### **Incident Summary**

On March 20, 2014, at approx. 1130 hours, Officer Gilbertson and Officer G. Gonzales were working as 2PL3, in full uniform and in a marked police vehicle (2PL3). Gilbertson observed suspect STAIB run a red light on his bicycle at 7th St/L St. The subject refused to stop for the officers and a physical confrontation ensued between the Officers and STAIB. During the arrest, STAIB intentionally placed Officer Gilbertson's hand into his mouth and bit Officer Gilbertson's fingers, resulting in serious injury. Officers Ratcliffe and Cook were among the group of Officers that responded to the scene to assist. It was at that time that Officers Ratcliffe and Cook learned of STAIB'S violent attack on Officer Gilbertson.

Officers Ratcliffe and Cook were assigned to guard STAIB as he received medical treatment at the UCD Medical Center prior to being incarcerated. STAIB was in-custody at that time for felony battery on an officer. Upon arrival at the Med Center STAIB was restrained by medical personnel on a gurney. The restraints at that time consisted of soft leather wrist restraints anchored to the gurney, along with a torso restraint that was placed across his chest horizontally and secured behind the back rest.

Over the next several hours medical personnel performed a number of tests, screenings, etc. on STAIB, including a CT scan. STAIB'S interaction with medical personnel during this time was somewhat amicable, so long as both officers were a short distance away and did not engage him in conversation. At some point, likely when STAIB was moved into a room for the CT scan, medical personnel removed and/or unsecured the soft wrist restraints on STAIB. The Officers had not shackled STAIB prior to this time.

At approximately 1730 hours Officers Ratcliffe and Cook were advised by medical staff that STAIB was cleared for incarceration. One of the officers called me and advised as such. 3PL3, Officers Strauss and Swift, were then dispatched to take custody of and transport STAIB to the main jail. It should be noted that both Officers Strauss and Swift had been present at swing shift roll call and had been advised of the circumstances of the incident in which STAIB violently attacked and injured Officer Gilbertson.

At approximately the time Officers Strauss and Swift arrived in the emergency room of UCD, STAIB was becoming verbally belligerent and uncooperative with Officers Ratcliffe and Cook as they attempted to prepare him for discharge and subsequent transport. He began to call the officers names. It was at approximately that time that Officers Ratcliffe and Cook realized that STAIB'S soft wrist restraints were no longer in place. The four Officers approached STAIB while attempting to gain compliance verbally. STAIB was still seated on the gurney wearing a hospital gown. Officers Ratcliffe and Cook, one on each side, attempted to gain control of STAIB'S arms. STAIB violently reacted, striking Officer Cook directly in the chest with his fist.

Seeing Officer Cook assaulted by STAIB, and with STAIB violently throwing his hands and legs towards the officers, Officer Swift deployed and cycled his CED (prongs) into STAIB'S chest. STAIB immediately pulled the prongs out of his body while yelling "motherfuckers." Officer Strauss then deployed her CED at STAIB'S torso. It was ineffective. STAIB continued to violently resist and assault all the officers. Officer Strauss attempted to move to his (left side) to drive stun STAIB to defend the officers in immediate danger of being struck or bitten by STAIB. As Officer Strauss moved to do so, she was kicked by STAIB in the face and stomach. She was not injured. Officer Strauss got to his left side and drive-stunned STAIB.

During the time STAIB was actively assaulting officers, and after CED'S were deployed by both Officers Swift and Strauss (ineffective), Officer Ratcliffe attempted to discharge his CED. It failed. Officer Ratcliffe then picked up Officer Swift's CED, removed the spent cartridge, placed his live cartridge in Officer Swift's CED and discharged it at STAIB. The deployment also appeared to be ineffective.


All four Officers were eventually able to get STAIB'S hands behind his back and cuffed. An on scene physician removed the remaining probes stuck in STAIB. STAIB was transported to the wagon and then to main jail. At

main jail he refused to walk and SSD deputies placed him in a wheel chair.

Hospital video surveillance of the incident was obtained (approximately 10 days later). It has been forwarded via intra-department mail. The SPD wagon ICC captured STAIB'S transport from UCD to jail and a portion of his interaction with SSD deputies (Back-End 14-74946). CSI responded to the main jail and took photographs of STAIB"S injuries from the CED deployments and drive-stun (redness on chest, stomach, and left rib-cage). The UCD police report (M14-0222) was forwarded to me approximately 3 weeks after the incident (attached hereto in PDF).

Chads and spent cartridges were collected by officers at the scene and booked. Medical personnel that witnessed the incident were identified and interviewed (G.O. 14-74946). I downloaded the CED firing data from each of Officers Strauss, Swift, and Ratcliffe's CED'S (reports attached hereto in PDF). The firing data from each device appears to correspond with facts articulated in the crime report. No Officers sustained injury.

Due to the Officers' knowledge of STAIB'S violent attack on another police officer earlier in the day, STAIB'S verbal and physical (punching and kicking) attack on the Officers attempting to subdue him, and the fact the Officers were in imminent and immediate danger of being struck and injured by STAIB, I believe the 3 deployments of the respective CED'S, and the application of the drive-stun, were appropriate, warranted, and within department policy.



Officer Ratcliffe was instructed to contact the Armorer for a CED replacement.

## **Incident Summary**

On 3/20/14 at approx 1130 hrs, Officers Gilbertson and Reserve Officer Gonzalez were working the wagon, on patrol in the downtown core. Officer Gilbertson observed Suspect Staib riding his bicycle on the north sidewalk of L street (a w/b street) riding east bound. Gilbertson observed Staib cross 7th street against a don't' cross sign. Officer Gilbertson attempted to use the PA in the wagon to stop Staib for the violations but he continued riding on the north sidewalk.

Officer Gilbertson drove through the alley east bound, paralleling Staib and caught up to him at 9th / L Streets. Staib had stopped for traffic on the comer of 9th and L streets.

Officer Gilbertson activated the wagons emergency lights as he drove towards the intersection and advised over the wagon's PA to "wait there bicyclist" and he parked the wagon with Staib at the driver's door. Staib appeared to look everywhere except at the patrol wagon.

Officer Gilbertson quickly exited the vehicle as Staib was moving his bike towards the back of the wagon. As Staib was about to clear the back of the wagon, Gilbertson reached out and grabbed him by the back of the pants, stopping his forward movement.

Staib yelled and took a wild swing at Officer Gilbertson. Staib was still straddling his bike. Staib grabbed Officer Gilbertson's right hand and while they they struggled, Staib and his bicycle went to the ground. Staib then began to bite Officer Gilbertson's right hand. Officer Gilbertson tried pulling his hand out of Staib's mouth but was not able to. Officer Gilbertson struck Staib once in the head with his knee to free his hand. Staib released Officer Gilbertson's hand. Officer Gonzales had come around from the passenger side of the wagon to assist in taking Staib into custody. Staib was resisting Officers Gilbertson and Gonzales to violently they were not able to control him. Officer Bonilla and Cook responded and the four officers were finally able to handcuff Staib.

Officer Gilbertson received a laceration to his right middle finger that required two stitches. Staib lost three teeth. Staib had abrasions on his hands and wrists and a small amount of blood around his mouth. He complained of pain to his wrists, chest, and mouth. He was taken to SMC for medical clearance.

The use of force was within departmental policy and reasonable. Specifically section B (4): Under extraordinary conditions that involve the risk of serious bodily injury or death (suspect biting finger), and in situations where it may be impractical to comply with the provisions of this order (one hand painfully trapped in the suspect's mouth), officers may resort to using any reasonable means of force to prevent injury or death to themselves or any other person.

The only ICC video I was able to locate was of the suspect in the back seat of the transport units car.
