## Two Rivers Trail Overview




 Two Rivers Trail is part of the City's goal for a continuous network of paved, accessible, multiuse trails connecting the existing Sacramento River and American River parkways



## Two Rivers Trail Components




- Two Rivers Trail Concept Plan Completed in 2001

   Completed in 2006
- Sutters Landing Completed in 2016
- Two Rivers Trail Phase II –
   Construction to be completed in 2025
- Two Rivers Trail Phase III & IV –
   2025 Preliminary Design Phase



## Two Rivers Phase I




- Constructed in 2006
- Extends from Tiscornia
   Park at Jiboom Street to
   SR-160
- Connects to Sac Northern trail



## Two Rivers Phase II



- **Sutters Landing** segment completed in 2016.
- Segment from H Street bridge to UPRR currently under construction – estimated completion fall 2025



### Two Rivers Phase III



- Closes trail gap at UPRR crossing east of Sutter's Landing Park
- Extends the trail within the Park at 28th Street, creating a loop around the landfill
- Connects the Sac
   Northern Bikeway to
   the Phase I trail



## Two Rivers Phase IV



- Provides an overhead crossing of the UPRR tracks on the west side of Sutter's Landing Park
- Provides an undercrossing of State Route 160 to connect with the Two Rivers Trail Phase I project and Sac Northern

- Public outreach
- Environmental clearance under CEQA






#### **Environmental History**
