was facing the suspect and the victim. Provencher was at the driver's side rear of the suspects pickup truck. Provencher could hear

the suspect talking in a loud, boisterous and demanding tone of voice. He could hear the suspect saying words to the effect of "I will this or were taking this", but could not hear everything. He described what was being said as in a threatening manner.

Provencher then heard Soohoo yell "Police Officer, freeze." The suspect turned away from the victim's car and started walking in a fast pace toward his truck. Provencher confronted the suspect as he approached saying "Police Officer, freeze, get down on the ground" or words to that effect. Provencher had his gun in his left hand and he grabbed the suspect with his right hand, around the neck, trying to stop him. The suspect was stout and would not stop. He pulled himself up into pickup truck with Provencher trying to stop him. Provencher could hear Soohoo behind him and Soohoo was calling for cover on the police radio. The suspect started the engine of the pickup truck and Provencher became concerned that the suspect was in the truck and might have a weapon. At this point, Provencher was not sure about where Soohoo was. Provencher was still holding on to the suspect trying to pull him out of the truck and stop him. The suspect then accelerated the truck in the parking lot and started moving forward. Provencher's first thoughts, at this point, were that he was going to get hurt, that he was going to be crushed under the truck wheels. The pickup was moving forward and the driver's door was still open. Provencher had his right arm around the suspect's neck and he was not letting go. The suspect was not going to stop or give up. Provencher was being pulled and dragged along the side of the truck as it moved forward.

Provencher said "I'm scared, I'm hanging onto this guy, I'm scared I'm going to get seriously hurt. I saw that I had to shoot, like it flashed on a screen, I had to shoot. My first shot hit my hand and I felt it. I knew I had to shoot again, and the second shot hit him and he slumped over toward the passenger side of the truck. I didn't know where I had hit him or how bad he was, but he slumped over."

The truck continued moving and Provencher was holding onto the suspect and he could see some parked cars and thought they might hit them. They turned left and plowed into a parked car and stopped. Provencher was not sure where Soohoo was, but thought that he was behind him, because he could hear Soohoo radio

After the truck stopped, someone pulled Provencher out of the pickup truck and he looked at his hand to see how bad it was. He was laid down on the parking lot and an ambulance was called. Provencher thought that Guilbault and Sherretts went to give aid and control the suspect. After that Provencher only recalls going in the ambulance to the hospital. At the end of the interview, Provencher added that as the suspect came around the rear of the pickup truck at him, he thought about a hair pull take down, but the suspect was pulling him. Provencher had a hold of him with one hand, but could not stop him. In his other hand was his gun.



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



2-7-91 approximately 1120 hours Det. Ford contacted the above witness in interview room five of the Homicide section. Det. Ford had transported the witness from the scene at Riverside and Florin Road.

The following is a summary of an audio and video tape recorded statement. For verbatim statements, refer to the recorded tapes.

Mr. Note told Det. Ford that he was leaving his office, Florin Road. He stated he was walking west bound toward his vehicle in the parking lot. The stated that as he was walking he heard the squealing of tires, and heard four to six shots. The stated that he saw the yellow and white pickup truck come to a stop. The stated the driver of the pickup truck exited the driver's side door, and pointed a gun at a subject, who was at the rear bumper of the truck. The stated that the driver of the truck pointed a dark gun at the subject at the rear bumper and fired a shot. The stated he turned to go back to his office, when he saw a blue car pull up. He stated that two men got out of the blue car with guns drawn, and pointed them at the driver of the truck. The stated the driver of the truck pointed the gun in his direction, and that he turned and went back to his office.



SHE STATES, SHE WAS WALKING TO THE BAKERY SHOP TO BUY A DONUT WHEN SHE OBSERVED SEVERAL SUSPECTS FIGHTING WITH A SUBJECT WHO HAD JUST GOT OUT OF HIS PICKUP. THEY WERE IN THE PARKING LOT NORTH OF HER LOCATION AND SHE THOUGHT AT FIRST THEY WERE JUST PLAYING AROUND. SHE RELATED, THE SUBJECTS DID NOT HAVE THEIR GUNS DRAWN AT FIRST BUT WHEN THE MAN DIDN'T STOP THEY POINTED THEIR GUNS AT THE SUBJECT AND YELLED FREEZE.

SHE STATES, THE SUBJECT DIDN'T STOP AND THE SUBJECTS GRABBED HIM TRYING TO KEEP HIM FROM GETTING INTO HIS PICKUP. THEY DIDN'T SUCCEED AND THE SUBJECT GOT INTO HIS TRUCK AND STARTED TO DRIVE OFF WITH THE SUBJECTS STILL TRYING TO STOP HIM. THIS IS WHEN THE WITNESS HEARD TWO SHOTS FROM THE TRUCK. SHE COULDN'T BE SURE ON THE EXACT NUMBER OF SHOTS SHE HEARD. AT THIS POINT THE TRUCK HIT A CAR AND SHE REALIZED THIS WAS A SERIOUS INCIDENT. SHE IMMEDIATELY WENT INTO THE GROCERY STORE AND TOLD THE EMPLOYEES WHAT SHE HAD SEEN AND TOLD THEM TO CALL THE POLICE.

Then what happened was, one of the subjects dropped back in a backward motion, either as he was pushed or hit. Then one of the subjects got into the pickup truck. The subject that was knocked back appeared to move towards the pickup truck at the door, and there was an additional struggle between the subject outside and the subject inside the truck. The truck started to accelerate as the struggle continued. The subject that was outside the door was either knocked backwards, hit by the door, or by the truck, or is not sure or clear as to what occurred at this point, as the possibly shot. action appeared to be very fast. further stated that she does not know what happened to the third subject; although later she related that she thinks that there was a second subject inside the pickup truck.

After the subject was hit at the driver's door, the subject appeared to roll to his backside and roll out of the picture as the truck accelerated around the corner and came to rest inside of a bushy area. At this time, **set of** had moved to the telephone and was calling the Police Department. **Stated** that she did not see a gun at any time. She only heard her boss, who was facing the window, state there was, in fact, a gun.

could not give a detailed description as to who the different players were, or if anybody was, in fact, a Police Officer, as she did not see any, what she thought, any uniform. Again upon interviewing, stated that she thought that this occurred at the driver's side of the vehicle. And then when I was requestioning her regarding if it was the driver's side of the vehicle or the passenger side of the vehicle, she stated that she was not positively sure, and she seemed that the way the truck made the turn, it could have been on the passenger side, but she still felt strongly that this action occurred on the driver's side of the vehicle. Cannot add any more to this statement at this time; however, she was visibly excited and upset during the course of her statement, and she was advised that a Detective would recontact her and go over her statement again.

OBSERVATIONS:

Detective LaBranch stood at the counter where stated that she was when she witnessed the accident, and she would have a clear view of the action, of what she said she saw from the parking lot, from behind the counter where she stood. I say that the distance was approximately seventy-five to eighty feet. It was a high, overcast day, although there was no low-level fog on the ground, so she was able to see exactly what she said.

Both vehs. continued toward the corner of Riverside and Florin in the parking lot. _____ then went into his office, and later noticed the commotion in the parking lot, so he walked over to see what was going on.

At approximately 1457 hours, 2-9-91, R/O (Detective Thurston) contacted by telephone. Called the Office of Investigations at the Sacramento Police Department and left a message saying she had witnessed the incident which took place in the shopping center at Riverside and Florin, involving Office Provencher and the suspect (Saline).

sounded very agitated and excited. She stated during the conversation that she was emotionally drained and upset over the incident. She indicated that she had not contacted the police immediately after the report because she really didn't know what to do, but after talking to some friends, they had convinced her that since she was a witness, she should contact the police and tell what she saw.

stated she had gone to the shopping center to Jacquelyn's Beauty Parlor. She stated that she left Jacquelyn's Beauty Parlor at around 1030 hours on 2-7-91, and went to J & P Beauty Shop also in the complex. She stated that after leaving the J & P Beauty Shop around 1030 hours, she walked toward her car, which was parked in the parking lot. She stated that she was walked from the J & P Beauty Shop to her car, indicating that the direction that she was walking was toward Riverside Boulevard through the parking lot. She stated that when she got into her car, she heard what to her sounded like a crash. She stated that she looked back and saw a gold and white truck go by behind her. She stated that she heard some noises which at the time she thought were backfires, but now thinks were possibly three gunshots. She stated that she began to back out of the stall when she heard another crash and looked and saw that the truck had crashed in the planter box area. She stated that when she looked back at the scene of the crash, she saw an undercover policeman pushing the suspect down on the ground with his left hand. She stated that the Police Officer was holding a revolver in his right hand at the suspect's neck. She stated that at first she thought it was just teen-agers clowning around with a water pistol, but then realized it was a gun. She stated that after seeing this, she drove out of the

parking lot onto Florin Road and was almost hit by another undercover policeman in a dark blue vehicle who came screeching into the parking lot. She stated that as she went down Florin Road, she was passed by three more Sacramento Police cars and a fire engine.

On further questioning, her answer indicated that she had heard the shots after she saw what she believed to be the suspect out of the truck, which she described as gold and white, and on the ground. She stated that she recalls seeing the officer holding the gun in his right hand. She stated that the officer had his left hand on the suspects neck, and was holding him on the ground.

R/O asked her how she was able to tell the officers at the scene from the suspect. She stated that she was not able to tell, because none of the people involved were wearing a uniform. R/O asked her how many people she saw at the suspect vehicle when she turned, just after hearing the crash. She stated that she saw, what she believes, is four men at the truck.

R/O asked her how she was certain that it was a police officer and a suspect out of the truck on the ground. She stated that she did not know if it was actually a police officer or a suspect that she saw out of the car.

She described the person she thought was a police officer as being a male, unknown race, with black hair, approximately 5'll" tall, 190 lbs., and a heavy set build. She stated he was holding the gun in his right hand. On further questioning she stated the subject she saw did not have a moustache, and she knows from seeing the news, that the wounded officer did have a moustache.

R/O asked if she recalled seeing an Oriental person on the scene. She stated that she saw two Oriental males standing near a photo studio, but believes they were just part of the crowd that was forming.

R/O asked if what she may have seen beside the truck was one officer giving aid to his partner who had already been wounded. Stated that it was definitely not an officer giving aid to another officer. She stated that the

subject with the gun in his right hand, had his left hand on the suspects neck and had the suspect under control.

went on to say that she did not actually see shots fired while she saw the individuals on the ground beside the truck. She stated that she heard "In the back of her mind" the gunfire, but did not actually see the shots fired. Stated that she initially heard a crash which drew her attention to the incident. She stated that she then saw the truck go by behind her vehicle as her vehicle was parked. This is when she states that she heard the possible three shots which she initially thought were backfires. She stated that this was prior to her hearing the crash, when the vehicle crashed into the planter box.

if she could identify any of the people that she saw outside R/O asked of the suspect vehicle. At first, stated that she thought she could recognize the guy that was pushing down the man on the ground. She stated that she has seen the officer and knows the officer had a moustache, but states that the person she saw did not have a moustache. She stated, however, that she thought that she could identify the officer based upon his size, and that the officer she saw on television had approximately the same build. R/O told that there are several male officers on the Sacramento Police Department who have a description similar to that which she described being 5'11" and 190 lbs. then recanted saying she realized this, and could not identify the person she thought was the officer or the person she thought was the suspect. Prior to recanting, the suspect. Prior to recanting, had indicated also, that she is as she said, fifty-one years old (Note: is only 50 years old), and that her eyesight is not that good, especially at a distance of thirty to forty feet. also said during the conversation "I didn't want to do this (referring to giving the statement) but I couldn't keep my mouth shut." This concludes the statement taken from concerning report #91-11140.



2/7/91, at approximately 1035 hours, Det. M. Hensley came into the Homicide Unit and advised that there had been a Police officer shot in the south area. At this time, every available Detective in the office was told to respond to the scene. I responded to the scene with Lt. K. Walker, Sgt. T. Mandalla, Det. C. Ford.

1047 hours, we arrived on the scene. It was determined while enroute that Sgt. Mandalla would take responsibility for seeing that all the witnesses were contacted and statements were taken. I was given the responsibility of investigating the crime scene.

I noted upon my arrival that police barricade type surrounded the entire scene. Fire Department and Ambulance personnel were administering first aid the Officer Provencher and the suspect.

Detectives J. Thurston, badge #0544 and J. Valenzuela, badge #400 were assigned to investigate the crime scene and coordinate the collection of evidence and photographs with Crime Scene Investigators Nugent, Lim and Cowan. For Details of the scene, see supplements from Thurston and Valenzuela.

Det. G. Walker was assigned the duty of vidoe taping the scene.



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



Anderson's attention was drawn to a white and yellow pickup which was in front of Officer's vehicle and was also driving into the parking lot. Anderson noted that the vehicle contained one male driver and had a white tonneau cover over the bed. The pickup was observed by Officers going eastbound through the lot toward the Luckys Market. Officers did not observe any suspicious activity by the driver of the pickup. Officers attention to the truck was only due to the clean appearance of the pickup.

1027 hours. Officers had left the parking lot and were driving west on Florin Road when IVY 96 advised over the radio that the suspect in the extortion had phoned the victim and made arrangements to meet her at the IGA Market at Florin and Riverside. Kirrene and Anderson, subsequently followed the victim when she left her residence, and drove toward the meet location.

1029 hours. Kirrene advised other Officers involved in the surveillance that the victim was driving into the parking lot of a shopping center, toward the IGA Market. Other Officers then advised that they had the victim in view. Kirrene and Anderson then positioned their vehicle near the southwest corner of the parking lot to await the arrival of the suspect.

1032 hours. Anderson observed a white/yellow pickup drive east from the west end of the parking lot and noted that it was the same pickup that Officers had seen minutes before at the shopping center at Greenhaven and Florin Road (possibly the location where the phone call to the victim had been place).

Kirrene and Anderson did not have sight of the victim and did not observe any meeting between the suspect and the victim. Kirrene and Anderson, subsequently heard an Officer calling for cover and the fact that shots had been fired. Kirrene and Anderson responded to the north side of the parking lot and observed the suspect vehicle going west through the lot, and simultaneously crash into a parked vehicle. Kirrene and Anderson approached the pickup with other Officers and observed that the male occupant was slumped over the seat and was bleeding from the head area. Officer Provencher was standing near the left side of the pickup and was bleeding from the right hand.

Plainclothes officers were surveilling a planned meet between a victim and a suspect of extortion. The meeting was with the victim's knowledge of only an exchange of an envelope between the victim and suspect. This was with extensive police observation. Upon contact, two officers in closest proximity to the suspect and victim, attempted to affect an arrest after identifying themselves as Police Officers. A short foot pursuit ensued. The suspect entered a vehicle and within a span of a few seconds. the suspect accelerated at a high rate of speed. The suspect was spinning his tires and drauged the officers approximately sixty feet. One officer was attempting to turn the ignition off, the other officer was attempting to subdue the suspect. Under this critical situation and fextreme danger to the officers, one of the officers who was struggling with the suspect fired two shots. One shot struck the officer on the right hand, another shot struck the suspect in the upper neck area. The wounded officer is awaiting surgery. His condition is stable and his injuries are not life threatening. The identity of the suspect is pending investigation and has not been confirmed. The suspect is described as a male white or Hispanic in his early 30's and is of heavy build. The suspect's condition is critical and he is still in surgery.

SUPPLEMENT:

2-7-91. Detective's Kirrene and Anderson were assisting in the investigation and surveillance of an ongoing extortion investigation.

1025 hours. Officers were driving into the parking lot of a shopping center located at the southest corner of Greenhaven and Florin Road. Anderson's attention was drawn to a white and yellow pickup which was in front of Officer's vehicle and was also driving into the parking lot. Anderson noted that the vehicle contained one male driver and had a white tonneau cover over the bed. The pickup was observed by Officers going eastbound through the lot toward the Luckys Market. Officers did not observe any suspicious activity by the driver of the pickup. Officers attention to the truck was only due to the clean appearance of the pickup.

1027 hours. Officers had left the parking lot and were driving west on Florin Road when IVY 96 advised over the radio that the suspect in the extortion had phoned the victim and made arrangements to meet her at the IGA Market at Florin and Riverside. Kirrene and Anderson, subsequently followed the victim when she left her residence, and drove toward the meet location.

1029 hours. Kirrene advised other Officers involved in the surveillance that the victim was driving into the parking lot of a shopping center, toward the IGA Market. Other Officers then advised that they had the victim in view. Kirrene and Anderson then positioned their vehicle near the southwest corner of the parking lot to await the arrival of the suspect.

1032 hours. Anderson observed a white/yellow pickup drive east from the west end of the parking lot and noted that it was the same pickup that Officers had seen minutes before at the shopping center at Greenhaven and Florin Road (possibly the location where the phone call to the victim had been place).

Kirrene and Anderson did not have sight of the victim and did not observe any meeting between the suspect and the victim. Kirrene and Anderson, subsequently heard an Officer calling for cover and the fact that shots had been fired. Kirrene and Anderson responded to the north side of the parking lot and observed the suspect vehicle going west through the lot, and simultaneously crash into a parked vehicle. Kirrene and Anderson approached the pickup with other Officers and observed that the male occupant was slumped over the seat and was bleeding from the head area. Officer Provencher was standing near the left side of the pickup and was bleeding from the right hand.

Dear Chief Kearns

The above entitled case was submitted to this office for review of the shooting incident involving Officer Charles Provencher, SPD #555. I am writing to inform you that it is the opinion of the District Attorney's Office that Officer Provencher's conduct in this incident was appropriate, reasonable and legally justified given the circumstances of the incident.

On February 7, 1991 Officer Provencher and Officer Ron Soohoo, SPD #433 were working with the C.S.U. and FLEX Units in an investigation. They were in plain clothes in an unmarked vehicle. They were parked at 300 Florin Road in a shopping center parking lot at the intersection of Florin Road and Riverside Drive. Provencher and Soohoo were deployed with other officers to that location. They were working as partners in the same vehicle located west of the I.G.A. Market and to the rear of the Great American Bank. They were parked in a diagonal parking lot stall.

Provencher and Soohoo were at that location as part of a team investigating an on-going extortion case. The victim, 79 year old **sector**, was instructed by the subject to go to the aforementioned location to make another payment. Over the past month the victim had paid \$51,000 in the extortion scheme. Jack Kearns, Chief of Police Page 2 March 5, 1991

At approximately 10:29 a.m. the victim entered the parking lot in her car. At approximately 10:32 a white over beige pickup truck entered the parking lot. The victim parked in a diagonal parking space in front of the I.G.A. Market. The subject pulled in behind her, perpendicular to her vehicle, preventing her from leaving. He got out and approached the driver's door of her vehicle. He was a white male, approximately 25 years old, 6 feet tall and 200 pounds. The subject, later identified as Steve Saline, began to speak to the victim, leaning inside her window.

Officers Provencher and Soohoo exited their vehicle which was approximately 30 feet away. They drew their service weapons and ordered Saline to freeze, identifying themselves as police officers. Officer Provencher was located at the rear of Saline's car, Soohoo was at the front of the vehicle. Saline started walking quickly to his truck. Both officers again yelled "freeze". Saline walked right past Provencher. Provencher tried to grab the back of Saline's head and collar with his right hand while he held his weapon in his left hand. Provencher couldn't stop Saline as Saline got into the cab of the truck. Saline dragged Provencher into the cab of the truck with Provencher's right arm wrapped around Saline's neck. Soohoo was trying to prevent Saline from shifting the column shift into drive. While Officer Soohoo recalls that the engine was running, in park, Provencher states that the truck was not running yet as they struggled for control of the cab. Regardless, at some point, Saline was able to get the truck into drive. Both officers report he was very strong and difficult to control. Despite their efforts, Saline then punched the gas pedal, and the truck took off. Both Soohoo and Provencher were between the door of the truck and the cab as the truck screeched off.

Provencher didn't know where Soohoo was as he fought with Saline. Provencher was still half outside the cab of the truck as it took off. He states that once the truck started moving he thought he was either going to be run over by the truck or crushed as the door hit a parked car.

Once the truck had travelled a short distance, Provencher shot one time hitting his right hand which was wrapped around Saline's neck. He shot again, hitting Saline in the neck. The truck then made a severe left turn, went over a planter and hit a parked car. The truck traveled approximately 60 feet, leaving 20 feet of skid. Soohoo received lacerations and scratches to his arms and knees. Officer Provencher recieved a through and through wound to his right hand. Saline was shot one time in the neck. He has recovered from this wound.

Saline admitted in his statement to Detective Thurston that the officers identified themselves and had their guns drawn. He said that they told him to "hold it", and that he dragged them

into the truck. He remembers trying to start the vehicle, and at that point his memory fails him.

There were numerous civilian witnesses in the vicinity of the shooting. The accounts varied to some degree as to the location of the participants, race, number of shots fired, and sequence of events. However, the statements of Soohoo and Provencher are verified by physical evidence and the statements of the statements of Officer Provencher's service weapon revealed that two shots had in fact been fired from the weapon.

It is well established in law that a peace officer may use reasonable force to effect an arrest. Penal Code section 835a provides:

Any peace officer who has reasonable cause to believe that the person to be arrested has committed a public offense may use reasonable force to effect the arrest, to prevent escape or to overcome resistance.

A peace officer who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from his efforts by reason of the resistance or threatened resistance of the person being arrested; nor shall such officer be deemed an aggressor or lose his right to self-defense by the use of reasonable force to effect the arrest or to prevent escape or to overcome resistance.

In <u>Tennessee v. Garner</u> (1985) 471 U.S. 1, 105 S.Ct. 1694, 85 L. Ed. 2d 1, the United States Supreme Court recognized that a peace officer may in certain circumstances, use deadly force to effect an arrest.

Deadly force may not be used to prevent an apparently unarmed suspected felon's escape unless such force is necessary to prevent the escape and the officer has probable cause to believe that the suspect poses a significant threat of death or serious physical injury to the officer or others (105 S. Ct. 1697, 85 L. Ed. 2d 4).

In the California cases of <u>Kortum v. Albe</u> (1977) 69 Cal. App. 3d 325 and <u>Long Beach Police Officers Assn. v. Long Beach</u> (1976) 61 Cal. App. 3d 364, the courts upheld the right of peace officers to use deadly force in apprehending a felon in situations that threatened death or great bodily injury. In Kortum, supra, the court upheld the use of deadly force where:

the officer or other person. (69 C.A. 3d 325)

Lastly, Penal Code section 69 provides:

Every person who attempts, by means of any threat or violence, to deter or prevent an executive officer from performing any duty imposed upon such officer by law, or who knowingly resists, by the use of force or violence, such officer, in the performance of his duty, is punishable by a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or by imprisonment in the state prison, or in a county jail not exceeding one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

We have found that based on review of all photographs, videos, physical evidence, and statements provided that Provencher's conduct in this case was reasonable at all stages of the Initially, he drew his weapon, identified himself and arrest. ordered Saline to freeze. Officer Soohoo did the same. Saline did not comply. Provencher then tried to prevent him from escaping in the truck by grabbing the back of his head and collar. Despite his efforts Saline was able to get the truck in gear and moving. At this point, Provencher was in a life threatening situation. He was in between the truck cab and the door. He could have been crushed as the truck hit a parked car or could have fallen under the truck, and been run over. Also, the moving vehicle was a serious danger to any people in the parking lot, either on foot or in a vehicle.

In conclusion, the facts presented in the reports demonstrate that in the totality of the circumstances that Officer Provencher was justified in his use of deadly force. There will be no action taken by this office against Officer Provencher.
