### **Sacramento Regional Office of Homeland Security**

#### **Introductions**

Lieutenant Mike Hutchins introduced Lieutenant Neil Cybulski as his replacement as Director of the Sacramento Regional Office of Homeland Security (SROHS). Lt. Mike Hutchins also introduced the Sacramento Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) program staff.

## **UASI and Nonprofit Funding**

Craig Mohar provided an overview of Sacramento's homeland security grant funding and its FY 2019 risk ranking. Sacramento UASI funding increased from \$2.5 million in FY 2018 to \$3.25 million for FY 2019. A spreadsheet will be sent out to all the agencies in the region requesting their special event information. There has also been an increase in local applicants for the federal nonprofit security grant program. Grant workshops were held earlier in the year to provide training to interested nonprofit agencies.

## **Grant Proposal Presentations**

Using funds from the FY 2016 UASI grant, the following regional projects were proposed for funding:

- Sergeant Clayton Buchanan with Sacramento Police Department Explosive Ordnance Detail (EOD) Team announced that the city of Sacramento has approved the purchase of a new robot for the EOD team to replace the current one that is 19 years old. The purchase of a remote control for the new robot was approved by unanimous vote.
- 2. Captain Ryan Gifford with Sacramento Metropolitan Fire provided an overview about command and control elements they are trying to implement and proposed purchasing several Aeroscope devices. These devices will allow agencies in the region to be more prepared for critical incidents. By unanimous vote, it was approved to use FY 2016 funding to purchase these devices.
- 3. Training Coordinator Beth Glynn with the Sacramento Police Department proposed purchasing tourniquets for the 72 large high schools within the region. She proposed 30 tourniquets and two lock boxes to be stored at each high school. These will be available for not only the schools but for the community and local first responders. A total of 2,200 tourniquets and 150 lock boxes will be purchased for the region. By unanimous vote, it was approved to use the UASI grant funds to purchase the tourniquets and lock boxes for the high schools in the region.

- Tactical Life Saver courses are scheduled for three this summer and three next summer. A class in June is scheduled in South Lake Tahoe to provide onsite training to smaller agencies in the region.
- AWR192 Terrorist Awareness class is planned.
- Suspect Tactics and Perimeter containment will be held at Sacramento State, more information to follow.
- ICS 300& 400 have been requested and we are currently pending.
