Summer heat and winter storms are nothing new for Sacramento. However, these events are becoming more frequent and intense as a result of climate change.



The H Street Bikeway project aims to create a two-way, separated bikeway on the south side of H Street between 5th and 10th streets. 





## **Street Sweeping Begins Again on Sacramento Streets**

With spring fast approaching, residents should be aware of seasonal changes to some City services. [Street sweeping service](#) starts occurring monthly in February, after [leaf season](#) collections are finished, and continues through October each year.

Street sweeping is provided on public streets that have curbs and gutters. Private streets and areas without this service are not included.

Sweeping service is intended to prevent loose dirt and smaller debris from entering the City's storm drains. Sweepers cannot pick up large litter and debris. Residents should report illegally dumped debris and/or request a bulky waste pickup by contacting the City's [Customer Service](#) at 3-1-1.

Calendars are specific for each customer's address and will show all the days the street has been and will be swept in a calendar year. This includes residential and commercial properties.

## **Planned Safety Upgrades Coming to Marysville Boulevard**

A half-mile stretch of Marysville Boulevard will soon look and move differently as the City of Sacramento begins construction on a quick-build safety project aimed at improving safety and reducing serious crashes along the corridor.

The quick-build project is part of [Sacramento's Vision Zero effort](#), which aims to eliminate traffic deaths and serious injuries. Rather than waiting for a full corridor rebuild, the City is using interim materials like striping, signage and protective barriers to deliver safety benefits sooner in high-injury areas.

## Sacramento Invites Community to Shape Vision Zero Action Plan Update

Throughout January and February, the City of Sacramento hosted two community workshops as part of its Vision Zero Action Plan Update, a citywide effort aimed at eliminating traffic-related deaths and serious injuries.

The workshops — one held in person and one online — were designed to give residents an opportunity to share their experiences, concerns and ideas about transportation safety as the City updates its long-term strategy.

The City of Sacramento launched a new artificial intelligence feature website. Designed to help residents find information more quickly and easily.

The City's website search page now includes an AI-generated summary at the top of search results. The tool provides clear, concise answers by summarizing information from multiple City sources, reducing time spent searching and improving transparency and usability. Users can ask full, plain-language questions and receive easy-to-understand responses before clicking through individual pages.
