Incident Summary

On 1/5/14 approximately 2134 hrs. Officer Teurn#403 and Redlich#739 were in the area of Fruitridge Rd. and Stockton Bl. looking for a subject that had been creating chaos along Stockton Bl. south of Fruitridge(citizens reported the subject jumping up on stopped vehicles and in one instance kicking the side of another). The citizens that were hailing him reported the suspects progress north bound approaching Fruitridge.

Officer Redlich had actually caught sight of the described subject but had lost contact while stuck in the traffic pattern. As Redlich waited to regain a visual sighting, the subject (later identified as Clifford MANN XREF ██████████) Struck again at the Hollywood Market in the Fruitridge Manor shopping center. MANN vaulted the checkout counter of the store and pushed over sales racks before exiting.

Redlich responded and was advised of MANN's foot borne movement toward the Valero gas station. Officer Teurn responded with Redlich to the Valero and was the first to advise over the radio that he had visual contact with MANN.

Teurn broadcast that the clerk inside the Valero was acting frantic and had caught sight of Teurn and was hastily waving Teurn to enter. Teurn awaited cover.

Unbeknownst to Teurn and Redlich at the time but information obtained through later interviews revealed that MANN had already picked up corn chips, donuts and a six pack of Dos Equis. At the counter MANN had began consuming the chips and the beer.

Near this time, MANN became aware of the officers presence and began yelling at them beckoning them to come get him. The officers considered the environment they would be operating in and opted to wait until either the terrain was more to their advantage or circumstances dictated moving into the store. This decision was abbreviated by MANN's actions. MANN exited the store and engaged the officers.

MANN began to verbally taunt the officers by telling them they "why you out there? Come on in and get me."

MANN advanced on the officers and the officers told MANN to stop and get on the ground. MANN responded by saying ;"make me." Redlich, with his baton already out and in an upper cradle position, backed up to give MANN more time and space to comply. All the while the officers repeated their command to get on the ground. MANN continued his advance and said; "go ahead and hit me." At this point, Redlich complied and delivered two blows to the left arm of MANN. The first hit MANN in the elbow and the second to the closed fist. MANN made it to the ground then began to roll over on his back and prepare to raise up. Redlich delivered another blow to the shin of MANN's right leg. The effects of the well placed and well delivered baton strikes effectively and efficiently provided by Redlich ended MANN's assault.

MANN was handcuffed and medical aid was requested. SFD Medic 10 transported MANN to UCDMC as he was totally immobilized by the well placed well delivered baton strikes. Officer Redlich followed the ambulance to UCDMC.

Officer Graham#389 responded as did Officers Striech#247 and Tippetts#259. These officers conducted a canvass and contacted victims and witnesses. A canvass for video surveillance in addition to the ICC of the officers car was made. The only alternate video source located was from the Valero gas station. The AM/PM across Stockton Bl. did not reach that range. An appointment was set to collect the video and book it into evidence.

On scene I observed all the activities and the statements of the involved officers. Officer Teurn stated that he had his tazer out at the scene but due to the proximity of Redlich in relation to MANN and the fluidity of the

conflict did not employ it.

I noted that the officers exercised a great degree of restraint in their contact of MANN and inflicted upon him only the most reasonable force necessary to overcome his ill conceived plan of attack. I believe this is evidenced by Redlich giving ground for MANN time to think better of his assault, Redlich delivering blows to sites on MANN that are strictly in keeping with department policy and according MANN merely the amount of strikes needed to effectively and efficiently stem MANN's attack and gain his compliance.

I responded to the hospital and was updated on MANN's condition. Medical personnel advised me that MANN had incurred a possible broken elbow, a broken hand and a broken tibia and fibula. UCDCM intended to admit MANN into the hospital for extended stay.

MANN was cited for 484PC and 148PC.

Redlich was instructed to fill out a Red Boarder Form, that he may have submitted through his sergeant.
