# YOUR GUIDE TO CITY SERVICES

## **Recycling and Solid Waste Division - Drop-Off Programs**

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) can come in various forms. Products such as paint, cleaners, oil, batteries and pesticides require special care and may not be thrown in your residential waste containers. These products may contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable or reactive ingredients and are considered Household Hazardous Waste (HHW).

Sacramento residents interested in disposing of Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) can take qualifying items to the following locations, free of charge (maximum of 15 gals or 125 lbs. per trip):

## Sacramento Marina: Planning Your Fourth of July on a Boat: Safety First

Lots of other boaters will have the same idea, so waterways get very busy on the Fourth. Here's how to stay safe:

- Check for Coast Guard restrictions in your area before going out.
- Make sure you have enough life jackets for everyone on board.
- Keep your boat's navigation lights working.
- Don't try to anchor in a spot that's already packed with boats.

It's a good idea to brush up on your basic [safe boating tips](#), too. A little planning goes a long way. Have a safe and amazing Fourth of July on the water!

Boaters in the Sacramento area can anchor out near the Tower Bridge to watch the post-game fireworks show from Sutter Health Park. The marina may accommodate boats for overnight guest slips for \$50/night provided boaters make arrangements prior to July 3rd, with all required documentation.
