

EXAMINATION, RESULTS and CONCLUSIONS

trigger pull of approximately 9 to 9¼ pounds. The pistol appeared in good condition and no abnormalities were noted. The pistol is also accessorized with a functional weapon light that is attached to the frame rail. I successfully test fired the pistol three times using the submitted magazine (Item 002-9) and ammunition from the laboratory's reference collection.

Prior to test firing the pistol, I noted the presence of reddish stains on its surface. The reddish stains located on the left side of the grip tested presumptively positive for blood with the Kastle-Meyer test. These stains were then swabbed and collected as Items 004-A, B, and C.

Smith & Wesson Revolver

A 38 Special caliber, Smith and Wesson revolver (Item 003-5) was submitted to the laboratory for a functionality examination. This revolver has a single-action trigger pull of less than 2 pounds and a double-action trigger pull of approximately 10 to 10½ pounds.

I noted the cylinder was intermittently having difficulty swinging up so that it could be locked into the frame. There appeared to be excessive movement in the crane assembly/cylinder, and during the examination the crane assembly and cylinder separated from the frame. The side plate screw located in the frame of the revolver is responsible for securing the crane assembly (and its attached cylinder) to the frame. I noted that this screw was not tightened completely. When I reinstalled the crane assembly/cylinder and properly tightened the screw, the crane assembly moved normally and the cylinder could be readily swung up and locked into the revolver frame. I successfully test fired the revolver three times using ammunition from the laboratory's collection.



SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

1323 Hours/10-28-2010 (Thursday): I, Lieutenant J. Spano #200 (Unit L1), while working as the Day shift Watch Commander responded to assist Officer J. Smith #7 (Unit 1E30) with a suspicious person on a bike. Officer Smith had voiced via radio that he was stopping a subject at Nogales Street and High Street. I was partnered with Detective M. Dias #401.

While en route, Officer J. Smith voiced that shots had been fired. I responded with lights and sirens to his location.

1324 Hours: I arrived on scene at the intersection of Osmer Lane and Noglaes Street. The suspect was prone with his arms out to his side. His head was facing northwest directly towards my patrol vehicle. Officer J. Smith was standing approximately four feet from the suspect, northeast of him in the middle of Nogales Street. I observed Officer J. Smith holding his backup .38 caliber revolver in his left hand pointed towards the suspect. Officer Smith was holding his department issued handgun in his right hand. As I exited the vehicle I could clearly see that Officer's Smith department issued handgun had malfunctioned and was not serviceable.

After checking Officer J. Smith's welfare, I assisted Detective Dias in handcuffing the suspect. I could see that the suspect was bleeding from his left hand and left leg. I instructed Detective Dias to stay with the suspect. I then confirmed, via radio, that the Sacramento Fire Department was en route to the scene.

I returned to Officer J. Smith and instructed him to holster his department issued handgun and back up revolver. I obtained a Public Safety Statement from Officer J. Smith where he told me there were no other suspects and that he fired three rounds in a southwestern direction. I then instructed Sergeant Lor to stay with Officer J. Smith and he was escorted to the outer limit of the crime scene.

As other officers arrived on scene, I had them secure the crime scene and begin canvassing the neighborhood for witnesses.

SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE:

10-28-2010, 1323 hours: I, Officer Yen #27 as 1C10, was on patrol in a marked Twin Rivers Police vehicle (#710) and I was wearing an identifiable police uniform. I was in the Main Office of the Grant West Campus (1221 South Avenue, corner of South Avenue and Dry Creek Road) when I heard Officer Smith #7 advise, via radio, that he was making contact with a suspicious subject, who was identified later as Richard SAZO, in the area of Nogales Street and High Street (approximately one block east and one block south from my location).

Approximately one minute later, I heard Officer Smith, via radio, yell:

"Get on the ground!"

I heard Officer Smith yell this approximately three times. Officer Smith's voice sounded loud and charged as if he was struggling with the subject.

I immediately ran out of the office towards my patrol vehicle, which was parked on South Avenue just east of Dry Creek Road. As I ran to my patrol vehicle, I heard several consecutive loud popping sounds. The loud popping sounds sounded to be gunfire. A few seconds later I heard Officer Smith advise, via radio, that shots had been fired at his location.

When I reached my patrol vehicle, I saw Lieutenant Spano #200 and Detective Dias #401 turn eastbound onto South Avenue from southbound Dry Creek Road. I entered my patrol vehicle, started it, and performed a u-turn driving maneuver and pulled behind Lieutenant Spano.

We continued eastbound along South Avenue and turned southbound onto Osmer Lane. Lieutenant Spano came to a stop at the intersection of Osmer Lane and Nogales Street and I came to a stop immediately behind him. I saw Lieutenant Spano and Detective Dias exit their vehicle and run to a location in front of their vehicle.

I exited my patrol vehicle and drew my department approved firearm from its holster and made my way to the location of Lieutenant Spano and Detective Dias. As I came around the side of Lieutenant Spano's vehicle, I could see that Lieutenant Spano and Detective Dias were kneeling on the ground by SAZO. I saw Officer Smith standing near SAZO and I could also see that Officer Smith's department issued weapon appeared to have had a feeding/ejection malfunction as the slide was partially locked back. I asked Officer Smith if there were any other subjects that were outstanding and he advised there were not.

SAZO was laying on the ground and sounded as if he was yelling. I then returned to my patrol vehicle as Chief Breck #100 arrived on scene. Chief Breck then instructed me to place Crime Scene tape around the scene in order to lock the area down.

A short time later, the Sacramento City Fire Department arrived on scene and took custody of SAZO in order to transport him to a medical facility for treatment.

As I looked eastbound along Nogales Street, I saw several adult subjects standing near the residence of

Supplemental Narrative

1323 Hours/10-28-10 (Thursday): I, Detective Dias #401, was parterned with Lt.Spano #200 (Unit L-1) when we responded to cover Officer J. Smith with suspicious person at Noglales Street and High Street. While en route, Officer Smith voiced on the radio:

"Get on the ground!"

Officer Smith continued to yell into the radio several times. Officer Smith's voice was very loud and out of breath.

At approximately 1324 hours, Lt Spano and I arrived on scene. Officer Smith was standing in the middle of the street facing in a south west position. Officer Smith had his firearm pointed at a Hispanic male later identified as Richard Dela Cruz Sazo (DOB 7-19 1981). Sazo was lying in the street on his stomach and was yelling at Officer Smith. Sazo had blood coming from his right shoulder and his left upper leg.

- Lt. Spano and I handcuffed Sazo. I searched Sazo for weapons with negative results.
- Lt. Spano assisted Officer Smith and I stayed with Sazo until the Sacramento Fire Department arrived on scene. Medic 17 arrived at 13:34 hours.

Sacramento Fire transported Sazo to UC Medical Center. I remained with Sazo as he was transported to UC Med Center.

While en route to the hospital, Sazo asked for his attorney.

We arrived at UC Medical Center at 13:52 hours.

Sazo sustained a total of three gun shot wounds. One to his right upper shoulder, left hand and to his left upper thigh. Medical personnel advised me that his injuries were not life threatening.

While at the hospital, I observed Sazo sign a medical form with his left hand, which had sustained a gunshot wound.

I requested that the medical staff take blood from Sazo. At approximately 15:33 hours medical staff drew blood from Sazo. I took custody of the blood evidence and at no time was the blood evidence out of my custody. I released the blood evidence to Sacramento Police Seargent Marnie Stigerts at approximately 17:16 hours.

Officer A. Brown #18 arrived at the hospital at 1630 hours to relieve me.





On March 1st, 2010 the department conducted a qualification course of fire (day light & low Light) at the City of Sacramento's Mangan Indoor Shooting Range.

Each officer participated in the following qualification course of fire. Each officer was made aware in advance of the course of fire. The course of fire was the State of California, Bureau of Security and Instigative Services, Initial and Re-Qualification course for Armed (Exposed Firearm Permit) Security Officers. The only modification that was made to the course was the scoring and three stages where completed in low light settings. Currently the State accepts all round hits inside the 7 ring on a B-27 target. Due to an equipment mix up, all of the participants fired the course of fire using a TQ-19 grey and black silhouette training target. 

DIAGRAM AND PHYSICAL EVIDENCE SHEET



We address only whether or not criminal charges should be filed against Officer Smith for the shooting of Ricardo Sazo.

FACTS:

On October 28, 2010, Officer Jason Smith of the Twin Rivers Police Department ("TRPD") was on patrol in uniform driving a marked patrol car. At approximately 1323 hours, Smith observed Ricardo Sazo riding his bike against the flow of traffic in violation of California Vehicle Code section 21650 westbound on Nogales Street in the Del Paso Heights neighborhood. Smith pulled up to Sazo and verbally told him to stop. Sazo stopped. Smith's patrol car stopped in front of Nogales Street facing westbound.

Sazo was wearing an oversized white T-shirt, a ball cap that was turned backwards, and baggy denim shorts. The T-shirt was untucked and covered Sazo's waistband. Sazo was listed on the arrest report as 5'6" tall and weighing 180lbs. Smith was listed in the report as 5'8" 200lbs. Smith had never seen Sazo before and had no history with him.

Following the incident, Smith was interviewed by Sacramento Police Department ("SPD") Det. Kyle Jasperson. According to Smith, as soon as Sazo stopped his bike, Smith observed Sazo's hand moving towards his lower back region. Smith told Sazo, "Let me see your hands." Sazo stated that he was merely pulling up his pants. Smith replied, "I don't care what you're doing. I need to see your hands." Smith exited his patrol car and asked to see Sazo's hands. Smith also told Sazo to get off the bike. Sazo responded by pedaling his bike quickly westbound on Nogales.

Smith advised dispatch that he was involved in a foot pursuit of a subject on a bike and provided the direction of travel. Smith chased Sazo on foot and told Sazo that if he did not stop that Smith would tase him. Smith took out his taser and deployed it. When a taser is deployed the weapon fires two probes at the subject. The probes have hooks on them that are designed to become embedded in a subject's person and clothing. Once the probe embeds into the subject, a five second cycle of electricity is discharged from the taser into the subject through the probes. After that the officer can discharge another five second burst of electricity into the subject. The officer can keep doing this until the subject submits to the officer's authority.

Smith only saw one of the probes go into Sazo's back. Sazo made sounds typical of people who have been tased. The bike started to wobble and then it veered up to the north curb line of Nogales. (Note: the bike was later found on the curb in front of Nogales, the home of Sazo. Sazo staggered but never fell to the ground.

Smith's recollection was that Sazo then rode off on his bike again westbound and that Smith discharged the taser one more time. All the other witnesses were consistent in stating that Sazo left the bike near the fence of Nogales and continued on foot. The crime scene photos show the bike in the gutter in front of Nogales. Det. Jasperson's opinion based upon a view of the scene was consistent with the other witnesses and he asked Smith about this point. Smith agreed that it was possible Sazo never got back on the

bike after the second taser discharge. The taser records indicate three full 5-second cycling discharges of Smith's taser, corroborating Smith's statement that he discharged the taser three times. Smith's first taser deployment was at 1323:49 hours. The next discharges were at 1323:54 and 1324:02 hours.

Smith stated Sazo had no noticeable reaction to the third discharge of the taser. Smith stated Sazo started to get much more violent and that he started advancing on Smith. Smith's recollection was that Sazo was on the bike advancing towards him while reaching towards the back of his waistband – the same region he reached for upon the initial contact.

In reference to the movement when Sazo started advancing toward him, Smith stated:

"I drew my department issued firearm and discharged 3 rounds at the subject. I was in fear for my life, my safety, and I didn't know if the subject didn't have any weapons or if he was inflicting harm on me."

Smith stated that the distance between himself and Sazo at the time of the shooting was about three to five feet. Sazo was facing Smith directly as he was advancing towards Smith so that Smith could not see what was behind Sazo's back.

Smith's gun, a .40 caliber Sig Sauer P226, malfunctioned after the third round was fired. It was later determined that this was due to a defective round that could not be properly loaded into the chamber of the gun. After unsuccessfully attempting to clear the Sig Sauer so that it could fire again, Smith drew his back-up gun, a chrome .38 Special Smith & Wesson revolver, and told Sazo, "If you move again, I'll kill you." Smith advised dispatch that shots were fired and code-3 fire was needed. Sazo was lying in the street in front of the west side of Nogales Street after he was shot. Sazo was face down with his head toward the middle of the street and his feet were near the south curbside which had a telephone pole close by. Crime scene photos depict Sazo's blood stains on the street in this area.

Sazo's parole revocation attorney, Scott Wippert, submitted three CD's that are poor quality recordings of the testimony at Sazo's December 13, 2010 parole revocation hearing. Wippert had an audio expert attempt to filter out hiss and adjust the speed of the recording so as to make the CD's more understandable. Even after an expert's attempt to clean up the recording, only portions of the questions and answers could clearly be heard. As to other portions, one had to guess at what was said on the recording.

At Sazo's parole revocation hearing, Smith's testimony (that could be heard) of his recollection of the shooting was generally consistent with his statement to Det. Jasperson, with a few differences. Smith recalled deploying his taser twice instead of the three times

he told Det. Jasperson. Additionally, the distance between Smith and Sazo at the time of the shooting went from "three to five feet" up to "three to five yards."

TRPD Lt. Spano and Det. Dias arrived on scene just after the shooting and handcuffed Sazo. Sazo was taken to U.C. Davis Medical Center where he was treated. Sazo had gunshot wounds to his right shoulder, left hand and left upper leg. Although the bullet that entered the leg broke Sazo's femur, none of the wounds were life threatening. Det. Jasperson attempted to talk to Sazo at the hospital about the incident; however, Sazo invoked his right to an attorney before Det. Jasperson could even read him his Miranda rights.

Det. Dias had received Sazo's felony blood sample from the hospital. The blood sample was analyzed by the Sacramento County Crime Lab. Crime Lab report number 10-010448 indicated that Sazo had no alcohol in his system. However, Sazo's blood did contain amphetamine 0.07mg/L, methamphetamine 0.48 mg/L, morphine 0.04 mg/L and delta-9-THC 3.9 ng/mL.

Numerous individuals witnessed all or part of the incident. Accounts vary greatly as to what transpired. Some witnesses said that Sazo was not advancing towards the officer and not reaching towards his back at the time he was shot. According to these witnesses Sazo was just standing in the street when he was shot.

On the other hand, several witnesses said that Sazo was aggressively advancing towards Smith at the time of the shooting. Two witnesses also saw Sazo reaching towards his rear waistband right before Sazo was shot. The witnesses had different vantage points of the incident.

Nogales Street is a residential street that runs east to west. The street numbers decrease as one travels westbound. Smith's patrol vehicle was parked in front of Nogales Street (all addresses are on Nogales Street unless otherwise noted) on the south side of the street. Exhibit A is attached to this letter and depicts the witnesses' locations in relation to the different aspects of the incident. The following is a summary of the various witness statements provided to law enforcement and other sources.

the taser in his hand. Sazo held his hands up like he was going to rush Smith. said Sazo was leaning to the left and right trying to taunt the officer, like he was going to run. Sazo was saying something to Smith but could not hear what was said. did not see anything in Sazo's hands. gun, but he heard three shots. said he saw Sazo lunge toward Smith, then looked at his partner, at the time of the shooting. admitted not being able to watch what happened every second. He said it was hard to see everything that happened. said the distance between Smith and Sazo at the time of the shooting was 15 feet.
On October 28, 2010, spoke to SPD Det. Vigon. was sitting in the driver's seat of the truck when he heard Smith say "I want to talk to you." He heard the police car stop and the door open. When Smith opened up the door, Sazo took off on his bike. Smith said "Stop, stop" a lot of times. Smith then shot Sazo with his taser. Sazo kept going for 40 feet, then fell down. Sazo got up and made aggressive motions towards Smith with clenched fists, then he ran again. Smith was still yelling "Stop, stop" at Sazo. Sazo then stopped and turned to Smith like he wanted to fight. Sazo took three steps towards Smith, and then Smith shot Sazo. I did not see any weapons on Sazo nor did he see Sazo reaching into his waistband.
On October 28, 2010, spoke with SPD Det. Bullard. was driving his vehicle westbound on Nogales and was passing by the city utility truck at the time of the incident. When Sazo took off running bulled in front of the utility truck and parked. See the next saw Sazo falling off his bike. Smith yelled at Sazo, "Lay down! Lay down!" Smith then fired his taser at Sazo. Then said they were fighting in the middle of the street. Sazo was swinging at Smith. Sazo swung with closed fists about six times telling Smith to "Get back, man." 

LEGAL ANALYSIS:

A peace officer may use deadly force under circumstances where it is reasonably necessary for self-defense or defense of another. Additionally, an officer who has reasonable cause to believe a person has committed a public offense or is a danger to others may use reasonable force to affect arrest or detention, to prevent escape or to overcome resistance. (*Tennessee v. Garner* (1985) 471 U.S. 1; *Graham v. Connor* (1989) 490 U.S. 386; *Kortum v. Alkire*

(1977) 69 C.A. 3d 325; California Penal Code Section 853a; CALCRIM 2670.) An officer who attempts to arrest or detain a person need not retreat or desist from his efforts by reasons of the resistance or threatened resistance of the person; nor shall the officer be deemed an aggressor or lose the right to self-defense by use of reasonable force. (California Penal Code section 835a.) Police may use some degree of physical coercion or threat thereof to accomplish an arrest. The force used must be objectively reasonable, considering such issues as the severity of the crime, whether the suspect posed an immediate threat to police or others, and whether the suspect actively resisted arrest or attempted flight. (Graham v. Connor (1989) 490 U.S. 386.) The reasonableness inquiry takes into account those facts known to the officer at the moment he or she uses deadly force to apprehend a fleeing suspect. (Ford v. Childers (7th Cir. 1988) 855 F.2d. 1271, 1275; Sherrod v. Berry (7th Cir. 1988) 856 F.2d 802, 804.)

The person being detained or arrested may be subjected to such restraint as is reasonably necessary for his arrest and detention and has a concomitant duty to permit himself to be detained. (People v. Allen (1980) 109 C.A.3d 981, 985; CALCRIM 2670, 2671, 2672.) The rule "requires that the officer's lawful conduct be established as an objective fact; it does not establish any requirement with respect to the defendant's mens rea." (People v. Jenkins (2000) 22 Cal.4th 900, 1020.) California law permits the use of deadly force if the officer actually and reasonably believed he was in imminent danger of death or great bodily injury. (CALCRIM 3470.) An officer who uses deadly force must actually believe that force is necessary. The appearance of danger is all that is necessary; actual danger is not. (People v. Toledo (1948) 85 Cal.App.2d 577; People v. Jackson (1965) 233 Cal.App.2d 639.) Thus, the officer may employ all force reasonably believed necessary. (CALCRIM 3470.) The reasonableness of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene, rather than with 20/20 hindsight. The calculus of reasonableness must embody allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split-second judgments—in circumstances that are tense, uncertain, and rapidly evolving—about the amount of force that is necessary in a particular situation. (Graham v. Connor (1989) 490 U.S. 386.)

The law in this area is clear. The facts in this case are not. The crux of this case is did Smith actually and reasonably believe he was in imminent danger of death or great bodily injury at the time he shot Sazo. As to the facts of this shooting, was it reasonable for Smith to believe that Sazo was reaching back for a weapon which could be used to inflict death or great bodily harm on Smith? Factually one part of the equation is clear. Smith and Sazo were close enough that Sazo could have inflicted death or great bodily injury on Smith. Although witnesses' statements varied as to the distance between Smith and Sazo at the time of the shooting, the amount of the variance is small. The range was from three to 15 feet. Even at the greatest distance cited of 15 feet, Sazo was close enough to apply lethal force with a multitude of weapons. The crime scene photos of the blood stain on the street

Officers are frequently trained that at a distance of 21 feet or less, from a standing start, a subject with an edged weapon can cover the distance to an officer (or indeed any person) in less than two seconds. Finally, Smith threw Sazo down right before the shooting. No one else saw anything close to that scenario. Also, as noted above, criminal history affects his credibility. The statements of and to the extent she also saw Sazo's hand at his back waistband) would indicate that this was a justifiable shooting. Smith's first contact with Sazo resulted in Sazo reaching back to his lower back region where his waistband was covered by a long T-shirt. Then Sazo attempted to flee. Smith repeatedly told Sazo to "Stop" or "Get on the ground." Smith made several attempts to stop Sazo's flight by use of the taser. The result, Smith recounted, was that Sazo got much more violent. Then Sazo started advancing towards Smith while reaching towards the back of his waistband. There are reasons that a person may reach behind their back other than to grab a weapon. But when one does it from a close distance during a hostile confrontation with an officer, the most reasonable conclusion from an officer's perspective is that one is going for a weapon. And from three to 15 feet away, Sazo could have been on Smith with a weapon before Smith got his gun out of the holster had Smith not acted quickly. Based upon the totality of the circumstances, the use of deadly force was justified because it was reasonable for Smith to believe that Sazo was reaching for a weapon as Sazo advanced violently on

Under these circumstances, although there is conflicting evidence about exactly what occurred, credible evidence indicates that this shooting was lawful. At the time Smith fired his gun he actually and reasonably believed that Sazo was aggressively advancing towards Smith while reaching for a weapon. Therefore, we will take no further action in this matter.

On 10-28-10 at approx 1701 hours, Sgt. McCloskey and I (Det. Jasperson) contacted Twin Rivers PD Officer Jason Smith #7 in interview room #6 at SPD Headquarters. Also present were Ofc. Smith's attorney (Steven Welty), Twin Rivers PD Lieutenant Spano, and SPD CSI Boyd.

The interview room was being audio/video recorded.

Based on the information we had previously received, Ofc. Smith was believed to have fired three rounds from his primary duty handgun during this incident. He was also believed to have deployed/fired his taser. Lastly, he was believed to have drawn his backup handgun, but not fired it.

(We were also told that Ofc. Smith's primary duty handgun had malfunctioned/jammed during the course of being fired, which is why he initially drew his backup gun.)

Sgt. McCloskey conducted the "round count" of Ofc. Smith's firearms, as per standard protocol. The results of this round count were as follows:

- From the two 12-round capacity magazines on his duty belt, 12 live rounds were found to be in each (for a total of 24 rounds). The rounds were all Federal brand .40 S&W jacketed hollow points (JHP).
- From his primary duty handgun (SIG SAUER P226 .40 cal, serial #), which was removed from his Safariland SLS holster located on the right side of his duty belt, 9 live rounds were found in the magazine. These were also Federal brand .40 S&W jacketed hollow points (JHP) rounds. This gun had a Surefire X200 weapon light mounted to the rail system of the gun's frame.
- Ofc. Smith's primary duty handgun was found to still be in a condition of malfunction, with the slide partially locked-back to the rear. I am a department rangemaster/firearms instructor, so I examined his weapon to determine what the cause of this malfunction might be. In doing so, I observed that there was one live round which was stuck in the loading breech of the weapon. This round failed to load into the chamber of the gun. The nose of the round was resting against the feeding ramp, and the slide was resting up against the rear of the casing. (I requested CSI Boyd to photograph the condition of the gun.) Ofc. Smith was then directed to

render his gun safe (by removing all live ammo), and upon doing so the sole remaining live round stuck in his gun dislodged and fell out. Upon examining this round, I observed that it was an unfired live round, which appeared to be defective. Specifically, this round's projectile was partially deformed (i.e. the jacket was partially peeled back from the projectile on one side) and the entire projectile was compressed further

back into the round's casing than it should be. This created a lip/edge on the round where the projectile was seated up against the casing. In my opinion, either the deformed jacketing and/or the aforementioned edge most likely caught on the feeding ramp of the gun and prevented it from being properly loaded into the chamber of the gun. (Note: I later made several attempts to replicate the malfunction I observed in Ofc. Smith's gun by putting the deformed round into the magazine that came from the gun and attempting to feed it into the gun's chamber. I did not actually fire the qun, but by releasing the slide on this deformed round, I was able to replicate the malfunction several times and each time the round/gun ended up in the same state of malfunction that I had observed in Ofc. Smith's gun at the time he showed it to me. Of note, I was unable to replicate the malfunction with another one of his rounds that was not deformed. This lead me to conclude that the cause of the malfunction was in fact the bad round. I later took 9 digital photos of the defective round, next to

another one of his non-defective rounds, to illustrate the differences between the two. These photos will later be transferred to a CD and booked as evidence.)

- Ofc. Smith was next directed to retrieve his backup gun, which was located in an ankle holster affixed to his left ankle. This gun was found to be a Smith & Wesson .38 special revolver, chrome with brown wood grips, serial # . It had a 5-round capacity cylinder and was found to be loaded with 5 live rounds (all Winchester .38 special jacketed hollow point rounds).
- Lastly, Ofc. Smith was directed to remove his taser, which was located in a taser holster on the left side of his duty belt. The taser (Taser brand, model X26, serial #X00-354929) was found to have a fired taser cartridge (serial #H08-954325, 25' length) affixed to it.

CSI Boyd took digital photographs of Ofc. Smith's guns, extra magazines, ammunition, taser, and his overall appearance in uniform. I collected the guns, extra magazines, ammunition, and taser (with cartridge) as evidence. All of the items taken from Ofc. Smith will later be booked into evidence.

Lt. Spano gave Ofc. Smith a replacement duty gun/magazines, which were already loaded.

During the interview that followed, Ofc. Smith told me the following in summary:

I have been an officer for four years. All of it has been with the Twin Rivers Police Department.

I am currently assigned to patrol and youth services.

My identifier is 1-Edward-30. I work day shift. Today my shift was 0700-1600 hours. I work as a solo-officer unit.

The SIG SAUER P226 .40 caliber I carry is my regular, department-issued gun.

My Smith & Wesson .38 caliber backup gun is personally-owned.

I don't carry any other firearms.

The taser (X26) I carry is department-issued.

What I am wearing now (i.e. full uniform, badge, patches, duty belt, etc)

is how I was dressed today (during this incident). The car I drive is a marked, black & white police car.

*Note: I then asked Ofc. Smith to tell me what happened during this incident. He told me the following in summary:

I was patrolling in the area of Nogales and High in the Del Paso Heights neighborhood near Grant High School. I was travelling westbound on Nogales, and I observed a subject (later found to be Ricardo SAZO) riding a bicycle against the flow of traffic (a violation of 21650.1 CVC). He was on the south side of Nogales, riding westbound.

After I passed through the intersection of High and Nogales, the subject turned around and saw me. I pulled up to him and told him to stop. Upon telling him to stop, he stopped his bike with one of his feet because he

didn't have manual brakes on his bicycle (a violation of 21201a CVC).

I didn't activate my lights or siren. I just verbally told him to stop.

As soon as he stopped the bike, he reached around behind him. I told him "Let me see your hands." He told me that he was pulling up his pants. I told him "I don't care what you're doing. I need to see your hands."

He was wearing an oversized white t-shirt, a ballcap that was turned backwards, and denim shorts, I believe, and those were somewhat baggy. His oversized white t-shirt was untucked and it was covering his waistband.

I exited my patrol vehicle and asked to see his hands. I also told him to get off his bike. He kind of straddled the bike and started to put it down, but then he got back on it and peddled off westbound on Nogales. I

was out of my patrol car at that point.

He said something before he peddled off, but I don't recall what he said.

I advised dispatch that I was in a foot pursuit of a subject on a bike, and the direction of travel. I chased after the subject on foot. I identified myself as a police officer, and I advised the subject that if he didn't stop then I was going to tase him.

He did not stop. He kept peddling away.

I drew my taser from the holster on my left side, and deployed (fired) it. I noticed one of the taser probes went in the subject's back. I could not see where the other probe went.

After deploying the taser, I could hear the subject making the typical noises that somebody does when they're under the control of the taser. He was still on the bike. The bike started to wobble and then it veered to the north curbline of Nogales. At that point, the subject leaned up against a fence and he reached behind him again. I was maybe 5 feet away from him.

At this point, I depressed the trigger on the taser once again. It didn't appear to have any effect on him. It didn't make him go down. He was kind of crouched down. He was kind of on and off his bike. He kind of staggered, but never to the point where he actually fell to the ground.

This was also a full cycle of the taser (like the first one).

My recollection is that the subject then continued riding the bicycle

westbound away from me. I discharged the taser one more time. I was probably within 3 feet of him.

My recollection is that he was still on the bike at this time.

He did not have any noticeable reaction from this (3rd) application of the taser. He still did not go down.

I saw that the subject was becoming much more violent and he actually started advancing on me.

My recollection is that he was still on the bike, and he was advancing towards me while reaching towards the back of his waistband - the same region that he did when I initially contacted him. I was not saying anything to him at that point. He wasn't saying anything either.

When he started advancing towards me, I drew my department-issued firearm and discharged 3 rounds at the subject. I was in fear for my life, my safety, and I didn't know if the subject had any weapons or if he was attempting to inflict any harm on me.

I was probably about the same distance from the subject that we are (referring to Ofc. Smith's distance from me in the interview room) when I shot. About 3 to 5 feet.

He was facing me directly as he was advancing towards me and he was still reaching towards his back. I could not see what was back there (behind his back).

When I fired, all 3 rounds hit the subject. The subject went down to the ground at that point. I advised my dispatch that shots had been fired and to start code-3 fire. I also advised that my weapon had malfunctioned and that I needed units there.

That's when I noticed that my weapon had malfunctioned. I have no idea what caused the malfunction. It just appeared to be a hard-lock. I attempted to do the typical drills that they show you in the academy - the tap, rack and invert, strip the magazine - but I was unsuccessful in clearing whatever the malfunction was. At that point, my department-issued firearm was rendered useless, so I drew my backup (gun) and held the subject at gunpoint. I believe my department-issued handgun was in my right hand, and my backup was in my left hand.

Once I pulled out my backup gun, I told the subject "If you move again, I'll kill you."

I could hear the incoming units coming. The next thing I recall, Lt. Spano and Det. Dias-Breck arrived on scene. They arrived in one vehicle at the intersection of Nogales and Osmer. At that time, I approached the subject and continued to hold him at gunpoint while they (Lt. Spano and Det. Dias-Breck) cuffed the subject.

I noticed that there was blood coming from underneath his body.

That was pretty much it. I was kind of ushered away from the scene as soon as our supervisor got there. I wasn't present for any searching of the subject. It was Sgt. Lor from my department who contacted me and pulled me off to the side.

I was never able to get the subject's name or determine who he was. I had

not seen him before and had no history with him.

*Note: I asked Ofc. Smith if it was possible that after the second time he deployed the taser, when the subject was up against the fence, if the subject could have taken off on foot and left his bike. He had previously told me that it was his recollection that the subject was still on the bike when this happened and then continued to flee on the bike. However, from observing the scene during the walk-thru, I felt it was more likely that the subject actually took off on foot from this point since his bicycle was still near the fence where the second discharge of the taser took place. He responded in summary:

That's very possible. Like I said when we did the walk-thru, I don't recall the bike being on the north curbline of Nogales (which is where it was located at the time of the walk-thru).

We do not have in-car cameras. We don't have any type of ICC or personal recording devices.

Once the subject was on the ground (after being shot), he was pretty much just laying there. I think he muttered "He shot me." Or something along that line.

I don't recall seeing anybody else around the subject, in the immediate area where the shooting took place, during the shooting. But immediately after the shooting everybody was coming out.

I work for the City of Sacramento Utilities Department in the storm drainage section. My partner is ______. I was in the truck [a large truck with drain system maintenance equipment attached] working on our work order on the computer. I was sitting in the passenger seat (______ was in the driver's seat).

I heard a voice outside saying "Stop, get on the ground." I looked up, and I saw the officer chasing the guy and the officer had a taser gun in his hand. He kept telling that to the kid on a bike. About 25 or 30 feet ahead of us the kid jumped off the bike or lost control of it and ended up on the north-side curb. The bike fell there. The kid, I don't know if he fell, but I remember that I heard the officer tell him to stay on the ground. The kid

leaned up against the fence right there and kind of "bounced back" at the officer. I don't know if the taser guns have any sound to them or not, but I didn't hear anything. I don't even know if the officer "struck him" with the gun or not, but he was within range. The kid bounced back off the fence and then he ran across the street; he ran around the officer and ran across the street.

The officer was right on him every inch of the way. He was right on him. He kept telling the kid, "Get down. Get down on the ground." The kid was hollering something, but I can't remember. I was concentrating on the cop and his movements. The kid ended up on the sidewalk on the south side of the street, and the cop is standing approximately 10 feet north of the south curbside, still in the street with the taser gun still in his hand. The kid, he was almost holding the officer like this [demonstrated a pushing movement with both hands up at chest height, palms facing out],

acting like he was going to "rush him." He come over here [demonstrating the motion leaning left and right] like he was going to rush the cop. I didn't see anything in the kids hand or nothing.

I didn't see the officer draw his gun, but I heard three shots right in a row. I knew what they were because I have been around guns long enough. It was like a "40 caliber." It "sounded like about a 40 that he shot off,

semi-auto." The kid fell at about the same time, and the cop was still saying, "Stay on the ground, stay on the ground." At that time I turned to my partner _____, and he turned to me too and we were kind of amazed. I said, "Did you hear that? All the sirens are coming. They are all coming now." _____ said, "That was a taser he hit him with." I said, "No, that's a gunshot."

But the kid seemed like he was still moving around. Just at that time, a female

officer pulls up driving south on Osmer, jumped out of the car and ran to the officer that fired the shots. She was helping to hold him [Suspect] down. Just at that time, the gentleman that lives on the south side of the street pulls up in his van and he pulls right in front of us, kind of blocking my view. I could see from the "waist on down of the kid," and then the third officer arrived and they all worked together to handcuffing the guy. So they handcuffed him, and he was lying on the ground. More cops pulled up, and then the ambulance, naturally.

I could see the officer that fired the shots was "all shooken up." He was walking back and talking on his radio and he walked right by our truck. I could see the look on his face, and I could see that he had a hard time with what had happened.

I come to find out that the neighbor who pulled up in the gold colored van was talking to another cop and

he said he was bringing his daughter home and saw the whole thing. He came along the side of us from the east, driving westbound on Nogales. He pulled up in front of our truck. I don't know if he was stopped behind us or what, but the guy was already on the ground when the van stopped in front of us. He had already been shot. I was sitting in the passenger side of our truck. I heard something being said before I actually say anything. The officer was telling him to get down on the ground the whole time. When I looked up, I saw the kid riding his bike [westbound] on Nogales on the driver's side of our truck in the middle of the street. He pulled in front of us about 30 feet ahead. I could see in our driver's side mirror that the officer's car was parked behind us kind of "cock-eyed" in the eastbound side of the street, kind of "nosed to the north." Right after I saw the guy riding the bike, I saw the officer chasing him on foot with the taste in his hand.

From the first time I heard anything to the time the guy on the bike was on the ground, I would say the officer told him to get on the ground at least four times, maybe one or two more. When the guy fell up against that fence, on the north side of the street, I know the officer told him a couple of times there to get on the ground.

I first noticed the officer when the kid on the bike rode in front of us. I

think the officer was pretty close to our left-front fender. He was out of his car, running after the kid on the bike. I think the kid fell off the bike, or purposely got off. I don't know. He was "rolling pretty good." I don't think he purposely got off. "He had the run on the cop." If he was on the bicycle going pretty good, I think he would have outrun the cop. I think it was about that time that I saw the cop, and the bike lost control and the kid fell off.

As soon as I noticed the

cop, I kept my eyes on him. By the time I looked at the guy, he was on his feet and he leaned back against the fence. That's when the cop had the taser out and said "Get on the ground." He said a couple of times, "Get on the ground." I don't want to put in their something that shouldn't be in there, but it just seemed like the guy had no respect for the officer. He wasn't saying anything to the officer. He was mumbling some stuff, but I wasn't paying attention to what he was saying to the officer. Like I said, I was concentrating on the officer and what he was doing. I wanted to see what he was going to do. I mean, you automatically know what the kid was going to do. He was going to try and run and all that stuff. He was going to see how the officer was going to handle the situation.

When the guy fell back against the fence, he just pushed off it and shot across the street. The officer was right on him. He was right where the

guys bike was, probably right at the gutter. He ran around the officer's right side. The officer kept telling him to hit the ground. The guy wouldn't respond. The guy ran to the other side of the street and came out like this [demonstrating the hands chest high, palms out pushing movement] like you're going to scare somebody. He was going to this side, and that side [demonstrating the same motions in a left & right alternating fashion]. I didn't see anything in the guy's hands. It seemed to me he was trying to taunt the officer, like he was going to run or something. He was facing the officer. The officer was directly in front of him, facing south. The guy was facing the north, like I said. It was "like he was taunting him." The officer was in the middle of the street, maybe, I think he was at "right at the crown in the middle of the street." The kid was right on the edge of the sidewalk, near the gutter. He was acting like he was trying to see how the officer was going to respond to his moves.

The guy was saying some stuff to the officer but it sounded like gibberish to me. Like I said, my mind was on the officer. I wanted to see what he was going to do in that situation.

southwest of his truck] at an angle to me. I couldn't see the expression on the kid's face because I was concentrating on the officer. I couldn't even tell you if the kid was black or what. I heard he was black. I can tell you he was a minority, either black, Mexican or something. I know he wasn't white. I couldn't really tell what race he was, only that he was a minority race.

I think the male was wearing a white t-shirt, a dark jacket, and dark pants. I recognized the officer by his uniform. I could see the wire from

his radio microphone and his taser in his hand. His uniform was dark-blue pants and shirt. The officer was a white male. I don't really remember anything else the officer told the guy. The officer was a larger build than the kid. I think the kid was maybe 5-10, and the officer was 6-1 or 6-2. I didn't see the officer's transition between the taser and the gun. I think the taser was yellow and black, about the size of a Glock handgun, maybe seven inches long, probably. The kid went down when the officer shot him. I heard the three shots go off, and I knew right away he was shot. Saul thought it was a taser, but I don't know what a taser sounds like. From the time the kid reached the south side of the street to the time the officer confronted him there, I don't know how much time transpired between that and the time the officer fired the shots.

The kid was already on the south sidewalk, stepping off onto the asphalt, towards the officer. I think he ran to the sidewalk, ran around like this

[gestures a "u-turn" type movement on the table] towards the officer. He was putting on such a show. The guy was making those moves, and it caused me to divert my attention away from the officer for a second. This guy was making some funny moves. That had to be the time the officer changed guns. The kid was doing those same moves when he got shot. He was coming out like this [demonstrating hands chest high, palms forward, in a pushing motion]. He was doing that business, and he stepped out into the street like that [demonstrating pushing out]. He lunged out from the sidewalk. I had just turned to my partner right at that time and heard, "Bang, bang, bang." I didn't see the officer fire the gun, exactly. I just looked at in amazement. I don't think anything was said until after it all happened. At this time, I see the guy on the ground. Right after the shots were fired, I saw the next officer arrive, the female officer. I think it was a Twin River's officer in a black & white. She ran across to where the guy was laying near the south sidewalk.

After he was down, the guy was still moving around, rocking back and forth a little bit, and moving his feet around. It was just calm movements like he was trying to get comfortable. The female officer had both her hands on his back, she was on her knees. The other officers started to arrive, and



When he was down a male and female police officer came in an SUV and the female officer cuffed him. The police kept saying stay down, don't move.

Q: Did you see if the suspect pulled any weapons or had a knife?
A: No, I didn't see any weapons on the guy. The officer did not say drop the knife, gun, anything.

Q: Did you see, the suspect drop or throw anything down like weapons or drugs?

A: No, unless it happened when they were behind my truck. When I saw him on his bike his hands were like this (motions like holding handlebars) trying to pedal faster.

I didn't notice any cop cars in the area or any sirens or lights. I didn't see anybody chasing anyone I just heard a male voice screaming saying, "Get down! get down! Don't move!" from here (indicating west on Nogales) but that van was in my way because I kind of hid behind it. I could have heard two voices, I don't know, it was just so loud. I didn't actually see who was yelling. When I went to see who was yelling, that's when the shots fired and I went back. I never saw the shots

get fired.

After the shots were fired, I started looking around the van. I ran into that yard and I seen him down already and he was like this (extending both of her arms out in a horizontal motion) laying like that (with her face forward and lifting her chin), he was looking up kind of like that. 2 houses west of High St on Nogales) was where she witnessed the suspect laying down and that he was laying with his head facing in a northeast direction $\star\star$

He said something like, "Please call this number, please call this number" and he said, "Don't shoot me! it hurts, it hurts". He also said

something like, "You shot me! you shot me!". The officer kept telling him to just stay down. On 10/28/10, approx. 1700 hrs, while at 5770 Freeport Blvd (HOJ), Interview Room #3, I, Det. Bullard (#375) interviewed and obtained his statement which he related the following in summary (video-recorded):

I just had left my girlfriend's house so I can go pick up my daughter, she lived down the street. So I come around, I see the cop sitting like this, "IIiiirrr!" (screeching tire noise and using his right hand to indicate vehicle positioning on the table), talking to the boy on the bike (using his left index finger pointed downward at the table to the left of his right hand). The big truck was there so I squeezed through (using his right hand to motion as though going around something) and as soon as I squeeze through, "Bam!", he took off and jumped on the bike and started riding. So the cop is right behind him chasing him saying, "Stop! stop!".

So I follow around and

I pull over in front of the big truck. So by that time he slipped and he fell (using both of his arms as if holding handlebars and turning them to the right suddenly) and fell off the bike. The cop said, "Lay down lay down!" (motioning with both of his hands in a pointing motion together). So he pulled his taser out (motioning from the left side) and "PPshheeww!" (firing sound) and I don't think he hit him (motioning with both of his hands on opposite forearms in a shedding/brushing motion). Then they start fighting (motioning both of his arms in a horizontal, circular motion), he was in the middle of the street now, swinging at him. He said, "Get on the ground! get on the ground!". Now he's fighting. So I said, "Man why don't you just get on the ground?!". So that's when he pulls the gun, he said, "Get on the ground! get on the ground!" (pointing with both of his hands together as though holding a gun). And then he went like this (motioning to his left hip area with his left hand, stands up and repeats the same motion). And then "Pow pow pow

pow!". I was like Goddamn, he shot him.

I asked if it appeared that the suspect appeared to be reaching for a weapon

Yeah, just like this (motioning again to his left hip, left hand quickly). I said, "Oh no no, he's gonna shoot him!" and "Pow pow pow!" (pointing with both hands in a shooting motion). He hit the ground, boom. That was it. I just stood there and I was in shock. That's exactly what

happened.

When I was coming down Nogales from Marysville, I hit the corner and come around and I already see him right there, boom on Nogales. Exactly where his car was parked.

When asked to display where on the map he was at and the positioning of others, indicated he needed his glasses and I then provided him with a zoomed in image of the same area

So when I drove down here, his car was already there (indicating the officer's patrol vehicle on Nogales St, approx. 2 houses west of High St on

the south side as indicated by an "x" which I marked for him and indicated that the car was facing southwest) and bam there's a cop car and he was talking to him. So I'm getting ready to squeeze through by the big truck on the north side of the street and that's when he ran and jumped on the bike and that's when he took off, so I pull around in front of that big truck. So I got out and I just watched, I can't get through there because he's swinging in the middle of the street. So then "pow!" (motioning with both of his hands in a shooting motion), I figured the wires hit him and he can't **inaudible**..

When I was coming up and first saw the cop talking to the guy, they were on the south side of the street, the guy was off of his bike, holding it before he ran. He grabbed the bike, started running, and jumped on trying to get away. The officer started running after him. It was a fully marked police vehicle that the officer was in. I don't know if the officer was

where another "x" was marked, approx. five houses west of High St on the north side of Nogales St). I parked my van east of where the bike crashed, maybe twenty feet? He said, "Get on the ground get on the ground!". He shot at him with the taser right where the bike was.

When asked what caused the suspect to crash his bike

satellite image that I showed him), they got some brand new houses.

It looked to me like the guy got mad when he got tased. I don't know which hand the officer shot the taser from. The reason I think it was a taser because I think I saw some wire. I know a little bit about tasers, I've seen them on TV. When he did it, he did it like this (motioning with both arms as though pulling the wires out of his torso area) and that's when I seen the wires. That's when they got in the middle of the street. When they were fighting they were going across the street from the bike (indicating in a southwest direction). They were fighting and backing up. They got to the sidewalk and he told him to, "get on the ground, get on the ground". And I was like, "Man get on the ground!". And then he went like this (motioning to his left hip/side area again with his left hand), just like this.

I asked if the motion the suspect was making was consistent with someone grabbing a gun

Yeah that's what it looked...I said, "Oh man" and "pow pow". I only heard four shots. They were physically fighting for at least a minute up to the point the officer shot him. When they were fighting, they were moving westbound and up to the sidewalk on the south side. He was swinging at the officer with closed fists about six times. He never kicked at the officer.

He was just swinging (motioning with left and right closed fists in a round punching motion). He wouldn't let the officer touch him, the suspect kept saying, "Get back man!". The officer was trying to grab him and he was trying to get away. They never got on the ground with each other, they were on their feet the whole time they were fighting.

When asked how far away the suspect and the officer were from each other when the suspect made the motion towards his hip with his hand, stood up and backed up

About from here to here (indicating the distance between he and I which appeared to be approx. 5 feet which I asked him if 5 feet sounded right). That's pretty close because he was saying, "get down! get down!" (pointing with both hands in a gun-pointing motion). The officer had his gun drawn. When the guy reached for his side, it was real quick. That's when the officer shot and I thought the

officer shot over him to scare him. The officer shot with his sidearm four times, the guy hit the ground and he tried to get up again. So the officer pulled out a little bitty gun, I don't know where he pulled it from. A little chrome one about like this (measuring approx. 5-6 inches between his two index fingers), he didn't get up then when he seen the gun. That's when the black SUV thing came up from Osmer. The guy went down immediately after being shot and fell on his stomach. I think the officer was shooting with this hand (pointing with right hand) and they were only about five feet from each other when he shot. Oh yeah, I would do the same thing! ..**inaudible**.. I told him man, "Just lay down!", he wouldn't lay down. I was out of my car when this happened but I didn't get near them, I stayed in front of my van. I was about fifty, almost sixty feet from them when he shot.

was about two or three houses down from me. I don't know if he fell off the bike or if the cop grabbed him.

I thought the cop had a taser in his hand. I'm not sure, but it seemed like it. I saw yellow and thought it might be a taser he was holding. There was a "yellow cord." I don't know. I saw something yellow. That's what I saw. The cop was chasing him like that [demonstrating with her right arm outstretched as if holding a weapon in front of her] and it was a yellow

The officer was probably about four or five feet away when shot the guy. The guy was lying on the ground, on his stomach when he was shot. I'm not positive, but I think the guy's feet were in the street, close to the gutter, and his head was out in the street. I couldn't see his facial expression. I don't think he was doing anything strange. I only say him running away from the officer. I didn't see nothing in his hands. The only thing I heard

him say was when he was on the ground telling the officer, "I don't have nothing. I don't have nothing." I don't think the cop said anything at the time. I only heard the cop telling him to stop before that.

I was inside my living room, playing a video game. My back was to the living room window, which faces Nogales. The blinds on the window were open. I heard someone saying, "Get on the ground, get on the ground." I turned around and looked outside. I could see the Officer and another guy. They were both standing, facing each other, and kind of moving around in the street. I was about 15 yards away from the Officer and the guy in the street, however I was inside my house. It did not appear to me that they were physically fighting, more like they were just "dancing" around each other.

I turned back to my video game to put it on pause, when I heard 4 gunshots. I knew that I had missed whatever just happened because I heard the shots but never saw the Officer shoot. I went out to my front yard, down by the fence and I saw the Officer holding his taser in one hand and his handgun in the other hand. The other guy was

lying on his stomach on the ground.

The Officer was telling the guy on the ground to "stay down, stay on the ground." The guy on the ground was yelling something like, "He shot me 3 times." He was yelling that to the Hispanic people who live directly next door to me. He was also yelling out a phone number and asking them to call it for him. I don't know if he knows those people, or if he was just yelling at them for help because they were standing out there. After that I just remember him saying, "Ow, ow, ow!"

There was a guy in a brown van. He was a black guy. I don't know him, but I guess he saw what was happening and he pulled over his van and parked it in

I was in my bedroom, folding clothes on my bed. My bed is right under the bedroom window. The window was open and the curtains were pulled aside. I had a clear view out of my window and into the street in front of me. I wear glasses so that I can see far away. I did not have my glasses during this incident, however, I felt that I could see pretty well. I could see that there was an Officer in the street. He was wearing a dark blue uniform

and I'm pretty sure he was with Grant P.D. because of the shape of the patches on his uniform. He was with another guy, who looked to be younger. The reason that my attention was brought to the street, was due to the fact that I heard someone say, "Get on the ground. Get on the ground." It was the Officer who was telling the guy to get on the ground. That was when I looked up and could see the Officer and the guy in the street. The Officer was chasing the other guy and they were running, like in circles, around the street. I would estimate that they chased each other for about 5 minutes.

The Officer had his taser in his hand. I think it was in his right hand. I don't remember if the Officer drew the taser while he was chasing the subject, or if he already had it in his hand when I became aware of the situation and started watching.

The Officer fired the taser at the guy. I saw the "strings" on the taser come out so I know he fired it. The Officer was not close enough to the guy to hit him with the taser, however, so the taser never touched the subject. The Officer pulled out his gun. I don't know if he put his taser away first and then pulled out his gun, or if he still had his taser in his hand when he pulled out his gun. The guy went down on the ground, on his stomach. He was saying something like, "You shot me" or "I got shot." Then he started yelling out numbers, like a phone number. I don't know who he was yelling them to or if he was just wanting

someone to call the number. I assume it was a phone number to his family to let them know that he was shot. I don't remember the number, nor did I call it. I don't know if anyone else called the number. My brother was in the house when this happened, but he was in the back of the house, so he did not see the incident. After the guy was shot, I called to my brother and he and I went outside to see what was going on. I don't remember where the Officer was during that time, nor do I remember if he was saying anything. I don't recall where his police car was parked. I didn't notice the bike during the initial incident. It wasn't until later that I saw the bike lying in the street. The bike was next to my two garbage cans that I had out by the curb.

INVESTIGATIVE FOLLOW-UP:

On 10-28-10, at approx. 1330 hrs., I, Detective Beery #248, was advised by the Felony Assaults Sgt. M. Stigerts, that Detectives were being called out on another Officer involved shooting, at Nogales. Prior to that we'd been called out on another Officer involved shooting at Terracina and Truxel and were currently interviewing witnesses on that shooting. Sgt. Stigerts advised that if I was done with my interviews on the first shooting, that she wanted me to respond to the scene on the second shooting.



NOTIFICATION:

On 10/28/10, at approximately 1335 hours, I was advised of an officer-involved shooting in north Sacramento by Twin Rivers Police. I was assisting with another Sacramento Police officer-involved shooting that had occurred on Truxel Rd. at Arco Arena East Entry Dr. I had been at HOJ at the time of the notification and assembled a group of detectives not immediately involved in the other case. NOTIFICATION:

On Thursday, 10-28-10, at 1330 hours, I was notified by SPD Sgt Stigerts of an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) involving a Grant/Twin Rivers School District Police Officer. I, Det. Jasperson #440, am currently assigned to SPD's Homicide Unit. In this capacity, I am responsible for investigating a variety of crimes, including, but not limited to: murders, suspicious deaths, kidnappings, and officer-involved shootings.

On 10-28-10 at approx 1335 hours, I was at SPD Headquarters when I was notified by Sgt. Stigerts of an officer-involved shooting which occurred on Nogales St and involved an officer from the Twin Rivers Police Department (TRPD).

At approx 1340 hours, Sgt. Stigerts conducted a quick briefing at SPD Headquarters where she advised that Twin Rivers PD had requested code-3 cover at Nogales St / Osmer Ln after shots had been fired by one of their officers. Also present for this briefing were Det. DeDonder, Det. Bullard, Det. Halstead, and Agent Lewis (ATF).

I was subsequently requested to respond to the area of Nogales St / Osmer Ln. My partner (Det. DeDonder) and I responded together, and arrived at Nogales St / High St at approx 1409 hours.

We then walked over to Nogales St, mid-block between High St and Osmer Ln, where other investigators had already begun to gather.

I observed that the scene (the entire block of Nogales St between High St and Osmer Ln) was taped off with police tape and was being guarded/secured by uniformed police officers.

At approx 1432

hours, a field briefing was conducted by SPD Lt. Lester #4101. During this briefing, she informed us of the facts of the case as they were known at the time, including the following:

SPD was notified at approx 1326 hours of a code-3 cover call from Twin Rivers PD for shots fired with a suspect down at Nogales St / Osmer Ln. (SPD call #10-324355.)

The call originated with Twin Rivers PD at approx 1323 hours, when one of their officers broadcast that he was making a stop which resulted in a foot pursuit and ultimately the shots fired (by the officer). (TRPD call #10-1028039; case #10-01435.)

Upon arrival of SPD patrol officers, the suspect was observed face down on the street near a telephone pole in front of Nogales St.

The shooting officer was identified as Ofc. Jason Smith #7. We were told that he had been driving patrol vehicle #731 (which was still on scene), and that he was not injured.

The suspect was identified as Ricardo SAZO, male Hispanic, DOB: 7-19-81, on active parole for 11377(A) HS, CDC # with a listed address of in Sacramento.

We were told that SAZO had been shot three times - in the right shoulder, left hand, and upper left leg. All were through-and-through shots and were non-life threatening wounds. He was taken to UCD Medical Center by SFD. TRPD Det. Dias also went with him to the hospital.

TRPD Lt. Spano also provided information during the field briefing. He

told us that their officer (Ofc. Jason Smith) initially put himself out on a 925B call, which is a suspicious subject on a bicycle. The officer then broadcast that he was in foot pursuit, that the subject was reaching for his waistband and he was non-compliant, and ultimately that shots were fired.

We were told that Ofc. Smith was currently with his attorney, Steven Welty.

We were told that TRPD officers already conducted a neighborhood canvass in the inner perimeter, and SPD officers conducted a canvass of the outer

perimeter.

TRPD Det. Dias #401 was in charge of the suspect at the hospital (UCD) and was currently with him.

SPD Ofc. Bohrer obtained the suspect's clothing from UCD.

No weapon was found on the suspect.

At approx 1503 hours, TRPD Ofc. Smith lead us on a walk-thru of the scene. Present for this walk-thru were Ofc. Smith's attorney (Steven Welty), SPD Sgt. Stigerts, SPD Det. DeDonder, SPD CSI Atkinson, TRPD Lt. Spano, and DA Investigator Joe. Ofc. Smith told us the following in summary:

with a light pole located on the south side of Nogales St and across from the property line separating Nogales St and Nogales St. There were also numerous AFID (Anti-Felon Identification) tags from the taser on the ground in this general area. Ofc. Smith said this is approx the area where he first fired his taser at the suspect.

He said he thought the taser made contact with the suspect, but the suspect

continued fleeing (on the bicycle). Although, he said the suspect did veer the bike to the right (generally northbound) and came to stop up against the chainlink fence in front of Nogales.

I observed that Nogales St, which is located on the north side of the roadway, had a chainlink fence around the front of its perimeter. In front of this residence, there was a chrome BMX-style bicycle laying on the sidewalk/gutter area. Near this bicycle, also in front of Nogales St, was another half of a taser cartridge "blast door", green in color.

Ofc. Smith said this is approx the area where he depressed the trigger on his taser again.

He said he advised on his radio that the suspect was resisting and he (Ofc. Smith) deployed his taser.

He said the suspect continued to flee in a south-westerly direction on Nogales St. Ofc. Smith pointed out that it was his recollection that the suspect was still fleeing on his bicycle at this point. However, he also mentioned that he didn't recall the suspect's bicycle still being in front of Nogales St. Since no one had reportedly moved this bicycle from where it was currently resting, Ofc. Smith said it was possible that when the suspect continued fleeing in a south-westerly direction from in front of Nogales St, he did so on foot.

Ofc. Smith said the suspect continued reaching towards his back area, so he (Ofc. Smith) ultimately drew his duty gun and fired three rounds at the suspect. He said that after he fired these three rounds, the slide on his duty gun locked back due to a malfunction, so he then drew his backup gun from his left ankle (but did not fire it).

He said he broadcast an update on his radio that shots had been fired, and held the suspect at gunpoint until TRPD Lt. Spano and Det. Dias arrived.

In the roadway, approx between Nogales St (on the southside) and Nogales St (on the northside) I observed blood on the ground as well as three spent casings (presumably from Ofc. Smith's duty gun).

After the walk-thru, I returned to SPD Headquarters for interviews. I

arrived at approx 1607 hours.

Det. DeDonder remained at the scene to oversee the processing by CSI.

At approx 1701 hours, I contacted TRPD Ofc. Smith in interview room #6 and obtained his statement. (See attached.)

At approx 1904 hours, I emailed Suspect SAZO's parole agent (David Martin) and advised him of this incident involving his parolee.

The following morning (10-29-10), I took Ofc. Smith's taser (which had been collected from him during his interview) to SPD's Internal Affairs office and downloaded the recorded firing data stored on it. In regards to the date of the shooting (10-28-10), the download showed that his taser was fired three times for a full 5-second cycle each time.

(The printout containing the taser's recorded firing data was later scanned into this report.)

That same morning, TRPD Lt. Spano emailed me the audio files (16 total) for TRPD's radio traffic during this incident. I later copied these files to

an audio CD and booked the CD into evidence.

Later that afternoon, TRPD Sgt. Lor delivered the TRPD report on this incident (TRPD case #10-01435), as well as Ofc. Smith's most recent range qualification record, to me at SPD Headquarters. I subsequently scanned these documents into this report.

On 11-1-10 at approx 0555 hours, I called UCD Medical Center and spoke to Suspect SAZO's nurse. I inquired about whether or not it would be okay to interview him. She said that he was in stable condition and it would be okay to speak with him. She advised that he was in their Davis-11 unit. I told her that I would be right over to interview him.

At approx 0624 hours, Det. DeDonder and I arrived at UCD Medical Center. At approx 0631 hours, we contacted Suspect SAZO in his room. At the time,

he was being guarded by a TRPD officer.

My intention was to obtain a Mirandized statement from SAZO; however, as soon as I informed him that we were detectives with the Sacramento Police Department he said "Okay, I want a lawyer." Consequently, no statement was obtained from him.

On 11-2-10, I listened to a voicemail message that had been left for me the day before (11-1-10 at 1615 hours, my day off) by TRPD Sgt. Lor. In this

On 11-12-10 at approx 1447 hours, I (Det. Jasperson) received a call from a male subject who identified himself as Scott Wippert @ _____. He said he was an attorney who was representing Suspect Sazo in this case, both criminally and civilly.

(Note: While I was on the phone with Mr. Wippert, I accessed the website for the State Bar of California and searched his name. I was able to confirm that someone with this name was an attorney in active status with the Berg & Associates law firm in Chico, CA.)

During this phone call, Mr. Wippert asked me if we were still investigating the case. I told him that we had already concluded our investigation and submitted the case to the District Attorney's office.

He asked me what our conclusions/opinions ended up being with regard to

this case. I informed him that is beyond the scope of my responsibility as neither myself, nor anyone from my department, have — or will — render a conclusion/opinion in this case. I explained to him that we basically just collect the facts, and then submit the case to the District Attorney's office for review and they make the necessary final determinations regarding whether or not to file criminal charges and whether or not the shooting itself was lawful.

I further explained to him that we would not even be doing an internal shooting review of this case, since the officer who fired his gun was from an outside agency (Twin Rivers PD) and not an officer of the Sacramento Police Department.

Mr. Wippert complemented us on our thorough investigation of this case. He said that his investigator went back out to the scene and contacted

numerous people who said that they had already been contacted by the police.

However, he said that he believed he had additional information that we may not have and which may be pertinent to the review of this case. He further stated that his investigator had contacted a subject named " who had already been interviewed by the police and told the police that he did not see anything. However, this individual was now claiming to have witnessed the incident. He said he had a transcribed statement from this person.




