# Parking Division - 2025 California Mobility & Parking Association Annual Conference

Awarded for "Parking Professional of the Year", Ursula Johnson has dedicated 26 years to the City of Sacramento, rising from Parking Enforcement Officer to Parking Enforcement Manager. She has led transformative technology initiatives—most notably Al-based enforcement tools—to improve safety, compliance, and equity. A respected mentor and innovator, Ursula's leadership has modernized operations and advanced the City's Vision Zero and mobility goals.

Ursula, along with several members of the Parking Services division gave a presentation at this year's 2025 California Mobility & Parking Association Annual Conference detailing the City's path to safer and more accessible streets.

Illustrated throughout the presentation given at this year's conference, "Enforcing the Future: A City's Guide to Automated Parking Solutions", the Parking Services Division team details the programs solutions and goals towards safer streets. Beginning with the early stages beginning in 2023, with initial automated ride-along trials with Hayden AI, the formal adoption of the program in turn setting the stage for further implementation in 2024, and now the launch of a 2025 public education campaign, and a 60-day warning period to prepare the community.

The Rear-Loader picks up curb bulk waste throughout the year.

Around the Fall/Winter months it gets loaded up with leafs and bulk yard waste. The Claw, vehicles used by Recycling and Solid Waste to pick up debris that is not placed in trash cans, assists with these tasks following the Rear-Loader truck around our City streets.

Before the mechanical side loaders and front loaders; these trash trucks were commonly loaded by hand picking up residential trash back in the day. City equipment has evolved over the years, continuing to provide clean and safe streets for years to come!

# <u>Traffic alert: Night paving scheduled on Franklin Boulevard as part of safety project</u>

The next phase of construction on the Franklin Boulevard Complete Street project will soon be underway with overnight paving activities.

To minimize inconvenience to the traveling public, businesses and residents, the paving work will be performed at night, between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Starting on Sunday evening, December 7, construction crews will begin grinding the existing asphalt roadway on Franklin Boulevard between Sutterville Road and 32nd Avenue. They will continue grinding operations each night through the morning of Friday, December 12.

Vehicles will be able to drive on the road during the day following grinding operations.

What to expect:


· Lane shifts and traffic controls

# <u>Public Works completes more than 100 safety improvements under</u> new initiative

The City of Sacramento's Department of Public Works this week shared progress on the City's Transportation Safety Initiative, a comprehensive effort to make streets safer for people walking, biking and driving.

Approved by the City Council in late March, the initiative accelerates how the City responds to safety needs and expands the tools available to deliver improvements more quickly. A core component of the initiative is the new Transportation Safety Team, a dedicated unit within Public Works focused on quick-build and interim safety projects across Sacramento's High Injury Network.

More than 100 traffic-safety improvements have been installed citywide so far in 2025, including:

- 17 quick-build projects
- 39 locations of intersection daylighting
- 17 school-zone safety upgrades such as high-visibility crosswalks and enhanced signage
- Six new stop-controlled residential intersections

One of these locations is the intersection of Sutterville Road and Mead Avenue in District 7 near William Land Park and nearby school zones.

# Ribbon cutting celebrates completion of Ninos Parkway Phase 2 trail connection

A new section of the Ninos Parkway trail is officially open, completing a key north—south connection for people walking, biking and rolling through the Gardenland and Northgate neighborhoods.

Vice Mayor Karina Talamantes and project staff with the Department Public Works, joined community members and partners today for a ribbon cutting ceremony marking the completion of Ninos Parkway Phase 2.

"This trail has been years in the making, and it's great to see it finally connect our neighborhoods," said Vice Mayor Karina Talamantes. "Projects like this strengthen our community by making it safer and more accessible for families, students, and neighbors to move throughout our city."

The half-mile project extends the existing multi-use path north of San Juan Road to Citrusparke Avenue/Parkechannel Way in the Parkebridge neighborhood, closing one of the final gaps along the trail.

# <u>'Leaf season' begins November 3: What it means for City of</u> Sacramento residents

Starting Monday, November 3, residents will see the Claw return to their neighborhoods for leaf collection.

It's that time of year when many Sacramento residents see an excess of leaves from the city's tree canopy. During this time, the Recycling and Solid Waste Division deploys a special "leaf season" service for leaf pile pickups.

Leaf Season Begins Nov. 3



From November to February 1, 2026, yard waste that cannot fit in the curbside container can be piled in the street for collection.

The Division's leaf season crews include a claw tractor and rear-loader truck, which move systematically through the City to collect leaf piles and take them to the recycling and composting facility.

Here are some guidelines to help you make the most out of leaf season:

- Fill the organics container before making a pile and refill when it's empty.
- Try to keep piles away from storm drains and out of bike lanes.
- Limit your pile to four by four by nine feet (4' x 4' x 9').
- Keep your pile clear of obstructions: if the claw cannot reach your pile due to an obstruction such as a vehicle parked too close, it won't be picked up.
- Check the Collection Calendar regularly as it can change daily.
