On 3-20-03, at approximately 0248 hours, Officer Avila observed a possible auto burglary in progress at Seavey Circle and McClatchy Way. The suspects fled on foot. Office Avila made contact with the two suspects in the parking lot at this location. While trying to detain the suspects, a car backed up and nearly struck Officer Avila and one of the suspects. This vehicle was being driven by Lynn Taffolla. Officer Avila ordered Taffolla to stop. Taffolla turned the vehicle and started to move forward. Officer Avila thought he was going to be struck by the vehicle and was in fear for his life. Officer Avila fired several rounds at the vehicle.

The vehicle drove off and was later recovered (unoccupied) at 6th/X Streets. The vehicle was hit by the gunfire and there was a small amount of blood on the steering wheel. Taffolla was found several days later. Taffolla was not hit by the gunfire. The investigation revealed that Taffolla was involved in the original 459 auto that Officer Avila had witnessed. Taffolla was arrested for 459/496 PC.

Recommendations:

This case was sent back to Homicide for further analysis and review. This case will be presented again when this analysis is complete.
