Summary:

On 1/3/23, at approximately 0945 hours, the Force Investigations Team responded to Central Command regarding a FIT call related to an incident that began during late watch. FIT was provided with the following information.

On 1/3/23, at approximately 0215 hours, Officers responded to the Exchange Hotel regarding a person experiencing homelessness (PEH) brandishing a knife and threatening valet employees. The complainant was a DOCO security dispatcher. The valet driver reported the subject swung the knife at him, but he was not cut.

Officers Kammerer (1A35) and Yee (1A33) were the first officers to arrive on scene and make contact with the suspect, who was later identified by a West Sacramento Police Officer as Skandar Alam. Officer Yee advised the suspect was armed with a 6" knife and not following commands, as he walked away from them. Alam continued walking away from officers, and they lost visual of him when he entered the K Street tunnel leading to Old Sacramento.

Officer Kammerer returned to the Holiday Inn and contacted the victim, who was a valet employee at the Holiday Inn. The victim advised that Alam approached him, asking for a key, and when he denied him, he pulled out a knife. Alam made a stabbing motion towards the valet employee and threatened to stab the employee.

Officers continued searching the area for Alam. Officer Vito located Alam walking westbound on the north sidewalk of the Tower Bridge, towards West Sacramento. Officers made contact with Alam, who was still armed with a knife. Alam proceeded to climb onto the outside of the bridge railing. Crisis Negotiation Team Officer Catalina Hernandez responded and established communication with Alam. Alam eventually came back over the railing and put down the knife. Prior to being able to take Alam into custody he pulled out another knife, then walked into West Sacramento. Alam walked down the embankment on the northside of Tower Bridge to a concrete wall near the waters edge. Officer Hernandez continued communications with Alam. Alam was telling officers that he was not going to surrender peacefully, and they were going to have to shoot him.

SPD Marine 1 and West Sacramento Fire Boat 41 were launched on the river in case a water rescue was needed.

SPD Sergeants Gresham (1SM3) and Trejo (1SM5) created a contact team plan with a combined less-lethal option. At approximately 0657 hours, Officer Yee deployed three rounds of PepperBall, which was ineffective. Officer Yee deployed another three rounds of PepperBall, which was again ineffective. Officers then initiated the combined less-lethal plan, which consisted of one bean bag round by Officer Ricci and one 40mm round by Officer Summey. That plan did not appear to be effective and was followed up by an additional two volleys of PepperBall by Officer Yee.

At 0702 hours, K9 Officer Phelan deployed his K9 partner, Shep. K9 Shep made contact with Alam's left leg and left arm. Almost simultaneous with the K9 deployment, another round of 40 mm and a bean bag round were deployed, striking Alam. Alam fell into the water and was brought back onto land by K9 Shep. Officers immediately took Alam into custody without further incident. Alam sustained the aforementioned injuries from the K9 deployment.

Sacramento Fire Department personnel were already on scene and began treating Alam. He was transported to Sutter General Hospital, where he was treated for his injuries. Alam was then booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail on various felony charges related to the knife assault.





522.02 EMERGENCY CARE FOR INDIVIDUALS UNDER POLICE CARE OR CONTROL 5-18-18

PURPOSE

The purpose of this order is to establish procedures for medical care for individuals under police care or control.

POLICY

It shall be the policy of the Sacramento Police Department to provide emergency medical treatment to individuals under police care or control, while ensuring their safety and that of others during treatment.

PROCEDURE

A. EMERGENCY MEDICAL TREATMENT

- 1. Officers having any doubt concerning a person's condition shall request emergency medical assistance.
- 2. Officers shall provide first aid to injured parties if it can be done safely.
- 3. Officers shall be aware of behaviors indicative of medical distress such as the medical condition known as excited delirium. Excited delirium is a potentially fatal condition caused by a complex set of physiological conditions, including over-exertion of the subject and inability for sufficient respiration to maintain normal blood chemistry. Indicators of excited delirium are
 - a. Bizarre/aggressive behavior.
 - b. Dilated pupils.
 - c. Fear/panic/paranoia.
 - d. High temperature.
 - e. Irrational/incoherent speech.
 - f. Jumping into water.
 - g. Profuse sweating.
 - h. Public disrobing.
 - i. Self-inflicted injuries.
 - j. Shivering.
 - k. Inconsistent breathing patterns.
 - I. Seizure.
 - m. Unexpected physical strength.
 - n. Sudden tranquility.
- 4. If officers suspect that a subject is suffering from any medical distress, including excited delirium, they should place the subject into a comfortable position (e.g., seated or supine position, etc.), and attempt to keep the subject calm and still until Emergency Medical Services (EMS) arrive and can treat the subject.
- 5. Officers will use their training and experience in deciding if a subject is suffering from an overdose of opioids and whether it is appropriate to deploy intra-nasal naloxone (Narcan) as directed in G.O. 522.06 (Administration of Narcan).
- 6. Communications personnel receiving telephone requests for ambulances shall
 - a. Make every effort to determine the seriousness of the situation.
 - b. Follow established procedure for dispatch of appropriate emergency medical personnel.

B. REFUSAL OF MEDICAL ATTENTION

1. The Department has no authority to force a non-arrested injured or ill person of a sound mental state to be transported to a medical facility.





2. When officers encounter a situation involving a refusal to accept medical attention, an Incident Report (SPD 107) recording the facts and circumstances shall be completed. EXCEPTION: See G.O. 522.01 (Handling Mentally III Persons).

C. <u>EMERGENCY MEDICAL AUTHORITY</u>

- 1. The highest-level paramedic/emergency medical technician (EMT) on scene is in charge and responsible for the examination, treatment, and transportation of medical patients.
- 2. Police supervisors and/or officers shall inform paramedics/EMTs when a patient is in lawful custody and request the patient be transported to a facility designated to handle prisoners.
- 3. Law enforcement does not have the authority to order anyone to stop performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) or to interfere with a paramedic/EMT.

D. OUT-PATIENT MEDICAL CARE FOR ARRESTEES

- 1. An arrestee requiring outpatient emergency medical care whose condition allows transportation in a passenger vehicle shall be taken to an emergency room.
- 2. Sacramento County's "intent to incarcerate" forms are located inside the Prisoner Watch Kit binder. The kits are stored at the following city emergency rooms: UC Davis Medical Center, Sutter General, Mercy General, Methodist, and Kaiser South.
- 3. The "intent to incarcerate" form shall be completed and signed by both the treating physician and the custodial officer.
- 4. After treatment is rendered, officers shall transport the subject with the proper documentation to the Sacramento County Jail.

E. ADMISSION OF AN ARRESTEE TO A MEDICAL FACILITY

- 1. If an ambulance is required, the patient should be sent to the nearest area hospital.
- 2. When the subject is waiting for or receiving medical attention, officers shall
 - a. Remain with the subject at all times.
 - b. Obtain an estimated time for medical clearance release.
 - c. Notify their supervisor of the estimated length of hospitalization to allow the supervisor to initiate arrangements for prisoner watch if needed.
- 3. The affected watch commander shall be responsible for staffing extended prisoner watch assignments.
- 4. Officers shall complete all booking paperwork and give it to the prisoner watch officer before leaving the hospital, unless other arrangements have been made through the affected watch commander.
- 5. In any case in which more than one consecutive officer is required for prisoner watch, all officers involved shall
 - a. Ensure a Prisoner Watch Log (SPD 916) is being kept.
 - b. Document all observations on the SPD 916 as to occurrences on their shift. If there is no SPD 916 available, the officer shall document his/her actions within the C.A.D. call.
 - c. Document prisoner comments and actions (e.g., if they are violent or a flight risk).
 - d. Liaison with hospital police or security staff regarding the prisoner watch.
 - e. Keep all SPD 916 pages with the prisoner's paperwork until the prisoner is released for incarceration. When the prisoner is released for incarceration, the SPD 916 pages shall be turned in as a report supplement by the booking officer.





525.07 BODY-WORN CAMERA 1-16-19

PURPOSE

This policy is intended to provide officers with instructions on when and how to use body-worn cameras (BWCs) so that they may reliably record their investigations and enforcement activity in accordance with the law and in order to provide accountability and transparency to the public.

POLICY

It shall be the policy of the Sacramento Police Department (SPD) to utilize a BWC in a manner that will assist in criminal investigations and prosecutions as well as civil litigation, by providing a recording of the incident that may supplement an employee's report and help document police conduct, investigations, and enforcement activity.

PROCEDURE

A. DEFINITIONS

- 1. On Position Switching the on/off switch of the camera into a standby mode which allows the camera, when activated, to capture the previous 30 seconds of video.
- 2. Activation Triggering the Body Worn Camera by touch or any other method, which initiates the audio and video recording functions.
- 3. De-Activation Discontinuing audio and video recording and returning the camera to a standby mode in the on position.
- 4. BLUE TEAM (BT) IA Pro Blue Team is Web-based computer software that allows sergeants to enter use of force incidents, pursuits, and audits from a Department computer.
- 5. Muting A function of the BWC that allows for video recording while audio recording is disabled.
- 6. Stealth Mode A function of the BWC where the LED indicator lights, sounds, and vibrations are disabled.

B. GENERAL

- 1. All employees issued a BWC are required to wear and use their BWCs while working in uniform. A "uniform" is to be considered the standard uniform of the day based on assignment. This would include, but is not limited to, any apparel (e.g., tactical/raid vests, visible badge and firearm) that identifies the wearer as a police officer.
 - a. Exceptions:
 - (1) Uniformed personnel attending a formal event or funeral.
 - (2) Personnel working in an undercover capacity or while conducting plain clothes surveillance where the intent is not to be identified as a police officer and no enforcement action is planned.
 - (3) Personnel working in an administrative assignment. However, they shall always have them readily available to use in accordance with this general order.
 - (4) Personnel with express managerial approval under special circumstances.
- 2. BWC video recordings help provide context and capture beneficial information during police investigations and enforcement contacts with members of the public. Because BWC recordings provide only a limited perspective of the encounter, all other available evidence, such as witness statements, employee interviews, forensic analysis, and documentary evidence should be considered before any conclusions are reached.
- 3. BWC should assist in the following:
 - a. Documenting an initial police response.





- b. Collecting evidence for use in investigations and prosecutions.
- c. Helping employees with completing reports and testifying in court.
- d. Deterring criminal activity and uncooperative behavior during police-public interactions.
- e. Promoting accountability.
- f. Recording video for use in training SPD employees.
- g. Documenting the performance and professionalism of SPD employees.
- 4. BWC video is not meant to replace or to relieve the employee from submitting any documentation as required by policy.
- 5. All recordings made using BWCs are the property of SPD and will not be released or disseminated to the public without the express written consent of the Chief of Police (COP) or authorized designee or unless otherwise expressly required by federal or state law.

C. EMPLOYEE RESPONSIBILITY

- 1. Employees issued a BWC shall be trained in the proper use of the device prior to deployment.
- 2. Employees issued a BWC shall:
 - a. Be responsible for the reasonable care and maintenance of the BWC they are issued.
 - b. Ensure the BWCs are functioning properly.
 - c. Affix their issued BWC to their uniforms above the beltline at the beginning of their shift in accordance with training and the manufacturer's guidelines. The BWC shall be worn for the entire shift.
 - d. Ensure their issued BWC is fully charged and has adequate video storage to complete the shift.
 - e. Only use BWCs that have been approved by the Department.
 - f. Ensure the BWC is placed in the on position after leaving a police facility or a detention facility.
- 3. Generally, employees shall begin downloading all media prior to the end of their shift; however, supervisors may approve other download schedules when appropriate.
- 4. When a report is generated, employees shall document their use of the BWC or ensure that it is documented by another employee. Employees are required to spell out "body-worn camera" at least once in the associated report prior to referring to the initials "BWC" later in the report.
- 5. Employees are authorized to review their own BWC recordings, including prior to giving a statement after being involved in a critical incident, when writing a report, testifying in court or other proceeding, or for any other official use.
- 6. Employees may be authorized to review other employees' BWC recording after being involved in a critical incident.
- 7. Employees shall not tamper with or modify any part of the BWC system.

D. EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT

In the event an employee's BWC is malfunctioning, damaged, lost, or unavailable for use:

- 1. The employee shall notify their supervisor as soon as reasonably practical.
- 2. The supervisor shall issue a replacement BWC, which are available at each station.
- 3. The supervisor shall send an email to Public Safety Information Technology (PSIT) that includes the serial number, Blue Tag number, description of the problem, and to whom the BWC was issued.
- 4. Only a watch commander or higher can authorize an employee to go in service without a BWC due to an equipment shortage or malfunction.

E. REQUIRED ACTIVATION OF THE BODY-WORN CAMERA

 This policy is not intended to describe every situation in which the BWC should be activated, but rather is designed to provide general guidance. Not all situations will start out as necessitating the activation of the BWC, nor will all events have a clear ending when the BWC is no longer necessary.





- 2. If immediate activation of the BWC is not feasible due to risk to the safety of the employee or others, the employee should activate the BWC as soon as it is safe to do so.
- 3. Employees shall activate their BWC during investigations and enforcement activity, including evidence collection, whether self-initiated or in response to a dispatched call.
- 4. If the BWC was not activated during an investigation or enforcement activity, or malfunctioned, the reason shall be documented on the CAD call.
- 5. Employees are not required to give notice they are recording when speaking with private citizens during the course and scope of their official duties, even when the contact occurs in a private residence. If asked, employees shall advise citizens they are being recorded. Moreover, employees should strongly consider advising citizens that they are being recorded as a tool to de-escalate a situation.
- 6. Generally, employees should not record informal or casual encounters with members of the public. Employees should consider that recording people in some circumstances may inhibit sharing information or developing strong ties between members of the community and employees.
- 7. Absent a deliberate intent to not comply or repeated pattern of non-compliance, the failure to activate the BWC shall not alone constitute cause for discipline.

F. <u>DEACTIVATION OF THE BODY-WORN CAMERA</u>

- 1. Once their BWC is activated, employees shall not deactivate their BWCs until the investigative or enforcement activity has concluded. If investigative or enforcement activity resumes, the employee shall re-activate the BWC and continue recording.
- 2. Lieutenants and above have the discretion to authorize or order officers to deactivate their BWCs when appropriate.
- 3. After a recorded public safety statement is obtained during an OIS the patrol sergeant will instruct involved officers to turn off their BWC so that they can be collected as evidence.
- 4. Employees shall audibly record the reason for deactivation in all instances.

G. RESTRICTED USE OF THE BODY-WORN CAMERA AND/OR STORED MEDIA

- 1. Except those instances involving a criminal investigation of department personnel, a conversation amongst Department employees shall not be intentionally recorded without all parties to the conversation being aware that it is being recorded.
- 2. No BWC will be intentionally activated to record Department personnel during briefings, meetings, roll calls, or while in private spaces such as locker rooms, restrooms, or any other place where a reasonable expectation of privacy exists.
- 3. The BWC shall not intentionally be activated to record confidential informants or undercover employees.
- 4. Prior to conducting a strip search, the employee shall record a 360-degree video of where the strip search will be conducted. During the strip search, the BWC will be activated to capture only audio of the event by positioning the camera away from the individual to be searched.
- 5. Employees should not normally record patients during medical or psychological evaluation by a clinician or similar professional or during treatment, unless necessitated by investigatory or safety concerns. Employees shall be aware of patients' rights to privacy when in hospital settings. When recording in hospitals and other medical facilities, employees should be careful to avoid recording persons other than those who are the focus of the investigations.
- 6. Employees shall not play back body-worn footage for citizens or the media without prior approval from the COP or authorized designee unless for investigative purposes.
- 7. Employees who have made an inadvertent recording may request to have that video deleted. Requests shall be submitted to their division captain.
- 8. Employees shall not:
 - a. make copies of any recorded event for personal use.





- b. use a recording device such as a cell phone camera or secondary video camera to record a BWC file or image.
- c. copy, upload, or disseminate any BWC recordings publicly or privately, nor shall employees post recordings on social media for personal use.

H. SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITY

Supervisors shall:

- 1. ensure that employees issued a BWC have completed required training and are familiar with applicable policies and procedures.
- 2. conduct periodic inspections of employees issued BWC equipment and ensure that the BWCs are properly affixed to the employees' uniforms and fully operable.
- 3. have the opportunity to view recordings in the field to mitigate and address citizen complaints when necessary.
- 4. have access to video footage of all users. This will allow instant access when creating or reviewing a pursuit or a use of force report for training or administrative purposes.
- 5. conduct audits and ensure compliance in accordance with section M of this general order.

I. USE OF VIDEO FOR TRAINING

- 1. Recordings may be used for training purposes.
- 2. When a recording contains footage that may embarrass an employee, consideration should be given before the video is used for training.
- 3. If a video will be used for training purposes, the Department will notify the employee. If an involved employee objects to the use of a recording, the employee may object in writing through their chain of command to the COP or authorized designee to determine if the training value outweighs the employee's objection. In no event shall any recording be used for the purpose of ridiculing or embarrassing any employee.

J. BODY-WORN CAMERA RECORDING DUPLICATION

- 1. BWC duplications shall not be made without an approved SPD 524 (Video Request Form). The SPD 524 may be approved by:
 - a. a sergeant or higher authority.
 - b. the Internal Affairs Division.
 - c. the Professional Standards Unit.
 - d. the City Attorney's Office.
 - e. a Supervising Police Records Assistant in response to a subpoena.
- 2. Duplication requests shall be received by the Evidence and Property Section (EPS) at least seven (7) business days prior to the date required.
- 3. An SPD 524 is NOT required when the BWC recording is downloaded by:
 - a. a sergeant or higher authority.
 - b. the Internal Affairs Division.
 - c. the Professional Standards Unit.
 - d. court liaison personnel.
 - e. authorized PSIT personnel.
 - f. employees for their own incidents for official purposes.
- 4. When a copy is made, the BWC software will create a traceable audit trail for that particular video that contains the date/time of the copy and employee's name and badge number. A remark in the "Notes" section shall be added to the video giving the reason for the copy and the name of the approving supervisor if required.
- 5. Recordings created by the BWC system are not to be booked as evidence unless they contain evidentiary information useful in investigations including, but not limited to:
 - a. Homicide investigations.
 - b. Officer-involved shooting investigations.





- c. In-custody death investigations.
- d. Major officer-involved vehicle collisions.
- e. Upon the direction of a lieutenant or designee.

K. OUTSIDE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY REQUESTS

- 1. All outside law enforcement agency requests for recordings of BWC footage or footage captured from the Air Unit shall be sent to PSU.
- 2. The PSU supervisor shall approve these requests. Exception: A watch commander may authorize the immediate copy and release of BWC footage to outside law enforcement agencies when it is essential to an ongoing investigation.
- 3. Approved requests shall be processed by EPS, except for Air Unit footage. The Air Unit supervisor can make copies of Air Unit footage when requested by PSU or EPS personnel.

L. DATA MANAGEMENT AND FILE RETENTION

- 1. BWC recordings will be retained for a minimum of two and a half years from the date created in accordance with the City of Sacramento Retention Schedule. Video recordings that become evidence will be kept in accordance with the crime classification listing in the City of Sacramento Retention Schedule SPD-007.
- 2. Any attempt to erase, alter, or tamper with the BWC or its recordings, except as authorized by law or Department policy, will be considered employee misconduct.
- 3. PSU shall facilitate an external audit bi-annually.
- 4. Digital evidence captured by BWC shall be treated as official records and handled pursuant to existing Department policies and procedures.

M. AUDIT/COMPLIANCE PROCEDURES

- 1. Periodic Review
 - a. PSIT shall generate a BWC audit on a monthly basis and make that information accessible to all employees.
 - b. Supervisors should periodically review the body worn camera audit mentioned in M(1)(a) to help determine if officers are utilizing their BWC in accordance with this policy.

2. Bi-annual Review

- a. Supervisors are required to complete a compliance review for each employee they supervise prior to the completion of the employee's mid-year and end-of-the-year performance evaluations.
- b. Supervisors shall:
 - (1) Randomly choose two BWC videos for each employee they supervise which:
 - (i) are at least ten minutes in duration.
 - (ii) have an associated RMS report.
 - (2) Compare the two videos mentioned above, along with ICC video, if captured, and the associated report, to ensure compliance with this policy.
 - (3) Generate a Blue Team entry for each BWC video they review.
- 3. The mid-year and end-of-the-year performance evaluations will have a BWC compliance check box to be marked upon completion of the audit.





580.02 USE OF FORCE 12-16-21

PURPOSE

This policy establishes guidelines for the use and application of force, as well as the procedures for after-force medical care.

POLICY

The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) values the sanctity of human life and the freedoms guaranteed by the United States and California constitutions. Use of force (UOF) by peace officers is of important concern to the community. The role of law enforcement is to safeguard life, dignity, and liberty of all persons, without prejudice to anyone. Peace officers shall carry out duties, including UOF, in a manner that is fair and unbiased. This policy will be regularly reviewed and updated by the Professional Standards Division to reflect developing practices and procedures.

It is the policy of the Department that a peace officer is justified in using deadly force upon another person only as a last resort when reasonable alternatives have been exhausted or are not feasible and the officer reasonably believes, based on the totality of the circumstances, that such force is necessary.

This policy is based upon Assembly Bill 392 as codified in Penal Code 835a which states:

- (a) The Legislature finds and declares all of the following:
- (1) That the authority to use physical force, conferred on peace officers by this section, is a serious responsibility that shall be exercised judiciously and with respect for human rights and dignity and for the sanctity of every human life. The Legislature further finds and declares that every person has a right to be free from excessive use of force by officers acting under color of law.
- (2) As set forth below, it is the intent of the Legislature that peace officers use deadly force only when necessary in defense of human life. In determining whether deadly force is necessary, officers shall evaluate each situation in light of the particular circumstances of each case and shall use other available resources and techniques if reasonably safe and feasible to an objectively reasonable officer.
- (3) That the decision by a peace officer to use force shall be evaluated carefully and thoroughly, in a manner that reflects the gravity of that authority and the serious consequences of the use of force by peace officers, in order to ensure that officers use force consistent with law and agency policies.
- (4) That the decision by a peace officer to use force shall be evaluated from the perspective of a reasonable officer in the same situation, based on the totality of the circumstances known to or perceived by the officer at the time, rather than with the benefit of hindsight, and that the totality of the circumstances shall account for occasions when officers may be forced to make quick judgments about using force.
- (5) That individuals with physical, mental health, developmental, or intellectual disabilities are significantly more likely to experience greater levels of physical force during police interactions, as their disability may affect their ability to understand or comply with commands from peace officers. It is estimated that individuals with disabilities are involved in between one-third and one-half of all fatal encounters with law enforcement.





- (b) Any peace officer who has reasonable cause to believe that the person to be arrested has committed a public offense may use objectively reasonable force to effect the arrest, to prevent escape, or to overcome resistance.
- (c) (1) Notwithstanding subdivision (b), a peace officer is justified in using deadly force upon another person only when the officer reasonably believes, based on the totality of the circumstances, that such force is necessary for either of the following reasons:
- (A) To defend against an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury to the officer or to another person.
- (B) To apprehend a fleeing person for any felony that threatened or resulted in death or serious bodily injury, if the officer reasonably believes that the person will cause death or serious bodily injury to another unless immediately apprehended. Where feasible, a peace officer shall, prior to the use of force, make reasonable efforts to identify themselves as a peace officer and to warn that deadly force may be used, unless the officer has objectively reasonable grounds to believe the person is aware of those facts.
- (2) A peace officer shall not use deadly force against a person based on the danger that person poses to themselves, if an objectively reasonable officer would believe the person does not pose an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury to the peace officer or to another person.
- (d) A peace officer who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from their efforts by reason of the resistance or threatened resistance of the person being arrested. A peace officer shall not be deemed an aggressor or lose the right to self-defense by the use of objectively reasonable force in compliance with subdivisions (b) and (c) to effect the arrest or to prevent escape or to overcome resistance. For the purposes of this subdivision, "retreat" does not mean tactical repositioning or other de-escalation tactics.
- (e) For purposes of this section, the following definitions shall apply:
- (1) "Deadly force" means any use of force that creates a substantial risk of causing death or serious bodily injury, including, but not limited to, the discharge of a firearm.
- (2) A threat of death or serious bodily injury is "imminent" when, based on the totality of the circumstances, a reasonable officer in the same situation would believe that a person has the present ability, opportunity, and apparent intent to immediately cause death or serious bodily injury to the peace officer or another person. An imminent harm is not merely a fear of future harm, no matter how great the fear and no matter how great the likelihood of the harm, but is one that, from appearances, must be instantly confronted and addressed.
- (3) "Totality of the circumstances" means all facts known to the peace officer at the time, including the conduct of the officer and the subject leading up to the use of deadly force.

POLICY AND PROCEDURE

A. <u>DEFINITIONS AND CONCEPTS</u>

- 1. IMMINENT THREAT OF DEATH OR SERIOUS BODILY INJURY A threat of death or serious bodily injury is "imminent" when, based on the totality of the circumstances, a reasonable officer in the same situation would believe that a person has the present ability, opportunity, and apparent intent to immediately cause death or serious bodily injury to the peace officer or another person. An imminent harm is not merely a fear of future harm, no matter how great the fear and no matter how great the likelihood of the harm, but is one that, from appearances, must be instantly confronted and addressed.
- 2. FEASIBLE Reasonably capable of being done or carried out under the totality of the circumstances to successfully achieve the lawful objective without increasing risk to the peace officer or another person.





- 3. TOTALITY OF THE CIRCUMSTANCES All facts known to, or perceived by, the peace officer at the time, including the conduct of the officer and the subject leading up to the UOF.
- 4. PROPORTIONALITY The balance of the severity of the offense committed, the threat to public safety and the level of force needed to overcome resistance based on the totality of the circumstances known to, or perceived by, the officer at the time.
- 5. DE-ESCALATION Taking action or communicating verbally or nonverbally during a potential force encounter in an attempt to stabilize the situation and reduce the immediacy of the threat so that more time, options, and resources can be called upon to resolve the situation without the UOF or with a reduction of the force necessary. De-escalation tactics include, but are not limited to, warnings, verbal persuasion, and tactical repositioning.
- 6. CRISIS INTERVENTION TECHNIQUES (CIT) A collaborative approach to safely and effectively address the needs of people with mental illnesses, link them to appropriate services, and divert them from the criminal justice system if appropriate. The primary goal of CIT is to improve peace officer and mental health consumer safety while reducing injuries to peace officers and consumers during law enforcement contacts. Crisis intervention techniques include using distance, time, verbal tactics, or other tactics to de-escalate a situation.
- 7. REACTIVE AUTHORITY- Pre-determined set of force directives given during a critical incident, provided by the Incident Commander or designee, regarding the type of force authorized to effect an arrest, overcome resistance, prevent escape, and/or to preserve life. The reactive authority shall be consistent with current policy and law.
- 8. PERSONAL BODY WEAPON (PBW) Improvised use of a part of a peace officer's body, including but not limited to the head, hands, arms, legs, and feet, as a weapon.
- 9. LEVELS OF RESISTANCE
 - a. COMPLIANT Subject offers no resistance.
 - b. PASSIVE NON-COMPLIANCE Subject does not respond to verbal commands but also offers no physical form of resistance.
 - c. ACTIVE RESISTANCE Subject uses evasive movements in an attempt to defeat a peace officer's attempt at control, including bracing, tensing, running away, verbally or physically signaling an intention to avoid or prevent being taken into or retained in custody.
 - d. ASSAULTIVE The subject is aggressive or combative; attempting to assault the peace officer or another person, verbally or physically displays an intention to assault the peace officer or another person.
 - e. LIFE-THREATENING The subject is taking action likely to result in serious bodily injury or death of the peace officer or another person.

10. FORCE DEFINITIONS

- a. REPORTABLE UOF Any UOF that causes injury as defined below; any UOF whether or not it results in injury, involving the discharge of a firearm, a canine bite, or use of an impact weapon, chemical agent, or CED; and any UOF, whether or not it results in injury, that deviates from the techniques taught and the equipment provided by the department (section G.4. & G.5.).
- b. LESS LETHAL FORCE- Any force that is not reasonably likely to cause death. Less lethal force options include, but are not limited to, the use of the CED, baton, chemical agents, 40mm projectiles, bean bag shotgun rounds, personal body weapons, and control holds.
- c. DEADLY FORCE Any use of force that creates a substantial risk of causing death or serious bodily injury, including, but not limited to, the discharge of a firearm.

11. INJURY DEFINITIONS

a. INJURY - Any visible bodily injury or complaint of bodily injury (non-visible injury) reasonably related to the UOF applied. This type of injury does not include the temporary pain associated with the proper application of control holds and/or restraints.





- SERIOUS BODILY INJURY- Bodily injury that involves a substantial risk of death, unconsciousness, protracted and obvious disfigurement, or protracted loss or impairment of the function of a bodily member or organ.
- 12. POSTITIONAL ASPHYXIA Situating a person in a manner that compresses their airway and reduces the ability to sustain adequate breathing. This includes, without limitation, the use of any physical restraint that causes a person's respiratory airway to be compressed or impairs the person's breathing or respiratory capacity, including any action in which pressure or body weight is unreasonably applied against a restrained person's neck, torso, or back, or positioning a restrained person without reasonable monitoring for signs of asphyxia.
- 13. RETALIATION Demotion, failure to promote to a higher position when warranted by merit, denial of access to training and professional development opportunities, denial of access to resources necessary for an officer to properly perform their duties, or intimidation, harassment, or the threat of injury while on duty of off duty.
- 14. INTERCEDE- For purposes of this policy, the term "intercede" includes, but is not limited to, physically stopping an excessive use of force, recording the excessive force, if equipped with a bodyworn camera, and documenting efforts to intervene, efforts to deescalate the offending officer's excessive use of force, and confronting the offending officer about the excessive force during the use of force; and if the offending officer continues, reporting to dispatch or the watch commander on duty and stating the offending officer's name, unit, location, time, and situation, in order to establish a duty for that officer to intervene.
- 15. EXCESSIVE FORCE- A level of force that is found to have violated Section 835a of the Penal Code, the requirements on the use of force required by this section, or any other law or statute, including Section 835a of the Penal Code and Section 7286 of the Government Code.
- 16. KINETIC ENERGY PROJECTILES- For purposes of this policy, the term "kinetic energy projectiles" means any type of device designed as less lethal, to be launched from any device as a projectile that may cause bodily injury through the transfer of kinetic energy and blunt force trauma. For purposes of this section, the term includes, but is not limited to, items commonly referred to as rubber bullets, plastic bullets, beanbag rounds, and foam tipped plastic rounds.
- 17. CHEMICAL AGENTS- For purposes of this policy, the term "chemical agents" means any chemical that can rapidly produce sensory irritation or disabling physical effects in humans, which disappear within a short time following termination of exposure. For purposes of this section, the term includes, but is not limited to, chloroacetophenone tear gas, commonly known as CN tear gas; 2-chlorobenzalmalononitrile gas, commonly known as CS gas; and items commonly referred to as pepper balls, pepper spray, or oleoresin capsicum.

B. DUTY TO INTERCEDE

- 1. If a peace officer observes another officer using force that is clearly beyond that which is necessary, as determined by an objectively reasonable officer under the circumstances, taking into account the possibility that other officers may have additional information regarding the threat posed by a subject, the peace officer shall intercede, when feasible to do so under the totality of the circumstances. If they do not do so, they shall be subject to discipline to the same severity as if they themselves engaged in the excessive force.
- Peace officers shall immediately report potential excessive force to a superior officer when present and observing another officer using force that the officer believes to be beyond that which is necessary, as determined by an objectively reasonable officer under the circumstances based upon the totality of information actually known to the officer.
- 3. Retaliation against a peace officer that reports a suspected violation of a law or regulation of another officer to a supervisor or IA is prohibited.

C. VERBAL WARNING





If feasible, and if doing so would not increase the danger to the peace officer or another person, the peace officer shall make every attempt to identify themselves and to issue a clear and comprehensible verbal warning before using any force that is likely to cause serious bodily injury or death, so that the subject(s) are given the opportunity to submit to the authority of the peace officer.

D. RENDERING MEDICAL AID

Peace officers on scene shall promptly render aid and/or summon medical assistance when reasonable and safe to do so pursuant to GO 522.02 (Emergency Care for Individuals Under Police Care or Control) when any UOF has resulted in any type of injury or death regardless of custody status.

E. <u>USE OF FORCE DURING AN ASSEMBLY, PROTEST, OR DEMONSTRATION</u>

- 1. Peace officers using kinetic energy projectiles or chemical agents during an assembly, protest, or demonstration shall ensure that such force is used pursuant to RM 532.11 (First Amendment Assembly Manual) and GO 580.12 (Less Lethal Munitions).
- 2. Peace officers shall only use kinetic energy projectiles or chemical agents during an assembly, protest, or demonstration if the use is objectively reasonable to defend against a threat of life or serious bodily injury to any individual, including a peace officer, or to bring an objectively dangerous and unlawful situation safely and effectively under control, and only in accordance with all of the following requirements:
 - a. De-escalation techniques or other alternatives to force have been attempted, when objectively reasonable, and have failed.
 - b. Repeated, audible announcements are made announcing the intent to use kinetic energy projectiles and chemical agents and the type to be used, when objectively reasonable to do so. The announcements shall be made from various locations, if necessary, and delivered in multiple languages, if appropriate.
 - c. Persons are given an objectively reasonable opportunity to disperse and leave the scene.
 - d. An objectively reasonable effort has been made to identify persons engaged in violent acts and those who are not, and kinetic energy projectiles or chemical agents are targeted toward those individuals engaged in violent acts. Projectiles shall not be aimed indiscriminately into a crowd or group of persons.
 - e. Kinetic energy projectiles and chemical agents are used only with the frequency, intensity, and in a manner that is proportional to the threat and objectively reasonable.
 - f. Officers shall minimize the possible incidental impact of their use of kinetic energy projectiles and chemical agents on bystanders, medical personnel, journalists, or other unintended targets.
 - g. An objectively reasonable effort has been made to extract individuals in distress.
 - h. Medical assistance is promptly provided, if properly trained personnel are present, or procured, for injured persons, when it is reasonable and safe to do so.
 - i. Kinetic energy projectiles shall not be aimed at the head, neck, or any other vital organs.
 - j. Kinetic energy projectiles or chemical agents shall not be used by any law enforcement agency solely due to any of the following:
 - (1) A violation of an imposed curfew.
 - (2) A verbal threat.
 - (3) Noncompliance with a law enforcement directive.
 - k. If the chemical agent to be deployed is tear gas, only a lieutenant or above at the scene of the assembly, protest, or demonstration may authorize the use of tear gas.

F. GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS GOVERNING USE OF FORCE

- 1. Any peace officer who has reasonable cause to believe that the person to be arrested has committed a public offense may use objectively reasonable force necessary to effect the arrest, to prevent escape, or to overcome resistance.
- 2. A peace officer who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from his efforts by reason of the resistance or threatened resistance of the person being arrested. A peace officer shall not be deemed an aggressor or lose his right to self-defense by the use of objectively reasonable force in





compliance with subsections E.1 and F.1-2 to effect the arrest or to prevent escape or to overcome resistance. For the purposes of this paragraph, "retreat" does not mean tactical repositioning or other deescalation tactics.

- 3. A peace officer shall consider the principles of proportionality in looking at the totality of the circumstances by weighing the severity of the offense, the reasonably perceived level of resistance and the need for apprehension prior to the utilization of force. A peace officer shall continually evaluate tactics when determining the appropriate UOF response.
- 4. The decision by a peace officer to use force shall be evaluated carefully and thoroughly, in a manner that reflects the gravity of that authority and the serious consequences of the use of force by peace officers, in order to ensure that officers use force consistent with law and department policies.
- 5. The decision by a peace officer to use force shall be evaluated from the perspective of a reasonable peace officer in the same situation, based on the totality of the circumstances known to or perceived by the officer at the time, rather than with the benefit of hindsight. The totality of the circumstances shall account for occasions when peace officers may be forced to make quick judgments about using force.
 - a. Circumstances of consideration may include, but are not limited to:
 - (1) The immediacy and severity of the perceived threat
 - (2) The conduct of the subject
 - (3) Officer versus subject factors such as age, size, relative strength, skill level, injuries sustained, level of exhaustion and number of peace officers available versus subjects
 - (4) The conduct of the involved peace officer
 - (5) The effects of drugs or alcohol
 - (6) The subject's apparent mental state or capacity
 - (7) The subject's apparent ability to understand and comply with officer commands
 - (8) The proximity or access of weapons to the subject
 - (9) The level of threat or resistance presented by the subject
 - (10) The availability of other reasonable and feasible options and their possible effectiveness
 - (11) The degree to which the subject has been effectively restrained and his/her ability to resist despite being restrained
 - (12) The seriousness of the subject offense or reason for contact with the subject
 - (13) The training and experience of the peace officer
 - (14) The potential for injury to peace officers, subjects or another person
 - (15) Whether the person appears to be resisting, attempting to evade arrest by flight, or is attacking the peace officer
 - (16) The risk and reasonably foreseeable consequences of escape or apparent attempt by the subject
 - (17) Prior contacts with the subject or awareness of any propensity for violence
 - (18) Environmental factors and/or other exigent circumstances
 - (19) The availability of other resources

Not all of the above factors may be present or relevant in a particular situation, and there may be additional factors not listed.

6. When using force, a peace officer should only use techniques and equipment that are approved by the department. Circumstances may arise in which a peace officer reasonably believes that it would be impractical or ineffective to use any of the tools, weapons or techniques provided by SPD. A peace officer may find it more effective or reasonable to improvise their response to rapidly unfolding conditions that they are confronting. In such circumstances, the peace officer may resort to using any objectively reasonable means of force. The use of any improvised device or method must nonetheless be objectively reasonable and utilized only to the degree that reasonably appears necessary to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.





- 7. When feasible, peace officers shall attempt to de-escalate situations.
- 8. When a peace officer reasonably believes they are dealing with a mentally ill, developmentally disabled, or an emotionally disturbed subject, the officer shall, if time and circumstances reasonably permit, utilize CIT.

F. CONSIDERATIONS GOVERNING USE OF DEADLY FORCE

- Notwithstanding subsection E.1, a peace officer is justified in using deadly force upon another person only as a last resort when reasonable alternatives have been exhausted or are not feasible and the officer reasonably believes, based on the totality of the circumstances, that such force is necessary for either of the following reasons:
 - a. To defend against an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury to the officer or to another person.
 - b. To apprehend a fleeing person for any felony that threatened or resulted in death or serious bodily injury, if the officer reasonably believes that the person will cause death or serious bodily injury to another unless immediately apprehended. Where feasible, a peace officer shall, prior to the use of force, make reasonable efforts to identify themselves as a peace officer and to warn that deadly force may be used, unless the officer has objectively reasonable grounds to believe the person is aware of those facts.
- 2. A peace officer shall not use deadly force against a person based on the danger that person poses to themselves, if an objectively reasonable officer would believe the person does not pose an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury to the peace officer or to another person.
- 3. A subject gaining control of one or more pieces of a peace officer's equipment, without the subject presenting an imminent threat of serious bodily injury or death, is not enough by itself to justify the use of deadly force.
- 4. A peace officer may discharge a firearm in the performance of their official duty:
 - a. Pursuant to Section F. 1.-4; or
 - b. At a firing range, pursuant to all safety rules and regulations; or
 - c. In order to stop a potentially aggressive animal, such as a dog, if the animal reasonably appears to pose an imminent threat of serious bodily injury or death to a peace officer or to another person and alternative methods are not feasible or would likely be ineffective.
 - (1) In circumstances where there is sufficient advance notice that a potentially dangerous animal may be encountered, department members should develop reasonable contingency plans for dealing with the animal (e.g., fire extinguisher, Conducted Energy Device, oleoresin capsicum (OC) spray, animal control peace officer). Nothing in this policy shall prohibit any member from shooting a dangerous animal if circumstances reasonably dictate that a contingency plan has failed or becomes impractical.
- 5. Firearms shall not be discharged as a warning.
- 6. Peace officers shall consider their surroundings and potential risks to bystanders and other peace officers to the extent reasonable under the circumstances, before discharging a firearm.
- 7. When a peace officers discharges or attempts to discharge a firearm while on or off duty, intentionally or accidentally, the employee shall immediately notify the on-duty watch commander. This does not include intentional discharges at a range or for recreational purposes (e.g., hunting, private target practice, or other similar activities).

G. PROHIBITED USES OF FORCE

- 1. Peace officers shall not use force:
 - a. By means of a carotid restraint, choke hold, or any other type of neck restraint.
 - b. Or utilize any transport methods that involve a substantial risk of positional asphyxia.
 - c. Against subjects who are not subject to arrest or detention, except to protect the officer or another person.
 - d. Against subjects who are handcuffed or otherwise restrained, except where the subject is actively resisting, attempting escape, or poses an imminent threat of harm to the peace officer, themselves or another person.





- e. For the sole purpose of preventing the exercise of first amendment rights, when a legitimate law enforcement purpose does not exist.
- f. For the sole purpose punishment or retaliation.
- g. To stop a subject from swallowing a substance that is already in their mouth.

H. VERBALIZATION DURING UNLAWFUL ASSEMBLY OR PROTEST

- 1. When feasible, peace officers should verbalize any use of force that is utilized during a mass protest/unlawful assembly. The following should be verbalized on body worn camera:
 - a. Location of where the use of force occurred
 - b. Type of force that was utilized
 - c. Reason for the use of force
 - d. Description of subject for whom the use of force was intended

I. FORCE OPTIONS

- Peace officers have a variety of force options available to them. Peace officers do not need to follow a
 continuum of force but shall select the UOF they deem appropriate for the circumstances, ensuring their
 UOF complies with the law, the provisions of this policy and any specific SPD policies or manuals
 governing the type of force they select to use.
- 2. Peace officers shall continue to assess their UOF selection and either transition to a different UOF option or discontinue a UOF based on their assessment, ensuring their UOF option remains reasonable for the circumstances.
- 3. Equipment for Sworn Peace Officers
 - a. Issued and required on person
 - (1) Firearm
 - (2) Conductive Energy Devices (CED)
 - (3) Impact weapons (Baton)
 - (4) Handcuffs
 - (5) Radio
 - (6) Oleoresin Capsicum (OC) spray
 - (7) Body Worn Camera (BWC)
 - (8) Flexible Body Armor
 - b. Issued and need to have readily available. This is not a complete list of other issued equipment:
 - (1) Less Lethal Shotgun (readily available in patrol vehicle)
 - (2) Patrol rifle (readily available in patrol vehicle and for qualified sworn personnel)
 - (3) Flashlight
 - (4) Gas Mask
 - (5) Ballistic Helmet
 - (6) Orange reflective vest
- 4. Required Equipment Issuance and UOF options for Non-Sworn Uniformed Department Personnel
 - a. Issued and required on duty belt:
 - (1) Oleoresin Capsicum (OC) spray
 - (2) Conductive Energy Devices (CED)
- 5. UOF Options for Sworn Peace Officers
 - a. The following is an alphabetical list of UOF options. This is not a complete list of options:
 - (1) Bola Wrap
 - (2) Chemical Agents
 - (3) Conductive Energy Devices (CED)
 - (4) Control Holds
 - (5) Discharge of Firearms and Other Deadly Force
 - (6) Impact Weapons (baton)
 - (7) Less Lethal Weapons Systems
 - (8) Personal Body Weapons





- (9) Pointing of a Firearm at a Person
- (10) Takedowns
- (11) Use of Canine
- (12) Verbal Commands/Instructions/Command Presence
- 6. UOF Options for Authorized, Non-Sworn Uniformed Personnel
 - a. Authorized non-sworn uniformed department personnel shall only use the CED or OC in immediate defense of themselves or another member of the department.
 - b. Authorized non-sworn uniformed department personnel who use the CED or OC in defense of themselves or another person shall:
 - (1) Attempt to get away from the situation as soon as possible.
 - (2) Call for code-3 assistance from sworn peace officers as soon as feasible.
- 7. The following is a list of SPD policies and manuals address specific UOF topics:
 - a. GO 522.02 (Emergency Care for Individuals Under Police Care or Control)
 - b. GO 580.03 (Use of Force Reporting, Investigations and Response)
 - c. GO 580.06 (De-escalation and Planned Response)
 - d. GO 580.04 (Firearms)
 - e. GO 580.10 (Use of the Conductive Energy Device (CED)
 - f. GO 580.12 (Less Lethal Weapons Systems)
 - g. GO 580.14 (Use of Canine)
 - h. RM 523.02 (Search and Handcuff Manual)
 - i. RM 532.09 (Arrest of Passive Resisters Manual)
 - j. RM 532.11 (Crowd and Riot Control Manual)
 - k. RM 580.07 (Chemical Agents Manual)
 - I. RM 580.08 (Baton Manual)

J. <u>USE OF PERSONAL BODY WEAPONS (PBWs)</u>

- 1. A peace officer may use PBWs to transition to a better position of advantage (i.e., positional change, handcuffing, etc.) to create distance/space, or overcome an assaultive subject.
- 2. When PBWs are used, peace officers must continually evaluate the ability to transition to a more advantageous position and/or recognize the signs of submission/compliance by the subject.
- 3. PBWs shall not be utilized against subjects solely engaging in passive non-compliance or merely active resistance.
- 4. PBWs should not be used on handcuffed persons unless they are exhibiting active aggression and/or to prevent subjects from harming themselves or another person.

K. USE OF A CONDUCTIVE ENERGY DEVICE (CED)

- 1. The CED shall be used pursuant to GO 580.10 (Use of the Conducted Energy Device).
- 2. A peace officer may deploy and use the CED under the following circumstances:
 - a. To incapacitate a subject whose conduct rises at least to the level of active resistance. This includes threats or pre-indicators leading up to assaultive or resistive behavior.
 - b. To incapacitate a suicidal subject who can't be safely controlled through crisis intervention techniques or other force options.
- 3. Peace officers shall avoid using the CED for more than a total of three (3) five-second cycles (15 seconds), unless the totality of the circumstances are such that a reasonable peace officer would conclude that each subsequent application of the CED, analyzed separately, is warranted by the imminent threat to the officer or another person.
- 4. CED deployment shall cease when the subject no longer poses an imminent threat of harm to the peace officer or another person.
- 5. The use of the CED is considered a serious UOF. Each individual cycle of the CED must be objectively reasonable under the circumstances.
- 6. The CED should not be used on handcuffed persons unless they are actively resisting or exhibiting active aggression and/or to prevent subjects from harming themselves or another person.





L. POINTING A FIREARM

- 1. Nothing in this policy shall preclude a peace officer from drawing of a firearm when the officer reasonably believes it necessary for the safety of the officer or another.
- 2. Detentions involving the pointing of a firearm at a person shall be entered into the Racial Identify Profiling Act database (RIPA) pursuant to GO 210.09.
- 3. The pointing of a firearm at a person shall be documented in the appropriate report, RIPA and on the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) call using the abbreviation "FPAP" (Firearm Pointed At Person).

M. MOVING VEHICLES

- 1. A peace officer shall make every reasonable effort to move out of the path of an approaching vehicle.
- 2. A peace officer shall make every reasonable effort to not intentionally place themselves in a position where a vehicle could be perceived as a threat to the officer.
- 3. Peace officers shall not discharge a firearm at or from a moving vehicle unless one of the following circumstances exists:
 - a. The peace officer reasonably believes that there is an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury to a peace officer or another person, by means other than the moving vehicle.
 - b. The peace officer reasonably believes that the driver is using or is attempting to use the vehicle as a means to cause imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury to the peace officer or another person.

N. <u>TRAINING</u>

- 1. At least annually, all sworn personnel shall receive training related to this agency's UOF policy and related legal updates for the following:
 - a. Legal standards for UOF
 - b. Duty to intercede
 - c. The use of objectively reasonable force
 - d. Supervisory responsibilities
 - e. UOF review and analysis
 - f. Guidelines for the use of deadly force
 - g. State required reporting
- 2. Additional regular and periodic training shall include:
 - a. Training standards and requirements relating to demonstrating knowledge and understanding of the law enforcement agency's UOF policy.
 - b. Training and guidelines regarding vulnerable populations, including, but not limited to, children, elderly persons, people who are pregnant, and people with physical, mental, and developmental disabilities.
 - c. Minimum training and course titles related to the objectives in the UOF policy include but are not limited to, the standards in Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) Learning Domain 20 (Use of Force), and the following:
 - (1) De-escalation and interpersonal communication training, including tactical methods that use time, distance, cover, and concealment, to avoid escalating situations that lead to violence.
 - (2) Implicit and explicit bias and cultural competency.
 - (3) Skills including de-escalation (crisis intervention) techniques to effectively, safely, and respectfully interact with people with disabilities or behavioral health issues.
 - (4) Alternatives to the use of deadly force and physical force, so that de-escalation tactics and less lethal alternatives are, where feasible, part of the decision-making process leading up to the consideration of deadly force. Enhancing a peace officer's discretion and judgment in using less lethal and deadly force in accordance with this policy.
 - (5) Mental health and policing, including bias and stigma.
 - (6) Using public service, including the rendering of first aid, to provide a positive point of contact between law enforcement peace officers and community members to increase trust and reduce conflicts.
 - (7) UOF scenario training including simulations of low-frequency, high-risk situations and calls for service, shoot-or-don't-shoot situations, and real-time force option decision making.





- 3. All UOF training provided to all sworn personnel shall be documented by the department.
- 4. Any officer that receives a sustained internal affairs complaint for excessive force will not be allowed to train any officer(s) for a period of three years from the date the complaint is substantiated. This includes:
 - a. Field training
 - b. In-service training
 - c. Academy instruction or evaluation
 - d. Roll Call presentations
- 5. Officers shall advise any supervisor that tasks him/her with a training assignment that they are not authorized to instruct, teach, or train. Failure to do so will be cause for discipline.
 - a. The officer is not obligated to go into detail about the prior incident or complaint as to why they cannot train other than to advise the supervisor that in accordance with applicable law they are not authorized to train at that time.

O. REPORTING

- 1. Supervisors Responsibilities. Upon notification of a reportable UOF, the peace officer's field supervisor shall:
 - a. Respond to the location of the arrest to ensure that a thorough investigation takes place. A thorough investigation into a UOF by a peace officer should include, but is not limited to, an area canvass (for witnesses, evidence and surveillance video), witness statements (which should be obtained by a supervisor or peace officers not involved in the UOF), subject statements, and photographs of the scene and any injuries. If the supervisor is unable to respond to the location of the arrest, the supervisor shall note the reasons why on the call.
 - b. Review the incident with the arresting peace officer and/or other officers.
 - c. Review all recordings (both audio and video) of the event, including In-Car Camera, Body Worn Camera video, and any available surveillance video).
 - d. Assess the appropriateness of the UOF and any charge(s) against the subject.
 - e. Consider arranging for other peace officers to transport and book the subject in the event the subject continues to display hostile, confrontational, or oppositional behavior toward the arresting officer(s).
 - f. A peace officer's field supervisor shall advise the watch commander of any incident involving UOF and initiate a management level review by making a tracking software entry whenever the following reportable UOF events occur:
 - (1) Any reportable UOF that results in the subject requiring a medical clearance (Fit for Incarceration report) prior to booking or, if the subject is not booked into jail or juvenile hall, any injury that would likely require a Fit for Incarceration report.
 - (2) Any reportable UOF, involving the discharge of a firearm, a canine bite, or the use of an impact weapon, chemical agent, or CED.
 - (3) Any reportable UOF that deviates from the techniques taught or the equipment provided by the department.
 - (4) Any UOF the supervisor or Watch Commander determines should be subject to a management level review.
 - g. The field supervisor shall enter the following information into the tracking software:
 - (1) peace officer(s) involved
 - (2) type of force used
 - (3) extent of injuries (if any) to the peace officer and/or subject
 - (4) supervisor's response or reason for no response
 - (5) any administrative actions taken by a supervisor or other managerial personnel
 - (6) all pertinent documents related to the incident (i.e. Red Border, Blue Border, Taser download, etc.)
 - h. Tracking software entries should be completed within 30 days of the incident date and routed in accordance to department procedure.





- (1) In cases where a firearm has been discharged or the UOF results in serious bodily injury or death, the tracking software entry shall be completed by FIT personnel.
- (2) All uses of force shall be categorized using the level of force definitions. (See Appendix #1.)
- P. DISCLOSURE OF PUBLIC RECORDS

The department will disclose public records pursuant to applicable law, including Penal Code Section 832.7.

Q. REPORTING TO THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

PSU shall submit statistical data regarding all qualifying officer-involved shootings and incidents involving UOF resulting in serious bodily injury is to be reported to the California Department of Justice (URSUS) as required by Government Code Section 12525.2.

R. COMPLIANCE

Any member of the public can submit a complaint to any member of the Department and in any form (i.e. in person, telephone, email, etc.). Once the complaint is received, it should be routed to the Internal Affairs Division in accordance with General Order 220.01 (Personnel Complaints).

S. LEGAL REFERENCES

- 1. California Penal Code Sections 196, 835a, 13652 and 13652.1.
- 2. California Government Code Sections 7286 and 12525.2.
- 3. GRAHAM V. CONNOR 490 U.S. 386 (1989) sets the legal standard for reasonable force. The court's decision "requires careful attention to the facts and circumstances of each particular case, including the severity of the crime at issue, whether the suspect poses an imminent threat to the safety of the officer or others, and whether he is actively resisting arrest or attempting to evade arrest by flight." In addition, "the 'reasonableness' of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on scene, rather than with 20/20 vision of hindsight... the question is whether the officers' actions are 'objectively reasonable' in light of the facts and circumstances confronting them."
- 4. TENNESSEE V. GARNER 471 U.S. 1 (1985) is a civil case in which the Supreme Court of the United States held that, under the Fourth Amendment, when a law enforcement officer is pursuing a fleeing suspect, the officer may not use deadly force to prevent escape unless "the officer has probable cause to believe that the suspect poses a significant threat of death or serious physical injury to the officer or others." It was found that use of deadly force to prevent escape is an unreasonable seizure under the Fourth Amendment, in the absence of probable cause that the fleeing suspect posed a physical danger.

580.06 De-Escalation and Planned Response 12-1-20

PURPOSE

The purpose of this order is to provide guidelines for interacting with those individuals who may be experiencing emotional or mental health crises.

POLICY

The Sacramento Police Department is committed to providing a consistently high level of service to all members of the community and recognizing that persons in crisis may benefit from intervention. It shall be the intent of the involved peace officer(s) to resolve an incident as safely as possible to protect the public and persons involved by reducing the danger through use of tactics, techniques, and force options. This is to ensure equitable and safe treatment of all involved. A peace officer shall employ de-escalation and crisis intervention techniques when feasible and when doing so does not increase the risk of harm to peace officers or another person. When making use of force decisions, a peace officer should be mindful that subjects may be physically or mentally incapable of responding to police commands due to a variety of circumstances including, but not limited to, alcohol or drugs, mental impairment, medical conditions, or language and cultural barriers. The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) values the sanctity of human life and the freedoms guaranteed by the United States and California Constitutions. Use of force (UOF) by peace officers is of important concern to the community. The role of law enforcement is to safeguard life, dignity, liberty of all persons, without prejudice to anyone. Peace officers shall carry out duties, including UOF, in a manner that is fair and unbiased.

PROCEDURE

A. DEFINTIONS

- 1. DE-ESCALATION Taking action or communicating verbally or nonverbally during a potential force encounter in an attempt to stabilize the situation, to decrease the likelihood of the need to use force, decrease the severity of any force required, reduce the immediacy of the threat so that more time, options, and resources can be called upon to resolve the situation with voluntary compliance. De-escalation techniques include, but are not limited to, gathering information, assessing risks, warnings, verbal and non-verbal persuasion, crisis intervention techniques, utilizing available resources (such as personnel and equipment), and tactical repositioning.
- 2. CRISIS INTERVENTION TECHNIQUES (CIT) A collaborative approach to safely and effectively addressing the needs of people with mental illnesses, linking them to appropriate services, and diverting them from the criminal justice system, if appropriate. The primary goal of CIT is to improve peace officer and mental health consumer safety while reducing injuries to peace officers and consumers during law enforcement contacts. Crisis intervention techniques include using distance, time, verbal tactics, or other tactics to de-escalate a situation.

B. **GENERAL**

 PLANNING – Peace officers should attempt to arrive at the scene with a coordinated approach based upon initial information and any pre-existing knowledge of the subject(s) or the involved parties. As additional information or factors become known to the peace officer, responding peace officers need to remain flexible and adapt to changing circumstances. Peace officers should attempt to isolate and contain subjects who are experiencing a crisis situation.





- 2. TIME Peace officers need to recognize that time is an essential element for de-escalation as it allows a peace officer the opportunity to communicate with the suspect, refine tactical plans and, if necessary, call for additional resources. Time can also provide an opportunity for the suspect to reconsider his/her actions and decisions, and aid in voluntary compliance.
- 3. ASSESSMENT- Peace officers should continually assess the situation as circumstances change and additional information is received. In the event of non-compliance demonstrated by the subject, peace officers should attempt to determine whether the lack of compliance is a deliberate attempt to resist or escape, or an inability to comprehend due to environmental, physical, cognitive, or other conditions. If the subject is unable to comprehend the situation, additional resources or tactical options may be needed to safely resolve the situation (i.e. infield mental health counselor or county clinician).
- 4. COMMUNICATE Peace officers should recognize that every situation is fluid and unique, therefore ongoing communication and coordination between peace officers is critically important for effective response. Communication between peace officers can improve decision making under tense circumstances and increase effectiveness of coordinated actions. Peace officers should consider using the following tactics:
 - a. Verbal warnings
 - b. Persuasion
 - c. Re-directing
 - d. Asking open-ended questions
 - e. Giving clear and direct orders that can be received and understood
 - f. Building rapport
 - g. Perspective taking (understanding the why)
 - h. Finding the meaning behind the words
 - i. Showing empathy





580.12 LESS LETHAL WEAPON SYSTEMS

2-19-2022

PURPOSE

This policy establishes guidelines for the use and deployment of various less lethal weapon systems.

POLICY

It shall be the policy of the Sacramento Police Department to deploy and use less lethal weapon systems as instructed in department training in order to maximize the safety of all individuals involved in an incident.

PROCEDURE

A. <u>DEFINITIO</u>NS

- 1. 12-GAUGE SUPER-SOCK® BEANBAG ROUND: A less lethal 2.4-inch 12-gauge shotgun round firing a ballistic fiber bag filled with 40 grams of lead shot at a velocity of 270-290 feet per second (FPS). CTS Supersock rounds are discharged from a dedicated 12-gauge shotgun that is distinguishable by an orange butt stock and fore grip. This round provides accurate and effective performance when fired from the approved distance of not fewer than five (5) feet. The maximum effective range of this munition is up to 75 feet from the target. The Model 2581 Super-Sock® is in its deployed state immediately upon exiting the barrel. It does not require a minimum range to "unfold" or "stabilize." The Super-Sock® is an aerodynamic projectile. However, accuracy is relative to the shotgun, barrel length, environmental conditions, and the operator. The Super-Sock® is very accurate. However, effectiveness depends on many variables, such as distance, clothing, stature, and the point where the projectile impacts.
- 2. PEPPERBALL (LIVE-X ROUND): A less lethal frangible .68 caliber sphere containing 2.5 grams of 2.5% PAVA powder (PAVA powder is a synthetic version of capsaicin or "OC," which is an irritant found in chili peppers). The pepperball is fired from purpose-built pepperball guns that are energized by a compressed air at 280-425 fps and delivers 8.85 -20.65ft/lbs. of kinetic energy on impact in addition to the dispersion of synthetic irritant. Pepperballs can be fired accurately and effectively to a distance of 164 feet.
- 3. PEPPERBALL (GLASS BREAKER): A solid nylon .68 caliber sphere. The Glass Breaker is fired at 280-325 FPS from purpose-built pepperball guns that are energized by compressed air. It delivers 0-30 ft/lbs of kinetic energy on impact. Glass Breakers can be fired accurately and effectively up to a distance of 30 feet. Glass Breaker rounds will be loaded into a yellow magazine.
- 4. 40MM EXACT IMPACT SPONGE (BLUE TIP): A less lethal 40mm lightweight plastic and foam projectile fired from a single or multi-round purpose built 40mm grenade launcher with a rifled barrel at 325 FPS. The 30-gram foam projectile delivers 120 ft/lbs. of energy on impact. The 40mm Exact Impact Sponge Round provides accurate and effective performance when fired from the approved distance of not less than five (5) feet and as far as 131 feet from the target.
- 5. 40MM DIRECT IMPACT OC (ORANGE TIP): A less lethal 40mm lightweight plastic and crushable foam projectile fired from a single or multi-round purpose-built 40mm grenade launcher with a rifled barrel at 295 FPS. The 39-gram crushable foam projectile delivers 120 ft/lbs of energy upon impact in addition to dispersion of 5 grams of OC irritant. The 40mm Direct Impact OC Round provides accurate and effective performance when fired from the approved distance of not less than five (5) feet and as far as 120 feet from the target.
- 6. COMBINED LESS LETHAL: The use of multiple less lethal force options in combination against a violent and/or resistive subject that would reduce the likelihood of further violence or the use of lethal force and allow officers a safer approach to take the subject into custody.

B. <u>AVAILABILITY</u>

1. Less lethal shotguns shall be secured in a weapon mounting system in police vehicles when not deployed. NOTE: Lethal shotgun ammunition shall not be loaded into dedicated less lethal





- shotguns.
- 2. Flexible baton rounds shall be available to all personnel trained in its use.
- 3. 40mm launchers, 40mm rounds as well as pepperball launchers and pepperball rounds shall be assigned to patrol teams and issued to individual officers by field supervisors.
- 4. Glass Breaker rounds shall only be loaded in yellow pepperball magazines. They will only be stored in watch commander vehicles and the Sacramento Police Department SWAT Van.
- 5. Less lethal weapon systems may be deployed by officers trained in their use.

C. DEPLOYMENT CRITERIA

- 1. Less lethal weapon systems are not a substitute for deadly force.
- 2. No officer shall simultaneously hold a lethal firearm and any less lethal weapon system launcher.
- 3. Each officer shall deploy no more than one less lethal weapon system at a time.
- 4. Officers shall not deploy a less lethal weapon system unless specific information reasonably indicates the potential for the system's use. The circumstances of each incident shall dictate the reasonableness for the deployment.
- 5. Pregnant women, young children and elderly people shall not be the intentional target(s) of a less lethal weapon system unless the use of the system is necessary and objectively reasonable under the circumstances.

D. PRE-DEPLOYMENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Personnel assigned a less lethal weapon system are responsible for maintaining the system's operational readiness.
- 2. When not in use, the less lethal weapon systems shall be stored unloaded in their issued case or vehicle locking device. Pepperball launchers shall not be energized with compressed air.
- 3. Less lethal weapon systems shall be locked in the vehicle during routine field assignments.
- 4. Pepperball air cylinders shall be maintained above 2500 PSI and shall be checked daily.

E. USE OF LESS LETHAL WEAPONS

- 1. Use of a less lethal weapon system shall be pursuant to department policies, in a manner that is consistent with department training, and current law.
- 2. Use of a less lethal weapon system shall be consistent with the manufacturer's guidelines and the approved department training plan.
- 3. When practical target zones shall be consistent with the manufacturer's guidelines and the approved department training. The head, neck, spine, heart or any other vital organs and groin should be avoided as target areas unless threat and circumstances justify their use.
- 4. When utilizing combined less lethal systems officers should be aware that nothing in this general order will relieve them of their responsibility to ensure that their application of force is consistent with existing law.
- 5. Situations for use of the less lethal weapon systems may include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Self-destructive, dangerous and/or combative individuals.
 - b. During assemblies, protests, or demonstrations, deployment shall be in accordance with Penal Code Section 13652.
 - c. Subjects that appear to be, physically unresponsive to a peace officer's commands when reasonably believed to be armed and/or dangerous. This allows officers a safer approach to provide medical aid, to take the subject into custody, and/or gain a tactical advantage.
 - d. Potentially vicious animals.
 - e. Training exercises or approved demonstrations.
- 6. When practical, prior to firing a less lethal weapon system, the discharging officer shall:
 - a. Loudly announce that a specified less lethal weapon system is going to be used.
 - b. Instruct the Communications Center to broadcast that a specified less lethal weapon system is to be used. The purpose of this notification is to alert all personnel that a less lethal weapon is being used.
- 7. Ammunition specifically designed for training only shall not be fired at a human being.





- 8. Glass Breaker Pepperball rounds are only to be used with watch commander approval. They are intended to be used on vehicles or residences for the purpose of breaking glass. However, these rounds may also be used to malfunction video cameras, break light bulbs, or other purposes.
- 9. Glass Breaker rounds shall not be used on people or animals.
- F. <u>USE OF FORCE DURING AN ASSEMBLY, PROTEST, OR DEMONSTRATION</u>

 Peace officers using kinetic energy projectiles or chemical agents during an assembly, protest or demonstration shall ensure that such force is used pursuant to RM 532.11 (First Amendment Assembly Manual).

G. <u>TACTICAL CONSIDERATIONS</u>

- 1. If possible, when a less lethal weapon system is to be utilized, a sufficient number of officers should be assembled to assist with the physical custody of the targeted subject. The number of additional officers and their responsibilities shall be dictated by the dynamics of the incident.
- 2. Unless extraordinary circumstances exist, consideration should be given to the following responsibilities:
 - a. Protection officer(s) a sufficient number of officers prepared to deliver appropriate force cover options given the immediate circumstances.
 - b. Custody officer(s) a sufficient number of officers who are responsible for handcuffing and restraining the subject(s).
- 3. Under exigent circumstances, nothing in this order shall prohibit an officer from deploying and discharging a less lethal weapon without requesting authorization or having the presence of additional officers.

H. RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. After a less lethal weapon system has been discharged and the subject has been restrained, officers shall:
 - a. Ensure that any injuries sustained are appropriately treated as outlined in:
 - (1) General Order 522.02 Emergency Care for Individuals Under Police Care or Control
 - (2) Reference Manual 580.07 Chemical Agents Manual (section C: First Aid)
 - (3) General Order 580.10 Use of the Conducted Energy Device (CED) (section G: Responsibilities After Use)
 - b. Immediately notify the sergeant supervising the district in which the discharge occurred. The officer shall also notify their immediate supervisor as soon as is practical.
 - c. Comply with the reporting requirements as outlined in the following policies:
 - (1) General Order 580.02 Use of Force
 - (2) General Order 240.03 Civil Liability

2. Supervisors shall:

- a. Respond to the scene of the incident.
- b. Ensure photographs are taken of the impact site(s), injuries, discharged projectile and any other evidence of significance.
- Comply with the use of force reporting requirements pursuant to General Order 580.02 Use
 of Force policy.
- d. Complete a City of Sacramento Incident/Loss Report form (RM-3 Red Border) when an injury or property damage has occurred.
- e. Notify the watch commander of the incident and circumstances.
- f. Ensure that all evidence, projectiles and expended cartridges are booked into the Evidence and Property Section. Expended pepperballs generally should not be booked.
- g. Ensure that all appropriate reports are completed before the end of watch.
- h. Replace any expended projectiles.

I. ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE

- 1. Any accidental discharge of a less lethal weapon system shall be immediately reported to the sergeant supervising the district in which the discharge occurred. The officer shall also notify their immediate supervisor as soon as is practical.
- 2. The circumstances of the accidental discharge shall be documented in a general offense report with the appropriate classification.





- 3. If a malfunction of the less lethal weapon system is suspected, the system and ammunition shall be given to the watch commander who will facilitate the inspection of the equipment by the department armorer.
- 4. The watch commander shall initiate a division investigation into the accidental discharge and forward the finding in memorandum format through the chain of command to the affected employee's Office Chief.





580.14 USE OF CANINES 6-27-22

PURPOSE

This policy establishes guidelines for the use of department canines to augment police services in the community including, but not limited to, locating suspects, contraband and apprehending criminal offenders.

POLICY

The Sacramento Police Department values the sanctity of human life and the freedoms guaranteed by the United States and California Constitutions. It is the policy of the Sacramento Police Department that canine handlers meet and maintain the appropriate proficiency to effectively and reasonably carry out legitimate law enforcement objectives pursuant to GO 580.02 Use of Force policy and GO 522.02 Emergency Care for Individuals in Police Care or Control policy.

PHILOSOPHY

The Sacramento Police Department's primary use of canines is to safely locate suspect(s) in areas that are difficult or dangerous to search, while preserving the handler's option to use minimal force or avoid force altogether, to apprehend and place the suspect into custody. Canines will be deployed based on the criteria listed in this policy. Nothing in this policy supersedes the Sacramento Police Department's Use of Force Policy to include de-escalation, proportionality, and or crisis intervention techniques.

The Sacramento Police Department primarily deploys canines utilizing voice commands from the handler as a method of control. Repeated notice on the presence of a canine and request to surrender are given during a deployment when possible. The canines are deployed for suspects wanted for violent felonies, specific felonies listed in this policy, other crimes where a suspect is fleeing and officers believe the suspect is armed with a weapon, or when a suspect is actively resisting arrest. The canine is used to search and locate a suspect(s). Should the suspect(s) surrender the canine will be called back by the handler. Should the suspect resist or continue to evade officers, the canine will engage the suspect and be called off as soon as safely possible by the handler.

PROCEDURE

A. DEFINITIONS

- 1. Canine handler Sworn members who have been POST trained and have attended the canine training school to be certified and qualified to perform all responsibilities of a canine handler.
- 2. Handler control methodology The training methodology employed by the department for both the canine and handler in which the handler demonstrates that they are able to maintain physical or verbal control over the actions of their canines.

B. GENERAL

1. Approval shall be obtained from a field supervisor prior to using a canine to search for, or apprehend, a suspect. Exception: A rapidly evolving situation that is within the deployment guidelines, but in which it is impractical to obtain supervisory approval.





NOTE: It is recognized that situations may arise that do not fall within the provisions set forth in this policy; in such a case, **a watch commander can use a standard of reasonableness to review the decision** to deploy a canine in view of the totality of circumstances.

- 2. Watch commanders shall notify the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant of any performance issues regarding handlers or canines.
- 3. Lethal force is not justified to protect a canine when the articulable threat is to the canine alone.

C. DEPLOYMENT GUIDELINES

The deployment of a canine shall be continuously re-evaluated during an incident to determine appropriateness of its use. During deployments when practical and safe to do so, the handler shall try to maintain visual sight, verbal control and/or have physical control of the canine.

- 1. Canines shall not be deployed for subjects in the following circumstances:
 - a. Infractions
 - b. Misdemeanor crimes not involving a weapon likely to cause serious bodily injury (such as simple assault, petty theft, vandalism, city code violations)
 - c. Mere flight from an officer unless one of the factors in C. 2. are present
 - d. Petty thefts that escalate to the level of a robbery due to the suspect's resistance towards the victim's efforts to stop the theft (absent actions resulting in great bodily injury (GBI) or a weapon being involved).
 - e. Stolen vehicles involving a named suspect or civil in nature such as a rental car non-return
 - f. Protest or crowd control situations
- 2. Canines can be deployed for suspects in the following circumstances:
 - a. Wanted for violent felonies (such as homicide, robberies, kidnapping, serious assaults, drive by shootings, sexual assaults)
 - b. Reasonable belief the person may be in possession of a weapon likely to cause serious bodily injury
 - c. Specific felony property crimes:
 - i. Burglaries
 - ii. Stolen vehicles (when factors in section C.1.e don't exist)
 - iii. Felony vehicle evading
 - d. Warrant service where any of the following are met:
 - i. Wanted for violent felony
 - ii. Has a violent criminal history
 - iii. Has a criminal history with firearms
 - iv. Has a criminal history of felony evasion or being physically assaultive towards law enforcement
 - e. Suspect is actively resisting arrest
- 3. When a canine has engaged a suspect, the handler shall direct the canine to release its hold as quickly as possible when the totality of the circumstances indicates the suspect is surrendering or when adequate resources are available to take the suspect safely into custody. Factors in assessing when a suspect is surrendering include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Suspect verbally surrenders
 - b. Suspect's hands can be seen and are not in possession of a weapon
 - c. Suspect physically complies (i.e., hands in the air, follows verbal commands or body language indicative of surrendering)





D. CONSIDERATIONS PRIOR TO DEPLOYMENT

Prior to the use of a department canine to search for or apprehend a suspect, the canine handler and/or supervisor at the scene shall consider all pertinent information reasonably available at the time. The information shall include, but is not limited to:

- 1. The suspect's age or an estimate thereof.
- 2. The nature of the suspected offense.
- 3. Any potential danger to the public and/or other officers at the scene if the canine is utilized.
- 4. The degree of resistance, if any, the suspect has shown.
- 5. The potential for escape or flight if the canine is not utilized.
- 6. The potential for injury to officers or the public caused by the suspect if the canine is not used.
- 7. Ability of suspect to understand and comprehend canine warnings to include mental health, language and other disabilities.
- 8. Having other less lethal force options available to aid the canine during a deployment.

E. BUILDING AND AREA SEARCHES

Whenever practical, a perimeter should be established before the canine is used for a building/area search. Canine officers shall:

- 1. If necessary, make search recommendations to the field supervisor.
- 2. Provide verbal warnings in a loud voice, or by use of amplified sound prior to releasing the canine:
 - a. Announce the presence of the canine unit.
 - b. Order the suspect out of hiding.
 - c. Warn the suspect that he or she may be bitten.
 - d. After allowing for a reasonable period of compliance, repeat the warning. If no response is received after again waiting for a reasonable period of compliance, the search may begin.
 - e. With the approval of the watch commander, the canine handler may omit or forgo canine warnings when exigent circumstances exist.
- 3. Repeat additional warnings when appropriate and safe to do so or when encountering structures where initial canine warnings may not have been heard. Supervisors and canine handlers should consider foregoing additional canine warnings when either of the following are present:
 - a. when there is increased risk to officer safety due to the reasonable belief the suspect (s) is armed with a weapon likely to cause great bodily injury
 - b. where the suspect (s) continues to elude officers during an area search based on the proximity of the canine
- 4. When a suspect is believed to be concealed in a specific area, e.g., a room, closet, or outbuilding, additional canine warnings shall be made indicating that specific location to allow the suspect an opportunity to surrender.
- 5. Officer should attempt to contact residents prior to utilizing a canine for yard searches. If a resident or responsible is unable to be contacted, then an additional canine warning shall be made by the handler prior to deploying the canine to search the backyard.
- 6. Advise Communications after initial warnings are given, and when possible, record on In Car Camera (ICC) and/or Body Worn Camera (BWC).
 - a. When feasible for area searches, verify the announcement could be heard by another officer on the perimeter opposite of the warning.
- 7. Notify communications and perimeter officers that the search has begun.
- 8. Maintain verbal control and frequent visual contact of the canine during the search.





F. CANINE OFFICERS

- 1. Canine officers shall:
 - a. Take a pro-active approach in dealing with priority calls, game plans, and attempt pickups where the use of a police canine would benefit the safety of the public and the officers involved.
 - b. When applicable, notify the field supervisor if there is a possibility of a potential canine deployment within that supervisor's area of responsibility.
- 2. Canine officers should not:
 - a. Be assigned to handle routine report calls.
 - b. Be dispatched to misdemeanor calls; i.e., 415s, 5150s, 901s, or traffic control.

G. CANINE SERGEANT

- 1. Intentional Apprehensions
 - a. The canine Sergeant shall be notified as soon as practical regarding the apprehension and the circumstances of the call.
 - b. The canine Sergeant shall review all pertinent reports, in-car camera video and body worn camera video related to the canine apprehension.
 - c. Based on the review, the canine Sergeant may go over the incident with the handlers but will not determine any policy findings pending outcome from the Use of Force committee.

2. Unintentional Bite

- a. The canine Sergeant shall:
 - i. be notified as soon as possible of any unintentional apprehension.
 - ii. respond to the scene when possible.
 - iii. notify the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant.
 - iv. review all pertinent in-car camera video and body worn camera video related to the apprehension.
 - v. coordinate with the Professional Standards Unit and the Metro Command to determine if a field settlement agreement is appropriate based on the totality of the incident.
 - vi. identify any training lessons learned from the incident and address with the handler and canine unit for educational and training purposes after concurrence by the Metro Captain that no policy violations need to be addressed.
 - vii. ensure a report and a red border form (RM3) is completed.
 - viii. document findings in a memorandum to the Deputy Chief of Office of Specialized Services.

H. CARE OF CANINE AND EQUIPMENT

- 1. Canine officers shall:
 - a. Be responsible for the health and welfare of the canine, ensuring that the canine receives the proper nutrition, grooming, training, medical care, and living conditions.
 - b. Not expose the canine to any foreseeable and unreasonable risk of harm, unless required by a particular application.
 - c. Maintain department canine equipment under their control in a clean and serviceable condition.
 - d. Permit the canine unit sergeant to conduct on-site inspections of affected areas of the residence to verify that conditions and equipment conform to this policy. The canine unit sergeant shall minimally provide 24-hour notice prior to the inspection.





- e. Report to the canine unit sergeant any changes in living status that may affect the lodging or environment of the canine.
- f. Report any injury or illness of the canine to the canine unit sergeant.
- g. Advise the canine unit sergeant prior to taking their canine to the veterinarian for a routine examination or for minor medical problems.
- h. Take the canine to the nearest available veterinarian if the canine is seriously injured or requires immediate medical attention. The canine unit sergeant shall be notified as soon as time permits.

I. TRAINING

- 1. Prior to assignment in the field, each canine team shall:
 - a. Be trained and certified to meet POST standards.
 - b. Receive training as defined in the current contract with the department canine training provider.
 - c. Conduct all canine training while on duty unless otherwise approved by the canine sergeant.
 - d. Demonstrate an understanding and ability to use the handler control methodology, including the ability to control the canine both physically and with verbal commands.

J. CROSS TRAINED CANINES

- 1. Canines trained in more than one discipline shall assist with investigations as directed by the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant.
- 2. Cross trained canine teams shall meet POST certifications.
- 3. Narcotics and firearm detection canines shall:
 - a. Assist in the search for narcotics or firearms during a search warrant service.
 - b. Search vehicles, buildings, and any other articles deemed necessary.
 - c. Not be used to search a person.
- 4. Explosives detection canines shall:
 - a. Assist in the search of a location where a bomb threat has been established. NOTE: Prior to responding, credibility of the threat shall be assessed.
 - b. Conduct preventive searches at locations such as special events, dignitary visits and restricted areas.
 - c. Not be used to clear a suspicious package.
 - d. Not be used to search a person.
 - e. Narcotics, article and explosive searches do not require verbal warnings prior to deployment.
- 5. SWAT deployment canines:
 - a. Shall be used in SWAT operations. NOTE: Only canine teams that have received specialized training and the approval from the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant will be utilized in this capacity.
 - b. Shall participate in bi-annual training with the SWAT team.

K. OUTSIDE AGENCY ASSISTANCE

Upon request from an outside agency for the assistance of a department canine, the following conditions shall be met:

- 1. The Communications Division shall:
 - a. Obtain all necessary information including location, type of incident, suspect description, contact person, etc.
 - b. Notify the watch commander.





- 2. The watch commander will respond to the request, taking into consideration personnel availability, the availability of the requesting agency's canine, and whether the need for the canine is consistent with department policy.
- 3. Prior to deployment, the canine officer will ensure that the use of the canine is within department policy.
- 4. Following a reportable injury caused by canine use of force, the nearest district sergeant or assigned field supervisor shall follow the supervisor's reporting procedures and responsibilities pursuant to GO 580.02 (Use of Force), including the completion of a tracking software entry.

L. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR INJURIES INFLICTED BY A CANINE UPON AN INTENDED SUSPECT AT THE DIRECTION OF THE HANDLER</u>

Canine officers shall:

- 1. Ensure first aid is rendered pursuant to (GO 522.02 Emergency Care for Individuals under Police Care or Control).
- Notify the district sergeant, who shall follow the supervisor's reporting procedures and
 responsibilities pursuant to GO 580.02 (Use of Force), including the completion of a tracking
 software entry.
- 3. Obtain a statement from the intended suspect or witnesses relevant to the use of the canine when possible.
- 4. Notify CSI for photos of suspect's injury(ies). If CSI is unavailable, notify the district sergeant for photographs.
- 5. Complete appropriate reports detailing the incident including documentation of warnings issued prior to the deployment of the canine when applicable.
- 6. Complete a red border form (RM 3).

M. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR INJURIES INFLICTED BY A CANINE UPON AN UNINTENDED</u> INDIVIDUAL

Canine officers shall:

- 1. Ensure first aid is rendered pursuant to (GO 522.02 Emergency Care for Individuals under Police Care or Control).
- 2. Notify the watch commander and canine sergeant.
- 3. Ensure an attempt was made to obtain a statement from the individual who was unintentionally injured by the canine or witness(es) relevant to the use of the canine when possible.
- 4. Notify CSI for photos of victim's injury(ies). If CSI is unavailable, notify the district sergeant and request they respond for photographs.
- 5. The canine sergeant will coordinate with the Professional Standards Unit and the Metro Command to determine if a field settlement agreement is appropriate based on the totality of the incident.
- 6. Complete appropriate reports or department memorandum detailing the incident, including circumstances that led or contributed to the unintended bite.
- 7. Complete a City of Sacramento Workers' Compensation form WC001 (first report of injury form) if a City employee is the unintended individual.
- 8. Complete a red border form (RM 3).

N. ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW

- 1. The canine unit sergeant shall:
 - a. Review all incidents in which a department canine injures any person. This does not replace or circumvent the Use of Force committee.





- b. Notify the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant of any deployment or training issues.
- c. When applicable, implement corrective and/or preventative action for any training, equipment, or canine issues that have been discovered as a result of the review. Any corrective actions should be approved by the Metro Captain so there is no conflict based on the Use of Force committees recommendations.
- d. Maintain a record, cross referenced by officer, on all injuries involving department canines for a period of five (5) years from the date of injury.
- 2. The Metro Captain and the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant shall:
 - a. Review all incidents in which a department canine injures any person.
 - b. Review the Blue Team entry, making a determination as to the appropriateness of the use of the canine.
 - c. The deployment is then brought before the Use of Force Committee to determine whether the incident is within policy.





580.12 LESS LETHAL WEAPON SYSTEMS 2-19-2022

PURPOSE

This policy establishes guidelines for the use and deployment of various less lethal weapon systems.

POLICY

It shall be the policy of the Sacramento Police Department to deploy and use less lethal weapon systems as instructed in department training in order to maximize the safety of all individuals involved in an incident.

PROCEDURE

A. DEFINITIONS

- 1. 12-GAUGE SUPER-SOCK ® BEANBAG ROUND: A less lethal 2.4-inch 12-gauge shotgun round firing a ballistic fiber bag filled with 40 grams of lead shot at a velocity of 270-290 feet per second (FPS). CTS Supersock rounds are discharged from a dedicated 12-gauge shotgun that is distinguishable by an orange butt stock and fore grip. PEPPERBALL (LIVE-X ROUND): A less lethal frangible .68 caliber sphere containing 2.5 grams of 2.5% PAVA powder (PAVA powder is a synthetic version of capsaicin or "OC," which is an irritant found in chili peppers). The pepperball is fired from purpose-built pepperball guns that are energized by a compressed air at 280-425 fps and delivers 8.85 -20.65ft/lbs. of kinetic energy on impact in addition to the dispersion of synthetic irritant. Pepperballs can be fired accurately and effectively to a distance of
- 3. PEPPERBALL (GLASS BREAKER): A solid nylon .68 caliber sphere. The Glass Breaker is fired at 280-325 FPS from purpose-built pepperball guns that are energized by compressed air. It delivers 0-30 ft/lbs of kinetic energy on impact. Glass Breakers can be fired accurately and effectively up to a distance of Glass Breaker rounds will be loaded into a yellow magazine.
- 4. 40MM EXACT IMPACT SPONGE (BLUE TIP): A less lethal 40mm lightweight plastic and foam projectile fired from a single or multi-round purpose built 40mm grenade launcher with a rifled barrel at 325 FPS. The 30-gram foam projectile delivers 120 ft/lbs. of energy on impact. The 40mm Exact Impact Sponge Round provides accurate and effective performance when fired from the approved distance of not less than and as far as a from the target.
- 5. 40MM DIRECT IMPACT OC (ORANGE TIP): A less lethal 40mm lightweight plastic and crushable foam projectile fired from a single or multi-round purpose-built 40mm grenade launcher with a rifled barrel at 295 FPS. The 39-gram crushable foam projectile delivers 120 ft/lbs of energy upon impact in addition to dispersion of 5 grams of OC irritant. The 40mm Direct Impact OC Round provides accurate and effective performance when fired from the approved distance of not less than and as far as a from the target.
- 6. COMBINED LESS LETHAL: The use of multiple less lethal force options in combination against a violent and/or resistive subject that would reduce the likelihood of further violence or the use of lethal force and allow officers a safer approach to take the subject into custody.

B. <u>AVAILAB</u>ILITY

1. Less lethal shotguns shall be secured in a weapon mounting system in police vehicles when not deployed. NOTE: Lethal shotgun ammunition shall not be loaded into dedicated less lethal shotguns.





- 2. Flexible baton rounds shall be available to all personnel trained in its use.
- 3. 40mm launchers, 40mm rounds as well as pepperball launchers and pepperball rounds shall be assigned to patrol teams and issued to individual officers by field supervisors.
- 4. Glass Breaker rounds shall only be loaded in yellow pepperball magazines. They will only be stored in watch commander vehicles and the Sacramento Police Department SWAT Van.
- 5. Less lethal weapon systems may be deployed by officers trained in their use.

C. DEPLOYMENT CRITERIA

- 1. Less lethal weapon systems are not a substitute for deadly force.
- 2. No officer shall simultaneously hold a lethal firearm and any less lethal weapon system launcher.
- 3. Each officer shall deploy no more than one less lethal weapon system at a time.
- 4. Officers shall not deploy a less lethal weapon system unless specific information reasonably indicates the potential for the system's use. The circumstances of each incident shall dictate the reasonableness for the deployment.
- 5. Pregnant women, young children and elderly people shall not be the intentional target(s) of a less lethal weapon system unless the use of the system is necessary and objectively reasonable under the circumstances.

D. PRE-DEPLOYMENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Personnel assigned a less lethal weapon system are responsible for maintaining the system's operational readiness.
- 2. When not in use, the less lethal weapon systems shall be stored unloaded in their issued case or vehicle locking device. Pepperball launchers shall not be energized with compressed air.
- 3. Less lethal weapon systems shall be locked in the vehicle during routine field assignments.
- 4. Pepperball air cylinders shall be maintained above 2500 PSI and shall be checked daily.

E. <u>USE OF LESS LETHAL WEAPONS</u>

- 1. Use of a less lethal weapon system shall be pursuant to department policies, in a manner that is consistent with department training, and current law.
- 2. Use of a less lethal weapon system shall be consistent with the manufacturer's guidelines and the approved department training plan.
- 3. When practical target zones shall be consistent with the manufacturer's guidelines and the approved department training. The head, neck, spine, heart or any other vital organs and groin should be avoided as target areas unless threat and circumstances justify their use.
- 4. When utilizing combined less lethal systems officers should be aware that nothing in this general order will relieve them of their responsibility to ensure that their application of force is consistent with existing law.
- 5. Situations for use of the less lethal weapon systems may include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Self-destructive, dangerous and/or combative individuals.
 - During assemblies, protests, or demonstrations, deployment shall be in accordance with Penal Code Section 13652.
 - c. Subjects that appear to be, physically unresponsive to a peace officer's commands when reasonably believed to be armed and/or dangerous. This allows officers a safer approach to provide medical aid, to take the subject into custody, and/or gain a tactical advantage.
 - d. Potentially vicious animals.
 - e. Training exercises or approved demonstrations.
- 6. When practical, prior to firing a less lethal weapon system, the discharging officer shall:
 - a. Loudly announce that a specified less lethal weapon system is going to be used.
 - b. Instruct the Communications Center to broadcast that a specified less lethal weapon system is to be used. The purpose of this notification is to alert all personnel that a less lethal weapon is being used.
- 7. Ammunition specifically designed for training only shall not be fired at a human being.





- 8. Glass Breaker Pepperball rounds are only to be used with watch commander approval. They are intended to be used on vehicles or residences for the purpose of breaking glass. However, these rounds may also be used to malfunction video cameras, break light bulbs, or other purposes.
- 9. Glass Breaker rounds shall not be used on people or animals.
- F. <u>USE OF FORCE DURING AN ASSEMBLY, PROTEST, OR DEMONSTRATION</u>
 Peace officers using kinetic energy projectiles or chemical agents during an assembly, protest or demonstration shall ensure that such force is used pursuant to RM 532.11 (First Amendment Assembly Manual).

G. TACTICAL CONSIDERATIONS

- 1. If possible, when a less lethal weapon system is to be utilized, a sufficient number of officers should be assembled to assist with the physical custody of the targeted subject. The number of additional officers and their responsibilities shall be dictated by the dynamics of the incident.
- 2. Unless extraordinary circumstances exist, consideration should be given to the following responsibilities:
 - a. Protection officer(s) a sufficient number of officers prepared to deliver appropriate force cover options given the immediate circumstances.
 - b. Custody officer(s) a sufficient number of officers who are responsible for handcuffing and restraining the subject(s).
- 3. Under exigent circumstances, nothing in this order shall prohibit an officer from deploying and discharging a less lethal weapon without requesting authorization or having the presence of additional officers.

H. RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. After a less lethal weapon system has been discharged and the subject has been restrained, officers shall:
 - a. Ensure that any injuries sustained are appropriately treated as outlined in:
 - (1) General Order 522.02 Emergency Care for Individuals Under Police Care or Control
 - (2) Reference Manual 580.07 Chemical Agents Manual (section C: First Aid)
 - (3) General Order 580.10 Use of the Conducted Energy Device (CED) (section G: Responsibilities After Use)
 - b. Immediately notify the sergeant supervising the district in which the discharge occurred. The officer shall also notify their immediate supervisor as soon as is practical.
 - c. Comply with the reporting requirements as outlined in the following policies:
 - (1) General Order 580.02 Use of Force
 - (2) General Order 240.03 Civil Liability

2. Supervisors shall:

- a. Respond to the scene of the incident.
- b. Ensure photographs are taken of the impact site(s), injuries, discharged projectile and any other evidence of significance.
- c. Comply with the use of force reporting requirements pursuant to General Order 580.02 Use of Force policy.
- d. Complete a City of Sacramento Incident/Loss Report form (RM-3 Red Border) when an injury or property damage has occurred.
- e. Notify the watch commander of the incident and circumstances.
- f. Ensure that all evidence, projectiles and expended cartridges are booked into the Evidence and Property Section. Expended pepperballs generally should not be booked.
- g. Ensure that all appropriate reports are completed before the end of watch.
- h. Replace any expended projectiles.

I. ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE

- 1. Any accidental discharge of a less lethal weapon system shall be immediately reported to the sergeant supervising the district in which the discharge occurred. The officer shall also notify their immediate supervisor as soon as is practical.
- 2. The circumstances of the accidental discharge shall be documented in a general offense report with the appropriate classification.





- 3. If a malfunction of the less lethal weapon system is suspected, the system and ammunition shall be given to the watch commander who will facilitate the inspection of the equipment by the department armorer.
- 4. The watch commander shall initiate a division investigation into the accidental discharge and forward the finding in memorandum format through the chain of command to the affected employee's Office Chief.





580.14 USE OF CANINES 6-27-22

PURPOSE

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POLICY

The Sacramento Police Department values the sanctity of human life and the freedoms guaranteed by the United States and California Constitutions. It is the policy of the Sacramento Police Department that canine handlers meet and maintain the appropriate proficiency to effectively and reasonably carry out legitimate law enforcement objectives pursuant to GO 580.02 Use of Force policy and GO 522.02 Emergency Care for Individuals in Police Care or Control policy.

PHILOSOPHY

The Sacramento Police Department's primary use of canines is to safely locate suspect(s) in areas that are difficult or dangerous to search, while preserving the handler's option to use minimal force or avoid force altogether, to apprehend and place the suspect into custody. Canines will be deployed based on the criteria listed in this policy. Nothing in this policy supersedes the Sacramento Police Department's Use of Force Policy to include de-escalation, proportionality, and or crisis intervention techniques.

The Sacramento Police Department primarily deploys canines utilizing voice commands from the handler as a method of control. Repeated notice on the presence of a canine and request to surrender are given during a deployment when possible. The canines are deployed for suspects wanted for violent felonies, specific felonies listed in this policy, other crimes where a suspect is fleeing and officers believe the suspect is armed with a weapon, or when a suspect is actively resisting arrest. The canine is used to search and locate a suspect(s). Should the suspect(s) surrender the canine will be called back by the handler. Should the suspect resist or continue to evade officers, the canine will engage the suspect and be called off as soon as safely possible by the handler.

PROCEDURE

A. DEFINITIONS

- Canine handler Sworn members who have been POST trained and have attended the canine training school to be certified and qualified to perform all responsibilities of a canine handler.
- Handler control methodology The training methodology employed by the department for both the canine and handler in which the handler demonstrates that they are able to maintain physical or verbal control over the actions of their canines.

B. GENERAL

 Approval shall be obtained from a field supervisor prior to using a canine to search for, or apprehend, a suspect. Exception: A rapidly evolving situation that is within the deployment guidelines, but in which it is impractical to obtain supervisory approval.





NOTE: It is recognized that situations may arise that do not fall within the provisions set forth in this policy; in such a case, <u>a watch commander can use a standard of reasonableness to review the decision</u> to deploy a canine in view of the totality of circumstances.

2. Watch commanders shall notify the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant of any performance issues regarding handlers or canines.

3.

C. DEPLOYMENT GUIDELINES

The deployment of a canine shall be continuously re-evaluated during an incident to determine appropriateness of its use. During deployments when practical and safe to do so, the handler shall try to maintain visual sight, verbal control and/or have physical control of the canine.

- 1. Canines shall not be deployed for subjects in the following circumstances:
 - a. Infractions
 - b. Misdemeanor crimes not involving a weapon likely to cause serious bodily injury (such as simple assault, petty theft, vandalism, city code violations)
 - c. Mere flight from an officer unless one of the factors in C. 2. are present
 - d. Petty thefts that escalate to the level of a robbery due to the suspect's resistance towards the victim's efforts to stop the theft (absent actions resulting in great bodily injury (GBI) or a weapon being involved).
 - e. Stolen vehicles involving a named suspect or civil in nature such as a rental car non-return
 - f. Protest or crowd control situations
- 2. Canines can be deployed for suspects in the following circumstances:
 - a. Wanted for violent felonies (such as homicide, robberies, kidnapping, serious assaults, drive by shootings, sexual assaults)
 - Reasonable belief the person may be in possession of a weapon likely to cause serious bodily injury
 - c. Specific felony property crimes:
 - i. Burglaries
 - ii. Stolen vehicles (when factors in section C.1.e don't exist)
 - iii. Felony vehicle evading
 - d. Warrant service where any of the following are met:
 - i. Wanted for violent felony
 - ii. Has a violent criminal history
 - iii. Has a criminal history with firearms
 - iv. Has a criminal history of felony evasion or being physically assaultive towards law enforcement
 - e. Suspect is actively resisting arrest
- 3. When a canine has engaged a suspect, the handler shall direct the canine to release its hold as quickly as possible when the totality of the circumstances indicates the suspect is surrendering or when adequate resources are available to take the suspect safely into custody. Factors in assessing when a suspect is surrendering include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Suspect verbally surrenders
 - b. Suspect's hands can be seen and are not in possession of a weapon
 - c. Suspect physically complies (i.e., hands in the air, follows verbal commands or body language indicative of surrendering)

D. CONSIDERATIONS PRIOR TO DEPLOYMENT

Prior to the use of a department canine to search for or apprehend a suspect, the canine handler and/or supervisor at the scene shall consider all pertinent information reasonably available at the time. The information shall include, but is not limited to:

- The suspect's age or an estimate thereof.
- 2. The nature of the suspected offense.
- 3. Any potential danger to the public and/or other officers at the scene if the canine is utilized.
- 4. The degree of resistance, if any, the suspect has shown.
- 5. The potential for escape or flight if the canine is not utilized.
- 6. The potential for injury to officers or the public caused by the suspect if the canine is not used.
- Ability of suspect to understand and comprehend canine warnings to include mental health, language and other disabilities.
- 8. Having other less lethal force options available to aid the canine during a deployment.

E. BUILDING AND AREA SEARCHES

Whenever practical, a perimeter should be established before the canine is used for a building/area search. Canine officers shall:

- 1. If necessary, make search recommendations to the field supervisor.
- 2. Provide verbal warnings in a loud voice, or by use of amplified sound prior to releasing the canine:
 - a. Announce the presence of the canine unit.
 - b. Order the suspect out of hiding.
 - c. Warn the suspect that he or she may be bitten.
 - d. After allowing for a reasonable period of compliance, repeat the warning. If no response is received after again waiting for a reasonable period of compliance, the search may begin.
 - e. With the approval of the watch commander, the canine handler may omit or forgo canine warnings when exigent circumstances exist.
- 3. Repeat additional warnings when appropriate and safe to do so or when encountering structures where initial canine warnings may not have been heard. Supervisors and canine handlers should consider foregoing additional canine warnings when either of the following are present:
 - a. when there is increased risk to officer safety due to the reasonable belief the suspect (s) is armed with a weapon likely to cause great bodily injury
 - b. where the suspect (s) continues to elude officers during an area search based on the proximity of the canine

5. Officer should attempt to contact residents prior to utilizing a canine for yard searches. If a resident or responsible is unable to be contacted, then an additional canine warning shall be made by the

- 6. Advise Communications after initial warnings are given, and when possible, record on In Car Camera (ICC) and/or Body Worn Camera (BWC).
 - a. When feasible for area searches, verify the announcement could be heard by another officer on the perimeter opposite of the warning.
- 7. Notify communications and perimeter officers that the search has begun.

handler prior to deploying the canine to search the backyard.

8. Maintain verbal control and frequent visual contact of the canine during the search.





F. CANINE OFFICERS

- 1. Canine officers shall:
 - a. Take a pro-active approach in dealing with priority calls, game plans, and attempt pickups where the use of a police canine would benefit the safety of the public and the officers involved.
 - When applicable, notify the field supervisor if there is a possibility of a potential canine deployment within that supervisor's area of responsibility.
- Canine officers should not:
 - a. Be assigned to handle routine report calls.
 - b. Be dispatched to misdemeanor calls; i.e., 415s, 5150s, 901s, or traffic control.

G. CANINE SERGEANT

- 1. Intentional Apprehensions
 - a. The canine Sergeant shall be notified as soon as practical regarding the apprehension and the circumstances of the call.
 - b. The canine Sergeant shall review all pertinent reports, in-car camera video and body worn camera video related to the canine apprehension.
 - c. Based on the review, the canine Sergeant may go over the incident with the handlers but will not determine any policy findings pending outcome from the Use of Force committee.

2. Unintentional Bite

- a. The canine Sergeant shall:
 - i. be notified as soon as possible of any unintentional apprehension.
 - ii. respond to the scene when possible.
 - iii. notify the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant.
 - iv. review all pertinent in-car camera video and body worn camera video related to the apprehension.
 - coordinate with the Professional Standards Unit and the Metro Command to determine if a field settlement agreement is appropriate based on the totality of the incident.
 - vi. identify any training lessons learned from the incident and address with the handler and canine unit for educational and training purposes after concurrence by the Metro Captain that no policy violations need to be addressed.
 - vii. ensure a report and a red border form (RM3) is completed.
 - viii. document findings in a memorandum to the Deputy Chief of Office of Specialized Services.

H. CARE OF CANINE AND EQUIPMENT

- 1. Canine officers shall:
 - a. Be responsible for the health and welfare of the canine, ensuring that the canine receives the proper nutrition, grooming, training, medical care, and living conditions.
 - b. Not expose the canine to any foreseeable and unreasonable risk of harm, unless required by a particular application.
 - c. Maintain department canine equipment under their control in a clean and serviceable condition.
 - d. Permit the canine unit sergeant to conduct on-site inspections of affected areas of the residence to verify that conditions and equipment conform to this policy. The canine unit sergeant shall minimally provide 24-hour notice prior to the inspection.





- e. Report to the canine unit sergeant any changes in living status that may affect the lodging or environment of the canine.
- f. Report any injury or illness of the canine to the canine unit sergeant.
- g. Advise the canine unit sergeant prior to taking their canine to the veterinarian for a routine examination or for minor medical problems.
- h. Take the canine to the nearest available veterinarian if the canine is seriously injured or requires immediate medical attention. The canine unit sergeant shall be notified as soon as time permits.

I. <u>TRAINING</u>

- 1. Prior to assignment in the field, each canine team shall:
 - a. Be trained and certified to meet POST standards.
 - Receive training as defined in the current contract with the department canine training provider.
 - c. Conduct all canine training while on duty unless otherwise approved by the canine sergeant.
 - d. Demonstrate an understanding and ability to use the handler control methodology, including the ability to control the canine both physically and with verbal commands.

J. CROSS TRAINED CANINES

- Canines trained in more than one discipline shall assist with investigations as directed by the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant.
- 2. Cross trained canine teams shall meet POST certifications.
- 3. Narcotics and firearm detection canines shall:
 - a. Assist in the search for narcotics or firearms during a search warrant service.
 - b. Search vehicles, buildings, and any other articles deemed necessary.
 - c. Not be used to search a person.
- 4. Explosives detection canines shall:
 - a. Assist in the search of a location where a bomb threat has been established. NOTE: Prior to responding, credibility of the threat shall be assessed.
 - b. Conduct preventive searches at locations such as special events, dignitary visits and restricted areas.
 - c. Not be used to clear a suspicious package.
 - d. Not be used to search a person.
 - e. Narcotics, article and explosive searches do not require verbal warnings prior to deployment.
- 5. SWAT deployment canines:
 - a. Shall be used in SWAT operations. NOTE: Only canine teams that have received specialized training and the approval from the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant will be utilized in this capacity.
 - Shall participate in bi-annual training with the SWAT team.

K. OUTSIDE AGENCY ASSISTANCE

Upon request from an outside agency for the assistance of a department canine, the following conditions shall be met:

- 1. The Communications Division shall:
 - a. Obtain all necessary information including location, type of incident, suspect description, contact person, etc.
 - b. Notify the watch commander.





- The watch commander will respond to the request, taking into consideration personnel availability, the availability of the requesting agency's canine, and whether the need for the canine is consistent with department policy.
- 3. Prior to deployment, the canine officer will ensure that the use of the canine is within department policy.
- 4. Following a reportable injury caused by canine use of force, the nearest district sergeant or assigned field supervisor shall follow the supervisor's reporting procedures and responsibilities pursuant to GO 580.02 (Use of Force), including the completion of a tracking software entry.

L. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR INJURIES INFLICTED BY A CANINE UPON AN INTENDED SUSPECT AT THE DIRECTION OF THE HANDLER</u>

Canine officers shall:

- Ensure first aid is rendered pursuant to (GO 522.02 Emergency Care for Individuals under Police Care or Control).
- Notify the district sergeant, who shall follow the supervisor's reporting procedures and responsibilities pursuant to GO 580.02 (Use of Force), including the completion of a tracking software entry.
- 3. Obtain a statement from the intended suspect or witnesses relevant to the use of the canine when possible.
- 4. Notify CSI for photos of suspect's injury(ies). If CSI is unavailable, notify the district sergeant for photographs.
- 5. Complete appropriate reports detailing the incident including documentation of warnings issued prior to the deployment of the canine when applicable.
- 6. Complete a red border form (RM 3).

M. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR INJURIES INFLICTED BY A CANINE UPON AN UNINTENDED INDIVIDUAL</u>

Canine officers shall:

- Ensure first aid is rendered pursuant to (GO 522.02 Emergency Care for Individuals under Police Care or Control).
- 2. Notify the watch commander and canine sergeant.
- 3. Ensure an attempt was made to obtain a statement from the individual who was unintentionally injured by the canine or witness(es) relevant to the use of the canine when possible.
- 4. Notify CSI for photos of victim's injury(ies). If CSI is unavailable, notify the district sergeant and request they respond for photographs.
- The canine sergeant will coordinate with the Professional Standards Unit and the Metro Command to determine if a field settlement agreement is appropriate based on the totality of the incident.
- 6. Complete appropriate reports or department memorandum detailing the incident, including circumstances that led or contributed to the unintended bite.
- 7. Complete a City of Sacramento Workers' Compensation form WC001 (first report of injury form) if a City employee is the unintended individual.
- 8. Complete a red border form (RM 3).

N. ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW

- 1. The canine unit sergeant shall:
 - a. Review all incidents in which a department canine injures any person. This does not replace or circumvent the Use of Force committee.





- b. Notify the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant of any deployment or training issues.
- c. When applicable, implement corrective and/or preventative action for any training, equipment, or canine issues that have been discovered as a result of the review. Any corrective actions should be approved by the Metro Captain so there is no conflict based on the Use of Force committees recommendations.
- d. Maintain a record, cross referenced by officer, on all injuries involving department canines for a period of five (5) years from the date of injury.
- 2. The Metro Captain and the Metro Special Operations Section Lieutenant shall:
 - a. Review all incidents in which a department canine injures any person.
 - b. Review the Blue Team entry, making a determination as to the appropriateness of the use of the canine.
 - c. The deployment is then brought before the Use of Force Committee to determine whether the incident is within policy.

On 1/3/2022 at approximately 0228 hrs I, Officer Hernandez #714 (1A34) responded to the area of Old Sacramento to assist in locating a subject who had brandished a knife and had threatened to stab security. I arrived in the area at approximately 0232 hrs. I was assigned to the Patrol Division and am also assigned to the Crisis Negotiations Team (CNT) as an ancillary duty. I was driving a marked Sacramento Police Vehicle and wearing Sacramento Police uniform. My body worn camera was on and activated during this incident. The following is a summary of my observations:

An update was put out by Officer Kammerer #554 that he confirmed that the suspect was on Tower Bridge. At approximately 0243 hrs, I arrived on scene and observed a subject (later identified as Skandar Alam) holding onto the outside railing of the bridge with both his feet and his arms. ALAM also had an object that appeared to be a knife in his right hand as he was holding on to the rails.

Officer Kammerer was attempting to make contact with the subject and I asked to take over communications with him due to my training in CNT. I began to communicate with ALAM who appeared very angry and erratic.

Throughout my contact with ALAM, he expressed multiple times that he would not comply, wanted to be left alone, and verbally stated that we (police) needed to "end" it. ALAM did not want to drop the knife. ALAM would communicate with me but initially would also focus his attention on other officer's and would ramble about various topics. I attempted to build rapport with him and asked what we could do to get him to comply. ALAM was very hesitant to receive any offer but did ask for water and food was requested for him. ALAM was explained that water would be brought with him by officer's with a shield and dropped off by the sidewalk. ALAM was ensured that no one would grab him but we needed him to drop the knife.

A water bottle was dropped off near him and ALAM came over to the other side of the rail and onto the sidewalk.

My communication continued with ALAM and his behavior would range from being calmer, pacing around, and being agitated. At one point, ALAM pulled out what appeared to be a meth pipe and began to smoke it.

A plan was formulated to get him to drop the knife and walk eastbound towards West Sacramento. See main report for details. At approximately 0452 hrs, I gave commands to ALAM to stop as he began to flee towards the river.

At this point, ALAM was standing near a ledge close to the river. ALAM was instructed to come towards me (up the levee), with nothing in his hands, and was reminded that police were not going anywhere because he was under arrest. Negotiations continued and ALAM continued to make statements such as, "No" and "You're going to have to shoot me".

At 0535 hrs, Sergeant Trejo #3003 took over communications with ALAM and attempted to make contact with him.

While another plan was being formulated, I was no longer in communication with ALAM and deactivated my camera to save battery.

Once plans were starting to be put in place, I noticed that my camera was completely off and did not have power.

I reengaged with the subject at approximately 0655 hrs and gave him commands to surrender or force would be used. Between each less lethal force that was used, I gave ALAM orders to surrender. ALAM did not comply and made no effort to surrender. ALAM was verbally warned that force continue to be used. ALAM was also verbally advised that he would be bitten by the K9 before the K9 was deployed. Enough time was given for ALAM to comply and ALAM did not. The K9 was deployed on ALAM.

Once ALAM was handcuffed and walked up the levee, I took a photograph (using my department issued phone and later uploaded to Axon) of the secondary knife that ALAM had dropped onto the bowl that was on top of the post he was holding onto and secured it. Officer's conducted a search and emptied out ALAM's pockets. I later collected ALAM's personal items and noted a black sheath and a green cigarette box containing a plastic baggie with a large crystal substance, which based on my experience is methamphetamine.

I gave ALAM's items to Officer Guglielmelli #202 and advised him that the second knife, black sheath, and methamphetamine were evidence. I later tested the methamphetamine with a Nartec testing kit, which came back presumptive positive. Officer Guglielmellii advised me that the methamphetamine weighed 12.48 grams. See Officer Guglielmellii's supplement for details.

On 01-03-22, at approximately 0214hrs SPD dispatch received a call regarding a person experiencing homelessness who brandished a knife and threatened a valet employee. I was working as the supervisor for district 6 and was temporarily covering district 3 while Sgt. Gresham focused on a call that lead his units to respond outside of the city limits.

I was dressed in full police uniform and driving a marked black and white patrol vehicle. I was equipped with a body worn camera which was activated upon arriving on this call and turned off once I was no longer engaged.

As I was responding to the call I hear updates that the suspect had been located on the Tower Bridge, that he was still agitated and armed with the knife. Officers were on scene initiating contact with the suspect and providing updates on the police radio.

I arrived on scene and confirmed that the suspect was standing on the outside of the north rail of the Tower Bridge, closest to the West Sacramento side. Officers continued to give the suspect commands to comply, drop the knife, and come back over the rail.

Officers confirmed with the victim that there was a good 422 PC and 245 PC against the suspect. While officers were talking to him the suspect stated a previous address in West Sacramento, which was relayed to WSPD and they were able to confirm his identity as Skandar Alam. We also learned that he had two outstanding warrants (1 felony and 1 misdemeanor). He was also a registered 290 who was exhibiting signs of being under the influence of narcotics.

Due to the circumstances and elements surrounding S-Alam location, I decided to start developing a plan to detain or prevent him from moving further into the center of the bridge, where the river has fast moving, high rise, cold water. The plan was to gain voluntary compliance, to get him back over on safe ground, and to prevent him from moving closer to the center of the bridge.

After a while of talking to S-Alam and him being non-compliant, it was decided that luring him away from the sidewalk and into the middle of the roadway where we could take him into custody. There were designated (combined) less lethal, lethal, and voice. K-9 unit was set up to the south and an arrest team was designated. S-Alam started walking westbound on the sidewalk, ignored commands and eventually made it to the river walk area. Officers approached but he made it to the river bank and edge of the water.

Sgt. Gresham, Sgt. Trejo, and Sgt. Bean took over the lead on the assignment regarding the call. I returned to the Tower Bridge to monitor my designated area and manage any details related to the outer perimeter.

I was not actually involved in the ultimate plan of apprehending S-Alam.

On Tuesday January 03, 2023 at approximately 1313 hours, Officer Madsen #421 and I (Officer Ryder #828) responded to the Sutter General Hospital Emergency Room to transport suspect Alam SKANDAR to Sacramento County Main Jail. I arrived at Sutter Hospital at approximately 1338 hours. My body worn camera was activated for the duration of this investigation. I observed the following in summary:

Officer Mabunga #300 advised that he rode with the paramedics earlier in the morning to transport SKANDAR to the hospital. Officer Mabunga advised that he had been waiting at the hospital for SKANDAR to be medically cleared for incarceration. Officer Mabunga advised that CSI Hill responded to Sutter General and photographed SKANDAR's injuries. SKANDAR was medically cleared at approximately 1338 hours. I took custody of SKANDAR and transported him to Sacramento County Main Jail.

Once at jail, CSI Bolla and Gunther responded and photographed SKANDARS injuries (see CSI supplement for further details).

I requested a bail enhancement for \$200,000 which was approved by Judge Lewis.

SKANDAR was booked at Sacramento County Main Jail, without further incident, for the following charges:

On Tuesday 01/03/23, I (Ofc. Ricci #302) was working routine patrol as 1A23 wearing a full police uniform and driving a marked patrol vehicle. At approximately 0222 hours, I was dispatched to 1006 4th St regarding a disturbance with a weapon. Per the text of the call, a person experiencing homelessness was brandishing a knife and threatening a valet. Officers who were already on scene advised that the subject was still armed with the knife, acting erratically, ignoring their commands and walking away from them. I arrived in the area at approximately 0230 hours. My body worn camera was activating and recording for the duration of the investigation. I observed the following in summary:

At the time of my arrival, officers who were already on scene had advised that they had lost sight of the suspect as he entered the tunnel connecting downtown Sacramento to Old Sacramento. I assisted units with searching Old Sacramento for the suspect. A short time later, an officer advised over the radio that they had located the subject walking westbound on Tower Bridge towards West Sacramento.

Myself and additional officers responded to the Tower Bridge. I observed the suspect, later identified as Skandar ALAM, standing on the outside of the north side of the bridge, hanging on to the railing. Myself and additional officers set up a contact team while on the bridge. 1SM6 Sgt. Martinez responded to the scene and assigned me to provide less lethal cover for the contact team with my department issued 12-gauge bean bag shotgun (serial #D508516M) that was loaded with SuperSock bean bag rounds. 1SM6 Sgt. Martinez verbally authorized the lines of demarcation to all officers on scene.

I remained in cover behind a marked patrol vehicle while other officers continued to engage ALAM in conversation in an attempt to deescalate him. During this time I observed ALAM to be holding a knife in his right hand and refusing officers commands to drop the knife. ALAM eventually climbed back over the railing and stood on the pedestrian walkway on the north side of the bridge.

I observed that ALAM was still armed with the knife. At approximately 0320 hours, 1SM2 Sgt. Bean advised me that I would be part of a secondary contact team tasked with delivering ALAM a bottle of water. I placed my department issued bean bag shotgun back in my vehicle and grabbed my department issued shield. Using the shield, I assisted officers in approaching the area in which ALAM was standing so that 1SM2 Sgt. Bean could place a water bottle on the pedestrian walkway near ALAM.

After this movement was completed, I returned the shield to my patrol vehicle, and re-deployed my department issued bean bag shotgun. I again took cover behind a marked patrol vehicle. I observed that ALAM picked up the water bottle and appeared to place the knife into one of his pockets.

1SM6 Sgt. Martinez and additional supervisors on scene devised a plan to deliver ALAM some food in order to coerce him into walking westbound on the bridge towards West Sacramento. The food was placed in the roadway approximately 50 yards to the west of ALAM. 1SM6 Sgt. Martinez verbally authorized the new lines of demarcation to all officers on scene. 1SM6 Sgt. Martinez advised that if ALAM would voluntarily drop his knife, he would be allowed to walk westbound toward the first line of demarcation, where he would be given commands to be taken into custody. If ALAM refused to comply with officers commands, combined less lethal and use of canine would be authorized.

Officers continued to engage ALAM in dialogue. At approximately 0450 hours, I observed ALAM place his knife on the ground next to him and begin walking westbound on the bridge. I, along with all other units involved in the contact team, began to make our way westbound to contact ALAM and take him into custody. At this time ALAM began running westbound on the bridge, and then made a northbound turn and began running north on the bike trail on the west side of the river. ALAM ran down a flight of stairs and stopped once he was at the river's edge.

Officers continued to speak with ALAM in order to de-escalate him so that he could be safely taken into custody. At this time I heard ALAM advise multiple times that he was not going to be taken in to custody peacefully. Myself and other units assigned to the contact team backed away from the flight of stairs while officers continued to talk to ALAM from a distance. Officers on scene advised that ALAM was now armed with a cheese cutting knife.

A new plan was designed to take ALAM into custody. 1SM5 Sgt. Trejo verbally authorized the new lines of demarcation to all officers on scene. 1SM5 Sgt. Trejo advised that if ALAM were to walk up the flight of stairs to the first landing and try to flee, combined less lethal was authorized if given the "impact" command.

At approximately 0657 hours, I was instructed to move with the contact team down the first flight of stairs to ALAM. As we made our way down the flight of stairs, I observed that ALAM had armed himself with the knife. I made my way with the contact team down the next flight of stairs. At this time, 1SM5 Sgt. Trejo gave the "impact" command for combined less lethal. I discharged one SuperSock bean bag round from my department issued bean bag shotgun, striking ALAM in the torso. I then observed ALAM retreat behind a large decorative flower pot which he used as cover. I observed ALAM drop the knife into the flower pot.

I was then directed to move further down the stairs towards ALAM. 1SM5 Sgt. Trejo then gave another "impact" command for combined less lethal. I discharged one SuperSock bean bag round from my department issued bean bag shotgun, striking ALAM in the lower back.

I observed ALAM fall into the water behind him. I assisted officers on scene with pulling ALAM out of the river and detaining him in handcuffs. I assisted officers in walking ALAM up the embankment towards fire personnel who were on scene.

On 1-3-2023 at approx 02:20 hours, while on patrol in a marked Police K9 vehicle and in full Police uniform, I, Officer Phelan #927 and my K9 partner Shep responded to the intersection of 4th Street and J Street regarding a report of a subject brandishing a knife and threatening security personnel downtown. Prior to my arrival Officer Kammerer #554 and Officer Yee #709 advised that they had located the suspect (later identified as Skandar Alam) and that Alam was armed with a knife with a six inch blade. Officer Kammerer advised that Alam had brandished the knife at Officers. Officer Kammerer then broadcasted that Alam was running away from him on foot and Officer Yee advised he lost sight of Alam as he ran into the Old Sacramento riverfront area. I arrived on scene at approx. 02:27 hours, I observed the following in summary:

Upon my arrival Officer Kammerer advised that Alam was wearing a black jacket and dark pants. Officer Kammerer contacted the complainant (downtown security Personnel) and confirmed that Alam was wanted for a fresh violation of 245 PC (assault with a deadly weapon) with a knife. Officer Vito #825 located Alam walking away from the scene westbound on Capitol Mall Drive across the Tower Bridge into West Sacramento. Officer Kammerer, Officer Yee and I responded to Officer Vito's location. Officer Kammerer confirmed that the subject located by Officer Vito was the suspect on the call.

When I arrived on the Tower Bridge suspect Alam was hanging off the outside of the hand railing attached to the north side of the bridge. Alam still had a fixed blade knife with a blade approximately 6 inches in length in his right hand. Alam was pointing the knife at Officers and making statements similar to "you're all going to see how this ends", "get the fuck out of here", and "leave me alone". Alam also had a large black duffle bag in his possession.

West Sacramento PD units arrived on scene and recognized Alam from prior contacts and provided Sacramento Police Officers with his identifying information.

A Web KPF records check indicated that Alam had an active NO BAIL felony arrest warrant (Warrant # 3457355) for narcotics possession (11377 H&S) and an active NO BAIL misdemeanor arrest warrant (Warrant #3457357) for failing to update his sex offender registration information (290.018 PC). Web KPF also revealed that Alam had a violent criminal history including

Sergeant Bean, Sergeant Martinez, Sergeant Gresham, Sergeant Trejo and Lieutenant Connor all responded to the call. Sergeant Bean and Officer Hernandez #714 attempted to deescalate the situation with Crisis Negotiation Tactics for approximately two hours. Despite multiple requests, Alam refused to put down the knife.

After continued efforts by CNT units Alam agreed to put down the knife in exchange for some food. Sergeant Trejo placed a bag of food on the west side of the bridge in an attempt to get Alam to walk off the bridge to a safer location. Alam put down the knife and walked to the west end of the bridge. As units began to move closer to Alam, he fled on foot northbound down the embankment on the north side of the bridge to the water line of the Sacramento River approximately 75 yards north of the Tower Bridge.

The Sacramento River water level was very high due to a recent storm. The bottom steps that led down the River walkway to the water line were fully submersed in water. Alam took a position on top of a curb above the last step that was protruding from the River. There were several large trees protruding from the water approx. 15 to 20 yards from the bank directly behind Alam.

Sergeant Bean and Officer Hernandez again attempted to de-escalate the situation and gain compliance from Alam with Crisis Negotiation tactics for an additional two hours, but Alam refused to cooperate and walk back to Officers away from the water. Sergeant Bean and other Officers on scene gave multiple announcements to Alam advising that if he did not comply he was going to get bit by a Police Canine. Alam then presented another knife (a small butter knife with a blade approx. 4 inches in length) that he had concealed on his person and refused to cooperate.

Due to the fact that Alam had reintroduced another edge weapon, Sergeant Trejo and Lieutennat Connor formulated a contact team compromised with multiple less lethal options, a shield and my K9 partner Shep. Sergeant Trejo, myself, and other members of the contact team advanced down the river walkway steps toward Alam. Alam was given multiple commands to surrender and to drop the knife, but he refused to comply. Sergeant Trejo directed a unit on the contact team to deploy pepperball. Alam was impacted with multiple pepperball rounds, but refused to comply. Sergeant Trejo then gave the IMPACT command for combined less lethal. Alam was impacted with multiple pepperball, less lethal bean bag impact rounds, and 40mm impact rounds. As Alam was struck with combined less lethal impact rounds he dropped the knife and took cover behind a large cement flower pot. Alam was hanging onto the pot above the water in a crouched position utilizing the cement pot to shield himself from Officers and impact rounds. At this time I attempted to de-escalate the incident by giving a K9 warning in an attempt to get Alam to surrender. I gave a loud verbal K9 warning to Alam informing him that he needed to comply or he was going to be bit by a Police K9. A secondary volley of combined less lethal impact rounds were fired, but were ineffective because Alam was using the large cement Pot as a shield. Sergeant Trejo then directed me to apprehend Alam with my K9 partner Shep.

At this time I directed K9 Shep to apprehend suspect Alam based on the following facts known to me at the time:

- -Alam was wanted for 245 PC (Assault with a deadly weapon), 417.8 PC (brandishing a weapon at a Peace Officer), and 148 (a)(1) PC (resisting arrest) along with his outstanding warrants
- -Alam was refusing to comply with Officers despite multiple requests to surrender, and K9 admonishments, showing a high level of commitment and resistance to being detained in violation of 148(a)(1) PC
- -Alam had already shown high a level of resistance by his willingness to flee from Officers and to hang off the side of a bridge to avoid capture
- -Alam posed a threat to pedestrians and passerbys if he was not detained
- -Alam had not been searched for additional weapons after already presenting two knifes at Officers
- -Alam was within an arm's reach of the knife he had just dropped and his bag that had not yet been searched for additional weapons
- -There were no other means of less lethal force other than K9 available to Officers on scene that would be viable or effective in this incident

- -Other less lethal devices had already been utilized and proved to be ineffective
- -Alam presented a substantial Officer safety concern by refusing to give up his position by the water. I was in fear that if Officers attempted to go hands on, that Alam may pull Officers into the water or that Officers may lose their footing
- -I believed that if Alam was not apprehended by K9 Shep that he may swim out into the river and take a position in one of the trees protruding from the water placing Officers tasked with detaining Alam in an even more dangerous position
- -The use of K9 in this situation would help enhance the safety of Officers tasked with apprehending Alam on scene

I gave K9 Shep the command to apprehend Alam. I had dawned K9 Shep with a ballistic vest attached to a long leash to prevent Alam from pulling K9 Shep into the water. As K9 Shep approached Alam, Alam attempted to move to the opposite side of the cement pot to avoid capture. K9 Shep apprehended Alam on his left calf, pulling Alam down from the cement steps. Alam and K9 Shep fell into the River, causing K9 Shep to let go of Alam. Alam then attempted to swim away from K9 Shep. I commanded K9 shep again to apprehend Alam. K9 Shep apprehended Alam on his left forearm. I utilized the long leash to pull Alam and K9 Shep back to the cement steps where he was taken into custody by the contact team.

Alam suffered multiple punctures and two avulsions on his left calf along with multiple punctures and two avulsions on his left forearm consistent with injuries one would sustain from a K9 apprehension.

Sacramento Fire Dept Personnel were requested to stage on scene prior to taking Alam into custody. Sacramento Fire Dept Personnel treated Alam's injuries on scene and transported him to Sutter General Medical facility (2801 L Street) where he was later cleared medically fit for incarceration.

SPD CSI was requested to respond to the scene for photographs and to the hospital to photograph Alam's injuries.

My body worn camera and my in car camera were activated and recording during this investigation.

Sergeant Martinez, Sergeant Trejo, Sergeant Bean, Sergeant Gresham, Sergeant Thompson, Sergeant Brown, Lieutenant Villegas and Lieutenant Connor were on scene of the call and aware of the call details.

It should be noted that this report is a summary of the incident. For exact or specific details please see my body worn camera.

On 1/3/2023 I, Sergeant Gresham #3010, was dressed in full SPD uniform, was equipped with a body worn camera, and was driving a marked patrol vehicle. I was working as a patrol supervisor (1SM3) assigned to district 3, which is the area of downtown Sacramento.

At approximately 0214 hours I was in Elverta, California, which is in the County of Sacramento. I was conducting followup on an unrelated call with 1A31 Officer James Summey. While I was in Elverta Sergeant C. Martinez was the primary supervisor for district 3 until I was clear the follow up call and I I returned to the City of Sacramento. At this time, I was monitoring the radio channel for District 3 and heard a broadcast for this weapons call. Shortly after the broadcast I completed my follow up and responded to the call. I arrived onscene on the Tower Bridge at approximately 0325 hours and activated my body worn camera.

Upon my arrival I observed that a contact team had been formed and S-Alam was standing against the northern pedestrian railing of the Tower Bridge. I met with Sergeant Martinez and Lieutenant Conner who provided me with an update on the call.

Crises Negation Team (CNT) Officer Hernandez, Sergeant Trejo (1SM5), and Sergeant Bean (1SM2) were all onscene. Officer Hernandez was the primary negotiator and was speaking with S-Alam. CNT was attempting to deescalate S-Alam.

S-Alam was very agitated, was not complying with Officer's orders to surrender, and was verbally telling Officer's he did not want to surrender, that he wanted food, and that he wanted to leave. A plan was established and communicated to Officers on scene. The plan was that if S-Alam dropped the knife we would be told he can walk westbound across the bridge into West Sacramento. Carrying out this plan would get S-Alam away from the railing of the bridge which leads to the Sacramento River. It should be noted that the City of Sacramento was having storms and the waterline of the river was high. Getting S-Alam off of the bridge would provide additional safety to S-Alam and the contact team. Once S-Alam was off of the bridge Officers were going to give commands to S-Alam and have him surrender. If the suspect did not surrender a command to deploy force up to and including combined less lethal may be given.

We began implementing our plan at approximately 0450 hours we implemented our plan. S-Alam dropped the knife and began walking westbound on Capitol Ave. Commands were given to S-Alam to surrender at the end bridge. S-Alam did not comply and fled northbound on the river walk in West Sacramento. S-Alam continued to flee to the riverbank at the bottom of a concrete stairway. The contact team followed him and contained him at the riverbank.

Officers maintained containment on S-Alam while CNT continued attempts to de-escalate him. Officers observed that S-Alam had a cutting instrument initially thought to be scissors and later identified as a cheese knife.

I tasked 1SM6 Sergeant Trejo as the team leader of our contact team at the riverbank.

CNT instructed S-Alam to discard the knife and to surrender to officers. S-Alam advised that if he did not, he could be subject to a use of force. CNT relayed to me that S-Alam stated that he would not comply and

that officers need to shoot him in the head.

Sergeant Trejo developed a plan to apprehend the suspect which included less lethal pepper ball deployment, combined less lethal deployment with pepper ball, 40mm baton rounds, bean bag rounds, and the use of K9. Sergeant Trejo briefed the contact team on the plan.

West Sacramento Fire Department boat 41 and SPD Marine 1 (boat) responded to our location and staged in the water for an emergency rescue. SFD also staged onscene with us and was prepared to assist with medical aid and life saving measures.

When the rescue boats arrived onscene at approximately 0657 hours the apprehension plan was initiated. It should be noted that at this time SPD Officers had been attempting to gain S-Alam's compliance for over four and a half hours. Officers had given him time and space and attempted to de-escalate him. S-Alam was given clear instructions that he was under arrest and if he did not comply with officers, he could be subject to a use of force. During this time S-Alam told Officer's that he did not want to go to jail and that he did not plan to comply or surrender. S-Alam had told Officer's they will have to shoot him in the head.

Sergeant Trejo lead the contact team down the stairs of the embankment and implemented the apprehension plan. I heard Officer Hernandez give S-Alam clear orders to surrender. I heard S-Alam admonished that force would be used if he did not comply. I heard S-Alam admonished that the K9 would be deployed, and he would be bit. I stood at the rear of the contact team. I could hear Sergeant Trejo give the command to deploy pepper ball rounds, combined less lethal, and deploy the K9. I voiced on the radio each time force was used. I also voiced other pertinent information. I was in a position where I could see the less lethal deployments towards S-Alam. I also observed Officer Phelan's K9 deployment. I observed S-Alam fall into the water. I then saw him being pulled out of the water by the contact team (including K9) and placed into handcuffs. I stayed on the concrete steps while this occurred.

I saw the contact team escort S-Alam to the walkway at the top of embankment where SFD provided medical aid.

After the suspect was taken into custody, I coordinated with Officers onscene to ensure the scene was photographed, evidence was collected, a canvass was conducted, and statements were obtained.

On January 3rd, 2023 I was dispatched to an errand call at 1006 4th St (Willow) in regards to obtaining video footage of a brandishing call (23-2258). I was wearing full Sac PD uniform and driving a marked patrol vehicle. I was wearing my body worn camera and had it activated at the time of the call. I observed the following in summary:

Upon arrival I made contact with the Willow restaurant manager, who was able to access video footage from their business. They had two exterior cameras on the building that were pointed in the general direction of the incident

In the video I observed the subject in question near the front of the business pacing around back and forth. I was unable to see the altercation that had occurred (to include the brandishing), as it was out of camera shot. However upon police arrival the suspect is seen running the opposite direction, and while running away it appeared as if the suspect had something in his hand, but in the video it was unclear what it was.

On January 3, 2022 at approximately 0649 hours, I (Ofc Bandy #214) contacted and obtained his statement. I wore standard patrol uniform equipped with a body worn camera which was activated during this interview.

I work graveyard shift from eleven to seven. I was inside and then this guy comes to the front door with all these Target bags and sets them in front of the entrance. He started pounding on the door. The door was locked. I was like, what can I help you with. He said he needed his room keys. I said, ok boss, do you have your ID; if you have your ID I can get your keys. He said, no I want my fucking room keys.

I was like, what did you say to me. I opened the door because I thought he should not be talking to me like that; I can help you out with anything you need.

I was standing in the door and he was just outside the door about arms-length away. Then he pulled out a shanker, a big knife, and said I'm gonna stab you, I'm gonna stab you right now, I'm gonna stab you. I was like, bro you're not going to stab me, just stop going through stuff. Just go away and I'm not going to call the cops, nothing; be on your way. He wasn't listening; I went back inside. He stood in front of the door, just staring at me for a good ten minutes.

I think if I would have stepped outside, he might have stabbed me. He was going through some stuff. He was making stabbing motions, but not really lunging.

I have guests that leave the hotel really early, and they weren't going to be able to leave if there's someone out there with a knife; so I called Allied Security and they called police.

When the police showed up, they brought out the shotgun with the rubber bullets, and he was about to stab the cops. As they were getting closer, he was like, I'm gonna stab you. He was here and they were about where the back of your vehicle is [approximately 20 feet].

There wasn't anyone in the lobby at the time. It was just me.

Right before police showed up, Allied Security showed up and tried to tell him to leave, he went over and started stabbing the window. He didn't cause any damage to the car.

I told the officer I talked to that I didn't want to press charges. I don't remember which officer I talked to. No one came back after they followed him.

The suspect was a male, middle-eastern, light skin, curly black hair, blue jeans, camouflage jacket on with a hoodie, late thirties, about 5'10", thin build, 150-155 pounds, dirty white sneakers. The knife had a silver blade and the blade was about six inches long not including the handle. It looked like it came out of his sleeve.

The subject appeared to have dark hair on top with shaved sides, wearing a dark colored jacket, dark colored pants, and black/white shoes. He is seen travelling on foot in the valet area, looking back towards the pursuing officer, before leaving the view of security cameras.

On 01/03/2023 at approx. 0216 hours, I Ofc. Kammerer #554 was dispatched to 1006 4th St in regards to a subject armed with a knife. Per the text of the call, the subject had threatened a valet employee and the employee had to run for his safety. The armed male was described as a male, black, adult 5'10", 175-180lbs, wearing a blue jacket and blue jeans. Additional updates advised that the subject may be mentally ill and he was still on scene. I arrived on scene at approx. 0219 hours. My in car camera and body worn camera were on and activated during the investigation. I observed the following in summary:

Upon arrival, DOCO security pointed to a male standing outside of the Exchange Hotel who matched the aforementioned description. As I exited my fully marked Sacramento Police Department patrol vehicle, the male, later identified as Skandar Alam (XREF), removed an approx. 6 inch knife from his pocket and armed himself. He was acting very erratic and clinched the knife very tightly in his right hand. S-Alam was identified with the assistance of the West Sacramento Police Department. See below.

I identified myself as the police and gave S-Alam several commands to drop the knife to which he refused. He appeared to be very paranoid and was making very erratic movements. Due to him being armed, I drew my department issued handgun. I later transitioned to a less lethal option. S-Alam walked out into the middle of J St and continued to ignore commands to stop and drop the knife. He began walking westbound on J St, still armed with the knife. When he got to the intersection of 3rd St / J St, he fled southbound and into the parking lot of the Holiday Inn located at 300 J St. S-Alam continued southbound through the parking lot, still ignoring commands. He walked through the valet area, at which time I lost visual of S-Alam. Once it was safe to move through the area in which S-Alam had walked through, I was no longer able to locate him.

I responded back to 1006 4th St in order to contact the victim and obtain a statement. I was able to obtain a preliminary statement, but was interrupted when DOCO security advised they had eyes on the suspect in the garage. See victim statement.

Based on the victim's statement, S-Alam had approached him and demanded a hotel key. When S-Alam wasn't given a key, he removed a knife from his pocket, held it in a threatening manner and stated that he was "going to shank" the valet. S-Alam made stabbing gestures towards the victim. While talking with the victim, he imitated S-Alam's movements by standing in a bladed stance and made stabbing gestures with his hand by swinging his arm near his hip.

The male that security was with, was not the correct individual.

Officers canvassed the area, looking for S-Alam. An officer advised they observed a male with a similar description as S-Alam walking across the Tower Bridge, heading towards West Sacramento.

I checked the area and observed S-Alam walking back eastbound towards Sacramento on the north sidewalk. I positively identified S-Alam as the subject that I had observed with the knife.

I attempted to contact S-Alam for a second time, but he immediately became agitated and armed himself again with the knife. He ignored commands and began climbing the railing on the bridge as if he were going to jump into the river.

An hours long stand-off ensued where officers attempted de-escalation techniques in order to safely apprehend S-Alam.

Up until the point, S-Alam had not been identified. S-Alam gave an address of sacramento. With the assistance of the West Sacramento Police Department, S-Alam was positively identified.

A computer records check of S-Alam yielded information of an outstanding misdemeanor warrant for 290.018(G)PC (DKT: 22MI018073) and felony warrant for 11377HS (DKT: 22FE016808).

A plan was put in place and S-Alam was allowed to walk westbound on the Tower Bridge in West Sacramento.

When officers attempted to give S-Alam commands to safely apprehend him, he fled northbound towards the river. A second hours long stand-off ensued.

After several hours, S-Alam was taken into custody after officers deployed less lethal tools. See supplements for further.

During the stand-offs, I assisted K9 officer Phelan as a lethal cover with my department issued rifle. See supplement for further.

S-Alam was taken into custody. He was evaluated by fire and transported to Sutter for further medical

S-Alam was later transported and booked for 245(A)(1) PC, 245(A)(4) PC, 422 PC and his outstanding warrants.

It should be noted that my body worn camera died at 0704 hours.

On 01/03/2022 at approximately 0324 hours, I, Ofc. Summey #491 was dispatched to 1006 4th St. regarding a disturbance involving a weapon. Notes on the call indicated a male was brandishing a knife. Prior to my arrival, I heard officers had followed the suspect to the Tower Bridge (101 Capitol Mall) which separates The City of Sacramento and The City of West Sacramento, and were attempting to deescalate the male suspect who was on the bridge railing still armed with the knife. To the best of my knowledge, my body-worn camera was activated. I observed the following in summary:

Upon arrival at approximately 0346 hours, I was requested by 1SM6 Sgt. Martinez #3048 to deploy my department assigned less lethal 40mm launcher, and join the contact team set on the west side of the bridge.

I positioned myself at the far east of the contact group with Ofc. Stackhouse #555, who also had a less lethal system deployed.

At approximately 0451 hours, I observed S-Alam set an object on the ground and started walking westbound on the northern pedestrian pathway towards West Sacramento. Due to my angle and distance from S-Alam, I could not tell what object he placed on the ground; I assumed the object was the knife, as officer's requests were for him to set the knife down, and I heard others officers say he placed the knife down.

Once S-Skandar had cleared the cement barrier for the bridge, he began to run northbound on the cement walking path along the waterline of the Sacramento River.

Officers followed S-Skandar for approximately 100' until he reached a cemented staircase at the waterfront. Officers remained at the top of the embankment, and continued to give orders to S-Skandar in attempts to deescalate.

All officers were positioned approximately 40' away from S-Skandar, up the embankment. The embankment had a steep slope, and aside from the concrete staircase, it was composed of muddy grass due to the weather.

Due to the recent rain, the Sacramento River's waterline was raised and touching the staircase that S-Skandar stopped at. The cement staircase ledge he was standing on appeared to be touching the water as well.

S-Skandar was looking behind him, as if he was contemplating jumping in the river.

Upon orders from supervising sergeants, contact officers moved down one flight of stairs, closer to S-Skandar.

Once down the flight of stairs, crisis negotiation officers (CNT) and I, approached several more steps closer to S-Skandar.

At this point, S-Skandar advised officers he had another weapon. I could tell the weapon was of metal construction due to the way it sounded on the concrete; however, I could not tell what the object was. S-Skandar held the item in his hand several times, but mainly kept it at his right side on the concrete

staircase ledge he was sitting on.

All officers retracted themselves from the staircase and gathered at the patrol vehicles on the top of the embankment.

During all of the conversations I was nearby, it did not ever appear that S-Skandar had any intention of cooperating with officer's orders. S-Skandar would say things such as 'you are going to have to shoot me in the head'.

At approximately 0643 hours, S-Skandar started moving on the ledge, which preempted officers to begin deescalation again.

I was assigned as a designated member of the contact team to take S-Skandar into custody; my role was that of less lethal (40mm launcher).

1SM5 Sgt. Trejo #3003 assumed the role as contact team leader. Sgt. Trejo briefed the contact team of their reactive authority, he specifically advised that upon order of 'combined less lethal', officers were to deploy less lethal force.

At approximately 0657 hours, Sgt. Trejo gave the order of 'pepperball'

At approximately 0658 hours, Sgt. Trejo gave a second order of 'pepperball'.

Approximately 30 seconds after the second deployment of pepperball, at approximately 0658 hours, Sgt. Trejo gave the order of 'combined less lethal'.

I fired one round of 40mm at S-Skandar's right abdomen from approximately 20 feet away.

I observed S-Skandar crouch down and seek cover using a cement flower pot. It appeared S-Skandar positioned himself to hide from officer's less lethal force.

At approximately 0659 hours, I observed S-Skandar drop the metal object he had in the flower pot, which he was also seeking cover behind. I was unable to see how far down the metal object fell into the flower pot to determine if the weapon was still readily accessible.

On orders, the contact team moved further down the staircase, closer to S-Skandar.

CNT officers continued verbal commands and deescalation with S-Skandar.

K9 Ofc. Phelan #927 was part of the contact team. (See Ofc. Phelan's observations).

At approximately 0700 hours, and while S-Skandar was crouched behind the flower pot, Sgt. Trejo gave another order of 'pepperball'.

I observed Ofc. Yee #709 move to a better position at a higher flight of stairs and deploy another volley of 'pepperball', at approximately 0701 hours.

I moved several stairs down the staircase to gain a better angle in preparation for another 40mm less lethal deployment.

Sgt. Trejo advised that several members of the contact team, including myself, were going to step over the stairs into the grass to get closer to S-Skandar.

From my perspective, as K9 approached S-Skandar from the right side of the flowerpot, S-Skandar started moving to the left to avoid K9, towards myself and other less lethal officers.

At approximately 0702 hours, Sgt. Trejo advised 'combined less lethal'. I fired one round of 40mm at S-Skandar's right upper torso. It appeared the impact of the 40mm round struck S-Skandar on the right shoulder, knocking him in the water.

I approached the ledge where S-Skandar was in the water, and assisted by several other officers, we pulled him out of the water onto the grass.

Officers placed S-Skandar on his stomach, and detained him without further incident.

S-Skandar was escorted up the embankment to where the fire department was staged.

On Tuesday 01/03/2023, I (Sergeant Bean #3083), was assigned as a Field Supervisor in the Northeast portion of Sacramento Police Department (SPD) jurisdiction, known as Sector 2. I was also assigned as a Crisis Negotiation Team Leader, which was an ancillary duty. At approximately 0256 hours, I arrived on scene at the Tower Bridge, to assist with a male suspect who was on the railing and armed with a knife; refusing officers commands to comply. I was wearing a full SPD uniform and was driving a fully marked SPD patrol sergeant's vehicle. My body worn camera and in car camera were activated.

Upon my arrival, Officer Hernandez was communicating with Suspect Skandar Alam. Officer Hernandez was also a member of our crisis negotiation team. I stepped in as her secondary/coach.

During my time as secondary to Officer Hernandez, I provided suggestions to steer the conversation in an attempt to build rapport and gain compliance. At one point, I suggested she offer a bottle of water, which was successful in getting Suspect Alam off the railing of the bridge, but he refused to put down the knife and surrender. I requested that food be ordered as another potential negotiation tool; however, Suspect Alam never agreed to comply in exchange for food.

Suspect Alam's only demand was to be left along and/or to be allowed to walk away. Eventually it was determined that he would be allowed to walk westbound across the bridge into West Sacramento where he could be detained without the additional hazards of being on the bridge above the river.

Suspect Alam agreed to put down his knife and walk westbound off the bridge toward food that was waiting on the opposite side. When Suspect Alam exited the bridge, I was driving a patrol car with a contact team preventing him from backtracking onto the bridge. Suspect Alam cleared the bridge, ran northbound, and took a defensive position along the river bank. I followed with the patrol car as officers repositioned to contain him.

Officer Hernandez continued attempts to negotiate with Suspect Alam on the river bank, but Suspect Alam showed no intent to surrender and advised multiple times that he would not. Officer Hernandez advised Suspect Alam that he was under arrest and provided multiple warnings that he would be subject to force and possibly a K9 deployment if he did not comply. On several occasions, he goaded officers to take an offensive approach and/or shoot him. He also pulled out an additional item from his pocket, which was found to be a metal cheese knife.

With limited progress. Sergeant Trejo (another SPD Crisis Negotiation Team leader) also attempted to

reason with Suspect Alam with no success.

For a brief period (approximately 3 minutes), I also attempted to reason with Suspect Alam and asked him to throw the items he removed from his pocket (cheese knife) to the side. I advised that he needed to comply with the warrant arrest and reiterated our desire for a peaceful resolution. I offered to get him cleaned up and fed before he was taken to jail. I also provided an additional admonishment that he might be bit by a K9 if he did not comply. Suspect Alam remained resistant to my requests.

When the command was given for officers to deploy less lethal weapons to take Suspect Alam into custody, I continued as secondary to Officer Hernandez and prompted her to continue use of force admonishments after each less lethal weapon deployment; including K9 admonishments.

Suspect Alam was ultimately detained after multiple less lethal weapon deployments and deployment of the police K9. I was not involved in the use of force or hands on detainment.

On the above listed date and time, I (Officer Guglielmelli #202) was in full police uniform and driving a fully marked police vehicle working downtown patrol in the city and county of Sacramento. My call sign for the day was 1B33. Below is a summary of facts know to me at the time of the call.

On 01/03/2023 at approximately 0642 hours, I was dispatched to the Tower Bridge on a reported subject armed with a knife and not following officers commands to drop it. I respond to the scene and arrived at approximately 0648 hours.

My Body Worn and In Car Camera was on and recording during this investigation

When I arrived on scene, I took over a road closure traffic position at Capitol Mall and Neashum circle (Westbound entrance to the Tower bridge). I remained at this location for the duration of the standoff until the SUSPECT was safely taken into custody. Once advised to open up the roadway, I responded to the scene where the SUSPECT was taken into custody and provided scene security until CSI could photograph and process the scene.

While on scene, I was contacted by Officer Catalina Hernandez #0714 (1A34) who handed me the SUSPECTS personal property, a second knife located near the SUSPECT, and a clear plastic baggie that contained a crystal like substance inside (Possible methamphetamine). Per Officer Hernandez #0714, she located the crystal narcotics on the SUSPECTS person (see her report for details)

I later transported these items to Central property and booked the second knife and Crystal like substance (Tested presumptive positive for methamphetamine - 12.48 grams) in as evidence and booked the SUSPECTS personal property in for safekeeping.

I also collected up the following Less Lethal casings that were photographed by CSI and identified as evidence at the scene:

Second Landing: 1 Spent LL Shotgun casing, 1 40mm spent casing

<u>First Landing</u>: 1 spent 40mm round and 1 spent 40mm casing, 3 spent pepper ball rounds, 2 spent LL shotgun socks, 1 LL shotgun casing, 1 smoked cigarette

I also booked these items at Central property at the end of my shift.

I then conducted a canvas of Old Sacramento Town to see if any of the businesses directly across the river had any video surveillance that might of captured the incident. I checked with Joe's Crab-shack located at 1210 Front street. Per the on site manager (NFI), they had no cameras facing towards the river or towards West Sacramento. I then checked with the Rio City Cafe located at 1110 Front Street and discovered that they were closed so I made up an errand call (SPD #23-2277) to have someone come back when open up to check to see if they had video that captured the incident.

I then checked with the Tower Bridge operator to see if they had cameras that might of recorded the incident. At the time of my initial call, I only had a phone number for the control tower so I called that number and only got voice mail so I left a message. A few days later, I got a call back from the operator (NFI) who advised that all cameras located on the Tower Bridge are "monitor" only and do not record.

I then updated my supervisor (2SM3 - Sgt. Justin Brown) of my findings

On 1/03/2023, I (Sergeant Trejo #3003) was dressed in full SPD uniform and driving a fully marked SPD patrol sergeant vehicle. I was working as a patrol supervisor, 1SM5, and assigned to the south district known as District 5. As an ancillary duty, I was a Crisis Negotiator Team (CNT) Leader.

At approximately 0251 hours, I responded to the Tower Bridge to assist Downtown units with a male subject who was armed with a knife and threatening to jump into the river. Information broadcasted on the radio was that the subject was wanted for 245 PC after he brandished a knife and lunged at a security officer. Officers had located the subject at the Tower Bridge and upon making contact, the subject refused to follow officer commands. The subject was agitated, armed with a knife, and had climbed over the railing threatening to jump into the river. West Sacramento PD was on scene assisting and had identified the subject as Skandar Alam. A record check on Alam had revealed that he also had a felony no bail warrant for narcotics possession and a no bail misdemeanor warrant for failing to update his sex offender registration information.

I arrived on scene at approximately 0259 hours and activated my body worn camera for the duration of the call. Upon my arrival I observed a contact team formed around subject Alam. Subject Alam was on the north side of the bridge, sitting on top of the pedestrian railing with one foot hanging one each side of the rails. Officer Hernandez who is a CNT member was already on scene communicating with subject Alam. Sqt. Bean who is also a CNT Leader was on scene assisting Officer Hernandez as a secondary/coach. Subject Alam was agitated, yelling, and refusing to surrender. He was holding onto a knife and making statements that he would not surrender. During negotiations, subject Alam agreed to come off the railing in exchange for a bottle of water. Officers were able to safely deliver a bottle of water and subject Alam came off the railing; however, he refused to drop the knife. Although subject Alam was now off the railing, he continued to stand against the rails and make threats to jump if we came close. During negotiations with subject Alam, he pulled out a 4-5-inch glass pipe with what appeared to be a bulbed tip. He then began to use the glass pipe to smoke an unknown substance. Based on my training and experience I know these types of glass pipes are commonly used to smoke methamphetamines. Officer Hernandez continued her efforts to de-escalate and have subject Alam drop the knife and peacefully surrender. Subject Alam refused to comply and demanded food and that he be allowed to leave. Negotiations and de-escalation tactics on the bridge lasted for over 2 hours.

A plan was set in place to have Alam drop the knife and allow him to walk westbound off the bridge towards food that would be waiting for him in the roadway. The goal was to safely detain Alam once completely off the bridge and away from the river. At approximately 0452 hours, the plan was implemented, and Alam agreed to put the knife down. Alam walked westbound off the bridge leaving the knife behind. As Alam walked off the bridge, the contact team moved forward and began to give him commands to surrender. Alam did not comply and fled northbound on the river walk. Alam continued to flee down the embankment to the edge of the river. Alam stood next to an approximate 1 ft concrete raised

curb that was part of concrete stairs leading down to the river. Due to a significant amount of rain in the region, the waterline at the river was high. The bottom portion of the concrete stairs was fully submerged in water. The concrete curb that Alam was standing next to was at the edge of the river waterline. There was concern that if Alan jumped in the river, and moved away from the riverbank, he could be swept away by the fast moving water. The contact team followed Alam up to the river walk and maintained distance. Officer Hernandez continued to communicate and negotiate with Alam. Alam showed no intent to surrender. Officer Hernandez gave Alam multiple advisements that he was under arrest and subject to less lethal force, including the use of a police K9, if he did not comply and surrender. Alam refused to surrender and produced what appeared to be a cheese or butter style knife with an approximate 3-inch blade.

At approximately 0535 hours, I took over negotiations for a brief period of time (approximately 30 minutes). I also gave subject Alam admonishments regarding the use of less lethal force including the use of a police K9 if he continued to refuse to surrender. I advised Alam he was under arrest and needed to comply. Alam stated he would not comply and that he was not going to get arrested. He stated he was "making a stand". During the time I was speaking to Alam, he was either holding the cheese/butter knife in his hand or had it right next to him within reach. Alam refused to comply and stated we either shoot him in the head or leave him alone. Officer Hernandez resumed negotiations.

As negotiations continued, Lt. Conner, Sgt. Gresham (Scene Supervisor), and I came up with a plan to take subject Alam into custody. The plan was to deploy less lethal pepperball rounds at subject Alam in an effort to get him to comply and surrender peacefully. In the event Alam did not comply, combined less lethal would be used. Combined less lethal would include the deployment of pepperball rounds, bean bag rounds, 40mm impact sponge rounds and the use of a police K9. 2 boats (West Sac Fire and SPD) had been deployed in river in the event Alam needed to be rescued from the water. I was assigned to supervise the contact team. The contact team was instructed to deploy the use of combine less lethal upon my "Impact" command. The contact team was made up of the following officers:

- Officer Hernandez Voice/hands
- Officer Lawrence shield/hands
- Officer Yee pepperball
- Officer Ricci bean bag
- Officer Summey 40mm
- K9 Officer Phelan K9 Shep
- Officer Kammerer lethal cover

At approximately 0648 hours, I briefed the contact time. During this entire time Officer Hernandez had continued to negotiate with Alam and provided him with admonishments of the use of less lethal force if he did not surrender. At approximately 0657 hours, I gave Officer Yee the impact command to deploy less lethal pepperball. Officer Yee deployed a volley of pepperball rounds at subject Alam. Alam was standing on top of the concrete curb and was holding the cheese/butter knife. I allowed time for Officer Hernandez to give surrendering commands. Subject Alam did not comply, instead he turned his back towards us and

was holding onto a large flowerpot vase with both hands. It appeared he was using the flowerpot for stabilize himself. The flowerpot vase was sitting on the south end of the concrete curb that Alam was standing on. I gave Officer Yee a second impact command for pepperball. Officer Yee deployed a second volley of peperball. At approximately 0658 hours, I observed Alam drop the knife into the large flowerpot vase. Given Alam was still holding onto the flowerpot, refusing to surrender and within reach of the knife he had just dropped, I gave the contact team the "impact" command for combine less lethal. Officer Ricci, Officer Summey and Officer Yee deployed their less lethal weapons. Alam was impacted by the less lethal weapons. Alam responded by moving behind the concrete flowerpot and using it as cover. Given Alam was positioned behind cover, I moved the contact team further down the stairs. During this time, Officer Hernandez continued to give Alam commands to surrender without success. Once it was established that K9 was within reach, I directed Officer Phelan to use his K9 to apprehend Alam. Officer Phelan had his K9 on a long leash and directed his K9 towards Alam. Officer Phelan and the rest of the contact team triangulated Alam. Upon the deployment of K9, I gave a second combined less lethal impact command. The contact team deployed their less lethal weapons. Alam came off the concrete curb and fell into the water. K9 was able to pull Alam back where officers were able to safely take him into custody. Once taken into custody, Alam was taken up to the river walk where the fire department was standby. Alam was provided medical aid.
