I looked inside the bedroom and observed what appeared to be a nude male black subject lying on his stomach. This subject did not appear to be breathing. Engine personnel checked the victim (█████) and others went into the northwest bedroom and checked the male black subject. The male black subject was pronounced dead at 0256 hours this date (2-17-96).

Prior to leaving the residence, I observed a bullet on the floor of the front entry way. As I stepped outside, I observed a spent casing on the ground.

NOTIFICATION:

On 02/17/96 approximately 0258 hours, I, Detective J. Gardner, Badge #404, received a call to my residence from SPD Dispatcher Murray, Badge #6158. Murray requested that I respond to an officer involved shooting at █████ Deerbrook Drive with the cross street of Deer Run Way. Murray advised that Lieutenant Steve Campas, 1LN2, was possibly involved and that two ambulances were responding. Murray further advised that the details were sketchy, but that Homicide Sergeant John Parker and my partner, Detective T. Winfield were also en route. I gave my ETA as approximately 30 minutes.

ARRIVAL/BRIEFING:

I arrived on scene at approximately 0331 hours, as did Sergeant Parker and observed Lieutenant Dave Poroli, Badge #4081 (1LN4) as the incident commander. I observed yellow crime scene (Secondary) barrier tape blocking off pedestrian and vehicular traffic on the corner intersection of Deerbrook Drive and Deer Run Way, with a number of marked patrol vehicles and uniformed officers, in or around the cordoned off area. (Refer to radio call #96054982 and Crime Scene Recorder, J. Plosser, Badge #8144, for a listing of all officers and city personnel who arrived on scene.)

I approached Patrol Sergeant Susan Feenstra, Badge #3087 and was advised that Lieutenant Campas and Patrol Officer Norman Leong, Badge #0644, (1AL23) were the two officers involved in the shooting. I observed Lieutenant Campas and Officer Leong standing next to a patrol vehicle talking with additional

officers on scene. Both Lieutenant Campas and Officer Leong were dressed in a Sacramento Police Department uniform.

I observed two Sacramento Police Department marked patrol vehicles, parked one behind the other, facing southbound, directly in front of █████ Deerbrook Drive. Sgt. Feenstra advised the first vehicle (Unit #7247S, CA license E373478), parked closest to the front door of █████ Deerbrook Drive, belonged to Officer Leong with the second vehicle (Unit #7664S LT, CA license E439251) belonging to Lieutenant Campas. Both vehicles were approximately 10' apart.

I met with Sgt. Parker and Det. Winfield, who arrived on scene at approximately 0340 hours. Sgt. Parker briefed us as to the information he had obtained. The names of the residents or occupants at █████ Deerbrook Drive had not yet been determined, nor had the decedent who was inside a back bedroom.

Sgt Parker requested that I handle the crime scene investigation, with CSI, with Det. Winfield to interview the officers involved in the shooting. Sgt. Parker had requested that the Communications Center attempt to contact additional detectives to help with witness statements.

On 02/17/96 approximately 0350 hours, I contacted a male Black subject who was wearing a white T-shirt, sitting on the driveway in front of █████ Deer Run Way. I identified myself to the subject who identified himself as █████ DOB of █████ and residing at █████ Deerbrook Drive with his wife, █████ and their three children, ages 8, 6 & 2. █████ stated the deceased subject inside of his house was his cousin, Stacy Davis.

On 02/17/96, approximately 0352 hrs., [REDACTED] gave me permission to enter his residence to conduct a crime scene investigation. Det. Winfield and I then obtained a brief statement from [REDACTED] as to the sequence of events that led up to his cousin, Stacy Davis, being shot by officers. [REDACTED] stated he and his wife had gone out to a comedy jam for the evening, after taking their kids over to another residence. [REDACTED] had his nephew, [REDACTED], stay at their house while they were gone. Upon returning home, Davis was yelling at Davis' wife. [REDACTED]'s wife asked [REDACTED] to get Davis out of their house.

[REDACTED] asked Davis to leave, but he refused, causing [REDACTED] to try to force him out. [REDACTED] fought with Davis but was, "No match with him." During their struggle, [REDACTED] picked up a fireplace poker and hit Davis over the head with it, but it broke and did not faze Davis. Davis also threw a microwave at [REDACTED] which hit the stove, shattering the face of the stove. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were able to drag Davis out of the house, who was naked at the time. Davis began breaking out the front windows and climbed through the broken front living room window.

[REDACTED] had the ladies and children go into the back bedroom and lock the door. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] then went out through the side garage door and waited for police. [REDACTED] observed a Police Officer parked down the street, who came running up, as Davis was climbing in through the broken front window. [REDACTED] told the officer he was, "no match for him (Davis)." [REDACTED] heard the officers yelling at Davis, but did not recall what was said. [REDACTED] was also outside, in front, at the time the shots were fired.

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DATE REPORTED:

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On 02/17/96 approximately 0406 hours, Sgt. Parker, Det. Winfield, Casey Clark (SPOA Representative), Lieutenant Campas, Officer Leong and I walked through the interior crime scene yellow barrier tape, and up to the front door at ██████████ Deerbrook Drive. This was done in order to conduct a walk-through so that the involved officers could explain the direction the shots were fired from, and an approximation of how many shots were fired. Lieutenant Campas stated he fired six to seven shots while inside of the back, southeast bedroom. Lieutenant Campas and Officer Leong were then transported to the Hall of Justice to be interviewed.

Sgt. Parker, Det. Winfield and I then conducted a walk-through inside the residence. I observed **one empty 9mm RP brand casing** just outside the front door with a **live 9mm RP round** on the tiled entryway, next to the living room. I viewed the damage inside the living room, dining room and kitchen, then walked to the back bedrooms. Upon entering the southeast bedroom I observed the decedent to be nude and laying on the side of the bed, next to the wall. I smelled a strong odor of **OC pepper spray** emitting from this room. I viewed the remainder of the residence and went back out front.

Det. Winfield advised me she had obtained information from ██████████ that ██████████ had fired a gun at Davis as Davis was climbing inside the broken living room window and that the gun, a black 9mm semi-automatic pistol was in a large green plastic trash can, on the side of the house, next to the garage and in the front yard. I began my scene investigation and documentation after conducting a walk-through with CSI. I also videotaped the entire crime scene.

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CSI-11, Officer J. Thorgrimson, Badge #638, SPD ID Technicians M. Nadeau, Badge #6387 and K. Cordova, Badge #6375 arrived on scene. Additional ID Technicians, including Supervising ID Technician Bob Springer, later arrived on scene.

WEATHER/LIGHTING:

The weather was cloudy, dry and cool with the temperature estimated to be in the mid 50s.

I observed **streetlights** at the following locations:

- In the front yard between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Deer Run Way, west of the west sidewalk.
- In the front yard between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Deerbrook Drive, south of the south sidewalk.

I observed **porch lights** on at the following locations:

- [REDACTED] Deerbrook Drive,
- [REDACTED] Deerbrook Drive (No porch light but a vapor light over the garage.)
- [REDACTED] Deerbrook Drive,
- [REDACTED] Deer Run Way,
- [REDACTED] Deer Run Way,
- [REDACTED] Deer Run Way.

GENERAL SCENE DESCRIPTION:

The residence at [REDACTED] Deerbrook drive is located on the south side of the street and faces northbound. The house is positioned

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at the corner of where Deerbrook Drive and Deer Run Way meet in a 90 degree turn. Deerbrook Drive runs east and west bound while Deer Run Way runs north and south bound. The area consists mostly of older, single story residences with wood facing and stucco sides.

DESCRIPTION OF RESIDENCE AT [REDACTED] DEERBROOK DRIVE:

The residence at [REDACTED] Deerbrook Drive is a single story, three bedroom, two bathroom house with a double car garage turned into a den/video game room. A fenced in dog run was on the east side of the house, accessible through the side garage door. The backyard consisted mostly of grass, a swingset and debris scattered around the southwest area. A six foot wood fence enclosed the backyard.

The entryway from the front door leads into the living room, nook and kitchen area with the three bedrooms down the hallway. The hallway runs east off the entryway. The kitchen and dining room share the common back (south) wall.

The stereo in the living room was on and at a moderate volume. The TV was on in the garage. A Sega video game was on the floor in front of the TV in the garage. The interior door from the hallway to the garage was wide open, as was the side garage door.

INTERIOR LIGHTING:

Upon my initial walk-through I observed the following lights on inside the residence:

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- Entry hall light on,
- Kitchen overhead light on,
- Bathroom light in hallway on,
- No lights on in the S/E master bedroom but the light in the S/E master bedroom was on,
- N/E children's bedroom light on,
- No light on in the N/W children's bedroom.
- Light in at south wall of garage/den and
- Porch light in dog run on.

FRONT YARD AREA:

A white 1989 2-door Dodge Sundance, bearing CA license plates [REDACTED], was parked facing eastbound, along the south curb in front of [REDACTED] Deerbrook Drive. [REDACTED] advised that the car belong to her and her husband, decedent Stacy Davis. I searched the vehicle after receiving permission from [REDACTED] and found nothing of evidentiary value.

A gray 1966 2-door Buick Starfire, bearing CA license plates [REDACTED], was parked backed into the driveway in front of [REDACTED] Deerbrook Drive. The vehicle was registered to [REDACTED] at the same address. This vehicle was also searched with no items of evidence located.

The front yard at [REDACTED] Deerbrook Drive was modestly landscaped mostly with grass and a few bushes. A concrete aggravate walkway with steps lead from the front sidewalk and up to the front door. A few drops of blood were scattered on the front walkway and the area around the front door. A small T-shaped walkway lead from the west side of the driveway to the main walkway. A concrete

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walkway continued from the east side of driveway, along the east side of the house and to the north fence and side gate. In front of the gate was the green plastic garbage can. The garbage can was full of plastic bags containing garbage.

I opened up the top to the garbage can and observed a Jennings Brand, Black 9mm semi-automatic pistol, S/N [REDACTED] Model Bryco 59, on top of the plastic garbage bags. The pistol contained one live 9mm copper round nose bullet in the chamber, and a second bullet of the same type in the magazine. Next to the pistol were beer and liquor bottles. Several pieces of trash had spilled out in front of the garbage can.

On the southwest corner of the driveway, just in front of the double car garage door, were two black handle pieces of a fireplace tool set. One piece was a fireplace poker with a handle. The other was a handle to a fire place set with the top portion broken and missing. (The piece of the broken poker appearing to match up to the handle was found on the kitchen floor.)

A portable basketball backboard and pole was up against the west side of the garage, on the walkway area, near the front door. A spiral piece of aluminum (dog stake) was on the front porch, at the southwest corner of the garage.

A sliding dual pane window (northwest kids bedroom window) was on the north wall and east of the front door. All eight (8) pieces of individualized exterior pane glass, on the stationary window, were broken. I observed no damage to the front door. A 9mm expended casing, as earlier mentioned, was on a piece of lavender carpet mat, outside and next to the front door threshold.

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A sliding dual pane window on the north front living room wall, west of the front door, had twelve individual exterior stationary windows broken, as well as the solid piece of interior glass. Jagged glass edges were observed around the entire broken window. The left side of the window which was covered by a screen was not broken. Pieces of aluminum window frames and glass were scattered on the window sill and in the planter box below the window. Fresh blood was observed on the right corner of the broken window and on both the inside and outside wall area. CSI was asked to obtain a sample of the blood.

I observed what appeared to be one (1) bullet hole on the tan exterior wood siding, under the broken living room window. The trajectory appeared to be, from inside the front room to the outside and downward through the wall. A mark in a concrete mow strip, in the front yard, indicated the shot ricocheted off the mow strip in a northbound direction. The bullet was never located. Dowels were put into the hole and photos were taken of the trajectory.

LIVING ROOM:

A stereo system was in a wood stack unit with speakers on both side, along the south wall. An opening on the east side allowed access to and from the entryway. A second opening on the south wall allowed access to the dining room and kitchen. A fireplace surrounded by pictures and mirrors was on the west wall. A loveseat was next to the east opening area and backed up to the entryway. A couch was along the north wall. The bottom (west side) seat cushion was pulled out and away from the couch. A child's coat was under the protruding cushion. A blue blanket

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and a pink Towel were on the gray colored carpet in front of the couch. A **second expended 9mm RP brand casing** was on the carpet between the couch and blanket, approximately 2-3" in front and to the middle of the couch. A mens, black (left) Reebok tennis shoe, size 11 1/2, was on the rug at the southeast corner of the brick fireplace.

Broken glass (and pieces of the aluminum window frames) from the front window was scattered on the interior window sill, a portion of the sofa below, on the rug and on the fireplace bricks. The windows were covered by brown mini blinds which were partially opened, but were bent and damaged. The damage to the glass and mini blinds were consistent with someone having climbed through the broken window.

A bullet hole (as earlier mentioned) was in the north wall next to the wall plug. A puncture hole was observed in the west Sheetrock wall between the fireplace and the north wall.

I observed what appeared to be cast-off type blood drops on the east living room wall, approximately 18" off the floor and to the east side of the stereo unit. A pink child's tricycle, close by the west stereo speaker, was turned on its side. Next to the tricycle was a tipped over chair from the dining room table. The chair was also laying on its side between the living room rug and the dining room floor. A phone cord and other items were scattered close by.

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DINING ROOM AND KITCHEN AREA:

The dining room and kitchen area gave the immediate appearance that a fight or struggle had taken place, due to tipped over or damaged furniture and appliances. A heavy wood table in the dining room/nook area was tipped over with the contents strewn about on the floor. Clothes and dining room table chairs were scattered around, damaged or also tipped over. The items that had been on the table (ceramic dish, plastic flower arrangement, plastic containers, curlers, papers and broken glass) scattered on the dining room floor, close to the west wall and the living room rug. A black fireplace tool holder stand was in the middle of the scattered items.

Under or around a tipped over black chair that was between the living room rug and dining room floor were:

- a men's, beige canvass & Pendleton shirt, size 2XL, in a torn condition,
- One (1) men's (right) black, Reebok tennis shoe, size 11 1/2,
- Two (2) white socks,
- One (1) tan pair of "GATE" jeans, size 42.

A single swing, closed and locked back door lead from the dining room to the back yard. The three bay windows on the (back) south wall were closed, locked and covered with pink mini blinds. On the floor under the windows was a men's black leather wallet with identification in the name of to Stacy DAVIS. (I took possession of the wallet, photocopied its contents and booked it as personal property.) Close by the wallet was a black plastic trash can turned on its side and a bent and damaged aluminum chair.

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In the middle of the kitchen floor was a scattering of change, a broken black aluminum fireplace poker tip, a lighter, gray plastic curlers and numerous other items. A desk and chair were against the north kitchen wall. A phone plug was over the desk. The phone cord was unplugged and was on the floor. A phone cradle was on the chair, under the desk, with a phone dialing pad and headset also on the floor.

The floor in front the stove was covered with shattered black tempered glass from the face of the stove door. A large amount of the broken glass was inside the stove. A heavily damaged Panasonic microwave was on its side, on the floor between the stove and refrigerator, in the shattered glass. A beer bottle and other debris were scattered on the floor around the microwave. Washed pots and pans were on the kitchen counter and in a plastic strainer next to the sink. An unopened slab of bacon was also in the sink. A gold chain was on the counter above the dishwasher.

HALLWAY:

As I walked down the hallway towards the back of the house, I observed what appeared to be cast off type of drops of blood on the south hallway wall, just past the kitchen entrance. I observed a slight amount of blood transfer continuing along the same wall to the back southeast bedroom. A bathroom lead off the south wall but did not appear to be involved in the incident. I observed no blood or items of evidentiary value anywhere inside the bathroom.

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SOUTHEAST MASTER BEDROOM:

I stood in front of the wide opened southeast bedroom door and observed blood smears and transfer on the west side door jamb of the master bedroom door, as well as blood spatter on the bottom half and middle of the outer master bedroom. I observed damage to the door lock with the face plate missing and fresh wood splinters around the lock and between the exterior door knob. The damage was consistent with the master bedroom door having recently been forced in. A door face plate was found on top of a stereo speaker in the living room. A empty plastic bag containing a empty shoe box was in the middle of the doorway.

The room had no lights on and was dark except for a small amount of light emitting from the master bedroom bathroom. A dark blue blanket covered the approximate 5' X 5' window in the bedroom. A king size mattress with two twin mattresses butted up against the east wall, centered between the north and south walls. A sliding three door closet made up the entire north wall. Two of the three doors were pushed inward, toward the inside of the closet, along the bottom. A pile of clothes, shoes and papers were piled on the carpet floor next to the closet doors. A TV/stereo wood entertainment unit was tipped over in a westbound direction with pieces of the stereo unit and TV laying on the master bedroom bathroom floor. Wood night stands were on both sides of the bed.

The deceased, a male Black adult, very muscular and heavy set, was laying unclothed on the floor, between the side of the bed and the south wall. He was identified as Stacy Davis, via a California Drivers License which listed him at 6'2" and 270 pounds. The deceased was in a semi-prone position, face down with his waist twisted to his left side and had multiple gunshot

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wounds to his upper torso. The deceased was clean shaven and had black hair worn in braids.

The deceased's head was pointed in a westbound direction. His left leg was bent at the knee with the top of the left foot resting on the bed with the heel turned upward. The right leg was bent at the knee with the knee resting on the top edge of the mattress and the foot resting on the floor. His left arm was bent and was under his waist area. His left hand was not visible. His right arm was bent upward with the right hand touching the right side of his head.

A white telephone handle was on the carpet floor, next to and west of the deceased's head. Next to the phone and close to the deceased's head, was a black wood **Police baton** with a rubber grommet. The baton was angled in a southeast to northwest direction with the top of the baton approx 4 1/2" north of the south wall and the base of the baton approximately 23" north of the south wall.

I observed what appeared to be arterial type of blood stains on the top of his right thigh with heavy bleeding on the left knee area from the gunshot wounds to the chest. A heavy amount of blood was on the right arm innerfold area. A moderate amount of blood was observed on the brown rug under the decedent and on several areas on the multi-colored bed comforter, which covered mainly the right lower corner of the bed. Under the comforter was a single multi-colored stripe sheet.

A pillow with no pillow case was on the lower left side of the bed. Blood transfer was on the pillow. A pair of men's underwear and a baby blanket were on the middle left side of the

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bed over the bottom sheet. The jeans and blanket also had blood transfer. Five (5) pillows were at the head of the bed up against the east wall. Blood transfer was on the middle of the bed sheet, and on the five pillows with a light amount of blood spatter on the east wall around the top of the pillows. Several areas of the comforter contained pools of blood with additional blood transfer heading toward the right side of the bed. Pieces of broken glass were in the middle of the bed on the left side.

I located **twelve (12) Win (Winchester) brand, 9mm Luger expended brass casings** on or around the area of the bed. Six (6) expended casings were on the king size bed. Four expended casings were in the middle of the bed on top of the multi-colored bedsheet (ITEMS #20-23.) One expended casing (ITEM # 24) was at the head of the bed, on top of the mattress, at the right side, between a pillow and a nightstand (at the S/E corner of the room.) One expended casing (ITEM #25) was at the foot of the bed, at the right side and on top of the comforter.

One expended casing (ITEM #19) was found on a white towel, on the floor, next to the closet doors, at the north side of the bed. Three casings (ITEMS #26-28) were on the rug, between the right corner (foot) of the bed, the dresser up against the west wall and knocked over TV/stereo system, in front of door leading into the master bedroom bathroom. One expended casing was found inside the bottom edge of the tipped over wood stereo cabinet. One expended casing (ITEM #29) was found in a box of dishes, on the floor, in front of a dresser, along the west wall,

I observed what appeared to be three (3) bullet holes into the master bedroom walls. One bullet hole was in the east wall and a Silvertip projectile was recovered by CSI just inside the

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exterior stucco wall. The bullet appeared to have struck a stud in the wall and ricocheted. Two (2) additional bullet holes were in the south wall. One of the bullets penetrated through the interior Sheetrock and fell into the wall space between the Sheetrock and the exterior stucco wall.

The second bullet penetrated the Sheetrock and the outer stucco wall. A dowel was placed into the hole which showed a slightly upward and to the right trajectory. A string was tied off to show the trajectory which appeared headed for the upper portion of the backyard fence. A search of the backyard, including the A/C unit, produced no bullet nor bullet fragments. The back fence was checked for bullet holes or indentations with none noted. (Refer to CSI diagrams and measurements.)

At approximately 0620 hours, I made a request for the Sacramento County Coroner to respond. At approximately 0700 hours, Sacramento County Deputy Coroner, Billy Guillot responded to the scene. I briefed Guillot who then examined the decedent. Guillot turned over the decedent and found a pair of prescription wire framed glasses, with tortoise shell stems, wrapped around the left ring finger of the decedent. The glasses were covered with blood.

A second pair of gold colored wire rim prescription glasses were observed under the decedent's left torso area (approximately 1' north of the south wall and 40" west of the east wall. The deceased had multiple lacerations on his arms and chest area. Two pieces of Kleenex were attached to The decedent's right outer hand and wrist. A black patch of hair was across the back of the knuckle of his right hand. The hair was curly and appeared to hair worn from an African American. There were clumps of the

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same type of hair throughout the bedroom rug and in the dining room area.

At approximately 0730 hours, The Coroner's Removal Service, John Moser, badge #611 and John Brynda, Badge #625, arrived on scene. The decedent's hands were bagged and he was removed at approximately 0830 hrs.

Under the decedent was a blue jean jacket, a black canvass bag, a gray nylon bag and a white phone base unit with the telephone cord stretched out approximately 3' and still attached to the phone handle. Blood spatter was observed on the base phone unit.

ADDITIONAL TWO BEDROOMS:

The northeast and northwest children's bedrooms appeared to be unrelated to this investigation with the exception of the broken window in the northwest bedroom.

GARAGE/DEN:

The converted garage contained a couch and loveseat, a card table and chairs and the TV/video games. This room did not appeared to have been connected to the incident other that the occupants passed through the room while exiting the residence through the side garage door.

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DETECTIVE FOLLOW-UP:

At approximately 1035 hours, the [REDACTED] family arrived at the residence to pick up clothes. The family was not allowed inside but their clothing items were located and given to them.

At approximately 1315 hours, the owner of the property, [REDACTED], arrived. I walked [REDACTED] through the house so that he could observe the damage.

At approximately 1445 hours, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] walked up to the front yard. I then obtained statements from each of them.

At approximately 1500 hours, I left the scene after turning over control of the residence to [REDACTED]

At approximately 1510 hours, I drove over to [REDACTED] Deer Hill Drive in an attempt to contact the occupant of the house and search the backyard and the back of the house. [REDACTED] Deer Hill Drive is to the south of [REDACTED] Deebrook Drive and backs up to the [REDACTED] residence. No one was home and a card was left.

Dispatcher Murray related that there had been an officer involved shooting, and an injury to a small child. Lieutenant S. Campas was involved in the shooting. Sergeant Parker was responding with a homicide team, and I was being requested to assist in the Homicide office.

I responded from my residence.

ARRIVAL:

0405 hours, I arrive at the Hall of Justice, Homicide office.

DETECTIVE FOLLOW-UP:

0455 hours, I requested that a Crime Scene Investigator respond to the Hall of Justice, to photograph Lt. S. Campas and Officer N. Leong.

0455 hours, ID Technician M. Schreiner, ID #6378, arrived at the Hall of Justice, 1st floor conference room. I directed Schreiner to take photographs of the officer's overall appearances, injuries, and damage to their uniforms.

The first person to be photographed was Officer Leong. I noted that Leong had an approximate one and a half inch (1½") abrasion to

his right knee. The abrasion had been bleeding. Leong also had an approximate four to five inch (4"-5") scratch to his left forearm, just above the wrist. The scratch caused redness only. Behind Leong's left ear was an approximate two inch (2") scratch. I observed redness only from the scratch. Leong had dirt on both pant legs and complained of pain to his back.

Lt. Campas was then photographed. Campas did not complain of any injuries. Campas's uniform shirt had blood on the right and left sleeves and lower portion of the front part of his shirt.

Both Officer Leong and Lt. Campas were in full police uniform. The uniform consisted of visible police patches on both shoulders, and badges on their chest. The uniform also consisted of a police utility belt which is worn around the waist.

0520 hours, I took officer Leong to the County Sobriety Test Station, located in the Sacramento County Jail. The purpose of going over to the Sobriety Test Station was so he could clean and treat the injuries to his leg, ear, and wrist.

At approximately 7:55 hours, I requested that a Crime Scene Investigator or Identification Technician respond to the UC Davis Medical Center to photograph any injuries sustained by the six year old female, [REDACTED]

On 02/17/96, at approximately 0530 hours, Detective Winfield conducted an interview at the Sacramento Police Department, Homicide Division interview room, 813 Sixth Street.

The interview was both audio/video recorded.

The following is a summary of that interview.

Also present during the entire interview was SPOA Legal Representative Casey Clark.

Detective Winfield advised Lieutenant Steve Campas that the purpose of our being present at this time and location was to obtain information regarding the incident that occurred earlier during the a.m. hours of this date involving a shooting incident.

Lieutenant Campas indicated he understood.

Detective Winfield asked Steve Campas what his current rank was with the Sacramento Police Department.

He responded that he is currently a lieutenant.

Detective Winfield asked what his current assignment was.

He indicated that on today's date, he was assigned as a Watch Commander for Area 2.

Detective Winfield asked Lieutenant Steve Campas about his length of employment as a law enforcement officer with the city of Sacramento.

Lieutenant Campas responded that he has fifteen years experience. Upon request, he advised that he had approximately six years of patrol experience, two years of traffic experience as a motor officer, one year as an investigator in the Metro Unit, one year in investigation in the Burglary Unit, six months as a press information officer, two years in Internal Affairs as a sergeant, one year in Professional Standards as a sergeant, and one year as a lieutenant for the field operations.

Detective Winfield asked Lieutenant Steve Campas what his stature is, that is, his height and weight.

Lieutenant Campas responded that he is 5'8", 172 lbs., and 40 years of age.

Detective Winfield asked Lieutenant Campas when the first time he received information about a potential problem at that specific location where the shooting occurred.

Lieutenant Campas indicate that he did not know the specific time, but that he does recall that he was advised by Communications that a Priority 1 call was pending. He indicated that this Priority 1 call involved a family disturbance. He was additionally advised by dispatch that dispatch had on land-line at this time a female who was giving information as she received it.

Dispatch advised Lieutenant Campas that there was only one unit available at this time.

Lieutenant Campas advised dispatch that he would cover the officer who had been dispatched to the call.

Lieutenant Campas stated that he was told by dispatch that the female who was on land-line had described a volatile situation with a lot of yelling and that the suspect was very angry at this time. (Lieutenant Campas told Det. Gardner that he advised communications to keep the female on the phone.)

Lieutenant Campas was advised that he was at Fruitridge and Freeport and that he would be some time short of ten minutes to get to the location of the incident.

Lieutenant Campas indicated that he heard the primary officer mark arrival on the scene.

Lieutenant Campas stated that the officer who marked arrival said things to dispatch that made him increase his speed in response to the call.

He indicated that the officer advised dispatch that he was observing a male breaking out windows from the outside of the residence in question.

Detective Winfield asked Lieutenant Campas if he knew who the officer was who was on scene.

Lieutenant Campas stated that he had a good idea that it was Officer Leong. Lieutenant Campas indicated that he knew that Officer Leong was a new officer in phase 4 and on probation. He

indicated that Officer Leong indicated to dispatch that he would stay and standby and wait for his cover unit.

The lieutenant, Steve Campas, indicated he increased his speed as the officer discussed the suspect breaking out the windows.

Shortly thereafter, Officer Leong commented to dispatch that he was able to observe that the man who had broken out the windows had now entered back into the residence through a broken window.

He indicated that Officer Leong commented about being committed and that he would be making entry as well.

Lieutenant Steve Campas stated that he shortly thereafter arrived at the scene of the incident and saw the officer's car parked outside of the residence. He indicated that he parked his car behind the primary officer's vehicle and utilized his spot light to illuminate the outside of the residence to look for persons.

He indicated that he could see a male Black, with a white T-shirt, standing in front of the residence at the northeast corner of Deerbrook and Deerrun, across the street.

He indicate that the male Black responded to Lieutenant Campas something to the effect of, "You'd better hurry up and get in there. That officer is going to need help."

Lieutenant Campas stated he ran across the lawn and did not see anyone else outside the residence.

He indicated he did not recall seeing anything unusual outside the residence, but that he was focused primarily in looking for people and responding quickly to the interior of the residence to assist Officer Leong.

Lieutenant Campas stated that as he approached the house, he heard a lot of yelling.

He indicated as he entered the front door of the residence, there was a hall to the immediate left.

Lieutenant Campas stated that as he entered into the hallway, immediately to the left of the entrance to the residence, he had his firearm in his hand.

Lieutenant Campas stated that he heard someone yell out, "Let her go!"

Lieutenant Campas additionally stated that he heard a female yelling, who he later identified as a female Black, heavysset, with braided hair, and eventually saw her in the hallway of that residence outside the bedroom. Lieutenant Campas stated that he told the female Black with the braids to "get back" and to remove herself from the area.

Lieutenant Campas describes the bedroom in which he entered as being at the rear of the house. He indicated that the hallway runs in an easterly and westerly direction and the bedroom in which the suspect was is the southeast end of the house.

Lieutenant Campas drew a sketch of the interior of the residence.

Lieutenant Campas stated that he saw, as he entered into the room, that there was light coming from the hallway and he could hear Officer Leong yelling at the suspect something to the effect of, "Let the baby go!"

Lieutenant Campas stated as he entered the room, he could smell "OC" (mace) as he entered the room.

Lieutenant Campas stated as he entered the room, he could see Officer Leong striking on the legs of the suspect with his police baton. He indicated that Officer Leong was pleading with the suspect to "let the baby go."

Lieutenant Campas stated that the man was lying on his left side on the bed and was kicking at Officer Leong at least three times.

Lieutenant Campas stated that as he looked at the suspect, he could see in the suspect's left arm a young child or baby.

Lieutenant Campas stated that he could see that the suspect had his hand on the child's throat.

Lieutenant Campas stated that as the suspect was kicking at Officer Leong, the suspect eventually fell into a gap between the bed and the wall. He indicated that it is approximately a 1 to 2 foot gap between the bed and the wall. He indicated that the child fell into the gap with the suspect.

Lieutenant Campas describes the suspect as yelling incoherently. Lieutenant Campas stated he does not recall any specific words

that were said, only that the suspect was yelling loudly and incoherently.

He indicated he could hear a female's voice yelling ("**He's killing her. He's killing her.**") in the background as well.

Lieutenant Campas stated he then holstered his handgun. He indicated that he felt at this point he could not neutralize the suspect and his primary concerns related directly to the safety of the child.

Lieutenant Campas stated that he jumped across the bed on top of the suspect and grabbed at the suspect's right arm.

It was at this time that Lieutenant Campas noted that the suspect was completely naked. He indicated that he had noticed earlier as he entered into the room that the suspect had nothing on the top portion of his body, but was unable to see his entire bottom portion of his body.

Lieutenant Campas stated that with his left arm he grabbed the suspect around the area of his cheek.

He indicated that he saw that the young child appeared motionless. Lieutenant Campas stated that he thought that the young girl was dying and he saw a lot of blood around and on the child.

Lieutenant Campas describes the suspect as being a very large person of approximately 250 lbs. plus. He describes the suspect as being much bigger than himself.

He indicated that it was his thought that Officer Leong was a smaller officer than he was, and that it was extremely difficult for Lieutenant Campas to control the suspect's arm.

Lieutenant Campas stated that at one point he was able to pull the suspect back onto the bed. He indicated the suspect still had a hold of the young child.

Lieutenant Campas stated that he told Officer Leong to grab the child.

He indicated that the suspect was lying on top of him with his back, that is the suspect's back, on Lieutenant Campas' chest.

He indicated that he was unable to move beneath the weight of the suspect.

He indicated the suspect was approximately 3/4 of the way on the bed at the time he fell back onto Lieutenant Campas.

Lieutenant Campas stated that his plan was to try to restrain the suspect and eventually handcuff him. He indicated he was unable to get to his handcuffs because of the fact he was pinned to the bed.

Lieutenant Campas stated that the suspect continued to yell incoherently. Lieutenant Campas stated that he was beginning to get fatigued struggling with the suspect. Lieutenant Campas describes the suspect as resisting him. He indicated further that at one point the suspect was able to break his grip (**and abruptly pulled away with ease**).

Lieutenant Campas stated that he then watched as the suspect got his back up against the wall and stood up close to the wall.

He indicated as he looked at the suspect standing, he could see he was approximately 6'2"/6'3". He indicated that the suspect got up real quick and was coming toward him. He describes him as lunging towards him.

He indicated that the suspect raised his right arm above his shoulders and his left arm to his shoulders as if he were preparing to lunge toward Lieutenant Campas.

He indicated that the suspect then let out a real loud yell and was coming at Lieutenant Campas.

He indicated that he was still positioned back on the bed on his back, and at that point directly thereafter was able to pull his handgun from his holster and began shooting at the suspect.

Lieutenant Campas stated that when he first began shooting at the suspect, it did not appear that the shots affected the suspect.

He indicated that he then heard Officer Leong firing his weapon toward the suspect. He indicated that Officer Leong was to his immediate right.

He indicated that shortly after he heard Officer Leong fire his weapon, he noted that the suspect jerked to his left and then collapsed to the floor.

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Lieutenant Campas stated he then got off the bed and went out of the room to check on the child.

He indicated that he told Officer Leong to put out to dispatch that shots were fired.

Detective Winfield asked Lieutenant Campas if he had made any radio transmissions prior to shooting the suspect.

Lieutenant Campas stated that when he walked into the bedroom, he saw Officer Leong hitting the suspect with his baton. He further stated that he could smell the "OC".

He indicated that he took his radio and immediately called for additional cover.

Lieutenant Campas stated that he felt the suspect would injure him and he also feared that they would get into a struggle for his gun.

The Lieutenant Campas stated that he considered that both he and Officer Leong were in severe jeopardy and ran the risk of being injured because of the suspect's attitude.

Detective Winfield asked Lieutenant Campas if he thought that he and Officer Leong could control the suspect.

Lieutenant Campas stated that he did not think he could control him, nor did Officer Leong think that he could control the suspect. He went on to state that he did his best and asked for assistance.

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Lieutenant Campas stated that he cannot remember any specific words that the suspect said. (Lieutenant Campas told Det. Gardner that he remembered the suspect repeatedly saying, "I'll take her with me" or "I'll take her, I'll take her" while laying partly on the bed and floor or standing/kneeling in the gap between the bed and the wall.)

He indicated that he does recall trying to plead with the suspect to let the child go.

He indicated that the suspect did not respond.

Detective Winfield asked Lieutenant Campas if he smelled any alcohol coming from the area of the suspect.

He indicated that he did not; the only thing that he could smell was the "OC".

There was a short break while Lieutenant Campas used the rest room.

Upon reconvening, Detective Winfield asked Lieutenant Campas about the lighting in the room.

Again Lieutenant Campas stated that the room was dark, but that there was light coming from the hallway.

He indicated that there was no light coming from inside of the bedroom, but that he did recall lights coming from the north portion of the house. He indicated further that he was able to

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make out specific facial features and individual injuries to the child.

The suspect stated that the bedroom that he was in was approximately 15X20 feet.

Lieutenant Campas stated that he was dressed just as he is now, that is in his full police uniform, including badge and patches identifying him as a Sacramento Police Officer.

He stated that there was no question about the fact that the suspect would have known that he was a police officer because of his uniform as well as the fact that he transmitted a broadcast shortly after, as he entered into the bedroom on his police radio.

Detective Winfield asked if, having made the observation of the suspect, hearing the windows being broken by the suspect, going into the bedroom and observing that the suspect did not respond to "OC", nor did the suspect respond to the baton, the fact that the suspect was naked, and raised his arms and lunged toward Lieutenant Campas, assisted him in understanding what the possible condition of the suspect was.

Lieutenant Campas stated that it was his opinion that two things are possible. He continued that it was either that the suspect was under the influence of some sort of narcotic, possibly "PCP", or that the suspect was intoxicated. The officer stated that he could not smell any alcohol with the stringent smell of "OC".

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Again Lieutenant Campas stated that it seemed like his initial rounds shot at the suspect did not disable the suspect.

He continued that only after Officer Leong shot the suspect, did the suspect actually collapse.

Lieutenant Campas stated that he was directly in fear of his safety and Officer Leong's safety.

Detective Winfield asked Lieutenant Campas what was it that assisted him in deciding that he had to result in lethal force against the suspect.

He indicated that, with all of the circumstances and the fact that he felt that not only himself but Officer Leong were in eminent danger from the suspect, and that they could not control the suspect, he had no choice but the result in lethal force.

Lieutenant Campas advised that he carries a Sig Sauer model 226 and that he would relinquish his weapon to Detective Winfield.

He indicated that he carries his weapon in a fully duty loaded condition and that would amount to fifteen rounds in the magazine and one in the chamber.

When asked to unload his weapon, it was apparent that he currently had eight rounds in the magazine and one in the chamber, leaving seven rounds to have been expended at the scene.

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OFFICER INTERVIEW: CAMPAS, S.

Detective Winfield advised the lieutenant that we would be taking his shirt as there appeared to be some evidence in the way of body fluids on his shirt.

Campas stated that he was trying to grab the suspect and get the child from him when he observed that the child was very bloody and that the blood on his shirt most probably came from the child because he does not recall seeing any injury to the suspect at this point.

Lieutenant Campas advised Detective Winfield entered into the residence, he saw that the place was in jumbles. He describes the table as being overturned and the general condition of the interior of the residence as shambles.

Lieutenant Campas stated that near the entry of the residence, he saw a live round and believes he saw a spent casing as well.

He indicated he did not know where those rounds came from.

He indicated that he had no additional information that he wished to relay at this time, and the interview was concluded.

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OFFICER INTERVIEW: **CAMPAS, S.**

RECONTACT WITH LIEUTENANT STEVE CAMPAS ON 02/22/96:

On 02/22/96 approximately 2045 hrs., I (Det. J. Gardner #404,) contacted Lieutenant Campas at J.E.R.P.F. for the purpose of allowing him to review his statement as recorded by Det. T. Winfield and to advise of any changes or discrepancies. Any changes from the above statement made by Lieutenant Campas were highlighted in bold letterhead by Det. Gardner

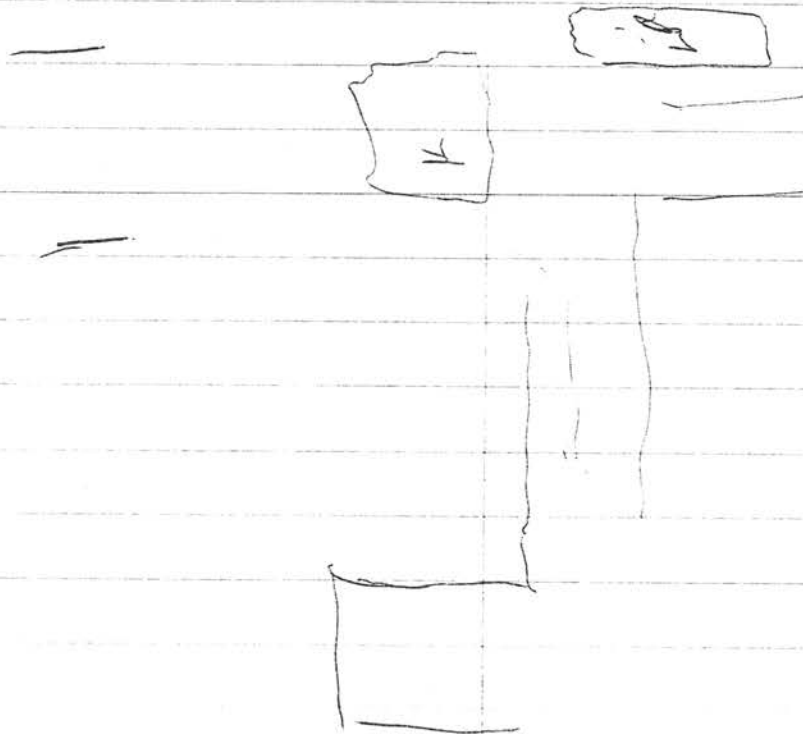
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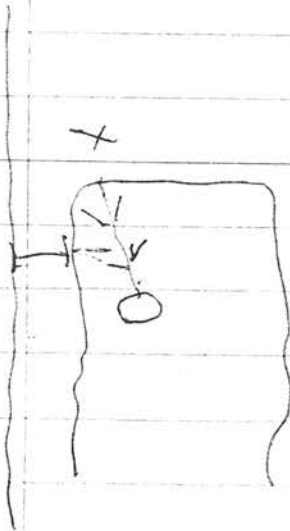

0615 hours, February 17, 1996. I interviewed the witness in the interview room in the Homicide Detail.

This interview was audio taped, and this is a summary of that interview.

Witness stated that he had been over his uncle's house, [REDACTED] over off of Mack and Deerhaven or Deerfield Way. He stated that he was there watching the house while his uncle and his wife and kids had gone out to a comedy show.

Witness indicated that Stacy Davis, his cousin, his cousin's wife, [REDACTED] and daughter [REDACTED] had come over to visit while he was there.

Witness was not sure what time of day this was, when they came over to visit.

Witness indicated that they were all sitting in the back room, and that his cousin, Stacy, had been very moody for the past week. His cousin, Stacy, was sitting on the couch in the den, relaxing, when he started talking, saying things from the verses out of the bible, and also saying I'm going to die tonight in this house.

Witness stated that his cousin, Stacy, had been accusing every male cousin, friends around him of having an affair with his wife, [REDACTED]. He was so obsessed with this, this evening, that the witness, who carries a gun for protection, stated that when Stacy first came over and walked in the house, Stacy patted him down, and felt that he had a gun on him.

Witness stated that when he was sitting on the couch back in the den, he had taken the gun and put it in between the couch cushions, unbeknownst to him Stacy had seen him put the gun there. Witness stated that Stacy reached for the gun and called for his daughter to come into the room, and his wife also came into the room.

Stacy had taken the clip out of the gun and pointed it to his daughter's head, and then also pointed it to his wife's head stating, Are you cheating on me? Witness stated that Stacy's wife, talking to him, made Stacy put the gun down on the table. Witness stated at this time he reached and grabbed the gun, and put it in his pants.

Witness stated that during this time at the house, he saw that Stacy was very upset, and talking, and accusing every man of having an affair with his wife. Witness stated that he and Stacy had smoked a marijuana joint that evening, and that Stacy hadn't drank any alcohol while at the house, and only smoke the marijuana joint, to his knowledge.

Witness stated that his friends had come over, so he decided to leave, but prior to leaving, Stacy pleaded with him to leave the gun because he wanted to kill himself. Witness stated that he said no, he left, and went to the North Area to visit his sister.

Witness stated that he thinks he came back to the residence about 10:30 that evening. He didn't feel it was right to leave the house unattended, so when his Uncle [REDACTED] comes back home, he wanted to be there.

Witness stated that when he got back to the house, Stacy was just sitting on the couch relaxing, so he sat and joined him, and about

thirty minutes later, he thinks it was about 11:00, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s wife, and their three kids showed up. At this time, witness stated that the women and the kids stayed up in the front living room of the house, while he, his Uncle [REDACTED] and Stacy were in the back room, den area, talking.

Witness stated that Stacy got up and started walking between the two rooms, walking down the hall, and was talking stuff, was ranting and raving. Finally, [REDACTED]'s wife came into the room and told her husband, [REDACTED], that Stacy was scaring the kids, so [REDACTED] confronted Stacy in the kitchen area and told him that he had to leave.

Witness stated that he heard a commotion, like a fight was going on, and finally [REDACTED]'s wife came to him and said, Can you help them [REDACTED]? They're fighting. We need them out of the house. ^{HIM}

Witness stated that he went to the kitchen and saw that his Uncle [REDACTED] had taken the fireplace wood pokers that were made out of metal iron, and saw him hitting Stacy with them, and saw that there was no affect at all on Stacy.

Witness stated that he got in between [REDACTED] and Stacy, and was trying to break them up, when Stacy turned on him and accused him of having an affair with his wife. Witness stated that they began to fight, and were wrestling, and he fell to the floor, and when he fell to the floor, the gun that he had in his front pants pocket fell out and slid across the floor. Witness stated that he saw that Stacy was trying to get it, so he managed to get the gun before him, and pointed it at Stacy. Stacy turned and ran out the front door. Witness stated that he followed him out the front door

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and pointed the gun up in the air and fired two rounds to scare him off. Witness stated that he saw that Stacy had walked over to his car to get something, cause the car was parked right in front of the house, and he can see from the front living room door. At this time, witness stated he saw a police officer in a car across the street, sitting there, and observed Stacy to come to the house and start breaking out windows. Witness stated that he and [redacted] saw that Stacy was crawling to the front window, so they ran to the back of the house. In the meantime, they told their wives and kids to hide in one of the rooms.

Witness stated that he ran out the back door with his uncle, and as he ran out the back door, the threw his 9mm pistol into one of the garbage cans there.

Witness stated that he saw another officer show up, and saw that officer go into the house, and a few minutes later he heard about six to twelve gunshots. Witness stated that he had seen his cousin, Stacy, like this for the past week, where he was accusing everybody of having an affair with his wife. He saw Stacy slap his wife a few times, and was having problems with other family members.

Witness stated that he was told by his mom and grandmother that Stacy was looking for him, and wanted to hurt him because he felt that he had an affair with his wife.

Witness stated that Stacy kept saying that he wanted to be with his mom and brother who are dead, and that he was going to die tonight.

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Witness stated that when he was fighting Stacy, he saw that he was extremely strong, he was mad, upset, and that Stacy was a large man, at least 6'1"-6'2", 250 plus lbs.

Witness stated that Stacy had been tripping (his term) lately, worrying about his wife having an affair. Witness stated that Stacy and his wife had been married about six or seven years, and that they've had a very violent relationship, and that Stacy had hit and beat his wife on several occasions.

Witness stated that he felt in his own mind, that Stacy was going to hurt or kill somebody tonight, or he was going to be hurt or killed.

Witness felt that, that was the state of mind that Stacy was in tonight, by the way he was acting, and yelling, and ranting, and raving and making comments from the bible.

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OFFICER INTERVIEW: LEONG, Norman

On 2-17-96 at approximately 0640 hours, Detective Winfield conducted an interview with a Norman Leong. This interview was conducted at the Sacramento Police Department, 813 6th Street, Homicide Division interview room.

Norman Leong is a Sacramento City Police Officer assigned to Field Operations Patrol.

Present during the interview was SPOA Legal Representative, Casey Clark.

The interview was both audio/video recorded.

The following is a summary of that interview.

Norman Leong advised Detective Winfield that he is twenty-four years of age, and has been on patrol as a Sacramento Police Officer for the past ten months.

He indicated he graduated with the Sacramento Police Academy 94-BR1.

He indicated that he started the Sacramento Police Academy as a Police Officer in November of 1994, and completed the academy in March of 1995.

He indicated he began his training program in April of 1995, and is currently a Phase 4 Recruit. He indicated he has ten months experience on patrol, and since November (**October**) of 1995 has been a solo unit in a Phase 4 capacity.

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He indicated he has been working in the South Area since November of 1994, and his designator for today's date was Alpha 23.

The Officer, Norman Leong, indicated that this incident occurred in District #24.

Detective Winfield asked what his stature was.

He indicated he is 5'4"/145 lbs.

Detective Winfield asked Officer Leong when the first time he heard the call was.

He indicated that a swing shift unit originally got the call at about 02:45 a.m.

Officer Leong indicated that he was at a stabbing call at that time, at the Denny's Restaurant on Mack Rd.

He indicated that when he heard the call come out, he knew that the swing shift officer was due to get off duty at 0300 hours, and thereby cancelled the swing shift unit, and elected to go with Lt. Campas to the call.

He indicated that the pending call was a 242 in progress. He indicated that the information that came out originally is rather foggy to him, but that he did recall that it was suppose to have been a 242 in progress with a male Black suspect. He indicated he could not recall specifics.

The Officer, Leong, indicated that he thought that Dispatch advised him that the guy was out of control, and possibly a 5150.

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OFFICER INTERVIEW: LEONG, Norman

Officer Leong indicated that he responded from the Denny's Restaurant and was approximately a total of three to four minutes away from the scene of the incident at the time of his dispatch. He indicated he briefly checked his map book to determine the exact location of Deerbrook.

He indicated he then drove over to the area of the call.

Officer Leong indicated that he parked his vehicle approximately six to seven houses away from the scene. He indicated that he was seated there in his vehicle when he heard someone yelling outside of a residence which he then figured was the residence where the incident was reported as coming from.

Officer Leong stated he could hear someone yelling, and then saw a guy walking back and forth in front of a residence.

He indicated that he was parked out in front of a residence with an address of the last two digits as being [REDACTED].

He indicated that shortly thereafter, he heard some glass breaking from the outside front area of the residence at the scene of the incident.

He indicated that he reported his observations, and his position was that he would maintain his position, and wait for his cover unit.

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OFFICER INTERVIEW: LEONG, Norman

He indicated when he first arrived at the location where he planned to wait for his cover unit, he had his headlights on, and then after he heard the glass breaking, he had turned his headlights off, only having his break (parking) lights illuminated.

He indicated he continued to wait for his cover unit. He indicated the male subject he had seen out in front of the residence then broke another window, and it was at this time that he saw the suspect climb into the broken window and enter the residence.

He indicated he then advised Dispatch of his observations, (that he would enter the residence) and drove up to the scene of the incident.

He indicated he got out of his vehicle, and advised that he was making entry into the residence.

He indicated he was walking to the front door of the residence when he saw two male Blacks walking along the left side of the residence as you face it. He indicated they were walking from the backyard, into the side yard, and out to the front.

He indicated that one of the Black subjects stated that the guy who was the suspect had just gone inside, and that he better get in there.

The officer stated he did not question the subjects further, but had some feeling that there was someone else inside of the residence, along with the suspect.

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OFFICER INTERVIEW: LEONG, Norman

He indicated he then went to the front door (which was locked) and a lady was at the door, and he got a quick glance of her. (Officer Leong stated that someone, possibly a lady, opened the door and once inside, he observed a lady with a child running from the east hallway.)

He indicated he told the female to get out of the residence. He indicated that he did recall tripping on his way up to the house, and that was why he had skinned his knee area.

He indicated that as he entered into the residence, he told everyone, in a loud voice, to get out of the house.

He indicated that the female who he saw walking down the hallway, just outside the bedroom where the suspect was, was told also to get out of the residence by Officer Leong.

He indicated that he then stood in the doorway of the southeast bedroom, and looked in and saw a little girl underneath the legs and pinned onto the bed by a subject who appeared to be a large Black male.

It was apparent to the officer that the little girl, possibly ten years of age, was unable to move from beneath the suspect's control.

Officer Leong describes the suspect as a big subject, 6'0"/200+ lbs.

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OFFICER INTERVIEW: LEONG, Norman

He indicated the suspect was completely nude, and he remembers the suspect muttering something, and at one point, heard him utter the words, "Kill me."

The officer stated that when he saw the suspect maintaining control over the child, he put the information over the radio and requested Code 3 cover, that he had a possible hostage situation. **(Officer Leong stated that communications may not have heard his request for cover as he had trouble with the radio on the call prior to this one.)**

Officer Leong stated he drew his weapon, and was prepared to hold the suspect at bay when the suspect began hitting the child with a closed fist in her face. He indicated he saw the suspect strike the victim in her face, twice.

It was at this time that Officer Leong determined that he had to do something, rather than just stand there and hold the suspect at bay with his handgun **(and wait for cover.)**

He indicated that the suspect did not appear to be concerned about his handgun, and he was afraid that the suspect was going to kill the child with his severe blows to her face.

He described the child as being very small, and the suspect as being very large. He indicated further that the suspect struck the victim full force with a closed fist in the area of her face.

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OFFICER INTERVIEW: LEONG, Norman

Officer Leong stated he then grabbed his Mace, got within two to three feet of the suspect, and sprayed the Mace in his direction.

He indicated the suspect put his head down just prior to Officer Leong spraying the Mace in his direction, and that it was apparent to Officer Leong that none of the OC gas had gone into the eyes or orifices of the suspect.

The officer stated that he then determined that the Mace most likely would not work **(because the suspect raised his head and grabbed the girl by the head and neck as if he was going to twist her neck.)** Officer Leong then took his baton out of his baton ring, went around the bed to the rear of the suspect, and struck the suspect three times full force in the area of his middle back to no avail.

He indicated that the suspect did not even budge, and did not appear to be the least bit phased by these blows.

Officer Leong stated that he had told the suspect to release the child on more than one occasion, and as he was swinging the baton at the suspect, Lt. Campas entered into the bedroom.

He indicated that Lt. Campas jumped over the bed and grabbed the suspect around the area of his head.

Officer Leong stated that he attempted to grab the suspect's right arm and pull it back, to attempt to free the child. **(Officer Leong**

stated he attempted to grab and attempt to free the child but the suspect had hold of the girl's legs.)

He indicated that a female then walked into the room, and as Lt. Campas had the suspect around the area of his head, and Officer Leong had the suspect's right arm, Officer Leong advised the female to grab the suspect's left side arm, and they were able to free the child, and the woman took the child away from the immediate area. (Officer Leong stated as Lieutenant Campas had the suspect around his head that Officer Leong advised the female to grab the girl's left arm as he grabbed the girl's right arm. Officer Leong stated they were able to free the child and the woman took the child from the immediate area. Officer Leong then pulled the suspect's right arm behind his back when the suspect threw him onto the floor, on his back, at the foot of the bed.)

Officer Leong indicated that it was quite dark in the room, and that there was a period of time when he used his flashlight to illuminate the interior of the room.

The witness, Leong, stated that when he and Lt. Campas were attempting to subdue the suspect, he recalls falling back onto his back, onto the floor.

He indicated that he was not sure how he fell to his back, but that it was either his losing his footing, or the suspect shoving him to the ground.

He indicated that he was on the floor, on his back, for approximately two seconds, and it was in that two second period of time that he heard two shots ring out from inside the bedroom.

He indicated as he got up to his feet (**looked up**), he saw that Lt. Campas was on his side with the suspect hovering over him.

Officer Leong states he did not remember drawing his gun, but he does recall that he shot his gun, but cannot really remember pulling the trigger.

He estimates his distance away from the suspect as approximately four feet.

He indicated that when he got up (**looked up**) from the position of being knocked or falling to his back, from the floor to a standing position, he observed that the suspect was hovering over Campas as close as three or four inches away from Lt. Campas.

The witness, Officer Leong, stated that when he looked up from the floor and saw the suspect standing over Lt. Campas, the suspect could have been on one knee against the bed, or could have been in a standing position.

Officer Leong indicated that somewhere in the altercation, he lost his glasses. He indicated that it most probably was when he fell onto his back.

Officer Leong indicated that when I first went into the room, suspect looked right at him, and he commanded the suspect to, "let the child go."

Officer Leong indicated that it was apparent to him that the suspect did not care about Officer Leong's gun, and it was Officer Leong's intention to just hold his position and wait for cover.

He indicated that it was when the suspect began slugging the child in the face, that he realized he must respond. He indicated that he was afraid for the child because of the way the suspect was striking blows on the victim's face.

After the failed effort with the Mace, and the failed effort with the baton, Campas entered the room.

Again, Officer Leong indicated that the suspect did not appear to feel the baton striking him in his back at all.

Officer Leong stated that it was apparent to him that Lt. Campas just wanted to get the girl free from the suspect's grip, and that was their first intention.

He indicated that when they were finally able to get the child free, that was when Officer Leong fell to his back.

He indicated that's when he got up (**looked up**) and saw Campas laying on the bed to his side, and the suspect hovering over him.

When Officer Leong got up (**looked up**) from his position of being knocked or falling to the floor, and heard the shots fired, he looked in the direction of the suspect and saw that he did not appear to be stopped from his behavior.

He indicated that the suspect did not fall to the ground at this time, and it was at that time that he believed he pulled his weapon out and shot rounds, and immediately thereafter, the suspect collapsed to the floor.

Officer Leong states he heard about two shots coming from Campas's gun, he thought, and that he thought he additionally shot a couple of times. He indicate he is right handed, but this whole incident happened so very fast, it is all a blur to him.

Officer Leong stated that his glasses are still missing, and presumably at the scene, as is his baton.

Officer Leong stated that Lt. Campas would have been in fear of his own safety.

Detective Winfield then asked the officer to relinquish his weapon, and it was determined that the officer, Leong, had three remaining live rounds in his magazine and one in his chamber.

Officer Leong stated that he is certain that his gun was fully loaded at the time this incident began.

The Officer, Leong, stated that after the shots were fired at the suspect, he held the suspect at bay for a couple of minutes while Lt. Campas went into the adjoining room to attempt to help the child who had been held by the suspect.

He indicated that he thought that Lt. Campas had also made some radio transmissions, and that he held his gun on the suspect for approximately two minutes, until Lt. Campas entered back into the room and told him that he could put his gun away, that the guy would not be getting up.

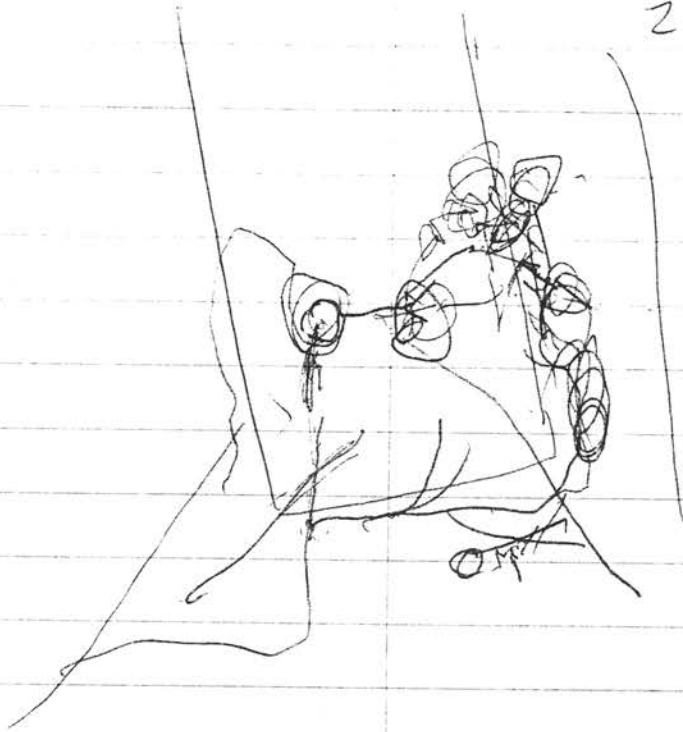

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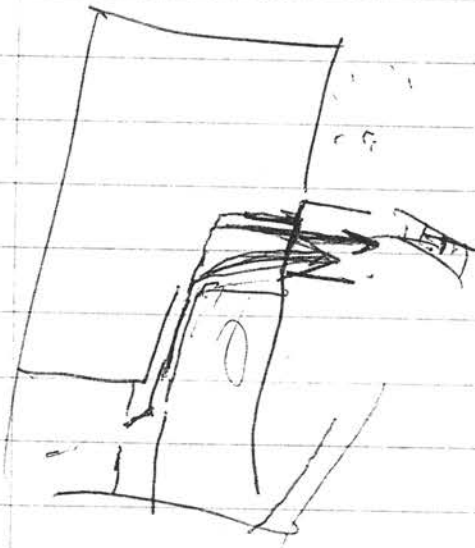

This interview was audio and video taped, and this is a summary of that interview.

I advised [REDACTED] that I was one of the officers doing a follow-up investigation on the shooting, and that I wanted to find out from her as to what happened this evening.

Witness indicated that she and her husband had gone out to a show this evening, and that they returned about 1:30-1:45 this morning. They had stopped and picked up their children and returned home.

Witness stated that she and her husband had left the house in the care of his nephew, [REDACTED] and when they pulled up in front of their residence, they saw a white vehicle which they did not recognize.

Witness stated they entered the house and saw that Stacy and his wife and little girl were in the residence, along with [REDACTED]

Witness stated that she stayed in the front living room with Stacy's wife and her daughter while Stacy was in the den with her husband, [REDACTED] and nephew [REDACTED] playing Nintendo.

Witness stated that Stacy kept walking back and forth between the two rooms, and had told her that he had been smoking sherns, and started arguing with his wife. Stacy started punching and hitting his wife, so I went and told my husband you have to get Stacy out of here.

Witness stated her son was underneath the covers there, and was afraid, scared, and she got him out, along with her other two kids, while Stacy's wife was hiding in the bathroom.

██████████ stated he stayed outside on the front lawn or on the sidewalk by his car, and he heard both officers yelling at Stacy to let the girl go, put the girl down. ██████████ stated he had learned from his wife that Stacy had grabbed his own daughter, and was punching her in the face while he laid on the bed with her.

██████████ stated that he heard the officers yell repeatedly, and then he heard silence, and then he heard gunshots.

On 02/18/96, approximately 1100 hours, I arrived at the Sacramento County Coroner's office where I contacted Dr. Mark Fajardo, a Sacramento County Forensic Pathologist. At this time, Dr. Fajardo was conducting an autopsy on deceased victim Stacy Davis, a male Black adult, who was identified by a toe tag on his left toe, with the coroner's report number of 96-0784. The decedent was the same individual who I had observed inside the southeast bedroom early this morning at ██████████ Deerbrook Drive.

Dr. Fajardo advised the decedent, Stacy Davis, received thirteen gunshot entry wounds to his body with eight projectiles having been located during the X-ray examination.

Dr. Fajardo then pointed out the thirteen mentioned gunshot wound entry wounds, and stated only two of the eight projectiles had been removed from the decedent at this time.

I asked Dr. Fajardo as to any associated injuries on the decedent's body. Dr. Fajardo stated there were incisions on the decedent's right arm in the biceps area, superficial scratches on the inside forearm, incisions on the palm of the right hand, a scratch on the left biceps area of the left forearm, lacerations on the left pinky and ring finger, and abrasions to the lower left leg. Dr. Fajardo stated he associated the above injuries with a sharp object of some type which could be consistent with the subject having jumped through a broken window. Dr. Fajardo also advised me the decedent's stomach was empty.

I remained present at the autopsy until approximately 1315 hours, at which time I left. At the time I left, Dr. Fajardo had removed two projectiles from the decedent's body with four additional projectiles yet to be recovered. I advised Dr.

Fajardo I would recontact him in order to have him list and describe the thirteen gunshot wounds.

On 02/20/96, approximately 1530 hours, I contacted Dr. Mark Fajardo at the Sacramento County Coroner's office via phone. Dr. Fajardo provided me with a list of the thirteen gunshot wound entries and associated information.

GUNSHOT WOUND #1: Entrance wound into the backside of the right arm on the forearm, midway between the elbow and wrist with the exit wound on the outer part of the right arm midway between the elbow and wrist. The direction of travel for the bullet wound was forward and very slightly upward (with the arm resting against the side of the body and the palm facing outward). Dr. Fajardo listed this wound as a **distant range** through-and-through gunshot wound with no tattooing or stippling and no projectile recovered.

GUNSHOT WOUND #2: This wound was into the right side of the body approximately 2 to 3 inches diagonally downward from the right nipple and away from the center of the body. The direction of travel was backward, slightly upward and to the left. Dr. Fajardo classified the wound as an **intermediate range** gunshot wound with a 5 inch area in circumference of stippling and tattooing. Dr. Fajardo stated a **copper jacketed projectile** was recovered from this wound. Dr. Fajardo stated **this wound would have been fatal** as the projectile traveled through the sixth rib, the right lung, under and just missing the aorta and through the left lower lung.

GUNSHOT WOUND #3: Entered into the right upper chest area, just under the collarbone. The direction of travel was backward, slightly downward, and slightly to the left. Dr. Fajardo classified this as a **distance range** gunshot wound with no tattooing or stippling. Dr. Fajardo stated the projectile fractured a couple of ribs on the right side of the chest and penetrated through the scapula (shoulder blade). Dr. Fajardo stated a **white metallic aluminum projectile** (Silvertip round) was recovered from this wound.

GUNSHOT WOUND #4: Entered into the left upper chest, in the midline area and at the base of the neck. Dr. Fajardo classified this as an **intermediate range** gunshot wound with a 5 inch circumference area of stippling and powder burns. Dr. Fajardo stated the projectile traveled front to back, slightly downward, and to the right. Dr. Fajardo stated a **copper jacketed projectile** was recovered from this wound. Dr. Fajardo stated the round went straight into the shoulder blade.

GUNSHOT WOUND #5: Was a large grazing wound with the entrance to the upper chest, adjacent to the midline with a direction of travel slightly backward, slightly upward, and to the left. Dr. Fajardo stated the projectile exited the left upper chest, adjacent to the collar bone. Dr. Fajardo classified this as a **distant range** gunshot wound, having no tattooing or stippling.

there was an associated exit wound on the left upper back. Dr. Fajardo classified this as a through-and-through **distance range** gunshot wound.

GUNSHOT WOUND #7: Dr. Fajardo stated this was the same type of wound as gunshot wound #6, into the front part of the left upper arm shoulder area with the direction of travel front to back and to the left. Dr. Fajardo stated there was an associated exit wound to the left upper arm and classified the wound as a **distant range** through-and-through gunshot wound with no tattooing or stippling.

GUNSHOT WOUND #8: Was to the upper abdomen, in the midline, with the direction of travel front to back, slightly upward and to the left. Dr. Fajardo classified this wound as a **distant range** gunshot wound which traveled through the diaphragm, through the stomach, and superficially grazed the spleen. Dr. Fajardo stated a **copper jacketed projectile** was recovered from this wound. Dr. Fajardo stated **this wound would have been fatal**, but that the decedent would have taken several minutes to die.

GUNSHOT WOUND #9: Into the left middle abdomen area, adjacent to the left umbilicus (belly button) with the direction of travel front to back and slightly to the right. Dr. Fajardo stated there was a soot ring around the wound, consistent with a **contact to near-contact** gunshot wound. Dr. Fajardo stated they recovered a **copper jacketed projectile** from this wound. Dr. Fajardo stated the projectile traveled through loops of bowels or intestines and lodged into the Psoas muscle.

GUNSHOT WOUND #10: Entered into the left upper arm, adjacent to the left armpit with the direction of travel slightly backward, slightly downward and to the right. Dr. Fajardo described an exit wound within the armpit on the arm's side, with a reentry gunshot wound in the armpit on the chest wall side. Dr. Fajardo stated they recovered a **lead fragment**, with no associated jacket, from this wound. Dr. Fajardo classified the wound as a **distant range** gunshot wound with no tattooing or stippling.

GUNSHOT WOUND #11: A grazing wound, with the entrance into the left middle lower leg, traveling front to back, slightly downward and to the left. Dr. Fajardo described this as a through-and-through type wound, and classified it as a **distant range** gunshot wound having no tattooing or stippling.

GUNSHOT WOUND #12: Entrance into the back of the left upper arm, adjacent to the armpit with the direction of travel slightly forward, downward, and slightly to the right. Dr. Fajardo classified this as a **distant range** gunshot wound with no tattooing or stippling. Dr. Fajardo stated they recovered a **white metallic aluminum jacketed projectile** (Silvertip Round) from this wound. Dr. Fajardo described the wound as a superficial wound into the muscles or chest and not into the body cavity.

GUNSHOT WOUND #13: Entrance wound into the right side of the chest with the direction of travel front to back, very slightly upward, and to the left. Dr. Fajardo classified this wound as a **distant range** gunshot wound through and

stopping in the right lung, with no tattooing or stippling. Dr. Fajardo stated they recovered a **copper jacketed projectile** from this wound.

Dr. Fajardo stated the cause of death would be multiple gunshot wounds to the decedent. Dr. Fajardo stated there were no rounds fired into the decedent that would cause instantaneous death, but that gunshot wound #2 and gunshot wound #8 would be fatal with the decedent to die within several minutes after having been shot.

On 03/02/96 approximately 1000 hours, I recontacted Dr. Fajardo via phone. Dr. Fajardo provided me with remaining four type of projectiles associated to gun shot wounds #2, 3, 4 and 8 which were incorporated in this report.

NOTE: Lieutenant Steve Campas' issued departmental handgun was a 9mm, semi-automatic, Sig Sauer brand pistol, **Model number 226**, which fired Winchester brand, Super-X, 9mm Luger copper jacketed hollow point, 147 grain, Subsonic rounds. The pistol was combat loaded with sixteen (16) live rounds.

Officer Leon Norman's issued departmental handgun was a 9mm, semi-automatic, Sig Sauer brand pistol, **Model number 225**, which fired Winchester brand, Super-X, 9mm Luger Silvertip Hollow Point, 115 grain rounds. The pistol was combat loaded with nine (9) rounds.

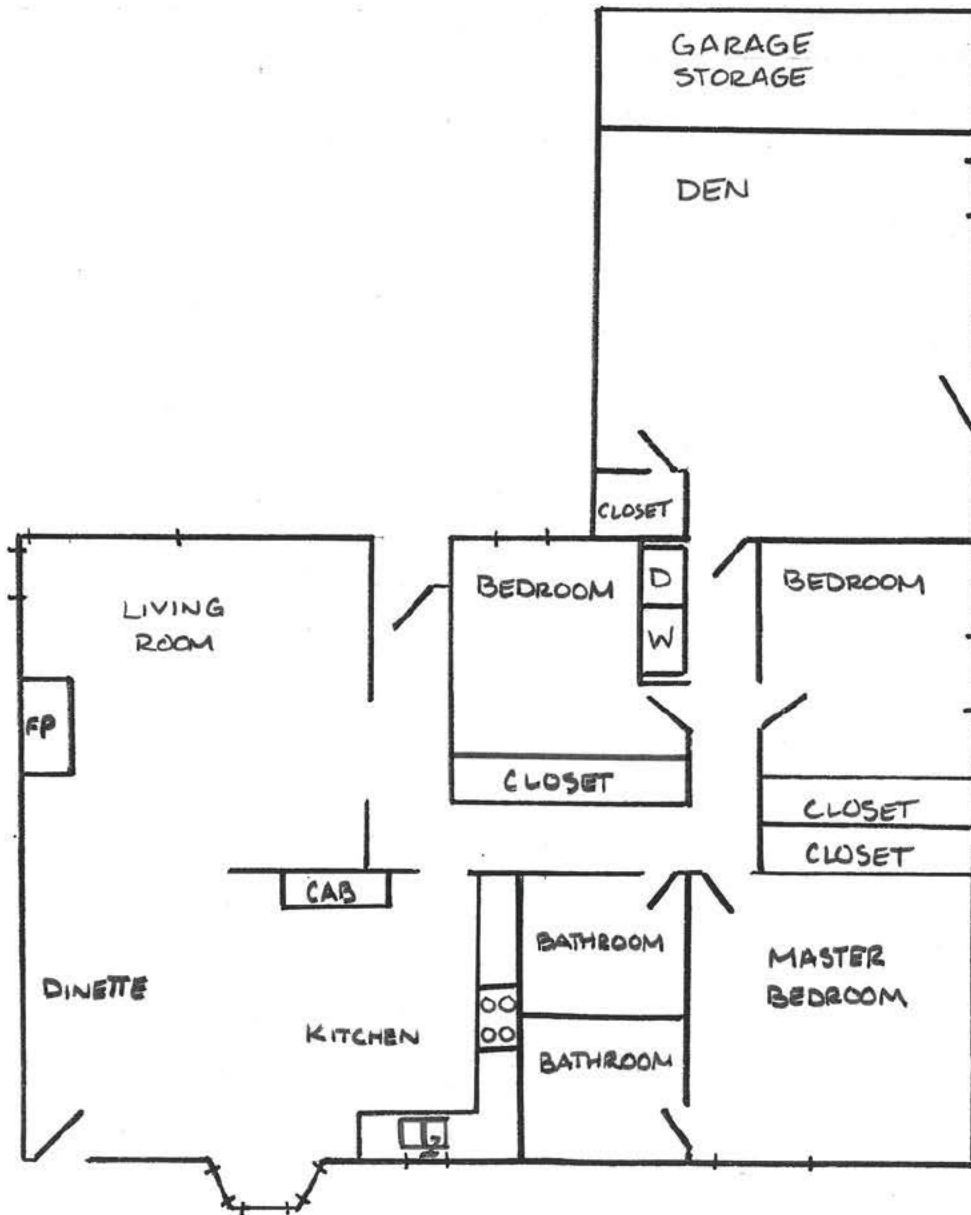

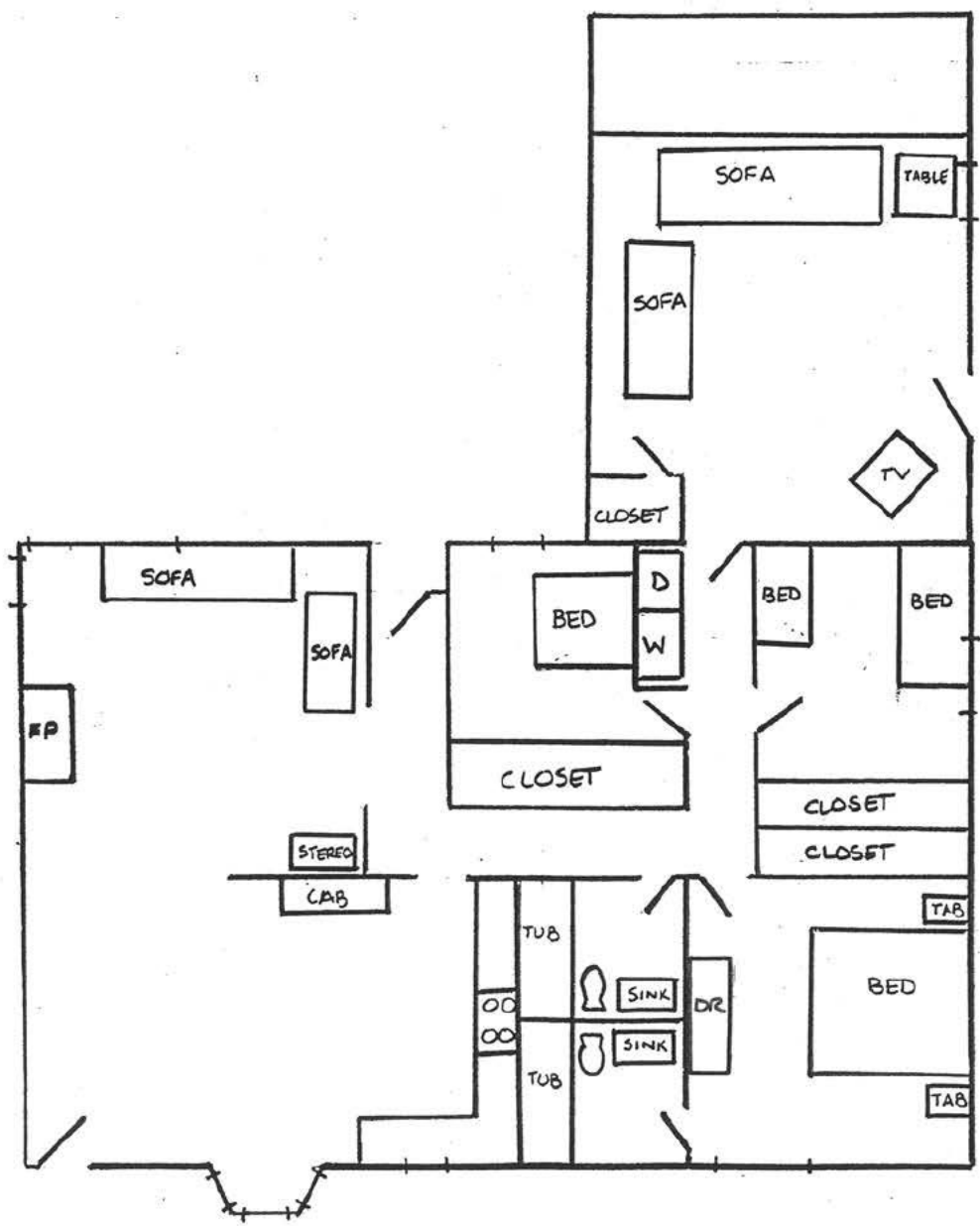

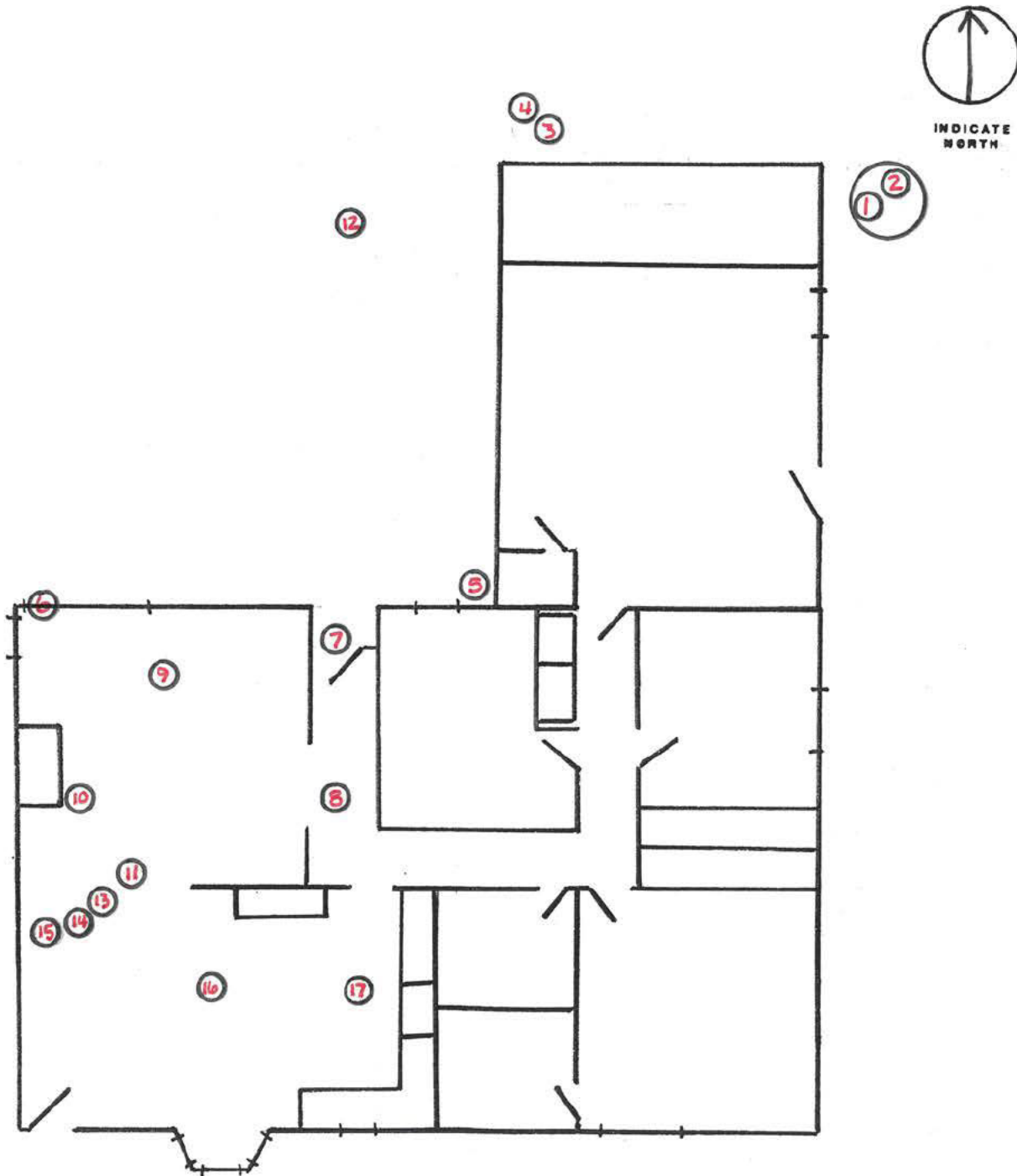

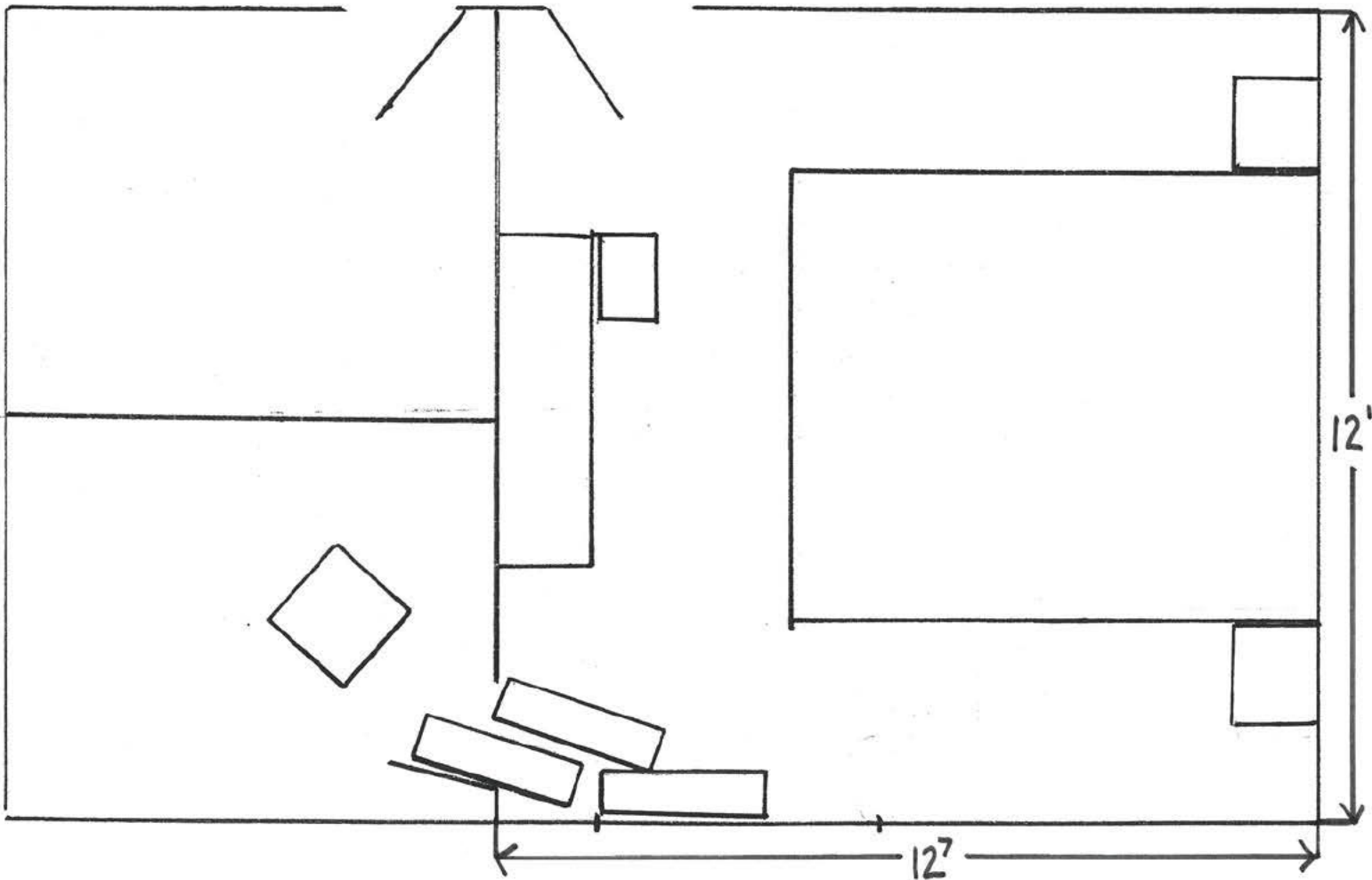

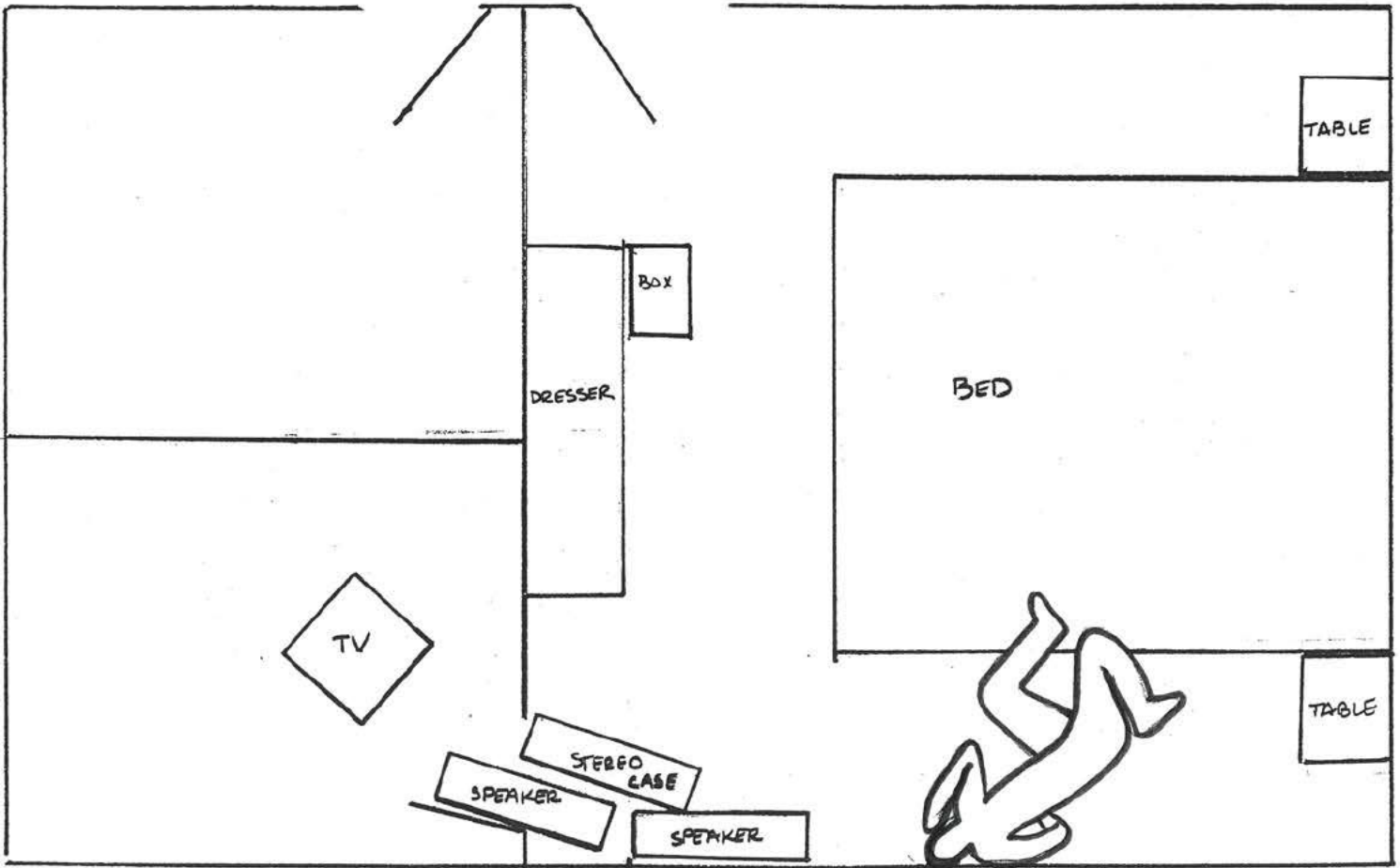

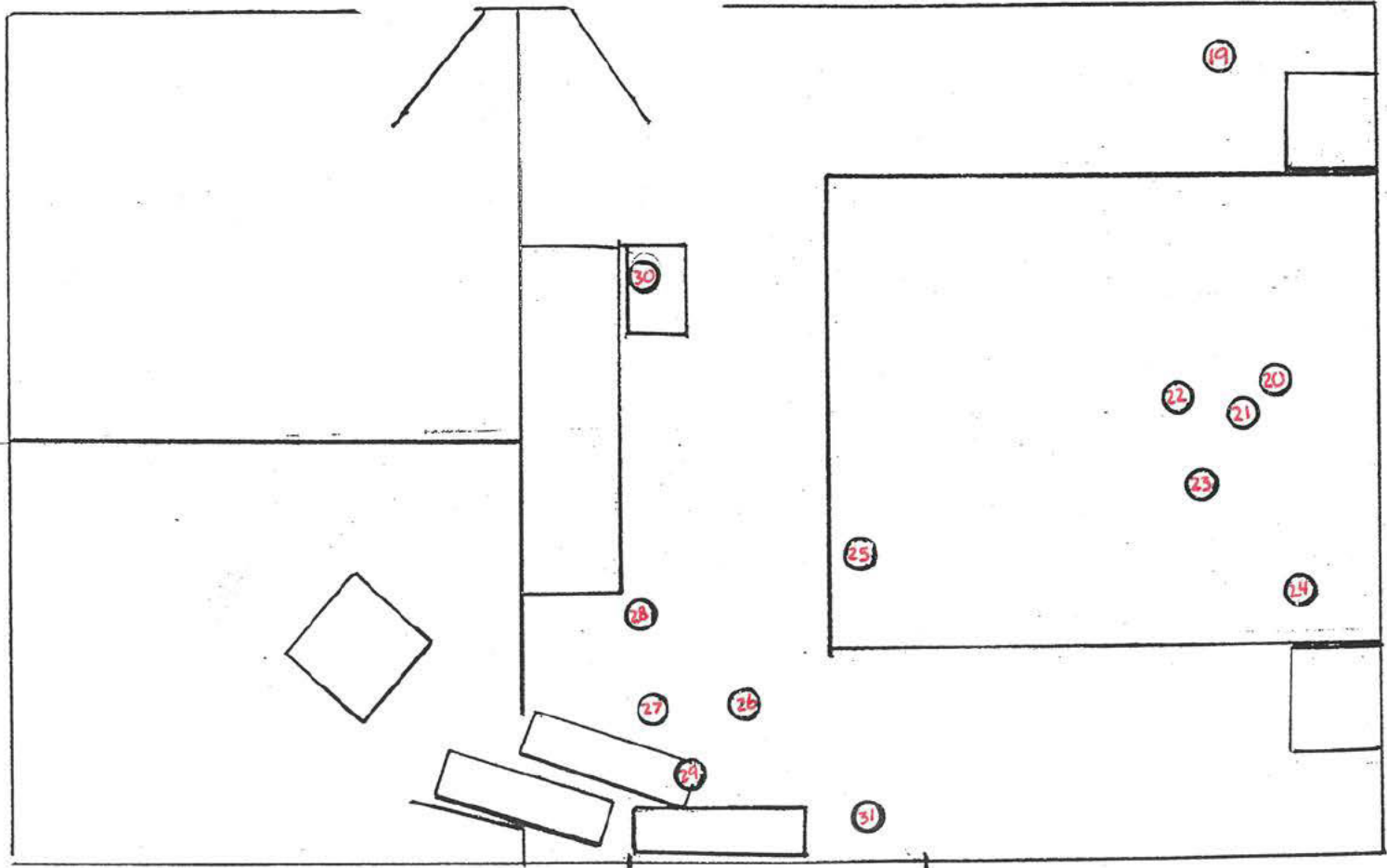

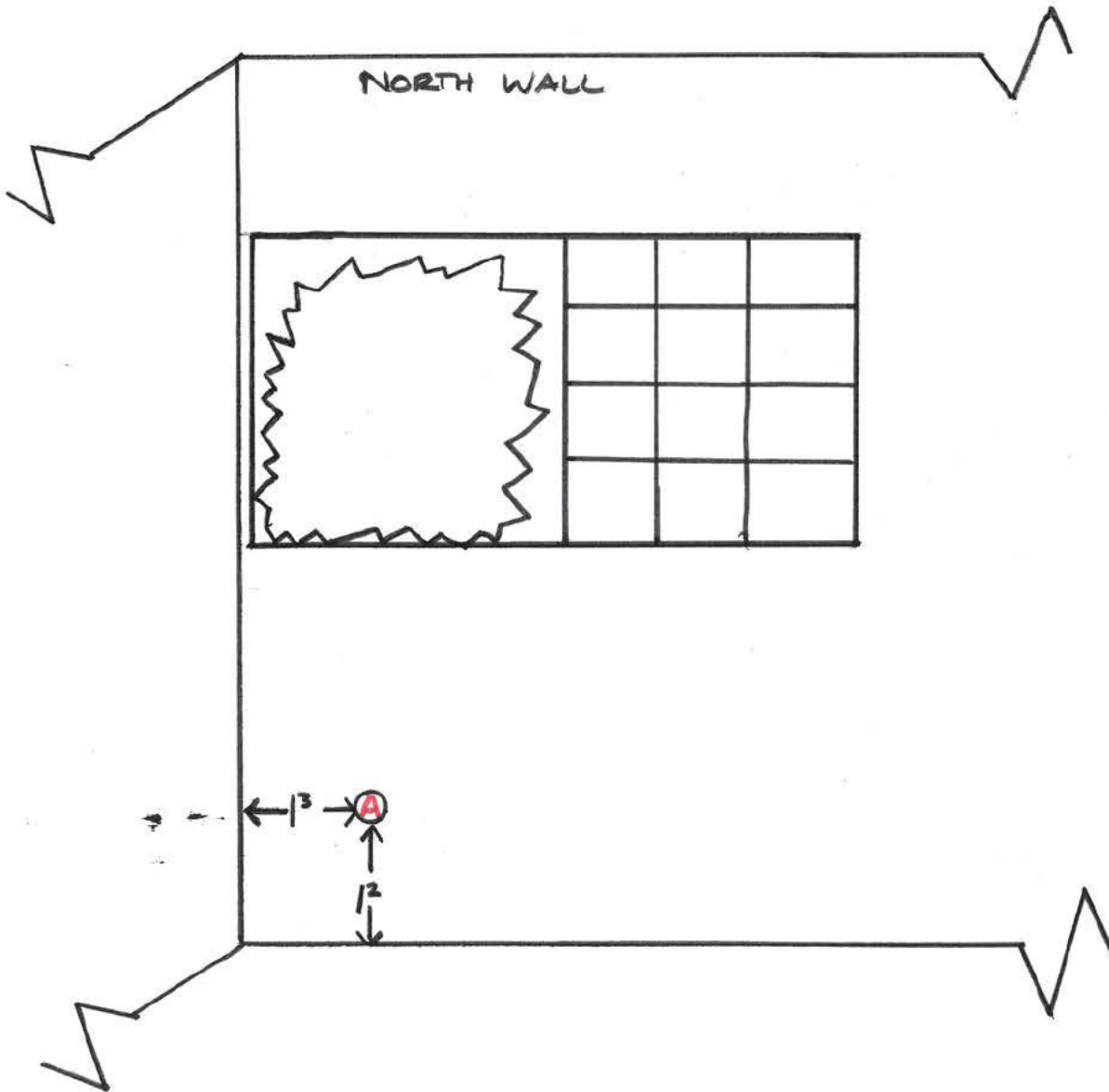

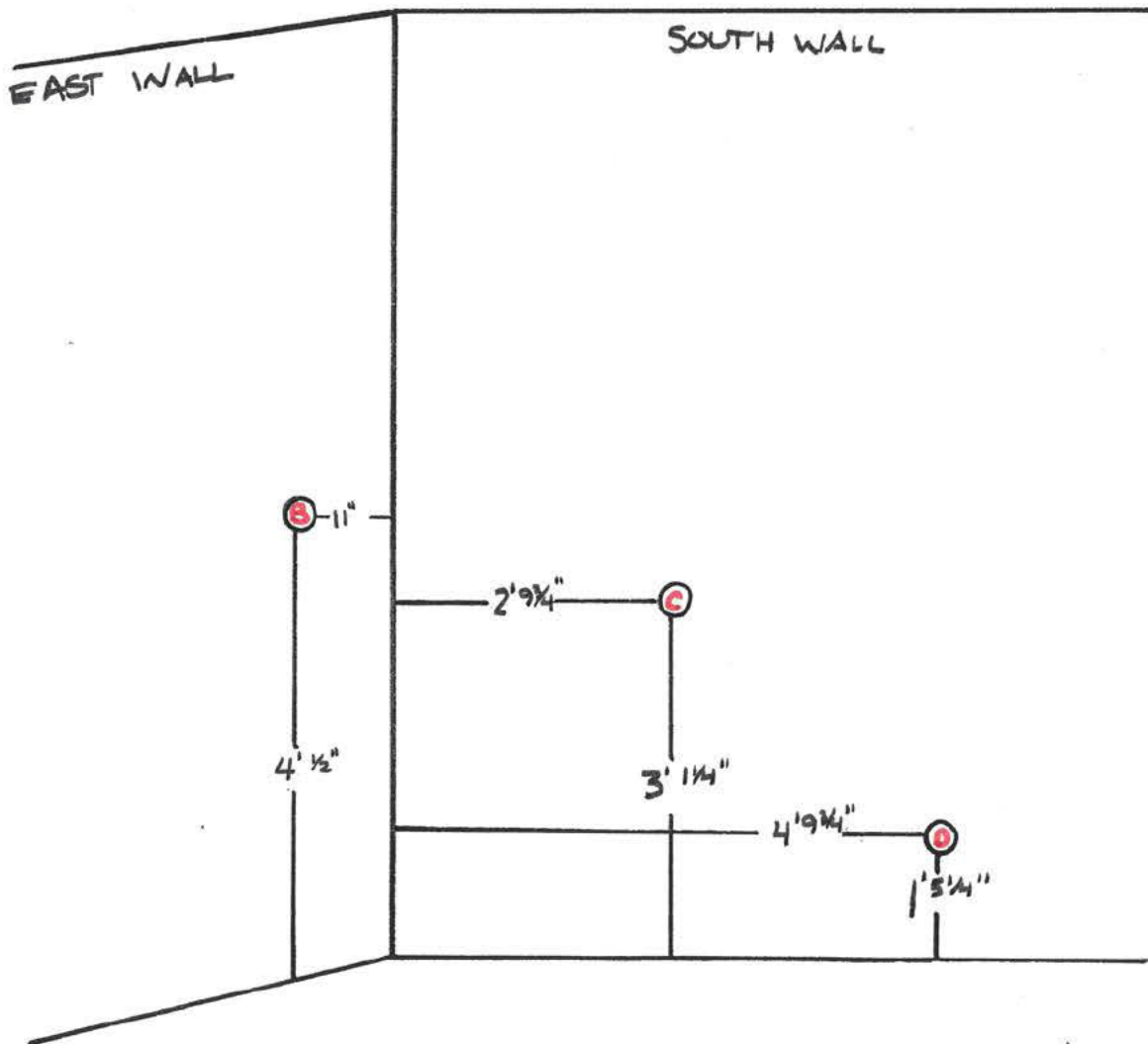

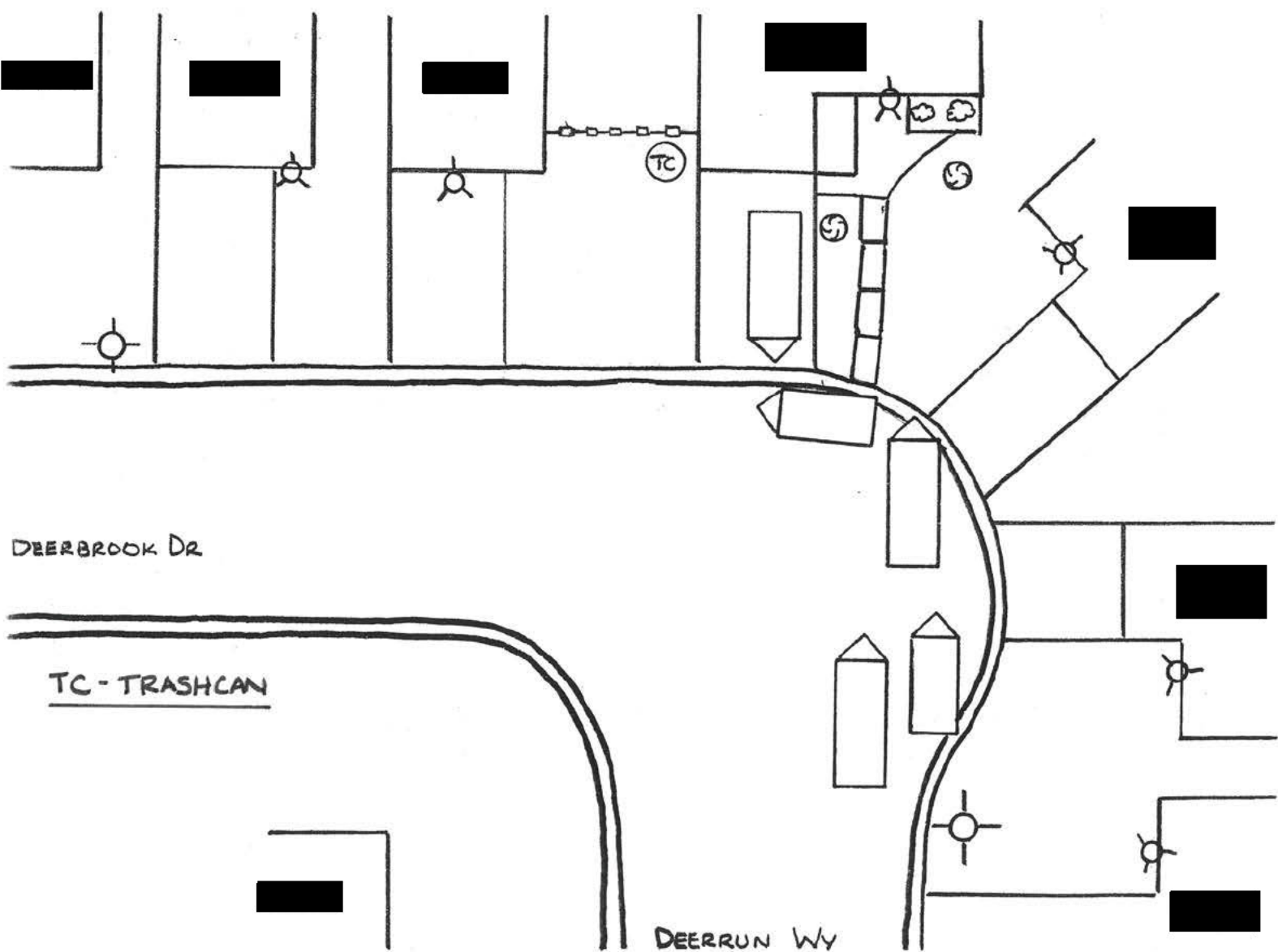

CASE SUMMARY

The following information was obtained from the Sacramento Police Dept. (SPD): The decedent, his wife, and his eight year old daughter had gone to visit some friends living at [REDACTED] Deerbrook Dr. The friends consisted of a husband and wife ([REDACTED] and [REDACTED]), and their three children. The friends had just returned from seeing a movie and a nephew, who had baby-sat the children was still present. The group reportedly spent some time visiting in the garage, which had been converted to a den, and were playing Nintendo. The decedent was reportedly under the influence of a controlled substance and became abusive towards his wife. The decedent reportedly began beating his wife. [REDACTED] and the nephew intervened on the wife's behalf and became involved in a physical altercation with the decedent. The fight moved through the house causing serious property damage. At one point the decedent attempted to throw a microwave at the nephew, missed him and hit a stove. The decedent was hit by a fireplace poker which broke. Eventually the decedent was drug from the house and the women and children were herded into the back bedroom. During this struggle the decedent's clothing was torn off, leaving him nude. The decedent made a forced entrance back into the residence by breaking out the window of the living room. As the decedent began climbing through the window, the nephew produced a handgun and began shooting at the decedent. The SPD responded to the scene and entered the residence. Two officers respond initially and found the decedent in the master bedroom. They reportedly observed that the decedent had his eight year old daughter in a headlock, was punching her in the face, and stating something to the affect that she was going to die with him. The SPD sprayed the decedent with pepper spray which reportedly did not stop him. The SPD used a baton and began wrestling with the decedent until they freed the daughter. The fight escalated and the decedent managed to get an officer down and get on top of him. Multiple shots were fired and the decedent collapsed. Emergency personnel were summoned and they responded to the scene. SFD (Engine #16) examined the decedent and determined that he was dead.

This office was contacted and notified of the death. I responded to the scene and obtained the above listed information. The decedent was nude and lying semi-prone on the floor of a bedroom in the residence. The decedent was noted to have multiple gunshot wounds. Crumpled in the decedent's left hand was a pair of eye glasses, later determined to belong to one of the SPD officers that he had assaulted. I had the decedent transported to this office for an autopsy. Dr. Mark Fajardo, a pathologist, conducted an autopsy and determined the cause of death as listed in section #31 of this report. Toxicology determined that the

decedent had a postmortem blood-alcohol level of 0.03%. Toxicology was unable to detect the presence of illegal narcotics in the decedent's postmortem blood. Based on the findings of pathology, toxicology, and the circumstances surrounding this death, this case is being classified as a Homicide.

I have received and reviewed Sacramento Police Department reports in this case, together with proof sheets, video and audio tapes. Upon reviewing the material, I have concluded that the shooting was justified.

FACTS:

The incident occurred on February 17, 1996. On that date, in the early morning hours, Officer Norman Leong and Lt. Steven Campas were dispatched to an assault in progress at ██████████ Deer Brook Drive, Sacramento. Officer Leong arrived first and waited for Campas. As Officer Leong waited in his patrol car near the residence, he observed a large naked black male adult break out the front windows and enter the residence through a broken window. Fearing for the safety of the residents, Officer Leong advised dispatch of his observations and intention to enter the residence (before his backup arrived).

Officer Leong (who is 5'4", 145 pounds) went to the front door and was allowed in the residence. The interior was in a shambles. He proceeded to the doorway of the southeast bedroom where he observed a large black male adult on the bed with a little girl pinned underneath his legs. The man (Stacy Davis) appeared to be over six feet tall and more than 200 pounds. (In fact Mr. Davis was 6'0", 243 pounds.) Davis was completely nude and

was muttering under his breath. At one point Officer Leong could make out the words, "...kill me." Officer Leong requested (via radio) Code 3 cover and drew his gun.

Davis started hitting the child full force with a closed fist in the face. Officer Leong felt that Davis was going to kill the small child given the force of the blows. He grabbed his OC (pepper) spray and sprayed it at Davis. Davis put his head down just before being sprayed and it did not appear to Leong that the spray made contact with Davis' eyes, nose or mouth. Davis did not appear affected by the spray and grabbed the girl by the head and neck. Officer Leong took his baton out and struck Davis three times full force with the baton in his middle back, to no avail. All the while Officer Leong was telling Davis to release the child which Davis did not do.

As Officer Leong was striking Davis with the baton, Lt. Campas (who is 5'8", 172 pounds) entered the room. The lieutenant immediately called for additional cover. Lt. Campas took in the situation. He could smell the OC spray. He saw that Davis had his hand on the child's throat. Davis was on the bed on his left side, hanging onto the child and kicking at Officer Leong as Leong struck him with the baton. Davis and the child eventually fell into an approximately two foot gap between the bed and the wall. Davis was yelling incoherently and a female was yelling in the background, "He's killing her, he's killing her!" Campas, who had his gun drawn, put it back in the holster and jumped across the bed onto the suspect. Campas' primary concern at this point was to try and free the child. There was a lot of blood on and around the child and Campas thought she was injured badly. He also heard the child gurgling as if she was being choked.

Campas found it difficult to control Davis. At one point he managed to pull him onto the bed but Davis still had the child in his grasp. Campas was lying on the bed, with Davis on his back on top of him, unable to move. Leong attempted to free the child but could not as Davis had a hold of her legs. Leong then grabbed Davis' arm and instructed a female who had walked into the room to help to free the child. The child was finally freed from Davis' grasp and the female took her from the room. Officer Leong then either lost his footing or was shoved by Davis and fell to the floor at the foot of the bed, landing on his back. Campas was beginning to get fatigued and didn't think he could hold out much longer. Davis had managed to get away from Campas' grasp and then, letting out a loud yell, came at Campas. Campas was still on the bed and drew his gun and began firing at Davis. He fired seven times but Davis remained standing. Leong heard the shots while he was still on the floor, got up and saw Davis hovering over Campas and fired his gun as well. Leong fired five times. Davis then collapsed to the floor. Davis died from the gunshot wounds. He was pronounced dead at 2:56 A.M. on 2-17-96.

The child, Stacy Davis' daughter, six year old [REDACTED] was transported to UCD Medical Center for examination and treatment. She was found to have "severe facial trauma...consistent with child abuse/assault with intent to cause great bodily injury" and a

possible head injury. See Dr. [REDACTED]'s Medical Report - Suspected Child Abuse, dated 2-17-96. She received treatment and tests (X-rays and a CT scan). She was released from the hospital on 2-28-96 at 6:40 P.M.

Statements were taken from witnesses at the scene. Witnesses reported that Davis had admitted to smoking "sherns" earlier that evening. It was also reported that he had been moody for the past week and had been accusing his wife of cheating on him. By all accounts, Davis had been acting bizarrely that evening, for instance he was quoting from the bible earlier and stating he was going to die in the house that night. Earlier that evening Davis had also pointed a gun (unloaded) at his wife and child. The gun belonged to witness [REDACTED] to whom Davis said he wanted to kill himself. When [REDACTED] returned to the residence that night after leaving for a brief time, he assisted the resident, [REDACTED] uncle, in attempting to get Davis out of the house as Davis had been beating on his wife and causing problems. During these efforts, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] fought and struggled with Davis. During the melee Davis nearly demolished the interior of the residence. [REDACTED] fired two rounds from his gun in an effort to frighten Davis away. They did get Davis outside but he was able to reenter the home after breaking the windows. Witness [REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s wife told patrol that she felt the officers were going to have to hurt Davis to keep him from hurting his child. Davis' wife, [REDACTED], told patrol that she thought Davis would have killed her daughter if he wasn't stopped by the officers.

Davis' criminal record includes having served prison time for drug sales and burglary and arrests for battery, robbery, discharging a firearm in a negligent manner and being an ex-felon in possession of a firearm. He was most recently paroled in May of 1991.

The crime scene investigation revealed two spent casings in the living room/entryway of the house, apparently from [REDACTED]'s weapon, and the spent casings from the officers weapons in and about the rear bedroom. Also, Davis had Lt. Campas' eyeglasses clutched in his left hand at the time of his death and Officer Leong's eyeglasses were found under Davis' body, both officers apparently having lost their eyeglasses in the struggle.

The autopsy revealed that Davis sustained thirteen gunshot wounds, twelve from the officer's guns and apparently one from [REDACTED]'s gun. Dr. Fajardo from the Coroner's office reported that the cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds and that two of the officer's shots caused the most serious injuries, injuries that would cause death within several minutes after having been shot. The toxicology tests on Davis revealed a .03 blood alcohol level and did not detect the presence of drugs.

ANALYSIS:

It is well settled in the law that a peace officer may use deadly force in self defense or defense of others, in response to threatened deadly force, in order to apprehend a person who has committed a dangerous felony (involving threatened infliction of serious physical harm), or when the flight of a suspect poses risk of great bodily injury. Penal Code sections 196, 197; Tennessee v. Garner, 471 U.S. 1; Kortum v. Alkire, 69 Cal. App.3d 325. In the situation at hand, Lt. Campas and Officer Leong were justified in using deadly force on more than one account.

Regarding the use of deadly force in self defense, California law permits such use if it reasonably appears that the person claiming the right of self defense actually and reasonably believed he was in imminent danger of great bodily injury or death. Lt. Campas had every reason to fear that he was in grave physical danger just before he shot Davis. He had witnessed Davis' brutal assault of the little girl and unwillingness to cease his attempts to hurt the child. Davis was a very large man, outweighing Lt. Campas by a large margin. Campas was getting tired and the likely result of a physical altercation with Davis was Campas would be injured or worse. Campas believed he was in extreme physical danger and that belief was reasonable.

Officer Leong fired his weapon after Lt. Campas shot Davis and Davis did not appear to be affected. Officer Leong also had every reason to fear for his own and Campas' well being. He saw Davis hovering over Campas who was in a vulnerable position on the bed. Leong feared not only that Davis would prevail in a physical altercation with Campas and that Campas would be injured, but also that Davis would gain control of Campas' gun. Leong had tried less deadly means (OC spray and his baton) with no success. Davis was not daunted in the least. Now Davis had been shot and didn't appear affected. Leong was smaller in stature than Campas and if Davis got past Campas and came at Leong, Leong would be in grave danger. Leong was justified in using deadly force in defense of Campas and in his own defense.

Furthermore, Davis had committed a crime involving not only the threatened infliction of serious physical harm but the actual infliction of such harm and his flight posed the risk of great bodily injury to the others in the house. As such, the officers were justified in using deadly force in an effort to prevent Davis' escape. Had Davis prevailed in the altercation with the officers he would have presented a serious danger to the others in the house including the child. It was the officers' duty to ensure that did not occur and to protect those persons from harm.



Sacramento Police Department officers this morning shot and killed a 28-year-old man who attacked them when they tried to stop him from beating and strangling his 6-year-old daughter.

Stacy Davis, born Sept. 13, 1967, and his family were visiting at a cousin's home at ██████████ Deer Brook Way when Davis became enraged at his wife. He beat the woman and assaulted two relatives who attempted to subdue him. Relatives have told officers Davis was under the influence of PCP.

Eventually, the two men forced Davis outside the home, where he smashed windows, stripped off his clothes and attempted to force his way back in. One member of the family, a 19-year-old cousin, fired several gunshots at Davis in an attempt to keep him from entering and resuming the attack. He forced open a door and returned inside. Breaking through a locked bedroom door, he found his 6-year-old daughter and began to beat and choke the little girl, stating his intention to kill her.

By this time, officers had arrived at the home. They attempted to rescue the girl, but the 270-pound Davis was unphased by their batons and pepper spray. Sensing the girl was in grave danger, one of the officers sacrificed his safety by tackling Davis, making it possible for his partner to free the girl. This left the officer on his back, with Davis advancing upon him. Knowing that other means had failed to effect Davis, the officers fired their service weapons, hitting Davis several times in the upper torso. Davis died at the scene.

In keeping with policy, the SPD's Homicide Unit and Internal Affairs section are investigating this shooting. The District Attorney's Office will conduct a separate inquiry. The two officers involved will be placed on administrative leave during this investigation, also a standard practice.

Police kill man allegedly on PCP

A man who may have been high on the drug PCP was shot and killed early Saturday by Sacramento police officers who were trying to stop him from beating and strangling his 6-year-old daughter.

"It is pretty clear that he was intent on destroying anything in his path, including his own daughter," police spokesman Michael Heenan said of the dead man, Stacy Davis, 28. The girl was in stable condition Saturday at UC Davis Medical Center.

Davis and his family were at a cousin's home on Deerbrook Drive

at 2:30 a.m. when Davis became enraged at his wife, according to Heenan.

Davis began beating his wife and also assaulted two relatives who attempted to come to her aid at the home near Mack Road and Franklin Boulevard, Heenan said. Relatives later told officers that Davis was under the influence of the powerful stimulant PCP.

Eventually Davis' two relatives forced him outside the home, where he smashed windows, stripped off his clothing and then tried to enter the home again.

A 19-year-old family member fired several shots at Davis in a vain attempt to keep him from entering. But Davis broke through a

window, forced open a locked bedroom door and attacked his daughter.

He shouted that he would kill the little girl as he beat and choked her, Heenan said.

Police officers arrived by this time, but the 270-pound Davis was unaffected as the officers struck him with their batons and used pepper spray in an attempt to subdue him.


One of the officers then tackled Davis, allowing the officer's partner to free the girl.

The officer who had tackled the man was on his back and Davis was advancing on him when both officers fired their weapons, hitting Davis several times.
