### SCPRC RECOMMENDATION

GO 580.02 Use of Force

SPD policy does not require drug testing of peace officers after a UOF incident.

Amend GO 580.02(L)(6): Require mandatory drug testing for police officers within 24 hours following a UOF incident leading to a death or serious bodily injury. Add a new line under Section L, subsection 6 using the following language:

d. The involved officer(s) shall submit to chemical testing for use of drugs or alcohol by use of handheld preliminary blood alcohol device at the scene and later transported to a medical facility for blood test or to police station for breath test via breath machine. Testing at medical facility or police department shall be conducted within 2 hours to preserve evidence, if any.

## SCPRC RECOMMENDATION RATIONALE

It is important to ensure that when peace officers are making life and death decisions their judgement not be impaired.

While investigations into officer-involved shootings routinely include drug testing for people killed by a peace officer, SPD's UOF policy does not require officers to submit to drug testing after they shoot or kill someone.

## SPD RESPONSE

At this time, drug testing of officers after a use of force cannot be implemented as this topic is a contractual issue subject to labor agreements.
