



DISORDERLY CONDUCT - **IT HURTS EVERYONE!**

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

You may not permit these acts in or about your business:

- * Lewd conduct in public
- * Prostitution
- * Accosting others for the purpose of begging
- * Loitering in or about public toilets for a lewd or lascivious purpose
- * Loitering without apparent reason and refusing to ID oneself upon the request of a peace officer
- * Being under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs in public and unable to exercise care for one's own safety or the safety of others

Maximum Criminal Penalty for the person committing the act:

First Time - \$1000 fine and/or six months in County Jail

Also, take into consideration possible disciplinary action from your employer, and disciplinary action against the ABC License.

DISORDERLY HOUSE

Licensees may not permit their businesses to become a disorderly house.

A disorderly house is a licensed outlet (on- or off-sale) that:

- (a) Disturbs neighbors with noise, loud music, loitering, littering, vandalism, urination, or defecation, graffiti, etc., and/or
- (b) Has many ongoing crimes inside such as drunks, fights, assaults, prostitution, narcotics, etc. The licensed premise includes the parking lot. (Sec.25601 B&P; 316 PC)

Maximum Criminal Penalty:

First Time - \$1000 fine and/or six months in County Jail. Also take into consideration possible disciplinary action from your employer and disciplinary action against the ABC License.
