On 09/01/2020 at approximately 1600 Hours, I was contacted by Folsom Police Department (FPD) Lt. Lockhart regarding assisting Sacramento Police Department (SPD). I spoke with SPD Sgt. Jarvis and he advised me they required FPD's armored vehicle to assist in the arrest of an armed suspect.

I drove to a meet location at Smart and Final, 3315 Northgate Boulevard, Sacramento, and SPD SWAT operators then rode with me to the target location, Wisconsin Avenue, Sacramento. I positioned the armored vehicle on the northeast corner of the residence and from my vantage only had a view of the front (north) side of the house.

At approximately 1850 Hours, I heard the SPD helicopter advise over the radio the suspect had left the residence. A short time later I heard what I believed to be gunshots coming from the west of the residence. I then heard over the radio shots had been fired.

My involvement in this incident was as a driver of the armored vehicle only. I remained in the vehicle until the suspect was apprehended. I exited the vehicle once the suspect was apprehended, but remained in the area of the vehicle and did not interact with nor view the shooting scene.







1543 Hours; September 1, 2020(Tuesday): I, Deputy Vernon #47, was assigned to the Special Enforcement Detail of the Sacramento Sheriff's Office. I was advised Sacramento Police Department SWAT personnel were requesting assistance with an operation.

I met with Deputy Winton #1135 at SED's office at SSO Air Operations. Deputy Winton and I drove to SPD's briefing location, with Deputy Winton driving and me as passenger.

We arrived at the briefing location and received briefing information on the operational plan and the wanted individual SPD was attempting to apprehend, including that this individual had recently fired a firearm at SPD officers.

We traveled to the scene, a residential property. Deputy Winton and I were positioned outside the southeast corner of the location, and were assisting SPD officers in containment of the east side of the location.

While in this position, I heard radio traffic stating the wanted individual had exited the residence into the backyard. I saw an adult male, consistent in appearance and clothing with the description of the wanted individual given to me during briefing, run north to south along the west fence line of the location. Due to my partially obstructed view, distance, and subject movement, I could not see whether or not the subject had anything in his hands. As the individual approached the southwest corner of the property, he ducked down behind an above ground pool, at which point I lost sight of him. Several seconds later, I heard what sounded to be several gun shots from the area west of my location.

I did not see the shooting occur.

**1543 Hours, September 1, 2020 (Tuesday)**: I, Deputy Winton #1135 (95E) was assigned to the Special Enforcement Detail (SED) for the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office (SSO) working within a full time Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) capacity.

I was notified by my supervisor, Sergeant Carver that Sacramento Police Departments (SPD) SWAT team had requested the SSO's armored vehicle (Bearcat) to assist with a high risk operation. Deputy Vernon #47 and I were within close proximity to our teams Bearcat and volunteered for the assignment.

Sometime around 1600 Deputy Vernon and I arrived to the area of the SPD command post where we received instruction of our responsibilities from multiple members of SPD's SWAT team.

I was instructed to drive the SSO Bearcat to a predetermined location via overhead mapping application which was the south west corner of the property neighboring to the east of the target location.

After arriving to the predetermine location, I maintained my position in the driver seat of the Bearcat for the duration of the event.

While I sat in the driver seat of the Bearcat I could see the backyard and some of the backside of the target residence. The view of the east side of the residence was obstructed by dense plant growth. The south end of the target property was a very tall concrete wall. The west side of the property was a very tall chain link fence which had dense plant growth throughout the chain link fencing severely obstructing any view to the other side. I knew from seeing an aerial image of the area, the west side of the aforementioned chain link fence was a commercial property which contained multiple businesses and an alley leading to the properties parking lot on the immediate other side of the fencing. Next to the tall fencing in the backyard was a large above ground pool which appeared to be somewhere around twenty feet in diameter and three to four feet tall.

Sometime after 1800 hours I heard radio broadcast on SPD's channel for the operation which I believed was from an aerial asset, state they observed the target in the backyard of the residence and was wearing a white shirt. I began visually scanning the backyard for a male adult wearing a white shirt. I saw what appeared to be the target suspect in a white shirt run from the rear of the residence towards the above ground pool and dive down between the pool and chain link fence. I lost sight of the subject for a moment before seeing a glimpse of part of the same white shirt in the alley on the commercial parcel side of the chain link fence before losing sight of the subject again.

Within a second or two of losing sight of the suspect I heard multiple gun shots followed by radio traffic regarding the suspect being down.

From my location and the obstructed views I had, I did not see the shooting occur.

On 9-1-20, I was working as a Patrol Sergeant for the Sacramento Police Department. I was driving a Sacramento Police vehicle, wearing my Sacramento Police uniform. My vehicle was equipped with an in-car camera. I was wearing a body worn camera. My identifier was "3SM1."

The following is a summary of my observations (for a precise record of my actions, please refer to my body worn camera and in car camera footage):

I was aware that Detectives from the Career Criminal Apprehension Team (CCAT) were in District 1, attempting to locate Albert Wheeler. Wheeler was wanted for the attempted murder of a Sacramento Police Sergeant. The firearm used in the attempted murder was outstanding.

I requested a few units respond to the area of Winterhaven Ave/ Northgate to assist CCAT with their gameplan.

I responded to the area from the Kinney Police Station. I responded to the Command Post which was located off of Rio Tierra, west of Northgate Blvd.

SWAT, CNT, Patrol, and other personnel were on scene at the Command Post. I met up with Lt. Wallace. I was in communication with Lt. Wallace for a majority of this call.

Wisconsin Ave was surrounded by numerous Detectives and other officers in unmarked police vehicles.

At approximately 1637hrs., I requested SFD stage in the area of Rio Tierra/Northstead as I wanted medics close to the scene in the event anyone was injured.

Wheeler had been shot and officers began CPR on him as they waited for medics to respond.

I responded to the scene from the Command Post and arrived at approximately 1902hrs. I activated my body worn camera and my in car camera.

SFD had arrived and after performing life saving measures, SFD Firefighter Van Such declared Wheeler deceased at approximately 1922hrs. Engine 15 and Medic 19 were on scene.

Wisconsin Ave is just east of 3016 Northgate Blvd (Northgate Liquor and Food). The Officer Involved shooting happened just to the south of the building of 3016 Northgate Blvd. Wheeler's body was left at the scene (not transported to the hospital).

Officers utilized crime scene tape to tape off the scene.

Barricades to block the public's view of Wheeler's body were requested and subsequently brought out to the scene and put in place.

Sgt. Young showed me the scene and pointed out the suspect's firearm which was near a wrought iron fence.

I requested units begin a canvass for witnesses/ video.

I initially requested Officer Espinoza standby to protect the scene which contained the firearm however her body worn camera had run out of battery, so I requested Officer Powell remain there to protect the scene with a functioning body camera.

I was advised initially that there were three officers who were close to the shooting but who had not fired any rounds. Those officers were Officers Pinola, Terman and

Air-1 advised they had video and photos from their vantage point.

I spoke with Officers Pinola and Terman and obtained brief summaries as to what they had observed as this information was needed for the upcoming briefing with Homicide Detectives. Please refer to my body worn camera footage and the officers' supplements related to their observations.

Officer Catricala was the lone shooting officer. I contacted him as he sat in a patrol vehicle with Sgt. Lannom (3SM2). Officer Catricala's body worn camera had been turned off at this point. The rifle that was used in the shooting was in the trunk of Sgt. Lannom's patrol vehicle. Sgt. Lannom later moved the rifle from his patrol vehicle and placed it in my patrol vehicle's trunk area.

At approximately 1936hrs., Officer Catricala accompanied me into the parking lot of 3016 Northgate Blvd., so I could obtain a "Public Safety Statement" from him. Officer Catricala's body worn camera was not activated, however my body worn camera was activated.

The following is the Public Safety Statement from Officer Catricala, in summary. I told Officer Catricala that I was going to read directly from a card (SPD 136).

I told Officer Catricala: "I will be taking your Public Safety Statement. I will be asking you specific questions, so please answer only the questions asked of you."

- 1. What was your approximate location when you discharged your firearm?
- Officer Catricala walked me over to the S/W corner of the building 3016 Northgate Blvd. He pointed out a shield that he advised had been stood up. He pointed out milk cartons that he had been sitting on. I noted several apparent milk/ drink cartons on the ground behind (to the west) of where Officer Catricala had been. Officer Catricala demonstrated his body positioning at the approximate spot where he had been, simulating pointing a long gun towards the east while looking through a wrought iron fence.
- 2. What was "your" approximate number of rounds you fired and in what direction?
- Officer Catricala stated he would say he fired 7 rounds in an eastern direction then south eastern direction as he (suspect) was moving.
- 3. Do you know if any other officers fired any rounds?
- Officer Catricala responded, " I don't believe so."

You will have an opportunity to provide a full statement of this incident at "that" time."

At this time, Officer Catricala removed his body worn camera from his uniform and gave it to me. I secured the body worn camera in my patrol vehicle.

I spoke with Officer and obtained a brief summary as to what he had observed as this information was needed for the upcoming briefing with Homicide Detectives. Please refer to my body worn camera footage and the officer's supplement related to his observations.

On Tuesday 09/01/20 at approximately 1520 hours, I, Officer Gomez #889, was on call for CNT (Crisis Negotiation Team) when I received a callout text regarding a potentially barricaded suspect by the name of Albert Wheeler.

I arrived at the command post Rimmer/Normington at approximately 1552 hours and the following occurred in summary:

Upon my arrival, I was assigned to assist Officer in the bearcat with verbal announcements to the residence (Wisconsin Ave). I remained at the command post and attending a briefing of the incident.

At approximately 1740 hours, myself, Officer and SWAT officers entered the bearcat and responded to the scene ( Wisconsin Ave). I activated my body worn camera as we departed the command post.

While on scene, Officer made approximately (22) verbal announcements, over the course of approximately 40 minutes, through the LRAD (Long Range Acoustic Device). The announcements ranged from advising all remaining occupants of the residence to exit the residence and to listen to officers instructions as well as direct announcements notifying Albert Wheeler that we knew he was inside the residence and to come out of the house and listen to officers instructions.

After CNT members had lost contact with Albert over the phone, I heard, over the radio, the air unit broadcast that the suspect had fled the residence through the backyard going westbound.

I then heard sounds of voices yelling and numerous loud bangs. I could not determine if the bangs were shots from firearms or from less lethal weapons.

Additional CNT members responded to the command post. Lt. Hutchins responded as our CNT Commander for this incident.

I assigned Ofc. and Ofc. Bryan Gomez to be in the BEARCAT near the front of the residence to try to establish communication with Wheeler via the long range acoustic device (LRAD).

I assigned Ofc. Dan Bean and Ofc. Morgan Becker to interview and debrief family and friends of Wheeler. During their interviews they obtained several recorded messages (TPIs) from friends and family. Wisconsin Avenue. At one point, the AIR unit advised (3) of the (4) residents were on the front porch and away from the suspect. SWAT responded and quickly rescued the (3) residents.

CNT was authorized to contact the female adult inside the residence and request for her to quickly exit to officers. Ofc. Boyer, as a member of CNT, contacted the female and she agreed to exit. SWAT officers safely got the last resident as she exited the house.

SWAT voiced that one of the rescued citizens described a male named "Richie" (unknown spelling) to be inside. Detective Bean (CNT) spoke with and confirmed that (S) Albert Wheeler goes by the name of "Richie".

CNT officers conducted announcements in front of the Wisconsin Avenue via LRAD. I was informed that the suspect's child's mother was near the scene and had been receiving phone calls from the suspect. Det. Tavelli contacted the female and obtained a phone number for the suspect, which was relayed to CNT.

CNT established contact with the suspect by telephone. CNT utilizes LETS (a recorded software technology system) which allowed me to listen to the conversation. 

#### PRE-AUTOPSY PROCEDURES:

The decedent is received with his hands covered in bags. The bags are removed, and the hands are photographed. Fingernail scrapings are obtained. Head hair is obtained. Photographs are taken in layer-wise fashion from opening the bag until the decedent is unclothed. X-rays are obtained.

#### **EXTERNAL EXAMINATION**

The body is that of an unembalmed, refrigerated, adult man who appears consistent with the reported age of 50 years. The body weighs 219 pounds, measures 67 inches in length, and is well nourished. The skin is remarkable for blunt force injuries as described below in "Evidence of Traumatic Injury" and is free of burns. Wrist scars are not identified. Tattoos are present over the torso and extremities. Rigor mortis is present. Livor mortis is fixed posteriorly.

The head is normocephalic and traumatic as described below in "Evidence of Traumatic Injury" and covered by brown hair. There is no balding, and the hair can be described as short and straight. A goatee-type mustache and beard are present. Examination of the eyes reveals irides that are brown in color. There are no petechial hemorrhages of the conjunctivae, lids, and/or sclerae. The oronasal passages are unobstructed. The teeth are natural and in good repair. The earlobes are unremarkable. There is no hemorrhage or discharge in the external auditory canals. The neck is unremarkable. There is no chest deformity. There is no increased anterior-posterior diameter. The abdomen is flat. The genitalia are those of an adult male. The penis is circumcised. The external genitalia are without trauma or lesions. The extremities show no edema, joint deformity, abnormal mobility, non-therapeutic punctures, or needle tracks. There is no cyanosis of the nail beds of the fingers. The feet are unremarkable. Wrapped around the left wrist is a bandage with gauze pads. There is no injury underneath the area that is wrapped. However, just proximal to this is an area that is scarred and has a nodular appearance, and upon palpation there is a small punctate abrasion that is exuding blood. This is reminiscent and suggestive of a possible AV fistula.

#### **EVIDENCE OF TRAUMATIC INJURY:**

#### **GUNSHOT WOUNDS:**

1. There is a perforating gunshot wound entering the left side of the posterior lateral neck at 7 ½ inches from the top of the head and 2 ½ inches left of midline. The wound is round and measures ½ inch with beveling along the superior margin measuring 3/16 inch. There is no soot or stippling seen on the skin surface surrounding the wound. The exit wound is located on the right side of the back at the junction with the arm near the armpit at 13 inches from the top of the head and 7 ½ inches right of midline. The wound is slit-like and measures ½ inch. No projectile is recovered. The direction of the wound is front to back, left to right, and downward, and courses through the left side of the neck skin, soft tissue of the posterior neck, continuing through and creating a comminuted fractures of C5 and C6 with disruption of the spine at the level of C6 and

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C7, continuing through the soft tissues of the right side of the chest, posterior of the clavicle into the back soft tissues, perforating the scapula, continuing through the soft tissues of the posterior back, and exiting the back at the junction of the right arm with the back near the axilla. There is associated linear fractures the posterior surface of the spinal column from C1 to C5 shows, and additionally they blow out fractures at the level of C5 to C7. There is associated hematoma formation present on the posterior neck soft tissues and hemorrhage along the wound track. There is contusion of the right upper lobe of the lung and fractures of the posterior right rib #1 at the junction with the spine and fracture of posterior-lateral right rib #2. There is focal subarachnoid hemorrhage around the inferior cerebellum.

- 2. There is a gunshot wound to the left lateral arm entering at 11 ½ inches from the top of the shoulder at the anterior lateral upper arm. The wound is superficial and tangential in appearance and creates an elongated laceration and disruption of the tissues. The end of the wound is located at 9 inches from the top of the shoulder on the posterior medial upper arm. The overall dimension is 6 1/8 inches in length x ½ inch at the entry to 2 ½ inches at the exit point of the wound. There is no soot or stippling seen on the skin surface surrounding the wound. Numerous fragments are identified within the wound track that are collected. The direction of the wound is front to back, left to right, and upwards, and courses through the skin and soft tissues of the left arm exiting the skin.
- 3. There is a probable gunshot wound to the posterior-lateral left buttock entering at 36 ½ inches from the top of the head and 7 inches left of the midline on the lateral left thigh. The wound is oval and measures 3/8 inch. There is a surrounding abrasion that is irregular in appearance and covers an area of 1 ¾ inch in greatest dimension. It is most accentuated along the posterior aspects and continuing down the left thigh. On the anterior aspects of the wound's margin, the abrasion is most reminiscent of an entry-type wound. Just anterior to this wound is an abrasion measuring 5/16 inch. There is no soot or stippling seen on the skin surface surrounding this wound. There is a probable exit wound located on the posterior-lateral left buttock at 31 ¼ inches from the top of the head and 6 inches left of midline. The wound has a somewhat short appearance with a marginal abrasion ranging from 3/16 to 1/8 inch. The wound is irregular and measures 3/8 inch in greatest dimension. The possibility the wounds represent injury from a canine unit is not excluded.

BLUNT FORCE INJURIES: The right side of the forehead has a 1/8-inch abrasion. There is a ¼-inch abrasion on the anterior left side of the chest near the axilla. The left lower quadrant of the abdomen is remarkable for irregularly shaped oval to teardrop-appearing abrasions ranging from 1/16 to 1 inch in greatest dimension. At the anterior left axillary line at the waist is a contusion that is red-brown in color measuring 2 x ¾ inch. The posterior-lateral left hip is remarkable for an area of irregularly shaped abrasions. Within this region there is a dominant rectangular-shaped abrasion measuring 1 ¼ x 3/8 inch with focal areas of dark discoloration, suggestive of a possible graze-type gunshot wound. Additionally, there is a dominant round to oval abrasion with a dark rim surrounding the edge on the lateral left hip, suggestive of a possible graze-type gunshot wound. Additionally on the posterior and lateral left hip, there are oval and elongated abrasions that are obliquely oriented ranging from ¾ to 1 ¾ inch. Additionally, distal and anterior to these are irregularly shaped abrasions ranging from ¼ to 3/8 inch. There is underlying hemorrhage in this region. The markings are suggestive of possible bite or scratch marks from a canine unit. The lateral left thigh posterior to the entry from gunshot wound #3 has 2 punctate marks measuring 3/16 and 1/8 inch from anterior to posteriorly respectively. Proximal to the posterior-most wound is an abrasion measuring 1/8 inch, and superiorly and posteriorly to the wounds are additional areas of abrasions ranging from 1/8 to ¼ inch. Inferiorly and posteriorly there are oval to elongated oval-appearing abrasions ranging from 3/16 to ¼ inch. Again, these areas are suggestive of possible bite marks from a canine or scratch marks from a canine. The posterior right buttock has a 2 ¼-inch area of irregular abrasions ranging from 1/16 to 5/8 inch. The lateral right arm extending from the upper arm across the elbow region onto the forearm has a 5 ¾-inch linear abrasion. The anter

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tissues. The metal fragment is retained. The posterior-medial right wrist has a 1/16-inch abrasion. The lateral right leg has a 2 3/8 x 1 ½-inch contusion.

[These injuries, having been described, will not be repeated.]

#### INTERNAL EXAMINATION

The following observations are limited to findings other than injuries, if described above

#### INITIAL INCISION

The body cavities are entered through the standard coronal incision and the standard Y-shaped incision. Additional incisions are made on the neck and extremities.

#### CHEST/ABDOMINAL CAVITY:

The soft tissues of the thoracic and abdominal walls are well preserved. The subcutaneous fat of the abdominal wall measures 2 inches. The pleural cavities are smooth and glistening. The organs of the abdominal cavity have a normal arrangement, and none are absent. There is no fluid collection. The peritoneal cavity is without evidence of peritonitis. There are no adhesions.

#### HEAD AND CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM:

See "Evidence of Traumatic Injury." There is no subcutaneous or subgaleal hemorrhage of the scalp. The external periosteum and dura mater are stripped, showing no fracture of the calvarium or base of the skull. There are no tears of the dura mater. There is no epidural or subdural hemorrhage.

The brain weighs 1310 gm. The leptomeninges are thin and transparent. A normal convolutionary pattern is observed. Coronal sectioning demonstrates a uniformity of cortical gray thickness. The cerebral hemispheres are symmetrical. There is no softening, discoloration, or hemorrhage of the white matter. The basal ganglia are intact. Anatomic landmarks are preserved. Cerebral contusions are not present. The ventricular system has a normal appearance, without dilation or distortion. The pons, medulla, and cerebellum are unremarkable. There is no evidence of uncal or cerebral herniation. Vessels at the base of the brain have a normal pattern of distribution. There are no aneurysms. Cranial nerves are intact, symmetrical, and normal in size, location, and course. The cerebral arteries are without arteriosclerosis.

#### SPINAL CORD:

See "Evidence of Traumatic Injury." A segment of the cervical and upper thoracic cord are removed and remarkable for the injuries previously described.

#### NECK:

See "Evidence of Traumatic Injury." The neck organs are removed *en bloc* with the tongue. No foreign material is present in the mouth, upper airway, or trachea. No lesions are present, and there is no trauma of the gingiva, lips, or oral mucosa. There is no edema of the larynx. Both hyoid bone and larynx are intact and without fractures. No hemorrhage is present in the adjacent throat organs, investing fascia, strap muscles, thyroid, or visceral fascia. There are prevertebral fascial hemorrhages. The tongue when sectioned shows no trauma.

#### CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:

Within the pericardial sac, there is a minimal amount of serous fluid. The heart weighs 450 gm and is enlarged. The right ventricle is 0.3 cm thick; the left ventricle is 1.0 cm thick; and the septum is 1.2 cm thick. The chambers are normally developed and are without mural thrombosis. The valves are thin, leafy, and competent. The circumferences of the valve rings are: tricuspid valve 13.3 cm, pulmonic valve 8.5 cm, mitral valve 10.3 cm, and aortic valve 7.2 cm. There is no endocardial discoloration. There are no lesions of the myocardium. There are no abnormalities of the apices of the papillary musculature. There are no defects of the septum. The great vessels enter and leave in a normal fashion. The ductus

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arteriosus is obliterated. The coronary ostia are widely patent. The right coronary artery is the dominant vessel. There is focal segmental atherosclerosis with up to 30% narrowing of the left anterior descending branch. No focal endocardial, valvular, or myocardial lesions are seen. The aorta is elastic and of even caliber throughout, with vessels distributed normally from it. The thoracic aorta unremarkable. There is no tortuosity or widening of the thoracic segment. The abdominal aorta is unremarkable. There is no dilation of the lower abdominal segment. No aneurysm is present. The major branches of the aorta show no abnormality. The inferior vena cava is unremarkable. The blood within the heart and large blood vessels is liquid.

#### RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:

See "Evidence of Traumatic Injury." Scant secretions are found in the lower bronchial passages. The mucosae are smooth and glistening. The lungs are subcrepitant, and there is dependent congestion. The right lung weighs 870 gm. The left lung weighs 690 gm. The visceral pleura is smooth and glistening. The parenchyma is congested and edematous. The pulmonary vasculature is without thromboembolism.

#### **GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM:**

The esophagus is intact throughout. The stomach is not distended. It contains 60 cc of brown fluid. The mucosa is smooth and glistening. Portions of tablets and capsules cannot be discerned in the stomach. The external and *in situ* appearance of the small intestine and colon are unremarkable. The small intestine and colon are opened along the anti-mesenteric border and are unremarkable. The appendix is present.

#### HEPATOBILIARY SYSTEM:

The liver weighs 2030 gm and is tan-brown in color and enlarged. The capsule is intact, and the consistency of the parenchyma is soft.

The cut surface is smooth. There is a normal lobular arrangement. The gallbladder is present.

The wall is thin and pliable. It contains 9 cc of bile and no stones. There is no obstruction or dilation of the extrahepatic ducts. The periportal lymph nodes are not enlarged.

#### **PANCREAS**

The pancreas occupies a normal position. There is no necrosis. The parenchyma is lobular and firm. The pancreatic ducts are not ectatic, and there is no parenchymal calcification.

#### URINARY SYSTEM:

The right kidney weighs 160 gm. The left kidney weighs 190 gm. The kidneys are normally situated, and the capsules strip easily, revealing a surface that is smooth. The corticomedullary demarcation is preserved. The pyramids are unremarkable. The peripelvic fat is not increased. The ureters are without dilation or obstruction and pursue their normal course. The urinary bladder is distended. It contains 90 cc of yellow clear urine. The urine is not tested by the dipstick method.

#### **GENITAL SYSTEM:**

The prostate is unremarkable. Both testes are in the scrotum and are unremarkable and without trauma.

#### **HEMOLYMPHATIC SYSTEM:**

The thymus is inconspicuous. The spleen weighs 140 gm and is normal in size. The capsule is intact. The parenchyma is firm. There is no increased follicular pattern. Lymph nodes throughout the body are small and inconspicuous. The bone is unremarkable. The bone marrow of the rib is unremarkable.

#### ENDOCRINE SYSTEM:

The thyroid is red-tan in color. The parathyroid glands are not identified. The adrenals are unremarkable. The pituitary gland is unremarkable.

#### MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM:

No abnormalities of the bony framework or muscles are present.

The District Attorney's Office, as an independent agency, has completed its investigation and review of the above-referenced officer-involved shooting. We only address whether there is sufficient evidence to support the filing of a criminal action in connection with the shooting of Albert Wheeler. For the reasons set forth, we conclude that the shooting was lawful.

The District Attorney's Office received and reviewed written reports and other documentary items. These items include Sacramento Police Department report 2020-261223, body-worn camera footage, in-car camera recordings, dispatch calls, witness interviews, photographs, diagrams, evidence logs, medical records, Sacramento County District Attorney Laboratory of Forensic Services reports, transcripts of phone calls, and the Sacramento County Coroner's Final Report of Investigation.

#### **FACTUAL SUMMARY**

On August 4, 2020, a woman called 9-1-1 and indicated that her husband, Albert Wheeler, was sitting in his truck in her driveway on Rivera Drive in Sacramento. She stated that Wheeler brandished a firearm and wanted to kill himself. She gave the 9-1-1 dispatcher a description of Wheeler and the truck.

Multiple officers from the Sacramento Police Department were immediately dispatched to the scene. Sergeant Andy Hall arrived at the Rivera home and saw Wheeler driving in his truck. Sergeant Hall noted that Wheeler and the truck matched the description given by Wheeler's wife.

Sergeant Hall turned on his overhead emergency lights to stop Wheeler, who sped away and ran multiple stop signs. Having lost sight of Wheeler, Sergeant Hall drove back to the house.

Sergeant Hall contacted Wheeler's wife and confirmed that she was the person who called 9-1-1. As he spoke with her, he heard another officer broadcast over the radio that Albert Wheeler was driving back towards the house.

Sergeant Hall crouched behind his patrol car and saw Wheeler's truck speeding towards the house. As Wheeler passed, he fired two shots at Sergeant Hall from inside his truck. Both bullets hit Sergeant Hall's patrol vehicle.

Wheeler sped away after firing at Sergeant Hall. Multiple SPD officers arrived to investigate the shooting. Officer David Lee interviewed Wheeler's son, who said that his father started an argument with his mother. He said that during the argument, Wheeler stated, "I'm gonna end it all. I'm gonna do suicide by cop."

Officer Morgan Becker interviewed Wheeler's daughter, who said that her mother and father were in the process of splitting up. Her father came over for her birthday and started arguing with her mother. Her father went to his truck and brandished a gun. She stated that her father had previously told her that he would die of "suicide by cop."

A warrant for Wheeler's arrest was issued for the attempted murder of Sergeant Hall.

On September 1, 2020, the Sacramento Police Department's Career Criminal Apprehension Team conducted surveillance at three different locations to locate and arrest Wheeler. At approximately 2:45 p.m., Detective saw Wheeler at a home on Wisconsin Avenue in Sacramento. The Wisconsin Avenue residence is a single-story home adjacent to a gas station and liquor store at the corner of Northgate Boulevard and Wisconsin Avenue. The two properties are separated by a chain link fence which borders the backyard of the home. A hole in the chain link fence leads to an alleyway between the liquor store and a strip mall.

Shortly thereafter, Detectives observed a female leaving the home and driving off. Officers contacted her and she stated that Wheeler was inside the Wisconsin Avenue residence.

SPD SWAT officers and a Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT) were dispatched to the location.

At approximately 5:45 p.m., a woman and two small children were contacted in the front yard of the Wisconsin Avenue home. Detectives removed all three from the scene. The woman told detectives that Wheeler was inside with a female.

At approximately 5:52 p.m., the CNT contacted the woman by phone to persuade her to safely exit the house. A few minutes later, she exited the house and was taken away from the scene by police. She told the CNT that Wheeler was now alone inside the house.

At approximately 6:25 p.m., Officer Travis Boyer of the CNT contacted Wheeler by phone. Officer Boyer asked Wheeler if he was okay. Wheeler began to cry and replied, "Fuck you,

man." Wheeler further stated that the police had come to his house too many times and that he did not care anymore. Wheeler stated, "You ain't going to get me alive, motherfuckers." Wheeler then ended the call.

At approximately 6:28 p.m., Wheeler called Officer Boyer back. Wheeler said he "is not playing." He asked if Officer Boyer would help him get away with the "stupid shit" he did. Wheeler told Officer Boyer that his life was in danger because he was not going back to prison.

Wheeler then said, "I am going to spend the rest of my life in prison, and I am not going back to prison, dude. I did fucking excellent and then I came home, and I fucked up and right now I am going to pay the price. I am not going back to prison and you need to understand that. Okay? Right now, you need to understand that. Don't fucking lie to me, dude."

Wheeler then asked to speak to his wife and said that no one was going to get hurt. He told Officer Boyer not to hurt his dog and not to shoot up his house. He then said that he wanted the officers to let him go to the back of the house so they could deal with him there.

Wheeler asked Officer Boyer to talk to his boss and see if he could guarantee that Wheeler would not receive prison time. Wheeler suddenly stated, "I see them coming man, you better come correct." The phone line disconnected. Officer Boyer called Wheeler back, but there was no answer.

At approximately 6:41 p.m., Wheeler answered Officer Boyer's call. Wheeler asked to speak with one of the two women the police had removed from the scene before he exited the house. However, the call abruptly dropped.

At approximately 6:49 p.m., Officer Boyer spoke with Wheeler again and told Wheeler he was with the woman that had exited the residence. Officer Boyer also told Wheeler that the woman had a message and that it would be delivered soon. Wheeler responded in a muffled voice. Officer Boyer believed he heard Wheeler's last words to be, "Time's up." That was the last conversation Officer Boyer had with Wheeler.

The Career Criminal Apprehension Team and other law enforcement partners had established a perimeter around the Wisconsin Avenue residence while Officer Boyer was speaking with Wheeler. Officer Vincent Catricala was positioned on the west side of the perimeter, at the end of the alleyway that connected the backyard of the residence to the liquor store and strip mall. Officer Catricala was dressed in full police uniform and armed with a department issued Colt AR-15 rifle. Officer Catricala knew from a previous briefing that Wheeler was potentially armed and had shot twice at Sergeant Hall. Officer Catricala also heard over the radio that Wheeler told the CNT that he "was not going back." Officer Catricala believed that to mean that Wheeler did not intend to allow himself to go back to prison.

At approximately 6:53 p.m., an observer in a police helicopter directly overhead saw Wheeler exit the house into the backyard. Helicopter personnel stated over the radio that Wheeler was heading westbound. The personnel saw Wheeler toss a duffel bag and flee the backyard.

Officer Catricala heard over the radio that Wheeler was running westbound and saw Wheeler sprinting towards his position. Officer Catricala saw a handgun in Wheeler's right hand.

Officer Catricala yelled to Wheeler, "Let me see your hands!" Wheeler did not respond and continued to run towards Officer Catricala with the gun. Officer Michael Pinola's K-9 was chasing after Wheeler as Wheeler ran towards Officer Catricala.

As Wheeler got closer, Officer Catricala saw Wheeler raising the gun up and bringing his hands together, as if positioning himself to shoot. Officer Catricala then saw Wheeler point the gun at him. He believed that Wheeler intended to shoot him and feared for his life.

In response, Officer Catricala fired multiple rounds at Wheeler. He fired as he was backpedaling to create space between himself and Wheeler. As he backpedaled, Officer Catricala tripped over the curb behind him and fell.

Officer Catricala immediately stood up and visually reacquired Wheeler's position. He saw Wheeler in a seated position with both legs straight out, still holding the gun in his right hand.

Officer Catricala saw Wheeler again bring the gun up to a shooting position and saw Wheeler turn towards him with the gun. Officer Catricala then immediately fired one additional shot at Wheeler.

Wheeler fell to the ground and dropped the gun approximately two feet away. Within approximately two minutes, officers equipped with shields approached Wheeler. They secured the firearm, took custody of Wheeler, and provided medical assistance to Wheeler until they were relieved by members of the Sacramento Fire Department at approximately 7:01 p.m.

Fire Department medical personnel attempted to administer life-saving treatment to Wheeler until approximately 7:50 p.m., when he was pronounced deceased at the scene by Fire Department personnel.

Officer Catricala's body-worn camera video was reviewed. It depicts Officer Catricala in the alleyway that connects the backyard of the Wisconsin Avenue home to the adjacent strip mall.

At approximately 6:52 p.m., the video shows Officer Catricala in a seated position, armed with his rifle

At approximately 6:53 pm, the video shows Officer Catricala stand up and point his weapon. Officer Catricala is heard yelling, "Let me see your hands!"

Wheeler is not captured on the body-worn camera video at this point due to Officer Catricala's crouched stance and the angle of the camera.

The video shows Officer Catricala backing up as he fires multiple rounds. Officer Catricala then falls to the ground.

The video then shows Officer Catricala immediately getting up and advancing forward. Wheeler is now captured on the video. Wheeler is in a seated position with both legs straight out on the ground.

Wheeler is seated with his torso partially bent over and an object can be seen in his right hand, which is raised. Wheeler then tries to straighten up into a fully upright seated position, and Officer Catricala then fires one final shot. After this shot, Wheeler is seen laying on his back on the ground.

In-car camera video of Officer Michael Pinola's patrol car was reviewed. The patrol car was parked at the end of the alleyway on the strip mall side. The camera directly faced the fencing of the Wisconsin Avenue residence and captured the entire incident.

In the video, Officer Catricala is seen positioned at the end of the alleyway near the patrol car.

In the audio portion, officers are heard stating over the radio that Wheeler was on the run and running towards the west side of the fence line. Further, officers relayed over the radio to "Get ready."

A few seconds later, Wheeler appears in the video running towards Officer Catricala. The video further shows Wheeler running directly at Officer Catricala, raising his gun up, and pointing it in Officer Catricala's direction.

Suddenly, yelling and multiple gunshots are heard. The video shows Wheeler pointing his gun directly towards Officer Catricala's position before and during the time Officer Catricala fires his weapon.

The video then shows Officer Catricala fall backwards and Wheeler being chased by Officer Pinola's K-9. Wheeler then falls to the ground and Officer Pinola's K-9 is seen biting Wheeler by the leg.

The video then shows Officer Catricala stand up and point his rifle at Wheeler. A clear view of Wheeler at this point is obscured by the dark metal fence. One last gunshot is heard and Wheeler's body goes limp to the ground.

Police helicopter video was reviewed. Wheeler can be seen running from the backyard of the residence towards the alleyway between the liquor store and strip mall. The area is blocked from view by the strip mall building until after the shooting when Wheeler can be observed laying on the ground. It otherwise depicts the events as described above.

A round count and examination of casings recovered at the scene determined that Officer Catricala fired a total of 10 rounds from his Colt AR-15 .223 caliber semiautomatic rifle.

A Beretta Model 92 FS Centurion 9mm semi-automatic handgun was recovered two feet away from Wheeler's body. The gun was loaded with 15 rounds. Two additional magazines loaded with 9mm rounds were found in Wheeler's right pants pocket.

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There is no evidence to suggest any bullets were discharged from Wheeler's gun during this incident.

An autopsy was conducted by Dr. James P. Tovar of the Sacramento County Coroner's Office. Dr. Tovar's findings indicate Wheeler suffered 3 gunshot wounds, one to his neck, one to his arm, and one to his left buttock. Dr. Tovar determined the cause of Wheeler's death to be the gunshot wound to his neck. The direction of that gunshot was front to back, left to right and downward.

A sample of Wheeler's femoral blood was obtained and sent to the Sacramento County District Attorney Office's Laboratory of Forensic Services for testing. The sample was found to contain a blood-alcohol content of .062%. The sample was further found to contain methamphetamine and amphetamine.

#### **LEGAL ANALYSIS**

An officer who has reasonable cause to believe a person has committed a public offense or is a danger to others may use reasonable force to affect arrest or detention, to prevent escape, or to overcome resistance. (*Tennessee v. Garner* (1985) 471 U.S. 1, 11; *Graham v. Connor* (1989) 490 U.S. 386, 396; *Kortum v. Alkire* (1977) 69 Cal.App.3d 325; California Penal Code section 835a(b); CALCRIM 2670.) The person being detained or arrested may be subjected to such restraint as is reasonably necessary for his arrest and detention and has a concomitant duty to permit himself to be detained. (*People v. Allen* (1980) 109 Cal.App.3d 981, 985; CALCRIM 2670, 2671, 2672.) Officers do not need to retreat or desist their efforts if the person they are arresting or detaining resists or threatens resistance; nor shall the officer be deemed an aggressor or lose the right to self-defense by use of reasonable force. (California Penal Code section 835a(d).)

Here, Sergeant Hall responded on August 4, 2020, to a complaint that Wheeler had brandished a firearm in front of his wife. Sergeant Hall located Wheeler driving in his truck and attempted to detain Wheeler. He activated his overhead emergency lights to instruct Wheeler to yield. Wheeler had an obligation to permit himself to be detained. Wheeler chose not to do so. Instead, Wheeler chose to accelerate away and run multiple stop signs.

Sergeant Hall lost sight of Wheeler. He returned to the scene of the original complaint to investigate further. When Sergeant Hall did so, Wheeler drove back to the area and fired two gunshots at Sergeant Hall from inside his truck. Both gunshots struck Sergeant Hall's patrol vehicle.

An arrest warrant was issued for Wheeler for the attempted murder of Sergeant Hall.

On September 1, 2020, it was determined that Wheeler was inside a home on Wisconsin Avenue. That home was eventually surrounded by police and a standoff ensued.

Wheeler had a duty to allow himself to be detained for shooting at Sergeant Hall. However,

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Wheeler conveyed to the police negotiator that he was not surrendering and that he would not go back to prison. He also stated that the police would not capture him alive. This was a threat to resist apprehension violently.

Officer Catricala was part of the apprehension team and had been informed of Wheeler's prior conduct and his conversations with the negotiator. After extended negotiations, Wheeler fled the home with a loaded firearm and ran towards Officer Catricala's position.

Officer Catricala commanded Wheeler to let him see his hands, but Wheeler continued running at Officer Catricala. Officer Catricala clearly saw a firearm in Wheeler's right hand. He also saw Wheeler raise the gun up and point it at him.

A peace officer may use deadly force under circumstances where it is reasonably necessary for self-defense or defense of another. California law permits the use of deadly force if the officer actually and reasonably believed he was in imminent danger of death or great bodily injury. (CALCRIM 505, 507, 3470; California Penal Code section 835a(c)(1)(A).) An officer who uses deadly force must actually believe that force is necessary. The appearance of danger is all that is necessary; actual danger is not. (*People v. Toledo* (1948) 85 Cal.App.2d 577; *People v. Jackson* (1965) 233 Cal.App.2d 639.) Thus, the officer may employ all force reasonably believed necessary. (CALCRIM 3470.) The reasonableness of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene, rather than with 20/20 hindsight. The calculus of reasonableness must embody allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split-second judgments – in circumstances that are tense, uncertain, and rapidly evolving – about the amount of force that is necessary in a particular situation. (California Penal Code section 835a(a)(4); *Graham v. Connor* (1989) 490 U.S. 386.)

Officer Catricala was faced with a suspect who had shot at another officer, who was sprinting towards him, who ignored a command to show his hands, and who was pointing a gun directly at him. Officer Catricala was justified in believing he needed to take immediate action to defend his life.

After the first volley of shots by Officer Catricala, Wheeler was on the ground and in a seated position, yet still had the gun in his right hand. Wheeler looked towards Officer Catricala and again raised the gun. In doing so, Wheeler clearly presented an immediate threat of death or serious bodily injury to Officer Catricala. Officer Catricala acted reasonably when he fired the final shot at Wheeler.

#### CONCLUSION

Given the circumstances of this situation, we conclude that Officer Catricala was justified in using deadly force. Wheeler had previously brandished a gun at his wife and was threatening suicide by cop. He fired two gunshots at Sergeant Hall before he evaded police custody. Police officers later located Wheeler and surrounded the home in which he was staying. After extensive efforts at negotiation, Wheeler fled the house on foot with a loaded firearm. He sprinted towards Officer Catricala and raised his gun upwards in his right hand. This created an immediate danger

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of death or serious bodily harm to Officer Catricala. Even after being shot and falling to the ground, Wheeler sat up and again raised his gun, continuing the immediate danger of death and serious bodily injury to Officer Catricala. It was reasonable for Officer Catricala to believe Wheeler would shoot him if he did not immediately respond with deadly force. As such, his actions were lawful. Accordingly, we will take no further action in this matter.



At this point there was nobody over here because Officer Pinola and Terman had also run to him. So, I got to about here and I stopped, and I was aware that my body cam was not active also, so I took a position to cover this, and at this point Pinola's dog came running out this way, so I helped deal with the dog, and I never ended up over here because there was plenty of people helping Catricala.
CULP: And when you looked over and you saw him fall, was he shooting? Did you see him shoot?
Well, I had heard the shots, and he fell, and then he kind of came back up at an angle. He was still on the ground, but he brought his rifle up and appeared to fire two more times.
CULP: Two more times? Okay. How many rounds do you think you heard him fire?
Initially I don't probably three or four, but I'm not certain.
CULP: At any time were you in fear for your own safety as a result of a direct threat from Albert Wheeler?
Yeah. I mean, I was aware of what he was capable of, and you know, I was concerned about that, but as I didn't see him or I didn't see the gun pointed right at me, so I didn't feel that fearful, but I was worried for Vinny the way he went down that he had got shot in the circumstances.
CULP: And could you and I guess you kind of answered that, but you did not ever see Albert Wheeler?

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resources, Air, and then we'll formulate either we're going to stop the vehicle or do a SWAT surround and call out. It's all kind of...it's volatile, if you will.

Q: Okay. And had any of that been talked about at the time that you had arrived on scene?

A: No, it hadn't.

Q: Okay, so then we're just going move forward to the incident itself. Just go into kind of where you were at, and I have a map here that you can mark areas, the tactical plan that you were aware of at the time and what your role was.

A: Okay, so Mr. Wheeler had been observed by CCAT, PRCS detectives. We were concentrating on this address on Wisconsin. I believe it was Wisconsin. It's this gray structure right here, or light off-white, if you will. Myself, Officer Terman, and Officer Catricala, our area of responsibility was this gas station that was off to the west of it. As SWAT vehicles moved into the area, K-9 units moved in. We assumed our position here. I drove south on Northgate and parked my vehicle near the gas pumps right here, along with Officer Catricala and Officer Terman. Initially what we were going to do is we were going to move into the southwest corner right here of the gas station, and there was a breezeway that allowed us access or just a visual on the fence line of the target location, the west side right here. Initially, I positioned - there was a wrought iron gate that separated this large business and the gas station. There was a wrought iron fence with a swinging door. We opened the swinging door, and I positioned myself with my K-9 here with using my two cover officers as long cover to this breezeway. While this was going on SWAT was positioned. They started doing announcements at the residence asking for anybody inside to come out, including the suspect. This took a while. While manning our position right here we were approached by two SWAT officers, Officer Deleon and Officer Surjan, and they advised that they had another area they wanted me to look at, maybe a better vantage for us. So I went with them after they borrowed a pair of bolt cutters to cut a fence somewhere in this area here on the north side of the business. I followed them, and we ended up in this area right here to the west of the target location but to the east of the gas station. There's a large Conex box that runs along the east side of the gas station and the target location, and that Conex box actually was butted up against the target location's fence. So from that position, I had a little breezeway. It was approximately three to four feet wide between the business and the Conex box and allowed us to see into the area in which Officer Catricala was monitoring, and based on the background, if we had to utilize lethal force, we had a solid background, and Officer Catricala would not be in danger. I asked Officer Terman - we were not on the Conex box, but we were standing on the ground in the breezeway, and as I looked south, I had a clear shot. There was some garbage and stuff on the ground, but if anybody emerged into that breezeway you'd be able to see him. I had Officer Terman cover a window on the target location that was facing us. Where the BearCat was focused they didn't have that line, so - I'm sorry, that area covered, so that's why we manned it. During this time, I could hear Air overhead giving updates about the target, Mr. Wheeler coming in and out of the residence, front and the back. They updated - gave us a different clothing description than we originally had, but they were positive it was Mr. Wheeler. During this time while monitoring this breezeway, I heard the Air unit over the radio advise that the suspect had emerged into the backyard, and he was running south towards the fence line that was being covered by myself, Officer Terman, and Officer Catricala. Looking down the breezeway that I was talking about, I saw

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the suspect emerge left to right or east of west, if you will. Clothing description matched and based on photos I've seen of him in the past - we've been actually working on game plans with CCAT for several weeks on this, so I knew it was him. I unhooked my police K-9, Brace, from his leash. Mr. Wheeler, he ran east to west, like I said, and it appeared he looked in our direction. I released my K-9, Brace, and I gave the normal K-9 warning of "K-9. Don't run." My dog started chasing him, and that's when Mr. Wheeler disappeared in the breezeway toward Officer Catricala. So what we did is we ran along the north side of the business back to where Officer Catricala was around the front. During that time as we were running, I heard loud automatic gunfire, approximately five rounds, and I ran south along the front of the business to where Officer Catricala was. I could see that he was in some type of crouched position or kneeling. He had his gun up, level, so I figured that he was okay. I actually drew my pistol as I rounded the corner starting to pie this, and looking over Officer Catricala I could see that suspect was now down on the ground. I don't know if he was in a prone position or supine, but he was flat on the ground, and my K-9, Brace, was - he was on apprehension, biting the suspect. Officer Terman had followed me along with a bunch of plainclothes detectives. My priority at that time was to get the dog off the suspect, so I ran back the same path that I had taken across the front of the business along the north side, and my dog met me on that position. I checked my dog for injuries. He was fine and ultimately returned him to my patrol car that was over here along the south side of the business. Officer Terman at some point had moved my vehicle from where I had originally parked, and he actually positioned it where it was resting when you guys arrived on scene last night.

Q: Okay.

A: Yeah. I'm sorry, go ahead.

Q: No, go ahead.

A: Okay. So I don't know if I mentioned or not, but I gave my dog a verbal, we call it an out command and release, and at that point, that's when he returned to me.

Q: Okay. And can you just go over the situations in which you would deploy a K-9 and why you decided to deploy the K-9 this time.

A: So prior to this whole incident unfolding and us setting up, I got a hold of 3- Sam-1, Sergeant Jeff Morris, and I briefed him on the phone about what was going on during this, our want for the suspect, his past history, statements he had been making about not wanting to go back - not going back to prison, wanting to shoot it out with police officers, so I felt that he was a danger to officers and the citizens. I looked at our K-9 deployment criteria. It's a three- pronged criteria. So number one, he had committed a public offense. He was wanted on a felony warrant, violent history, those statements that we talked about, and I discussed that with Sergeant Morris. It was believed if the suspect attempted to flee the residence he would probably try to shoot it out with officers, so he was a danger to us and the public. The area in which

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he was at provided a lot of concealment that my K-9 could locate him in, so that's why I deployed him.

- Q: Okay. And what did you know about the suspect in the incident that he was involved in, that he was wanted for?
- A: The incident in early August officers had responded to some type of 415 DV call. The suspect was located in a vehicle. He led him on a high speed pursuit, ended up going back to the initial location of the call and shot at one of our North Area sergeants with a handgun. That's what I knew about the call. I had actually seen the vehicle with the bullet holes in that.
- Q: Were you on that call as well?
- A: I wasn't. That occurred in the evening, but when I came back in the morning, I had seen the IB.
- Q: Okay. So, you had seen a photo of the suspect prior to responding to this?
- A: Several of them. I had seen his, I believe was a DMV photo on WebKPF, and then there was a detective, I don't recall which one, had actually sent out almost like a collage of new photos of the suspect, and I had also seen photographs of his tattoos. It was very distinctive.
- Q: And initially, what was he described wearing?
- A: He was initially described wearing a tank top. It was black and gray, I believe, multicolor, and he had a pair of some type of shorts on, basketball shorts or running shorts.
- Q: And what did you see him in?
- A: The Air Unit advised that he had changed his clothing and was wearing some type of white shirt, and I don't remember what he was wearing below. When I saw him across the breezeway all I could see was the upper torso, so I could see his face and shirt and such.
- Q: And did you immediately recognize him as he passed through the breezeway?

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A: Immediately, yes.

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Q: Did you see anything in his hands?
A: No, I didn't. It happened so quick that it was - all I saw was movement, and I was concentrating on whether or not this was my intended suspect or not.
Q: Okay. Can you show me - can you just mark with the number one where you were at prior to the suspect fleeing?
A: Yes. So, right here in this under hang area right here, but the one right there. I was right there. I looked down the breezeway to my right, and I saw the suspect emerge in this area right here, somewhere in this area.

The following is a transcribed statement of the interview provided by Officer Arian Terman #879, on 09/02/2020, at approximately 1530 hours. Officer Arian Terman, Detective Sergeant Joseph Ellis #3132, Sacramento Police Officer's Association President Tim Davis #340, and I, Detective Todd Culp #858, were seated inside an interview room at 5770 Freeport Blvd. I audio recorded the conversation and later booked a copy of the recorded audio into evidence, PR# 1094259-001. The transcription is not word for word. For a verbatim copy of the interview, refer to the DVD containing the audio recording. Officer Terman and Timothy Davis were later provided a copy of this transcription. The following was stated in summary:

TERMAN: So it was an attempt pickup call that looked like CCAT had created, and initially when I got in my car and started to get on their channel and listening and reading the call, it looked like they had information that Albert Wheeler, who was wanted for attempt homicide of a Sac PD officer from about a month ago, that they had potentially located him at Wisconsin. Shortly after, I started going en route to where the other K-9 officers were staging. I heard that, I believe, some of the PRCS units had followed away a female subject in a vehicle from that target location at Wisconsin and that they had stopped her at a laundromat, I think a bit to the south. In a debrief she had told the officers that Albert Wheeler was, in fact, at the house.

CULP: Let's talk a little bit about the staging area. When you guys staged, was it right there at the scene, or were you guys away from where it was?

TERMAN: No, we were I would say approximately half a mile to a mile to the northwest of the target location.

CULP: When you guys staged, did you guys have any kind of briefing? Did you guys have a discussion about the target and tactics or what you guys were planning on doing?

TERMAN: So, we were having internal discussions amongst the K-9 officers in the staging area, but we were also having directive relayed via radio from the watch commander level. Then, once the decision was made for the surround and call-out with SWAT and the CP was established, then communications were coming down via CP to us via the senior K-9 handlers, which were then relayed to all us units that were staging.

CULP: What was your directive?

TERMAN: The directive was that when the order was given, that me, Ofc. Catricala and Ofc. Pinola would move from our staging area to the gas station at the southeast corner of Wisconsin and Northgate, and we would hold that perimeter spot in case the suspect were to flee to the west.

CULP: As you were saying, you were getting radio updates. Once you get out there, were you also getting radio updates as to what was going on?

TERMAN: Yeah.

CULP: Did you have any concerns? Any of those radio updates give you any kind of concerns?

TERMAN: The suspect was -numerous times had exited the residence and was walking around the backyard. This was actually both prior to our arrival to our staging area and then once we were in the gas station, he was coming out. I believe he came out the front, he came out of the back several times. That concerned me that there was a higher likelihood that he was going to flee. I felt like he was testing our perimeter and seeing what resources we had where.

CULP: Did you have an ICC or a body worn camera?

TERMAN: I did.

CULP: Both?

TERMAN: Yes.

CULP: Were they activated?

TERMAN: Yeah, they were.

CULP: Both at the staging area and then when you guys get to the gas station, do you guys form a tactical plan?

TERMAN: Yeah, so we Vinny, Pinola, and I discussed in terms of how we were going to set up on that corner. We looked at Google Earth, the map, and our MDC and tried to determine the best place for us all to put ourselves and our vehicles. We were also given a rifle rated shield, ballistic shield I think from an Outside Agency SWAT Department that we figured out best to utilize that. We determined that Mike Pinola would have his dog out with him and that Catricala and I would be lethal cover with our rifles and that Catricala would take the shield out when we arrived at the gas station and we would find a place to prop it up and give us extra cover.

You start to run around. As you're kind of midblock on that gas station you start hearing shots. As you come around the corner, you see Vinny shoot either his last one or two shots. Okay. So, lets go into that in a little bit more detail. Start me off from you guys are in the gas station, and at one point you're kind of over where Vinny is and then you and Pinola move over to where that CONEX box is, and just kind of walk me through that.

TERMAN: So, when we first arrived, Vinny and I pulled in first, then Pinola pulled in after us. We all kind of cheated away from the alley. I think we all had the same thought to not be telegraphing our presence through the alley in case he were to look at that moment as all the other officers were converging on the other perimeter spots. Got out and Vinny took the shield out, we set it up on the wrought iron fence, which would be right here.

CULP: You want to just draw a line there?

TERMAN: Yeah. So, we kind of set the shield up right there, just propped it up against the fence. Initially, Mike Pinola was right on the corner of the gas mart right there, and I was kneeling behind the shield, and Vinny was on this corner I think, or right here there's a corner of this building to the south that Vinny was set up on.

CULP: Do you want to just draw an arrow where Vinny was?

TERMAN: Yeah. Then after a few minutes, I felt like, one, we noticed that there was a propane tank behind us, which was obviously a hazard, but we couldn't move that and we had to keep our position, but also I felt like the shield was not the best cover. So, I had Vinny cover, and I went and got Mike's car because I knew Mike had his dog out, so if it took rounds that his dog wouldn't be exposed. I moved Mike's car up probably to right here.

CULP: Okay. That little box that you drew is going to be Mike's car?

TERMAN: Yeah. I came around to the passenger side and opened the door, and I started covering down the alley from that position. Vinny stayed where he was on the building, and I stayed at the car, and he stayed at the building, and Mike stayed at that corner for, I don't know, maybe 20 to 30 minutes. Then two SWAT officers came over and they were talking with - I think at some point Vinny moved around and came to that corner with Pinola as I was still in the car. Two SWAT officers came over, they talked with Vinny and Pinola, and one of them came and got some bolt cutters from Pinola's car, went and cut a lock or something at - there was a wrought iron gate right here, so they cut this-

CULP: Did you hear any radio traffic that alerted you that Wheeler may be coming your way or how did that unfold?

TERMAN: Yeah, so I think at one point I heard that one of the SWAT units put out that it appeared Wheeler was looking at the armor to the east, but I know that there was SWAT presence in the church parking lot here to the east, and then within minutes or moments of that, it was priority traffic was put out that he was running westbound, and at that point, I knew that he was going to pop up in our viewpoint through that corridor through this corridor here that connects to the....

CULP: The backside of that liquor store?

TERMAN: Yeah.

CULP: Did you see him at all?

TERMAN: Yes. Then, I saw - within seconds of that priority traffic, I heard the yelling and I heard the

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rustling of brush, and then I saw him run past.

TERMAN: As the initial priority traffic came out that he was running westbound, I heard all that, I moved a little bit to the south just a few feet and brought my rifle up and was kind of off Pinola's left side and held that position as Wheeler ran by.

CULP: Do you know if the dog was sent or-

TERMAN: Yeah, so I heard Mike give Wheeler a K-9 admonishment, I think, "Police K-9. Don't run." Then I saw Brace running southbound down the corridor.

CULP: Brace is his K-9?

TERMAN: Yes. South down that corridor along CONEX towards the suspect.

CULP: And then what did you do next?

TERMAN: So, I lost view of Wheeler very quickly because it was maybe about a 3 to 4 ft window of space in that corridor, and then I saw Brace get to the end of the corridor after Wheeler had passed and ran around from-

I think I slowed down a little bit as I rounded the corner and saw that because seeing him back up as the suspect ran by, I initially saw, I thought maybe the suspect was going to pop out of the alley here, and so I slowed down and then when I saw that Catricala had stopped shooting, then I sped back up and continued to move to the corner where I ended up right here.

CULP: I know you just covered this about the K-9. Is K-9 considered a nonlethal tool? TERMAN: Yes. CULP: Other than the K-9, was there any other nonlethal attempt used? TERMAN: No. CULP: Talk a little bit about the shooting. Did you shoot? TERMAN: I didn't. CULP: If you were in the position and a subject was running at you with a gun, would you shoot?

TERMAN: I think it depends on the circumstances, but based on these circumstances - or if it was Albert Wheeler, yes. Absolutely.

TERMAN: Without a doubt.

CULP: If you saw a suspect on the ground and a K-9 engaged with him but he still had the gun and he was manipulating it, would you still consider him a threat?

CULP: If you saw a suspect on the ground with a K-9 engaged on him, but he still had a gun in his hand and he was manipulating it, would you still consider him a threat?

TERMAN: Yes, 100%.

CULP: Do you know if any other officers other than Ofc. Catricala fired?

TERMAN: No other officers fired.

CULP: Do you remember any aftercare that was taken for Albert Wheeler?

TERMAN: I'm aware that he was - that emergency care was done by both officers and the fire department, but I wasn't involved in it.

CULP: Joe, do you have anything?

ELLIS: When you first came around the corner and you saw Ofc. Catricala, what position was he in?

TERMAN: He was standing and kind of backing up from what I remember.

ELLIS: The whole time you saw him, was he standing?

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TERMAN: Yeah, when I came around the corner, he was standing and backing up.

Then he told me he had sent money to my kids. He sent \$40.00 and had a friend drop it off. I don't want to tell you the name of the friend because I don't want to get them involved.

A: I've been to post-certified rifle school, and that's all I can think of right now. Q: Okay. Any military experience? A: Yes. I was in the Marine Corps for six years. Q: Prior to, or? A: Yes. From 2006 to 2012. Q: Okay. So, at the day - so today is September 2nd, so on September 1st, the day of this incident, could you describe what uniform you were wearing? A: I was wearing - our - our unit, we wear kind of like a modified plain clothes, so I was wearing jeans and

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a tee shirt and then over that I had a police tactical vest. It was black in color and the front has like a silver reflective, it says police, and then the blue Sacramento Police Department patches on the front, and then

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Wisconsin Avenue, which is in - right off of Northgate and I went to the street north of Wisconsin, so one block north of where the target residence was and I basically took a position in my unmarked vehicle there.

Q: All right. Just for reference here, I have a Google Earth view.

A: Yes.

Q: This is just for reference only. It does not depict the scene at the day of the crime. This - on the - your left side of the page is Northgate heading northbound and this is Wisconsin from Northgate heading eastbound. So you stated you were north of Wisconsin-

A: Yes. I was one street north and I was just east of where the suspect residence was, kind of situated, if it was on the same street. If that makes sense.

Q: Okay. Kind of take me from there.

A: Okay, so I took position there facing - I had my vehicle parked facing Northgate and basically what we were told was that the unmarked assets, so other members of my team and myself, were going to follow Wheeler away if he got into a vehicle. We were going to be the unmarked resources that would follow him away along with the air units and we would follow him until armored vehicles and marked units were in a position to make an enforcement stop on him.

Q: Okay.

A: And then - so I stayed in my position and then I was listening to our air unit and the detectives on point watching the residence give verbal updates over the radio. The air unit had eyes on him it seemed like most of the time and they were giving updates about him being in the backyard and working on the fence and him just moving back and forth in the backyard. And they had already - I knew that they had positively identified him as our target, as Wheeler. Do you want me to keep going?

Q: Did the air units provide any physical descriptions of what - what Wheeler's clothing or anything like that?

A: I don't remember what clothing - what clothing they described him wearing.

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Q: Okay. So, after hearing all these updates, from where you left off, continue.

A: Okay. So, at one point I heard, I believe it was the air units or it could've been the officer who was on point say over the radio that two children and I remember at least one female adult had come out to the front yard and at that point I could hear over the radio, it sounded like the SWAT officers were moving in. I wasn't aware of their plan and what they were doing, but I could tell, just based off of my experience and working with SWAT officers, that they were going to move in at that point and do whatever plan that they had. So from my position on the street north, I could see our SWAT vehicles traveling southbound on Northgate and at that point, once they passed, I moved in behind them and I was going to take a perimeter spot to the west of them and that's what I did. So, the SWAT vehicles had traveled southbound on Northgate and made an eastbound turn onto Wisconsin Avenue and then I followed in shortly behind them and I parked my? my unmarked vehicle on Wisconsin Avenue, on the north side of Wisconsin and near the Jimboy's Tacos parking lot.

Q: Okay. If you want on this photograph, you can mark it. If you don't, that's fine too, where your vehicle was at.

A: Okay. I don't - I don't remember specifically where-

Q: And just for reference.

A: - where I initially parked. I think - I believe I initially parked at kind of in this - I'll just draw a square. It was initially in this area. I don't remember specifically, because at one point I did move my vehicle to block the entrance to the gas station right here because I wasn't sure if this street was blocked off, so I wanted to make sure no vehicles had gotten into the parking lot.

Q: So once you're on Wisconsin Avenue, after the SWAT Team had passed, heading eastbound towards the house, what happened next?

A: So I saw that - I saw that SWAT had set up their vehicles, their - I saw two Bear Cats, which are their armored vehicles, and then the big white truck, I think they call it the bread truck, were parked on Wisconsin in front of the target residence and I saw that Officer Smith was with what I believe were some family members. I just assumed that it was those - the female and the kids that they had initially described on the radio as being out in front, that they had gotten them from the front of the residence. Just based off my experience, I kind of figured that that's what the plan was, to get them away from the residence so that - so that Wheeler was the only one left there to prevent some sort of barricaded situation.

Q: Did you hear any other radio traffic at that point, specifically talking about reactive authority?

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A: Yes. So, it seemed like almost immediately when, once I had parked on Wisconsin that - I don't know who it was, but someone discussed over the radio the reactive authority and there were several - there were several orders that they gave out and one of them was that if he - they had discussed if he came out armed and tried to go back in the - into the residence, what the plan was with that, and that was if he did that or called them saying that we react based off of our general orders. And then there was an order discussing if he came out unarmed and if he tried to go back in and they discussed the line of demarcation. And I don't remember if it was put out over the radio or if they had discussed it prior to being on seen what the line of demarcation was and they discussed using overwhelming less lethal if he tried to go back into the residence and-Q: If he was unarmed? A: -if he was unarmed. Q: Okay. So as you were to the west of the address and SWAT is on scene, what happened next? A: I had -we had - I was standing with several other officers. It was myself, Officer Officer Josh and Detective We had all taken a position right near the entrance of the Jimboy's parking lot, that south entrance on Wisconsin Avenue, and basically I had - we had set up there just to provide resources if - as perimeter units, if he was detained and they needed our assistance, you know, taking him into a patrol car or whatever they needed. We were basically there as extra resources on that perimeter side. And we were there for a while. At one point Detective moved his truck. He was parked in a parking space on the east side of that Jimboy's parking lot. Can I mark it or does that-? Q: Yeah. If it - if you think it's relevant. A: Okay. So Detective seems 's vehicle was initially parked, I believe there, or in one of these parking stalls right here, facing the target residence and he had moved his truck to this position just west of the south entrance to that parking lot, and I was standing on the northwest corner of the back of his pickup truck. Q: So the - to the west of his pickup truck?

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A: Yes. On the sidewalk - on the north sidewalk of Wisconsin Avenue. And basically at that time we were listening to the updates over the radio. There was an air unit overhead. I don't know which unit -



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which air unit it was at that time because they were switching out to refuel, but they were continuously providing updates of - of what Wheeler was doing. At that point too, I could hear the PA announcements from our crisis negotiators. They were giving verbal announcements over the PA system to Wheeler to come out, come out of the residence, and that we didn't want to hurt them - or hurt him, but we weren't going to leave until he came out and they provided those announcements continuously.

Q: As they're providing those announcements, you said you had heard the air unit giving updates on Wheeler's position?

A: Yes.

Q: At any point was - after - after a certain point, was there any additional updates about Wheeler's position?

A: Yeah. So once the SWAT team was out in front and our crisis negotiator were giving those announcements, the air unit was saying that Wheeler was doing several different things. At one point I heard them say that he had - he had come out, I believe, of a window on the - the west side. They were calling it the number four side of the residence, so it was that west side of the residence and then he had gone back inside. And then I also heard over the radio that at one point that he had come out of the back of the residence and then went back inside and then he was also looking through the windows in the front of the residence, so it seemed like he was very active inside the residence in that he was aware of the police presence.

Q: And at that point, to your knowledge, was anybody else inside the house?

A: Not that I know of, no.

Q: And other than the SWAT team and the crisis negotiators that you said were towards the front of the house, which would be the north side of the house, were you able to observe any other officers from your location other than the officers that you were with at the back of officer, or Detective 's, truck.

A: Yes, so I saw three officers in the in the gas station parking lot, the Mobile gas station. I saw an officer who I didn't know - I didn't know who it was at the time, but they were - they were taking a position on the southwest corner of the gas station, near a wooden pillar. And that officer, he was sitting on some milk crates and he had his - I could see he had his rifle deployed and his rifle was facing eastbound towards the - towards the backyard of the target residence. There is an alleyway on the south side of the gas station between the gas station and the building to the south of it. So that's where he was positioned as a perimeter unit. And then there were two other officers that were - that had walked through the parking lot.

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They parked their vehicles near the gas pumps and then they had walked to the - what is that - The northeast corner of that gas station. I recognized one of them as Officer Terman. At the time I didn't know who the other officer was, but I saw that they had taken up a position on that northeast corner of the gas station.

Q: Okay. As you're there, air unit is, you know, providing continuous updates. You're hearing the PA announcements. What do you remember happening next?

A: So at that point I'm still standing at the - at the back of Detective struck, and I heard someone over the radio, I don't know who it was, if it was the air unit or someone else, but they said that the suspect was running, and I don't - I don't remember why, but I knew that he had - he was in the back of the - in the backyard of the residence at the time when they said he was running. And then I know they said something about him either going westbound or that he was on the number four side. So I immediately knew that he was coming towards the side of the residence where - that was closest to me. And at that point, it happened very quickly, but I-

Q: What-

A: Oh, go ahead.

Q: Sorry. Based on the fact that you hear that he is coming towards you, did that change your mindset or what were you thinking at that point?

A: It just kind of heightened my senses that we - that I focused on that area - I focused my attention over there and then - like I said, it happened very quickly, but for, I don't know what reason, but I focused my attention to where the officer was that had the rifle pointed in that eastbound direction, and then I heard and I saw the officer fire multiple rounds in an eastbound direction. I don't remember how many rounds he fired, but I knew it was - I knew it was multiple, and I saw him do it and immediately all the officers that were standing at the back of Detective struck, we started running over to his direction. At one point, as I was running in his direction. I saw that officer who I later found out was Officer Catricala. He fell backwards, and I don't remember - I didn't know if he had been hit, but - if he was shot or if he had just fallen backwards, but I saw that he had had stumbled backwards, and at that point I was running up towards the front of the gas station and Officer Terman was directly in front of me, and he was running parallel to the front of the gas station, and I ran kind of along parallel in the front of the gas station behind Officer Terman, and I knew there were other officers kind of in my periphery to my right running also in the same direction, and I did just assume it was Officer because we were standing right next to each other and we kind of took off in the same direction, but I don't remember seeing who else was there. But as I was running up and I saw Officer Catricala fall backwards, I had - I didn't hear if the suspect was down, so my mindset was that we were going to continue to engage the threat or the threat was still there on the - on that north side - or the south side of that gas station. So we continued to run towards that

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direction. I had my pistol out in front of me and lowered at my chest and then Officer Terman was in front of me, and I don't remember what kind of weapon system he had out. But then we came up on the - there was a gate there to the little alley on the south side of the gas station and we looked around - or I looked around the corner and I was behind Officer Terman at that point. I had dropped to one knee because he had - at that point I saw he had his rifle deployed, and I had dropped to one knee to get kind of underneath him so we could both have like our weapons systems pointed in that direction. But once I looked around the corner, that southwest corner of the gas station, I saw a subject laying on his back, face up, his arms were kind of splayed out beside him, like stretched out beside him. It was a heavyset individual. He had a white - I remember him having a white tee shirt on and then I saw blood on his head area. I don't really remember the specifics on where the blood was, I just remember seeing blood and he wasn't moving and then there - maybe a foot, maybe - or between a foot and two feet from his right hand, I saw a black pistol on the ground just north of that building.

Q: As you initially saw him, did you feel that there was still an active threat?

A: No. There was - there was no gunfire at that point I saw him, he wasn't moving. We weren't - I shouldn't say there was no threat, we were evaluating whether the threat was going to continue. I saw that he wasn't moving, but I kept my firearm pointed at him because I wasn't sure if he was, you know, just lying there motionless or faking it or kind of lying in wait. But, so I - I kept my firearm pointed at him and he wasn't moving at that time and I could hear officers behind me discussing a plan because they knew we needed to provide medical aid, so I heard someone discussing a shield and that they were going to bring up a shield. So I maintained my position and then it seemed just a couple moments later, maybe five to six SWAT officers came up behind me and I could tell that they were discussing a plan to go provide medical aid and they went up and gave medical aid to the subject on the ground.

Q: Did you, at any time, assist in the medical aid?

A: No.

Q: I know that you said that Officer Catricala your vantage point appeared to fall back?

A: Yes.

Q: When you saw that initially, did you - were you concerned about his safety?

A: Honestly, at that point I don't recall - I don't recall what was going through my mind when I saw him fall back, but I wasn't sure what was going on with him, but I remember thinking that there's still a threat on the other side of that building. And I knew other officers were running towards his direction, but I don't - I

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remember being very focused on Officer Terman and on the other side of that building.
Q: What the potential threat could be?
A: Yeah. I thought he was going to come out possibly armed.
Q: Okay. Did you ever check on Officer Catricala's welfare?
A: Not initially. I think he had been taken away to a patrol vehicle pretty quickly.
Q: Okay. Were you injured at all or anything like that?
A: No.
Q: I have one like a follow up question. So given the circumstances, if you were to have seen Mr. Wheeler come running towards you with a handgun in his hand, would you have fired at him?
A: Absolutely.
Q: If he - if at some point he fell to the ground and still appeared to hold that handgun, tries to - try to get up and look towards you, would you consider him still to be a threat?
A: Yes. That's why - I mean that's why we kept our firearms pointed at him when he was laying on the ground, even though he was motionless, there's still that threat because the firearm was very close to him he could've easily reached it, and continued to fire on officers. So
Q: So it's safe to say that up until the point where he was contacted and starting to be given aid, he was potentially still a threat and you still deemed it? deemed it so?
A: Yes.

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Q: All right. I think that's it. We'll take a quick break.

The information that we were given was that CCAT got information that suspect Wheeler had called his wife, I don't remember her name, but had called his wife saying that he was going - he wanted to come home or ne was going to come home to see his kids. So they had - and I was aware that one of the CCAT detectives was writing a search warrant to - to GPS ping the phone that he had called his wife from. So we were called out - basically we had a couple different missions, but the priority was the safety of his wife and the kids at the home and this was on in Del Paso Heights is the wife's residence, but we were - basically our primary mission was to help her get out of the residence safely and secure a safe place for her to go with the kids just in case Wheeler showed back up because we anticipated him being armed based off of the prior call for service where he shot at officers. So, I responded and set up a primate position on and we conducted surveillance looking for Wheeler to make sure he didn't come home and we got the wife out safely. We ended up never seeing Wheeler and to our knowledge he never came back home and we waited there until 1 a.m. on Sunday Morning until we - our supervisor deemed that it was - we were no longer needed out there.
Q: So by hearing that, is it safe to say that you believed that Wheeler was not only a threat to police, but also to other individuals, such as his family and his kids?
A: Absolutely. Yeah. We were concerned for their safety because of that previous incident and officer - and in the incident action plan that they had provided us, I - there was information that he wanted to - or he was willing to shoot it out with police. So, our - we're - officer safety was very heightened.
Q: And then going forward into yesterday, you still had that same height? heightened sense of safety?
A: Absolutely.
Q: For both you, other officers, as well as family or general public?
A: Absolutely. I took precautions that I typically aren't? aren't standard protocol, so

A: At that time I did not specifically ask. My focus was on Wheeler. I did not ask who else was in the house. The questioning that I gave to her was more of regarding Wheeler, what his description was, when he had arrived, and if he was armed.
Q: What information, if any, did she provide you?
A: She confirmed the clothing description that Det. had seen, which was a male Hispanic wearing a tank top and shorts, stated that Mr. Wheeler had arrived at the location several days prior, did not have a vehicle, was not supposed to leave any time soon and had a brown backpack that he had brought with him. I specifically asked her, I said, "Have you seen him with any firearms?" and she said no, that she had not seem him with a firearm, but for whatever reason she believed that he possibly was in possession of a firearm.
Q: Okay. Did you ask her any questions about his current demeanor, his state of mind or anything?
A: I did not, no.
Q: Did any of the other officers, as you were on scene that you may have overhead, ask her any of those questions?
A: Not that I can recall, no.
Q: All right. So, once you guys were finished debriefing her, if you've gone over everything, kind of take me from there.
A: At that time it was only the CCAT units, and one of the PRCS units that were on point or in the area of the residence. There were no other units that had been - arrived in the area, so Det. left the area and we called for a marked unit to be able to put the lady that we had just stopped into the backseat and transport to the CP for further debrief as the CCAT units wanted to get as many unmarked units back to the area of the target residence because we were short on resources at that time.

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Q: I know it seems probably obvious, what's the reason for multiple - as many units as possible in the area?

A: Like I said, at that time our resources were short. I had called over and spoke with the Air Unit, and the Air Unit was assisting us; however, CCAT had advised us that they were not up on any kind of equipment or they were not pinging any phones, had no equipment for Mr. Wheeler, and that if he left on foot or left in a vehicle, the only way to follow him would be unmarked surveillance.

Q: Go ahead and take me from after you arrived back on scene.

A: Okay. So, upon our arrival back at the location, we again parked in the same parking lot, which is south of the target location in the AutoZone, and we sat there for, it felt like a couple of hours, I don't know how long it was, while the addition units and resources such as the SWAT team and crisis negotiators and other units responded out to the CP to create their plan.

Q: Were you given any updates as to what was going to take place once they arrived?

A: We were given several updates. It was kind of a fluid situation. One of the first plans was that if suspect Wheeler were to leave the residence, unmarked resources would follow him along with the Air Unit until we could get marked units in behind him, and they would follow him and try to throw down a felony stop at a same location.

Q: All right. At any point as you were sitting in the back by the AutoZone, did he or anybody else leave the house?

A: Nobody left the residence; however, over the course of I would say at least an hour, the Air Units, we had multiple Air Units, arrived in the area and they observed Mr. Wheeler in the backyard portion of the residence going from one side of the house to the next - or one side - the three side to the four side to the two side, which are different corners of the house, over probably at least over an hour period.

Q: And those updates were given to you over the radio?

A: Yes.

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- Q: At any time did you change your position from where you were at the south end of the AutoZone to a different location?
- A: Yes. The plan that came into place was the SWAT team was going to roll in off of Wisconsin, and they were going to try to evacuate a female and a young child that was in the front portion of the residence, so once the SWAT team rolled in and covered the front of the residence I moved I relocated our vehicle onto Wisconsin, which was just west of the SWAT team and east of Northgate to kind of block the street and get people out of the area. I ran through the parking lot and observed Officer Catricala, who was to the south of us in the mobile gas station parking lot, firing his rifle in an eastbound direction in between the buildings.

A: Yes.
Q: Do you remember how many shots, or were you able to hear the gunshots?
A: Yeah, I was able - I physically observed him shooting his rifle. I could not see what he was shooting at I assumed it was suspect Wheeler, and I could hear - to me it sounded, and it all happened so quick, but I would say somewhere in the range of maybe between five and eight rounds.
Q: And where he was - where his location was at to the south of the Mobile gas station building, was any other officers that you were able to see in that area?
A: The only other two officers that I observed were Officer Pinola and Officer Terman, and they were initially here, and they began running around the liquor - or the gas station food mart to get to Officer Catricala and running alongside me.

Smith. It is 2:45, 1445 hours, and we are here to speak with Ofc. Smith who is a witnessing officer in an officer-involved shooting. Ofc. Smith, what's your badge number and your current number of years at Sac PD?

A: Badge number is 650 and 10 years of service.

Q: What's your current assignment?

A: I'm currently with PRCS Regional Task Force.

Q: What are your daily duties in that assignment?

A: Daily duties include monitoring and supervising, apprehending fugitives, PRCS parolees and probationers that have violated their terms and conditions and/or violated new crimes, to assist with

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detectives. We act as a resource for both our agency and other outside agencies.

Q: In your 10 years of service with the police department, other than the standard post academy, have you received any specific training related to those job duties?
A: Yeah. I've attended the Sac PD's gang course where we cover Sacramento related gang members, we touch on surveillance, and also search warrant writing.
Q: Okay. Great. So, the incident that we're talking about occurred yesterday on September 1st. When you were notified of this call for service, what were you doing at the time?

A: We were actually in the office. We received word from Det. \_\_\_\_\_\_ that they would be needing assistance from us to help with surveillance on three locations looking for a fugitive, Albert Wheeler.

Q: Did you know what Albert Wheeler was wanted for at the time?

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

Officer Terman repositioned Officer Pinola's patrol car where these-where this red and white car and he faced it eastbound down the alley, and Officer Terman opened the passenger door and used that passenger door as cover, and he held a rifle down the alley. Officers Deleon and Surjan of the SWAT team did a-I don't know, I guess a scout and kind of walked the liquor store mini-mart area and determined that it would be best if Officer Pinola and Terman utilized the K-9 on the two, three side of the mini-mart, so they moved over there. So, Officer Pinola took his dog to this corner. Officer Terman was his cover officer. I then repositioned to my original spot, and I was by myself.

Q: Okay. Then what?

A: I was in that position for, I'd say, approximately 30 minutes. In that time Mr. Wheeler had come out. He had made contact, I guess verbal contact, with, I believe it was the SSD BearCat that was on the east side. I could hear them saying, "Hey, let me see your hands," or "Go back in." There was something going on, and then he went back inside. A short time later Mr. Wheeler appeared, and then from there I heard, "He's out. He's running westbound. He's on the fence," and then before I knew it he was sprinting towards me, like directly towards me. I remember from the description of him originally that he had a black tank top on, but then he had appeared later on and he had changed his shirt. He was wearing a white shirt. The individual that ran at me was wearing a white shirt, and then I immediately recognized that he was holding a handgun as he was running towards me. Given Mr. Wheeler's past and the crimes that he was wanted for, I knew that he doesn't really have a regard for anyone's well-being or safety. He tried to kill a police officer three weeks prior. He had fled and kind of evaded capture, and he had made threats to-or not threats, but he had established contact with some of the CNT and HNT teams and made statements that he wasn't going to go back. When he came around the corner, he was coming right at me, and I was in fear for my life. I thought he was going to shoot me if I had not shot him. So, he charged at me. I didn't remember saying, "Let me see your hands." I shot what I thought was four or five rounds as I was-because I was sitting down with my rifle on like a shield in a comfortable position, and I heard the Air Unit say, "He's running over the fence," and what I was looking at is I don't see anybody coming over a fence, and then all of a sudden he just appeared with a gun running right towards me. So, I fired a couple of rounds. It startled me, and as I got up, he was still advancing towards me. I backpedaled and tripped over a parking curb, so I kind of fell down to my bottom, rolled back and got up, and I saw him that he still had the gun in his right hand, and he was, like, facing me with the gun just up, and at that point I just got up and fired one more shot, and I saw that the dog was on him, and then I had fallen. I got back up and returned to my original position, now standing just holding on his position, and then other officers then came up and kind of covered me, and they formulated an arrest team contact team, and they rushed up and made the gun safe and started giving him aid and, you know, try to administer aid on him and...yeah.

I know at one point they stated over the radio that the wife or ex-wife had called using her phone to get a hold of him, and then I think they said she broke her phone during that or after that. So, they were constantly trying to get in contact with him and then, like I said, they broadcasted over the radio he's making comments like he's not going back.

Q: What does that mean?

A: To me, I take that as he knows he's wanted. He knows he's going to go to prison for a very long time for what he did. He's saying, "I don't want to go back," so he's telling me that he's been to prison, and those are just words of a desperate human being.

Q: In your experience, when a felon or a suspect says that he's not going to go back, what does that mean about his possible behaviors in an apprehension scenario?

A: To me, when somebody says that, there's no possibility of a peaceful apprehension. They are going to go out with a fight, and they're going to do it by any means necessary, and usually what that means to me is suicide by cop scenario where he could have-and you know, I'm speculating, but he had a gun. He could have easily done it himself. He knew that if he ran out with that firearm towards officers and didn't follow orders to peacefully surrender that he was likely going to be shot.

Q: Were you more on edge on this perimeter than a usual perimeter spot?

A: Yes, absolutely. I mean, knowing that this person shot at Sgt. Hall and has gone to great lengths to evade law enforcement, dumping phones, hiding, getting rid of cars, hiding at places that aren't his, and the fact that the gun is outstanding and then him making those comments, I saw no peaceful resolution to this ending.

Q: Okay. When the SWAT officers came over and moved Ofc. Pinola and Terman?

A: Correct.

I just knew from the kind of-not the IAP because I wasn't there, but I was told and shown a picture that a BearCat will be on the east, the northeast, and then the north, so by that diagram that was shown to me, I knew that they were there. I couldn't see them, but hearing them say, "Let me see your hands," I assumed that they were police officers. Q: Did you hear him respond-the suspect respond to them saying, "Let me see your hands?" 
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During the interview I showed Officer Terman a color Google Aerial Map of the general area of Wisconsin Avenue. Officer Terman drew a rectangle indicating where he parked Officer Pinola's police vehicle. He drew an "X" on the north side of the Liquor Store where he and Officer Pinola repositioned themselves. He drew an arrow on the southwest corner of the Liquor Store indicating where Officer Catricala initially set up and an "X" where Officer Catricala was set up when the shooting began. Officer Terman drew a line indicating his path of travel from his position on the north side of the Liquor Store to where he saw Officer Catricala fire his last one or two rounds. I scanned the map into this report and booked the original into evidence, PR# 1094259-003.

NOTIFICATION:

On 9-1-20, at approximately 1900hrs, I was at home and on call when I was notified of a Homicide Team call out regarding an Officer Involved Shooting which had just occurred. I was instructed to respond to the area of Wisconsin and Northgate in Sacramento, CA.

I knew that the Sacramento Police Department Career Criminal Apprehension Team (CCAT) had possibly located Albert Wheeler that afternoon. I also knew that Wheeler had fired at Sgt Hall on 8-4-20 and had a warrant out for his arrest for attempt murder of a police officer. I had been told by other detectives that Wheeler had made comments to his family that he wasn't going back to prison.

#### ARRIVAL:

I arrived at the scene at approximately 2021hrs and I checked in with the Scene Recorder CSO Rios (3CS25) #8198. Several officers, detectives, and members of the Command Staff of the Sacramento Police Department responded to the scene including:

**BRIEFING:** 

At 2111hrs, Sgt. Morris #3023 (3SM1) gave a briefing regarding the facts of the incident known to the Sacramento Police Department at the time. He stated that earlier in the day the Career Criminal Apprehension Team had created a plan to surveil three different locations for Albert Wheeler who was

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wanted for attempted murder of an officer.

On 8-4-20, Wheeler had fired at Sacramento Police Department Sgt. Hall who was standing next to his patrol vehicle in front of Wheeler's residence on in Sacramento, CA (SPD 20-233265). Wheeler was being purseud by SPD Officers at the time. Wheeler had fled the scene in his vehicle and had not been located since that day. There was an arrest warrant out for Wheeler for 664/187 PC, 29800 PC, and 2800.2 PC (SA#03385211, Docket 20FE01222, Bail \$500,000, Issued by Judge Roman on 8-5-20).
CCAT had developed information that led them to believe that Wheeler may be at Wisconsin Ave.
At 1445hrs, Det. Shrum of the CCAT Unit drove by the residence and saw a subject who he believed was Wheeler. Shortly thereafter, a female subject left the residence in a vehicle. She was contacted by Det. of the CCAT Unit and she confirmed that Wheeler was in fact in the residence.
At 1522hrs, LN3 (LT. Wallace #4004) initiated a full SWAT/ CNT call out to assist units.
At this time, several units from the Sacramento Police Department responded to the area including the SPD SWAT Team, the PRCS Team, the Gang Intelligence Unit, and several K9 Officers. A perimeter was established around Wisconsin. The SPD Helicopter (AIR1) responded to the area as well.
At 1745hrs, (4) and (2). They were removed from the scene and taken to the Command Post. related that Wheeler was in the house along with one other subject named At 1752hrs, (2). Came out of the residence and was removed from the scene. She confirmed to CNT that Wheeler was the only subject left in the house.
At 1814hrs, CNT NEG10 began to call into the house to make contact with Wheeler and urge him to surrender peacefully. At 1826hrs, NEG10 established contact with Wheeler.
At 1835hrs, CNT NEG30 broadcast that the subject stated that he doesn't want to go back.
At 1852hrs, AIR1 broadcast that the subject was now wearing a white T-shirt.

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At 1853hrs, AIR1 broadcast that the subject was running toward the west side of the yard.



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At 1854hrs, radio broadcast suspect was down south of gas station. Suspect was not moving.
At 1856hrs, radio broadcast that officers were performing CPR on the subject.
At 1901hrs, the Sacramento Fire Department took over CPR.
At 1922hrs, the subject was pronounced dead by Firefighter Paramedic Adam Van Such of the the Sacramento Fire Department.
Sgt Morris stated that K9 Officer Catricala had taken up a perimeter spot on the west side of the perimeter near the southwestern corner of the gas station at 3016 Northgate Blvd. The subject fled directly at Ofc Catricala and pointed a handgun at him. During his public safety statement, Ofc. Catricala told Sgt Morris he fired seven rounds to the east and southeast.
Sgt Morris stated that K9 Officer Pinola was on the perimeter to the north of 3016 Northgate Blvd and he sent his dog to apprehend Wheeler when Wheeler came through the western fence of the residence. Officer Pinola heard the shots fired and ran to Ofc Catricala's postion. His dog had caught up to Wheeler during the shooting and was on a bite on Wheeler. Pinola immediately called his dog off.
Sgt Morris stated that Ofc Terman, Ofc. Smith, Det. Masingale, Det. Det. Det. and Ofc were also witnessing officers of the shooting.
WALK THROUGH:
After the briefing I was assigned as case agent for this investigation. I walked through the scene and observed several shell casings just to the southwest of the southwest corner of 3016 Northwest Blvd near to a large propane tank. The shell casings appeared to be 5.56mm.
Wheeler was on scene to the south of 3016 Northgate Blvd. His shirt had been removed and I could see a large wound on his left tricep area. His left hip had what appeared to be bite marks.
Wisconsin was cleared by Detectives from the Gang Intelligence Unit after a search warrant for the premises had been written by Det. Cruz. I entered the back yard of Wisconsin and observed a hole in the fence on the western side of the yard. The hole was large enough for a grown man to fit through. It

Wheeler was able to pass through the hole in the fence and then regain his footing and start to run before he made it to the corner of the building where Ofc Catricala could see him. (In the ICC video described below, Wheeler seems to be running at full speed as he passes the corner of the building.)

The camera is pointed towards the ground just before the incident. Ofc. Catricala seems to be sitting on something and is positioned behind what appears to be a ballistic shield. 18:53:25 Ofc Catricala says, "Let me see your hands," and begins to stand up and then fires his rifle 9 times. He stands up as he shoots. He then falls back and down to the ground. As he regains his footing, the suspect is shown in the video for the first time. The suspect is on the ground, facing east, and his left side is towards Ofc Catricala. As Ofc Catricala gets to his feet, the suspect turns towards him and has what appears to be a handgun in his right hand. The police dog is visibly biting the suspect. Wheeler appears to be pointing the gun in the direction of Ofc Catricala and the K9. (18:53:32) Ofc Caticala fires one round and the suspect immediately falls back with his arms spread out. Other officers then arrive and you can hear Ofc. Pinola call his dog out (18:53:38). SYNOPSIS OF ICC FOOTAGE (Ofc. Pinola's Vehicle#12247):

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The view is almost directly due west towards the alley just south of the gas station. Ofc Catricala is hidden from view by a large white propane tank but his helmet is occasionally visible over the top left of the tank. At 18:53:24 Wheeler comes around the southeastern corner of the gas station and runs directly at Ofc. Catricala. Wheeler seems to be at a full run when he first appears. Wheeler appears to be holding an object in front of him with both hands. He immediately begins to bring the object up towards Ofc Catricala. Ofc Catricala stands up and fires his rifle. The subject ducks his head and drops his left arm from the object as he runs toward Ofc Catricala and begins to veer to to south, continually pointing the object at the officer. SYNOPSIS OF AIR1 VIDEO:

AIR1 was on scene overhead of Wisconsin at the time of the incident.

At 18:53:12 on the video's clock, Wheeler is shown throwing a bag to the east and then running to the west towards the hole in the fence that was later discovered. It should be noted that due to radio traffic, AIR1 was not able to broadcast that Wheeler is running Westbound toward Ofc Catricala's position until after Wheeler was already crawling through the hole in the fence. The bag Wheeler threw to the east was later shown to contain a sleep apnea machine.

The video doesn't show the shooting due to the position of the helicopter. Ofc. Catricala's location was hidden from the AIR1 by the buildings in the area.

The camera re-acquires Wheeler at 18:53:51 and Wheeler is down on the ground.

During the briefing, I had been informed that the Crisis Negotiations Team and been successful in making contact with Wheeler prior to the shooting. I was eventually provided with a recorded copy of the phone calls. The following is a summary of the calls. Ofc. Boyer was the primary officer on the calls. I sent the recordings to Filezilla/Docuscript to be transcribed and the transcriptions for the calls are attached to the report.

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

At 0024hrs, I arranged for Ofc Catricala to view his BWC footage in a private office at HOJ. I had him read and then sign the OIS Video Admonishment Form first. His attorney was present while he viewed the video. Ofc. Catricala was then allowed to view the ICC footage from Ofc Pinola's car prior to his interview.

At 0226hrs, on 9-2-20, I interviewed Ofc Catricala in the Homicide Briefing room at HOJ. Sgt Ellis and Catricala's attorney, William Clark, were present for the interview. The interview was audio recorded and later sent for transcription through Filezilla/Docuscript. (See attached transcript).

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


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On 10-6-20, I received the results from the toxicology and alcohol tests performed on Wheeler. Wheeler

had methamphetamines in his blood and had a blood alcohol level of .06%.

The number isn't contacted by the other numbers involved in this incident. This number is listed under the contact name of in the phone that was found on his person. (I wrote a search warrant for the subscriber information and call detail records for this phone number and it was served to METRO PCS. METRO PCS responded that they had no record of the number and therefore no subscriber information although they were the listed phone company for the number in multiple databases. This has occurred in other circumstances when the phone number was not active and it was being used as a WIFI phone only.)

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



#### NOTIFICATION:

On Tuesday, 9-1-20, at appx 1930 hrs, I was notified by SPD Homicide Sergeant Maclafferty of an Officer involved shooting at 530 Wisconsin Blvd. I was requested to respond to assist with the scene. Sgt Maclafferty advised that I would take the role of the scene supervisor. I contacted Homicide Team #3 Detectives to also respond. Detective Culp, Detective Murawski and Detective Putman also responded.

#### ARRIVAL AND BRIEFING:

At 2010 hours, I arrived on scene and checked in with Crime Scene Recorder Community Service Officer Rios and entered the scene. Patrol supervisor Sergeant J. Morris #3023, Lieutenant Wallace and patrol officers were also on scene. CSI Officers also responded to the scene for processing.

At 2111 hours, Sergeant Morris briefed us about the incident and the circumstances known to him at the time. The scene had been secured with police barricade tape, and patrol officers had completed a neighborhood canvass. Evidence was located on scene by responding Officers and left in place. Certain pieces of SWAT equipment that were inside the crime scene were moved prior to investigations being briefed and taking control of the scene. On Tueday, 09/08/2020 at approximately 1000 hours, I, Detective Brendan Schulte #0911 contacted Doctor Tovar (Forensic Pathologist) regarding the autopsy for the body of Albert Wheeler.

Dr. Tovar advised that he observed evidence of a dog bite to Wheeler's left buttock, right buttock, and left hip, illustrated by scratches and puncture injuries. Additionally, Dr. Tovar advised that he observed what appeared to be a superficial gun shot wound that entered Wheeler's left thigh and exited the soft tissue at his left hip. Dr. Tovar advised that the injury was hard to characterize with certainty as a gun shot wound due to the various nearby injuries caused from the dog bite.

Dr. Tovar advised that he observed a gun shot wound to the Wheeler's left arm above his elbow. Dr. Tovar characterized the wound as a blown out and that it was typical of a large caliber weapon. Dr. Tovar advised that the bullet entered the outside of Wheeler's left arm at elbow level and traveled upward, blowing out the tissue as the bullet exited the upper arm. Dr. Tovar advised that he also located bullet fragments in his arm, which is typical of rifle ammunition.

Dr. Tovar advised that he observed a gun shot wound to the left side of Wheeler's neck. Dr. Tovar advised that the bullet traveled left to right, downward, and nearly parallel. Dr. Tovar observed that the bullet appeared to track down to Wheeler's trapezius and went through his spine, causing fractures to his C5, C6, and C7 vertebrae. The bullet disrupted Wheeler's spinal cord, traveled behind his collar bone, and exited near his back right arm pit area. Dr. Tovar furthermore stated that no major blood vessels were hit and that Wheeler likely only lived minutes after this injury.

Dr. Tovar advised that the cause of death for Albert Wheeler was the gun shot wound to his neck.

I later advised Sacramento Police Department Homicide Sgt. Maclafferty #3065 and Detective Krutz #0680 of the preliminary findings. For further detail please refer to the Sacramento County Coroner report 20-04918.

NOTIFICATION:

On Tuesday, 09/01/2020 at 1923 hours, I, (Det. B. Schulte #911) was notified by Sacramento Police Department (SPD) Homicide Sergeant Maclafferty #3065 of a homicide team call out to Wisconsin Ave, in the City and County of Sacramento. The Sacramento Police Department responded to the above location in an attempt to locate wanted suspect Albert Wheeler. A subsequent Officer Involved Shooting occurred during the attempt to apprehend Albert Wheeler. SPD Officers and Sacramento Fire Department Personnel performed life saving measures to Albert Wheeler. Sacramento Fire Department Engine 15 and Medic 19 responded to the scene to assist. Officers secured the scene and a homicide call-out was initiated.

Homicide Detective Sergeant Maclafferty #3065 (IV18) was the Homicide Unit Sergeant assigned to supervise this incident.

Homicide Detectives T. Culp #858 (IV86), K. Koppinger #914 (IV56), S. Krutz #680 (IV107), M. Cruz #278 (IV77), B. Murawski #871 (IV96), D. Putman #870 (IV27), L. 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along with Wisconsin Ave mid-block between Northgate Blvd and Natoma St. The perimeter of the crime scene was marked with yellow police crime scene tape and secured by uniformed police officers in marked black and white SPD patrol vehicles. I checked in with the crime scene recorder and proceeded to the briefing location.

At 2111 hours, once the homicide team was present, Sergeant J. Morris #3023 briefed us about the incident and the circumstances known to him at the time. Refer to Detective supplements for further details. Patrol Officers had completed a canvass of the area. Evidence was located on scene by patrol officers and pointed out to investigators. All evidence items were left in place and the investigation was turned over to the homicide team at the time.

Refer to Detective Krutz's supplement for further details.

#### SCENE DESCRIPTION:

The shooting occurred outside on the property of 3016 Northgate Blvd (Northgate Liquor & Food). 3016

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Northgate Blvd is a single story convenience store located at the south-east corner of the intersection of Northgate Blvd and Wisconsin Ave, located within the City and County of Sacramento. There is access into the parking lot from both Northgate Blvd and Wisconsin Ave by way of two driveways for both vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

Wisconsin Ave is a single story residential home on the south side of Wisconsin Ave. The front door of the residence faces north. Wisconsin Ave is the neighboring property to the east of 3016 Northgate Blvd and the properties are separated by a chain link fence. Located just north of the southeast corner of the Northgate Liquor & Food building is a hole in the chain link fence, allowing access between the back yard of Wisconsin Ave and 3016 Northgate Blvd.

The Northgate Liquor & Food building (3016 Northgate Blvd) is situated toward the south-east corner of the lot and there are gas pumps directly west of the building in the center of the lot. There is an alleyway south of the building that runs in an east-west direction and a breezeway to the east of the building that runs in a north-south direction. The alleyway to the south of the building has a wrought iron fence at its westernmost end that is in line with the west wall of the building, with access via a two-door swing gate. The south side of the south alleyway is bordered by the north wall of 3000 Northgate Blvd.

Located leaned up against the wrought iron fence at the west end of the south alleyway was a ballistic shield.

Located approximately 10 feet west of the wrought iron fence was a large propane tank. Located just north of the propane tank were four spent Speer 18 223 Rem casings (Item #1, Item #2, Item #3, and Item #4). Located immediately east of the propane tank was another spent Speer 18 223 Rem casing (Item #5). Located southeast of the propane tank were five spent Speer 18 223 Rem casings (Item #6, Item #7, Item #8, Item #9, and Item #10).

Located on the west wall of 3016 Northgate Blvd near the southwest corner of the building was apparent damage from bullet fragmentation (labeled as "E"). Located on a metal pole directly next to the wall to the south was a possible bullet entry and exit hole (labeled as "F1" and "F2"). Located three pickets to the south of "F1" on the east swinging gate was an apparent bullet hole (labeled "G1"). Located on the backside of the pole was the apparent exit hole for the bullet (labeled "G2"). Located three pickets to the south of "G2" was an apparent bullet hole (labeled "H1"). Located on the backside of the pole was the apparent exit hole for the bullet (labeled "H2"). Located on the picket immediately south of "H2" was apparent damage from a bullet that appeared to be a continuation of the previous bullet (labeled "H3").

Located attached to a pole at the entryway into the south alleyway is a fire extinguisher case. Located on the south side of the case was an apparent bullet hole (labeled "A"). There is another metal pole just south of the fire extinguisher case. Located on this pole was another apparent bullet hole (labeled "B1"). Located on the back side of the pole was the apparent exit hole for the bullet (labeled "B2"). Located to the south of

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the metal pole with damage labelled "B1" and "B2" was the west swinging door for the wrought iron fence.

On the fence post to the south of "B1" and "B2" was apparent damage from a bullet (labeled as "B3"). Located immediately south of the picket "B3" was apparent damage from a bullet to another picket (labeled "C1"). Located on the picket immediately south of "C1" was apparent damage from a bullet that appeared to be a continuation of the previous bullet (labeled as "C2"). Three pickets south of "C2" was another apparent damage from a bullet (labeled as "D1" and "D2"). Located on the picket immediately south of "D2" was apparent damage from a bullet that appeared to be a continuation of the previous bullet (labeled as "D3").

Located just east of the fence at the western end of the southern alleyway was a black Beretta 92FS 9mm handgun Serial # (Item #11). The handgun had a magazine inserted into it. The magazine had a 15 round capacity and was found to have 16 rounds inside of it. There was no live round in the chamber of the handgun and the hammer was still up.

Located east of the handgun was a blue Alcatel cell phone (Item #12), blue Clickit lighter (Item #13), and a black leather wallet with multiple cards in Albert Wheeler's name (Item #14) along the north wall of 3000 Northgate Blvd on the south side of the alleyway.

Located on the ground north of the wallet, cell phone, and lighter was a torn white "Pro Athletic" t-shirt (size 2XL) with apparent blood, one "49ers" neck gaiter with apparent blood, and two rosary bead necklaces on the ground (Item #15).

Located on the ground just east of the clothing was the body of Albert Wheeler. Wheeler was lying in a supine position with his head facing west and his feet facing east. Wheeler was wearing white shoes and black cargo shorts. Upon conducting a search of Wheeler's person, two black 9mm handgun magazines with live ammunition in them were located in his right cargo pocket of his shorts.

Located on the ground just south of the southeast corner of the 3016 Northgate Blvd (Northgate Liquor & Food) was a pair of black eyeglasses.

Located on the north wall of 3000 Northgate Blvd east of the body of Albert Wheeler was an apparent bullet strike (labeled "I"). Located east of "I" on the north wall of 3000 Northgate Blvd was an apparent bullet strike to an electrical box (labeled "J"). Located east of "J" along the north wall of 3000 Northgate Blvd was another apparent bullet strike to an electrical box (labeled "K").

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#### LEGAL ACCESS TO THE SCENE:

The scene at 3016 Northgate Blvd was located in a common outdoor area accessible to the public. There were no locked gates, fences, or locked doors preventing access to the alleyway from the parking lot or road.

The scene at Wisconsin Ave was accessed pursuant to a search warrant.

#### WALK-THROUGH:

On 09/01/2020 at 2235 hours, Detectives completed a walk-through of the crime scene. All items of evidence were pointed out by Sergeant Morris.

#### SCENE LIGHTING:

The scene was initially processed in the daylight. After nightfall, the scene lighting was supplied by streetlights and headlights of patrol vehicles. Additional lighting was provided by hand-held flashlights.

On Tuesday, 09/01/20, at approximately 1914 hours, I (Detective Koppinger #914) was notified by Sergeant Maclafferty #3065 of a call out for an officer involved shooting (OIS) investigation. I was requested to respond to the area of Wisconsin Avenue, which is located in the City of Sacramento. I arrived on-scene at Northgate and Wisconsin Avenue at approximately 2017 hours.

#### **BRIEFING:**

At 2111 hours, Sergeant Jeff Morris #3023 briefed us about the incident and the circumstances known to him at the time (See Detective Krutz' observations for further).

## ADDITIONAL FOLLOW-UP:

Following the briefing, I was assigned to interview Sacramento Police Officer Mike Pinola #279 regarding his roles during the incident.

On 9/01/2020, at approximately 2229 hours, I conducted a Public Safety walk-through with Officer Pinola.

During this time, I was advised that (S) Wheeler was confirmed at Wisconsin Ave, and that he was known to carry a gun in a backpack. I also had prior knowledge that the suspect had shot at a peace officer, was considered armed and dangerous and that he made threats that he would shoot it out with the police. I was advised several other people were inside Wisconsin Ave which included (2) young children. I was assigned a role, when the decision was to be made, to be on the SACPD Bearcat Armor as a custody (hands) officer or breacher if needed in regards to a surround and call out of the house.

A short time later, I was informed by UNN10 (Sgt. Edgerton), that we would be responding to Wisconsin Ave and attempt to have the suspect surrender to officers. At this time, I was advised to turn on my BWC and record, which I did. I was also advised per AIR1 that there were 2 small children and a woman who were outside, in the front of the home. Sgt. Edgerton advised me that as the team arrived at Wisconsin, Sgt. Edgerton and I would immediately evacuate the woman and two small children who were in the front yard, which we did upon arrival, and handed them over to other police personnel. Information was gathered that a younger female would be in the house. A short time later she walked out of the house and was taken to detectives also.

Based on the evacuations of the people, information was that the suspect was that only person left inside the home. I transitioned to a different position where I observed the north and the east side of the home (Folsom Bearcat position). During my time at this position I never observed the suspect nor did I ever hear the suspect. I was continually updated by AIR1 and other units on scene that the suspect was active, such as crawling out of a window on the west side of the home, coming to the front door, being observed in the backyard and engaging in some type of communication with the rear perimeter units. I was also told that our Crisis Negotiation Units were attempting to contact the suspect. I heard (CNT) also make several announcements outside the home with the use of the LRAD.

During the duration of the call out, I was advised by AIR1 in regards to the suspects location when he was in the backyard. At one point during the incident, AIR1 related that the suspect began running to the southwest corner

of the property, where I then heard several rounds fired. I observed other officers then respond to the direction of the shots where I heard the suspect was down. A short time later I walked to the area of the parking lot of the gas station which was west of the target location and observed several police personnel medically treating the suspect. The fire department arrived on scene and took over. I was not needed at that location and responded back to the Folsom Bearcat and stayed. I eventually was advised per Officer Ratcliffe to turn off my BWC.

On 09/01/20 at approx. 1500 hours, I, Sgt. R. Young #3102 was notified via telephone that the wanted suspect (Albert Wheeler) was being surveilled by SPD detectives and was currently inside a residence at Wisconsin. I called Lt. Mike Hutchins who was the acting SWAT Lieutenant and advised him of the situation in case it became a SWAT call out.

At approx. 1520 hours I then received a SWAT notification page that a SWAT call out was being initiated and to respond to Winterhaven / Northgate. This Command Post location appeared to be too close to the target residence, so I advised Lt. Hutchins and had it moved to Rio Tierra Ave / Northgate. Upon my arrival I spoke with Lt Hutchins who advised me to get (2) contact teams in place and help secure the perimeter of the location until the SWAT team arrived and could use the armor vehicles to contain the suspect at the location. I made two contact teams the first vehicle had myself, Ofc. Surjan and Ofc. Deleon. We set up to the East of the location. The second vehicle had Ofc. Hawley, Ofc. McGill and Ofc. Kellermann who I set up to the South.

Once the armor vehicles arrived we set a tight perimeter around the location. I made up an HRT team at the SPD BearCat with me as the team leader. Once all the subjects inside the house other than the wanted suspect were outside, I broke down the HRT team and took over the role as voice on the contact team at the SPD BearCat. If Wheeler walked outside and surrendered, I would give him commands.

At approx. 1853 hours, Air1 advised over the radio the suspect was running to the 4 side of the house. Shortly thereafter within seconds I heard what was distinct rifle fire and then a broadcast over the radio that shots were fired. I assembled a contact team with our rifle rated ballistic shield and moved to the location of where Air1 broadcasted the suspect was laying. I could see the suspect laying on the ground with a handgun next to him. I immediately made a safe movement to approach the suspect so we could begin after force care. Officers began life saving measures and provided CPR to the suspect.

Officers continued to provide medical aid until relieved by fire.

I contacted Sgt. J Morris and asked if he needed assistance with anything. He asked if I could find out who the officer witnesses were. I gave the list of officer witnesses to Lt. Wallace to give to Sgt. Morris.

Lt. Wallace asked if I could look to see if any of the officers rounds that were fired may have had a path of travel that could have injured anyone else. Based on what I saw, the concrete backdrop, the angle the officer fired at I did not believe any rounds could have injured anyone else.

I had my activated and functioning body worn camera on my helmet running for

On Tuesday 9-1-20, I, Sgt. Todd Edgerton #3131 (UNN10), was assigned to the Sacramento Police Department SWAT team as a Team Leader. At approximately 1502 hours, I was notified by the other SWAT Sergeant (Rob Young) that SPD's CCAT (Career Criminal Apprehension Team) believed that they had located a subject named Albert Wheeler inside a residence located at Wisconsin Ave. in Sacramento. Suspect Wheeler had discharged a firearm at an SPD Sergeant and several Officers on 8/4/20. A felony warrant had been issued for him the following day for 664/187PC, 29800 PC, and 2800.2 PC.

We had been assisting CCAT with attempting to locate Wheeler over the last several weeks. During those operations, we had been advised by CCAT Detectives that Wheeler was believed to still be armed. He had also made statements to associates and relatives that he did not want to go back to prison. Lt. Hutchins who was our SWAT commander advised us to get the team headed towards the area to stage. I received the SWAT callout notification page at 1520 hours and arrived at the Command Post location at approximately 1525 hours.

I met Lt. Hutchins at the Command Post. Sgt. Young deployed with a team of five SWAT Officers to the area around Wisconsin in case Suspect Wheeler left while SWAT assets were arriving and being briefed. We requested a Bearcat armored vehicle from Folsom PD as well as the Sacramento Sheriffs Department. Both arrived within 30 minutes. We observed photographs taken from the air unit showing Suspect Wheeler in the back yard of the residence. The air unit was also providing updates on Suspect Wheelers location in the yard and advised that he appeared to be repairing a fence. Lt. Morgado arrived on scene and took over as SWAT Commander. Lt. Hutchins transitioned to CNT Commander duties.

We were briefed by CCAT Detective Shrum. He advised that they had stopped a female leaving Wisconsin and that she had confirmed that wheeler was currently at the residence and had been staying there. She further advised that there were four subjects still at the residence. An older female, teenage female, 2yr old girl, and a 5 year old girl. She advised that Suspect Wheeler had a bag with him that had something heavy in it that made a noise when it was dropped on the floor and suspected it was a firearm.

I assigned personnel to the Armored vehicles to conduct a surround and callout of the target residence. The plan was for the Sheriff Bearcat to lead the other Bearcats East on Wisconsin Ave from Northgate and travel S/B through the parking lot of St. Basil's Church which was located to the East of the residence. The Folsom PD Bearcat would follow the Sheriff Bearcat and stop covering the N/E corner of the residence. Our Bearcat would stop in front of the residence where it would have the arrest team/hostage rescue team,

negotiators, as well as cover the West side of the residence. K-9 Officer Azevedo would cover the South portion of the house from the business located South of the residence (521 Indiana). I assigned K-9 Officer Pinola to an alleyway between two businesses on the S/W corner of the target backyard. He was provided with a shield and K-9 Officers Terman and Catricala as cover Officers.

Assigned to the Folsom PD Bearcat was Officer Ratcliffe #224 as high cover and Folsom PD Officer Scott Somersett #230 as driver.

Assigned to the Sheriff Bearcat was Deputy William Vernon #47 as driver, Deputy William Winton #1135, Sgt. Jerimiah Jarvis as assistant team leader, Officer Barry Tiner #327 as high cover, Officer Michael Mantsch #918 as lethal cover, and Officer Adam Feuerbach #601 as less lethal. K-9 Officer Dustin Henderson #343 was also assigned to the Sheriff Bearcat as an additional less lethal option.

Assigned to the SPD Bearcat was Officer Wanger #251 as high cover, Sergeant Sean Cunningham #3021 as custody, Officer Kyle McGill #330 as additional cover covering the West side of the residence (#4 side), Officer Troy Hawley #646 as lethal cover, Officer Brandon Kellermann #4352 as less lethal, Officer Dakota Penny #4190 as custody, and Sgt. Rob Young #3102 as team leader/voice. We also had K-9 Officer Yasonia #577 as an additional less lethal option. Sgt. Young was assigned as the team leader for the hostage rescue team if the incident escalated into Suspect Wheeler taking the occupants of the residence hostage. Reactive authority was received from the IC for the hostage rescue team.

Prior to departing the command post, we were advised that there was a female out on the porch with two small children. At 1744 hrs. we arrived on scene. I immediately observed a female on the front porch and what appeared to be the 2 and 5 year old playing in the front yard. I advised her to grab the children and come out towards me. She grabbed the 2 year and advised that there was an additional child inside. I told her that we would call in to get that additional child out. The 5yr old was close to the pedestrian gate that led into the front yard from the sidewalk and it appeared that it would be beyond the physical limits of the female to pick up and carry the 5yr old in addition to the child she was already carrying. I was worried that Suspect Wheeler may exit armed and the children and female could have been caught in the crossfire. I approached and grabbed the 5yr old child as Sergeant Cunningham assisted evacuating the female who was carrying the 2yr old. We brought them back to the Bearcat and them passed them off to perimeter units.

CNT called into the residence and reached the teenage female inside. She was given directions and she exited the residence. She was passed on to perimeter units.

Officers Dan DeLeon #535 and Brian Surjan #426 were deployed to conduct a scout of the residence and develop a chemical agents plan since Suspect Wheeler was now the sole occupant of the residence.

At 1802 hrs. CNT began announcements through the LRAD mounted on the Bearcat for the suspect to exit. At 1803 hrs. the suspect shut the front door that was left open by the last occupant that exited. CNT continued to make announcements. At 1815hrs Officer McGill advised that the suspect attempted to exit a window on the West side of the residence before crawling back inside. He may have observed the scout team that was on the West side of the residence at the same time. The suspect looked out the front door, front window, and out of the back door. I appeared that he was observing and evaluating our inner perimeter.

At 1851 hrs. Airl advised that the suspect was on the back patio wearing a white t-shirt. They were unable to tell if he was armed. I requested the UAS for a closer look at what he was doing and to see if he was has holding a firearm. The Sheriff Bearcat had a view into the back yard but Suspect Wheeler was hidden from their view.

At 1853 hours Airl advised that the suspect was running to the South side of the yard. I ran W/B approx. 15 yards to ensure that he didn't exit W/B onto the North side of the Northgate Liquor and Food as the K-9 team perimeter team was positioned on the South side of that business. I heard multiple gunshots coming from the area where the K-9 unit was. A unit advised over the air that the suspect was down. Sergeant Young took a team over with a shield to assist with taking the suspect into custody so medical aid could be provided. I asked Officer Wanger to hold the front of the residence and responded to assist with medical aid for any injured parties. The other two EMT's on the team besides myself (Officer Tiner and Sergeant Jarvis) were at the Sheriff Bearcat on the east side of the residence.

I responded to the scene of the shooting and observed Suspect Wheeler laying face down in a small alleyway between Northgate Liquor & Food and a business South of it. Officer Hawley was cutting the shirt off of Suspect Wheeler to assist with an injury assessment. I cut the jean shorts and belt off of Suspect Wheeler. I observed what appeared to be a bullet wound on Suspect Wheelers left hip, right shoulder, and left arm. Once a neck gaiter type Covid-19 mask was moved from his neck, we observed what appeared to be a bullet would on the left side of his neck. Suspect Wheeler had no detectible carotid pulse and was not breathing. I started chest compressions and took turns providing them with Officers Hawley and Penny until relieved by Sacramento Fire Department personnel.

Looking at the direction of the rounds fired by SPD Officer Catricala, I felt that it was possible that rounds may have struck the wall of the auto business located S/E of the shooting scene and directly behind the target residence. I responded to the business (Northside Window Tinting and Car Wraps) located at 521 Indiana Ave. and contacted several employees. They advised that everyone in the business was accounted for and there was no damage to their wall that they could see.

I responded back to the front of the residence and assisted with demobilizing

On 09/01/20 at approximately 1609 hours, I arrived on scene of an SPD SWAT call-out for Wisconsin Ave regarding a wanted suspect (Albert Wheeler). I was tasked with providing high cover on the SPD Bearcat that was going to be placed in front of Wisconsin Ave. Reactive authority was given to officers on scene and a tactical action plan was put in place for us to respond to the residence in an attempt to locate and safely apprehend S-Wheeler. We arrived on scene of Wisconsin Ave at approximately 1744 hours and I observed the following in summary:

Upon arrival I observed (2) small children in the front yard of wisconsin, as well as an older female subject. Officers quickly reacted and safely removed all three subject from the front yard as we were setting up the Bearcat.

At approximately 1752 hours, an additional female exited the front door of Wisconsin Ave and safely walked westbound towards officers. Approximately 30 minutes later I observed movement in the front window next to the front door, but the movement was slight and brief.

A short time later (approximately 1850 hours) the front door of the residence opened and I observed a male subject wearing a white t-shirt appear. Just as the front door opened it immediately closed again and I lost visual of the subject. A few minutes later I heard over the radio the suspect was running westbound through the back yard of Wisconsin Ave. I could also hear a dog barking and then several shots (unknown amount) fired. I could not see where the shots were coming from or who was firing the shots. From my position I could not see down the west side of the house (same side next to the gas station).

I observed several officers running to the location where I heard the shots coming from and then heard on the radio that life saving measures were being performed on S-Wheeler. I held on the front of Wisconsin Ave until I was relieved of those duties and the scene was secure.

I cleared the scene at approximately 2045 hours.

On 09/01/2020 at approx. 1520 hrs I, Ofc. Penny # 533/ UNN15 (Currently assigned to the Sacramento Police Department SWAT Team 10) received a call-out page that stated "SPD 20-261223\*\*SWAT/CNT/ C/O. 940 at Winterhaven/Northgate, possible 664/187 suspect Albert Wheeler inside." While en-route, I was advised the command post had been changed to the parking lot behind Smart and Final (3315 Northgate Blvd). It shall be noted that I was wearing a full SWAT uniform which consists of a ballistic vest, helmet and duty belt. The vest has "POILICE" patches clearly visible on the front and back. My ballistic helmet is equipped with a mounted body-camera which was on and activated during the incident. I arrived at approx. 1530 hrs. I observed the following in summary:

SWAT team members received instructions at the command post before deploying to the target address of Wisconsin Ave. I was assigned as the driver of the SPD Bearcat.

We responded to the target address at approx. 1744 hrs. I positioned the SPD Bearcat near the 1/4 corner of the residence. Officers assisted in the evacuation of the children and female adult that were observed in the front yard of the residence. I moved up and assisted with lethal cover on the house as team members retrieved the aforementioned subjects.

After evacuations were made, I was assigned as a designated hands officer to take custody of the suspect once he emerged from the house.

Numerous announcements were made by CNT while we were positioned in front of the house.

At approx. 1851 hrs, I heard AIR1 advised via radio that the suspect was on the back patio wearing a white T-shirt.

At approx. 1853 hrs, AIR1 advised via radio that the target had ran to the 4 side of the house (southwest corner). Shortly after, I heard approx. 8-10 qunshots.

Updates via radio stated that shots were fired and the suspect was down, south of the gas station not moving.

I became part of a contact team to approach the suspect. I was designated as a hands officer for custody. Upon approach, I observed a black, semi-automatic handgun located approx. 3' feet south west of the suspect, near the brick wall. I immediately retrieved the firearm and moved it away from reach of the suspect near a black gate located about 10' feet west.

Officers performed a head-to-toe rapid assessment of his person, and I observed what appeared to be a gunshot wound to his left hip, one to his right rear shoulder and a large laceration to the back of his left tricep.

His T-shirt was removed to better access his wounds. It was determined that a tourniquet was not needed for his left arm because no soaking, pooling or spurting of blood was observed. No chest seals were applied due to the location of the gunshot wounds.

I (Ofc. Hawley #0646) am assigned to the Sacramento Police Department's SWAT Team. On 09/01/2020 at approximately 1520 hours I received a SWAT Call Out page stating "SPD 20-261223\*\*SWAT/CNT C/O\*\*Full SWAT / CNT C/O 940 at Winterhaven / Northgate possible 664/187 suspect Albert Wheeler inside..." Prior to my arrival on scene the stage location was changed to the rear parking lot of Smart and Final (3315 Northgate Blvd). I arrived on scene at the stage location at approximately 1527 hours. Upon arriving on scene I dressed in full SWAT gear, including a ballistic vest, duty belt, and helmet. The ballistic vest has Sacramento Police Department patches and "POLICE" patches on the front and back of the vest.

At this time it was known to me that Albert Wheeler was wanted for 664/187 PC on a Sacramento Police Department Officer. I was aware that S-Wheeler shot at several officers during a pursuit and subsequently a warrant was issued for his arrest. It was believed that S-Wheeler was still armed with a firearm.

Immediately upon arriving on scene, SWAT Sgt. Young, directed myself, Ofc. McGill, and Ofc. Kellerman to move to a perimeter location to the south of the suspect residence (Wisconsin Ave.) to hold the southern boundary. The three of us responded to Indiana Ave. directly to the south of Wisconsin Ave. We held this location until we were advised by SWAT Sgt. Young to move to the front of the suspect residence with our armored vehicle. We arrived to the front of Wisconsin Ave. at approximately 1744 hours.

Upon arriving at Wisconsin Ave. additional SWAT Officers and K9 Officer Yasonia were assisting a female and young child away from the residence. When I arrived on the armored vehicle I was tasked with being lethal cover on the arrest team. At approximately 1752 hours, we were advised over the radio that the final occupant, other than S-Wheeler, was going to exit the house. A female exited the house and we directed her to the back of our armored vehicle.

While on scene in front of Wisconsin Ave. CNT officers made numerous announcements to S-Wheeler asking him to exit the residence. At one point S-Wheeler was seen attempting to exit a window along the west side of the residence. He did not exit the window fully. A while later S-Wheeler opened the front door and then immediately closed it. S-Wheeler never exited the front door of the residence and obeyed officers orders.

At approximately 1851 hours, SPD helicopter (AIR1) advised the suspect was on the back patio wearing a white t-shirt. At approximately 1852 hours AIR1 advised the suspect was running towards the southwest corner of the yard, moments later I heard several gunshots. AIR1 advised the suspect was down and

the targets gun was 3 feet away from him. Myself and several SWAT officers responded to the gas station parking lot (3016 Northgate Blvd.). We immediately formed an arrest team with a shield in order to make an approach to the suspect. I was tasked with being hands on the arrest team. At 1855 hours we approached the suspect who was laying in a supine position in a gravel area on the south side of the gas station. The suspect was not responsive. I observed a black semi-automatic handgun laying on the suspects right hand side. The firearm was approximately 2-3 feet away from the suspect.

I immediately patted S-Wheeler down to ensure he was no longer armed. I removed several personal items from his pockets. After I determined the suspect was not armed I began checking the suspect for injuries. I located an apparently gun shot wound on S-Wheeler's left hip area and his right rear shoulder. Neither of this wounds were bleeding. I observed a large gashing wound on S-Wheeler's left upper arm. This wound was not bleeding heavily. I assisted in cutting the clothing off of S-Wheeler. S-Wheeler was wearing a red bandana around his neck, when I removed the bandana I located an additional apparent gun shot wound on the left side of his neck. This wound also was not bleeding. I assisted Sgt. Edgerton with chest compressions in an effort to save S-Wheeler's life until relieved by Sacramento Fire Department.

I responded back to the armored vehicle until I was relieved from the scene at approximately 2045 hours.

My body worn camera was recording for the duration of the incident.

On 9-01-2020, I, Ofc Ratcliffe #224 was working as a uniformed police officer assigned to the Sacramento Police Department Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) Team. At approximately 1510 hrs, I received information from other members of the SWAT Team that detectives assigned to the Career Criminal Apprehension Team (CCAT) had possibly located a residence where Albert Wheeler, suspected of shooting at officers on a prior incident, was located. I was advised that the address of the residence was Wisconsin Ave. At approximately 1520 hrs, I received a call-out page through SPD Dispatch advising of a full SWAT/CNT (Crisis Negotiations Team) call-out.

I responded to the designated command post location on Rio Tierra Ave. I was briefed with the SWAT Team regarding the intelligence gained by CCAT detectives and observations from officers, both in an orbiting helicopter and on surveillance at the residence. I was briefed on the tactical plan for containing and arresting suspect Albert Wheeler. I was given the assignment of high cover in the armored vehicle provided by the Folsom Police Department (Folsom PD Bearcat). I was advised of the reactive authority for the use of force by the Incident Commander (IC).

At the direction of the IC, the SWAT Team moved into pre-designated tactical positions. I activated my helmet mounted body worn camera (BWC) as we moved toward the scene. Upon arriving at the scene at approximately 1744 hrs, the Folsom Police officer assigned to drive the Folsom PD Bearcat positioned it in the street in front of the residence to give me a view of the front (north side) of the residence and along the side (east) of the residence. I was positioned in the turret of the Folsom PD Bearcat (high cover) and was responsible for covering the east side of the residence and part of the front of the residence.

I saw a woman and two children in front of the residence when we arrived. Those three people were given directions by officers in the Sacramento Police Department Bearcat (armored vehicle), located to in front of the residence and west of the front door. At approximately 1751, I heard an update over the radio that contact had been made with a female inside the residence via telephone. At approximately 1752 hrs, I observed a female exit the front door of the residence. The front door was left slightly ajar. Once the female exited the residence, I heard updated reactive authority given by the Incident Commander. At approximately 1803 hrs, I observed the front door close.

During the course of the operation, there were numerous updates given regarding the progression of the operation. At approximately 1853 hrs, I heard

a broadcast that suspect Wheeler was running from the back of the house and heard commands being shouted by officers. A short time later, I heard several gunshots. Officers in the police helicopter advised that the subject who ran was down and that there was a firearm on the ground a short distance away. I maintained coverage on the residence while a contact team was formed to render aid.

I maintained a position in front of the residence until advised that we were not making entry into the residence. I deactivated my body worn camera (BWC) once I was advised that Lt. Wallace had authorized us to do so.

On 09/01/20 I, Ofc. Mantsch #918, was working in the north area of Sacramento when a SWAT call out came in at approx 1520 hours. I responded in my SWAT take home vehicle from the Kinney Police Station to the command post located behind the Smart and Final on Northgate Blvd. I observed the following in summary.

During the briefing at the command post, we were told that a subject (Albert Wheeler), who was wanted for an attempted murder on a Sacramento police officer, was located at Wisconsin Ave. Wheeler had previously shot at officers while in a car pursuit trying to evade the police. It was advised to us that the people who knew Wheeler advised that he should be armed with a gun.

I was assigned to the Sacramento Sheriff's Department's armored vehicle. I was assigned to that vehicle with other swat team members from my team (Ofc. Tiner, Ofc. Feuerbach and Sgt. Jarvis) as well as two SWAT members from the Sheriff's team. We were assigned to lead the way on the street where the house was and continue east of the house to the parking lot of the church located at 514 Wisconsin Ave. The church parking lot was immediately to the east of Wisconsin Ave.

We all arrived on scene of Wisconsin Ave at approx 1744 hours. I looked at the lock on the sliding gate of the church and decided that it was going to be too much exposure to try and cut the lock. I had the armored vehicle I was with drive through the chain linked fence gate. We then positioned the armored vehicle in the church parking lot so we could see most of the backyard and 3 side of the house at Wisconsin Ave. Once we were set in that position, my assignment was to be lethal cover for the officers at the vehicle.

At approx 1815 hours, an officer advised on the air that Wheeler was climbing out of a window on the 4 side of the house and then immediately went back inside the house. I did not observe him during this movement.

At approx 1848 hours, Wheeler came out of a door on the 3/4 corner of the house. The air unit spotted him coming out of a door to the house that I could not see from my angle. He was wearing a white shirt. I could see him as he looked around the 3/4 corner towards our vehicle. I could not see his hands due to the way he was standing and items on the patio by where he was standing. I began to give commands to Wheeler. I told him to "come on out here, put your hands up and come out." At that point Sgt. Jarvis took over voice commands telling Wheeler to come out. Wheeler did not listen to our commands or show us his hands. He yelled something at us that sounded like "Don't shoot me" and then reached up to close the screen door as he went back inside the house. He did not have anything in his hand as he closed the

screen. He was outside, in my view, for approx 20 seconds. It appeared that Wheeler was standing out there just long enough to scout out the situation outside and to see where the police were located. The way he was looking at me and looking around while I gave him commands appeared that he had no intention of coming out to us but rather was getting a lay of the land.

At approx 1851 hours, the air unit advised that Wheeler came back out on to the patio from the same door that he did a few minutes prior. I was able to see that the screen door was open but did not have a good visual on him. He was staying hidden from me based on my angle that I had to that side of the house. Sqt. Jarvis started to give him commands to come out to us but Wheeler did not comply with any of them. The air unit advised that Wheeler was standing with his hands at his side and could not see anything in his hands. I could see his upper body at times when he would move into my view. At approx 1853 hours, Wheeler sprinted from the corner of the house to midway into the back yard. He was running along the west fence line that was full of bushes and trees. As he sprinted, I could see his left hand (closest to me) and to my knowledge there was nothing in it. I was not able to see his right hand (far side of him from me) while he was sprinting. I do not know if he had anything in his right hand while sprinting due to the way his hand stayed hidden by his body. Sqt. Jarvis gave him a command to stop but Wheeler did not. He sprinted to a spot behind the above ground pool in the back yard. He went down to the ground very quickly and appeared to be using his hands as he went down to make a hole through the bushes to get through the fence line. He was out of my view behind the pool as he was getting through the fence line. I was able to see him as he stood up to finish getting through the brush and fence line. I told Sgt. Jarvis to put out on the air that he made it through the fence but the air unit put it out before he could. At that point I lost sight of Wheeler due to the brush. A few seconds later is when I heard shots being fired. Wheeler was outside for approx 50 seconds before he took off in his sprint. He is not visible on my body worn camera at any time due to the lighting and distance.

Wheeler appeared to have his plan of escape planned out. He did not hesitate at all when he took off in his sprint for the fence. He was quick and went exactly to the spot he wanted to go through. He was quick to get behind the above ground pool to be out of sight from all of us at my vehicle until he was through the fence.

I had my body worn camera on for the whole event. I kept my camera on until I was told by Lt. Wallace that my team was able to turn off our cameras.

K9 Officer Henderson - Assigned as a K9 handler Both SSD deputies were operating the vehicle.

My team drove to the church at 514 Wisconsin Ave directly to the east of the residence. We drove through a locked gate at that location. We drove south inside of the parking lot there and parked near the south east corner of the residence at Wisconsin Ave.

We could see into the back yard of the residence.

Just prior to 1849 hours, I observed Wheeler exit the residence to the rear. I gave him verbal commands to come out and surrender. He went back into the residence.

At approx. 1851 hours I observed Wheeler exit the residence to the rear. He stood for a moment, looking in our direction.

I again called out to Wheeler. I advised him, "Albert, we are not here to hurt you. Come on out."

I Officer Kellermann (#0961) am a member of the Sacramento Police Departments Special Weapons and Tactics Team (SWAT). On 09/01/2020 at approximately 1520 hours I was called out to Wisconsin Ave. for a possible 664/187 suspect inside of the residence (Albert Wheeler). During the call out I was wearing fully marked Sacramento Police SWAT gear and was equipped with a helmet mounted camera. Throughout the duration of the call out my helmet mounted camera was on and recording. My initial response was to the command post that was established at the Smart & Final, located at 3315 Northgate Blvd. I observed the following in summary:

From the command post I was instructed by Sgt. Young (#3102) to accompany Officers Hawley (#646) and McGill (#330) in an unmarked vehicle to take up a perimeter position to the south west of the target location. We maintained our perimeter position until instructed to drive in behind the SPD Bearcat on the target street in front of Wisconsin Ave. (north) at approximately 1744 hours. Once in front of the target location I was instructed by Sgt. Young to be part of the arrest team and to stage less lethal equipment as well as emergency gas behind the SPD Bearcat. I maintained my position behind the SPD Bearcat with the less lethal equipment staged. At approximately 1853 hours AIR1 advised that the suspect (Albert Wheeler) who was wearing a white t-shirt, was running to the four side of the property on the southwest side. Within seconds of the initial broadcast I heard multiple gunshots to the southwest of my location. AIR1 then broadcast, shots fired, and indicated that the suspect was down and not moving, with a gun approximately three feet away from him on the ground.

As part of the arrest team staged behind the SPD Bearcat, I moved, carrying the less lethal shotgun, to the southwest and into the parking lot of Northgate Liquor & Food (3016 Northgate Blvd.). Sgt. Young established a contact team to approach the downed suspect. At approximately 1855 hours, Officers approached the suspect. I followed behind the shield and hands Officers with the less lethal shotgun. I observed other SWAT Officers take custody of the suspect and begin providing medical aid. I stood near the casings until we were provided with evidence placards to place over them.

I then assisted with the collection of SWAT equipment that was utilized during the call out and returned to the SPD Bearcat. I remained there until the termination of the call out at which time I was authorized to deactivate my camera. I cleared the scene at approximately 2045 hours.

On 09-01-2020 at approximately 1520 hrs. I Ofc. Tiner #327 was assigned to the Sacramento Police Department SWAT Team 20. I received a SWAT Call Out page at approximately 1607 hrs. to respond to the Command Post at Rio Tierra Ave/Northgate, regarding 664/187 suspect Albert Wheeler. I arrived on scene and I was wearing my Fully marked Sacramento Police Department issued SWAT uniform and gear. I observed the following in summary:

Upon my arrival I received a briefing regarding the suspect and the location. I was assigned to be High Cover in the Sacramento Sheriffs Armored Vehicle to cover the 2/3 corner (South/East) of the residence at Wisconsin.

At approximately 1747 hrs., the Sacramento Sheriff's Department moved into position with me in high cover. I could see the majority of the three side of the residence (South Side) in this position. There was a window midway of the residence and a cut out that went in towards the house covered by an overhang leading to a back door. I could not see into the cut out or the back door from my position in high cover. Once in position I could hear PA announcement being made from the front of the residence.

The perimeter units advised Suspect Wheeler crawled out of a window on the four side (West Side) of the residence and then jumped back into the window.

At approximately 1848 hrs. Suspect Albert Wheeler exited the residence through the back door into the backyard. Sgt Jarvis (UNN 24) gave verbal commands for Wheeler to show his hands and come out to us. He faced the Armored vehicle and yelled something that was not understandable before reentering the residence through the back door and out of my sight. Shortly after, the team at the front of the residence advised suspect Wheeler opened the front door and then shut it again.

Air1 then advised that suspect Wheeler exited the residence through the back door and was standing unseen by us in the corner with his arms down by his sides. I could not see Wheeler at this or if he was armed due to the cut out of the residence and overhang.

At 1853 hrs. I observed Wheeler throw an object that appeared to be a bag around the corner into the backyard from the area of the back door in our direction. He then ran from cover near the back door directly to a hole in the fence on the 4 side (west side) of the yard and through the hole into the alley. I did not observe a weapon in Wheelers hand as he exited the residence. The fence line on the west side was heavily covered in brush. I

advised Wheeler ran and was on the four side (West Side) of the residence. I heard the police  ${\tt K9}$  and several shots being fired in the direction where Wheeler ran.

On 09/01/2020 at approximately 1520 hours, I (Ofc.Feuerbach #601) (UNN21, Sacramento Police Department, SWAT) received a call-out page regarding SPD Case #2020-261223. Shortly after the initial call-out page, the command post / staging location was determined to be at 3315 Northgate Blvd, Sacramento, CA 95834 (behind the Smart & Final grocery store). I responded code 3 from the William J. Kinney Police station at 3550 Marysville Blvd, Sacramento to the Northgate Blvd / HW80 off-ramp with no incidents.

On-scene at the command post I was assigned to the SSD Bearcat as a Breacher and would transition to the less-lethal shotgun after entry thru the vehicular gate into 514 Wisconsin Ave (St Basil's Jacobite Syriac Orthodox Church). Ofc. Mantsch, Sgt. Jarvis, K-9 Ofc. Henderson were assigned to this Bearcat. Additionally, we had an SSD SED officer driving and another inside for support as needed.

At approximately 1744 hours, SWAT team members and their assigned armored vehicles marked on-scene in front of the suspects' (Albert Wheeler) location. Sgt. Jarvis, Ofc. Mantsch, and I went to the vehicular gate to breach it so that we could cover the three side of the suspects location. Ofc. Mantsch viewed the bike cable lock wrapped around the fencing and advised the SSD SED driver to push the gate open with the Bearcat. This would allow quick entry to the parking lot and limit exposure from the suspects' location. The Bearcat pushed the vehicular gate open snapping the bike cable lock and knocking the gate onto the ground. We positioned the Bearcat to the East fence line of wisconsin Ave. We could see the three side of the suspects residence. However, the three / four corner of the residence had a patio overhang that obstructed the view of the back door and limited visibility.

At approximately 1815 hours, over the radio AIR1 advised suspect Wheeler crawled out the second window on the four side of the residence, and then immediately crawled back into the residence. At approximately 1848 hours, AIR1 advised suspect Wheeler stepped out onto the back patio. Ofc.Mantsch advised he had visual from our location and began to yell instructions to suspect Wheeler to come out of the yard. Sgt. Jarvis took over voice commands from Ofc. Mantsch yelling instructions for suspect Wheeler to come out. At this point I heard suspect Wheeler yell "Don't shoot" or something similar as he looked around the yard. It appeared suspect Wheeler was attempting to determine where law enforcement was positioned. Then he went back inside. I only briefly saw him during this interaction.

At approximately 1852 hours, suspect Wheeler stepped back out onto the back patio and began to run down the West fence line. Ofc.Mantsch stated, "here he comes." Sgt. Jarvis yelled, "hey Albert stop." I only saw a quick glimpse of a

On 09/01/2020 at approximately 1500 hours, I responded to Rio Tierra Ave / Northgate Blvd regarding a possible sighting of an attempted Homicide suspect (Albert WHEELER). At approximately 1520 hours, I was notified via text of a SWAT C/O. I was working in full SPD SWAT Police uniform as UNN26. I observed the following in summary:

Upon arrival, I was tasked with being a rear perimeter unit at 2990 Northgate Blvd with Officer Hawley (UNN23) and Officer Kellerman (UNN16).

At approximately 1745 hours, I took up a position on the SPD Bearcat to cover the 4-side (west) of the residence (Wisconsin Ave). The SPD Bearcat was located on Wisconsin Avenue in the middle of the street, facing eastbound. My position was on the rear steps of the Bearcat looking south down the 4-side (south). At approximately 1815 hours, I observed S-WHEELER crawl out of a window on the 4-side of the residence and then immediately crawl back in. The window was the second window south of the ?? corner (northwest).

At approximately 1853 hours, I observed S-WHEELER run from the ?? corner (southwest) of the residence in a west direction, before he disappeared out of my view to the west. The only view of S-WHEELER was his head. Once S-WHEELER was out of my view, I heard yelling from the west side of the perimeter followed by approximately 10 qunshots.

I was tasked with carrying the large rifle shield as part of the contact/custody team. Once up to the scene of the shooting, I observed S-WHEELER laying on his back, with his head facing towards Northgate Blvd (west). I observed a black handgun approximately 3 feet from the right side of S-WHEELER's body. The contact team moved behind the shield and approached S-WHEELER in order to render medical aid. Officer Penny moved the handgun to the southwest corner fence line and I placed the shield in a vertical position over it.

I then transitioned to assisting officers with medical aid on S-WHEELER. I used my medical shears to cut S-WHEELER's shirt away from his body. I did not provide any contact medical aid.

I stood by with the handgun at the scene until I was relieved by a patrol officer.

The entire incident was captured on my body worn camera.

At approximately 1950 hours, I was instructed by Lt. Wallace (LN3) to turn off my body worn camera. At this time I no longer had a role in the scene.
