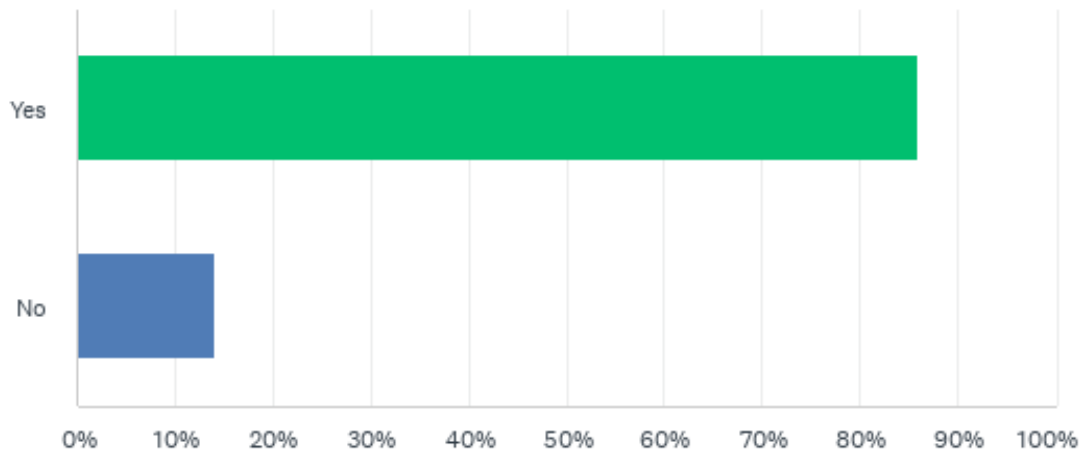


21st Avenue Median Park

Survey analysis

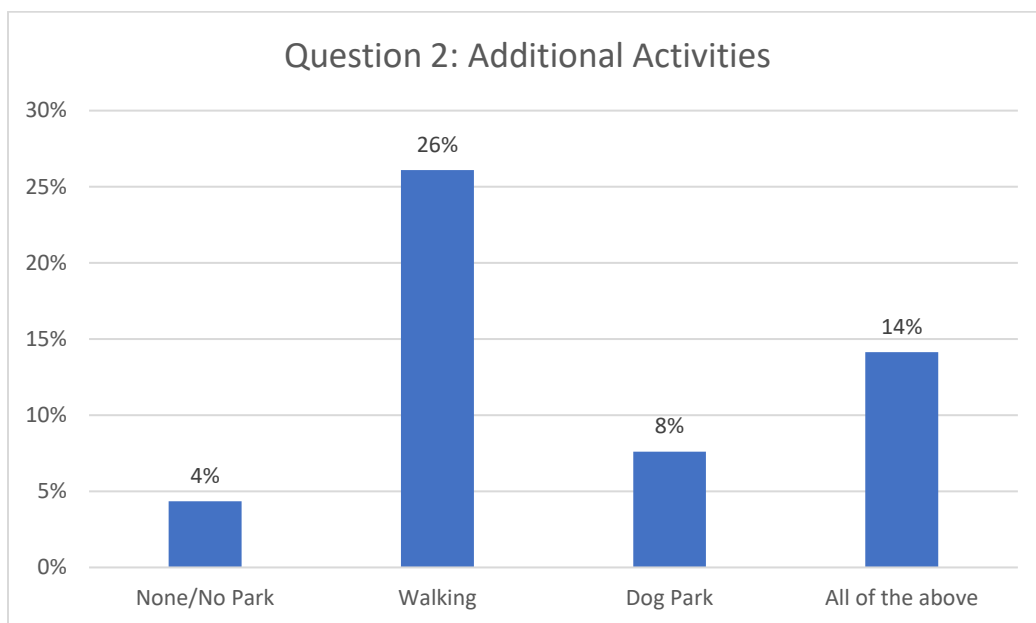
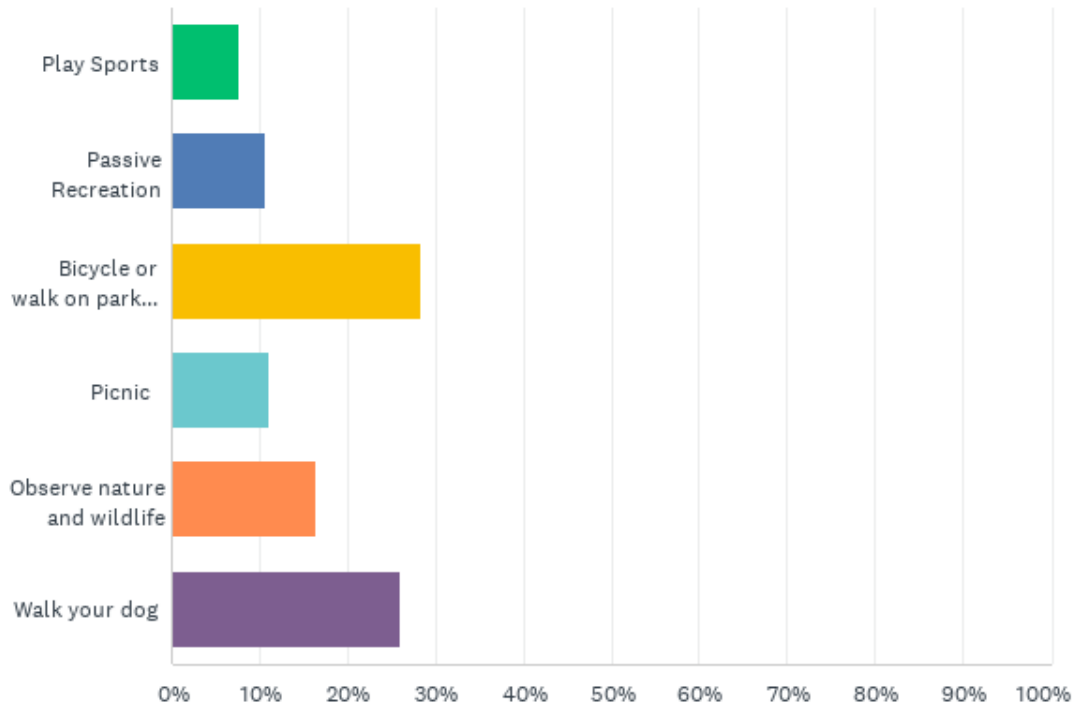
The purpose of this survey was to establish whether the community supported a park in the surrounding neighborhood between 60th street and 64th street. Additionally, the community was asked what amenities they would like included in their park. Based on these responses the City will interpret what items should be included in the design of this park.

Question 1: Do you support the conversion of a portion of the existing street median to the park?

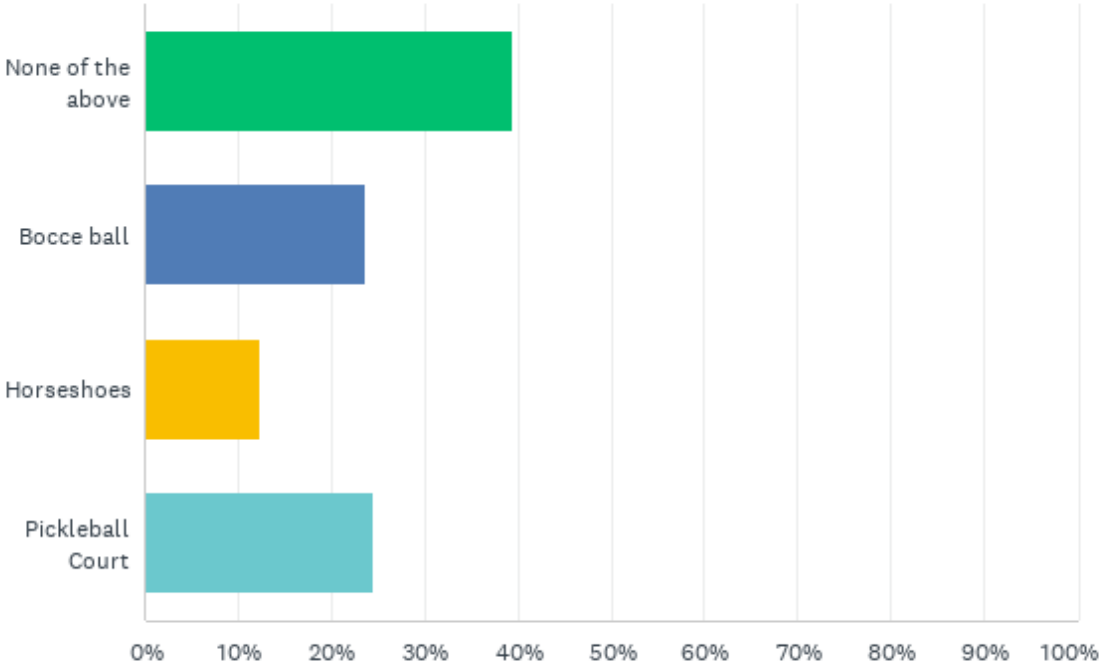


Question 2: What Activities would you enjoy at this park?

Based on the question of what activities would the residents enjoy at this park, the majority favor a bicycle or walking path. The additional write-in responses show the majority supporting walking as an activity they support.

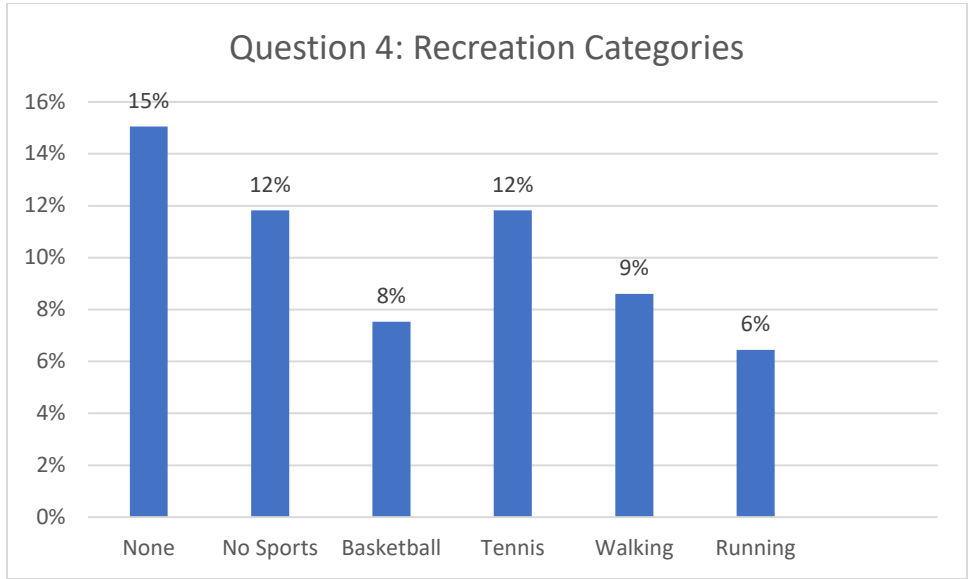


Question 3: Which type of sport court are you likely to utilize?

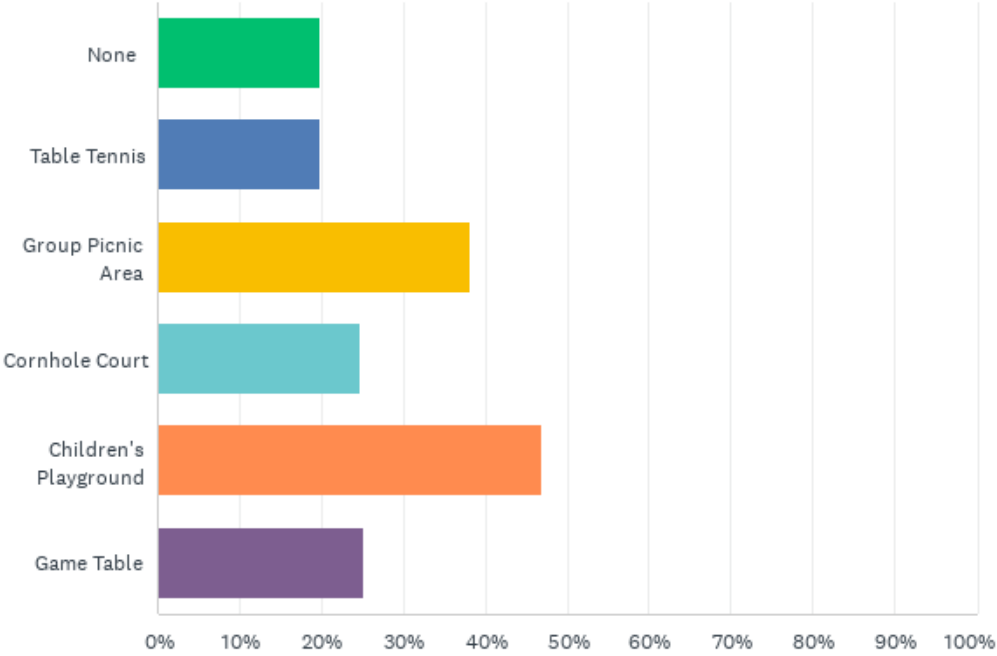


Question 4: If not previously listed, what additional sports court would you like at this park?

This question was an open response question and generated the word cloud shown below. Based on this word cloud the most frequently used words were: None, Sports, Tennis, basketball and Park. The majority of the responses seemed to not be in favor of additional amenities. The largest response was “None” or “No Sports” which combined contribute 27% of the written answers.

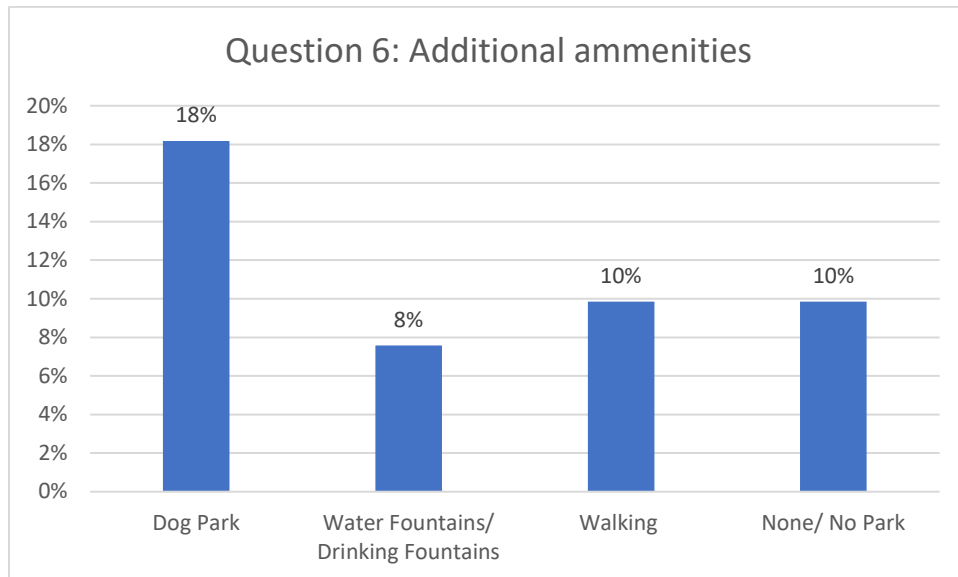


Question 5: Which recreation amenity do you want to see in your park?



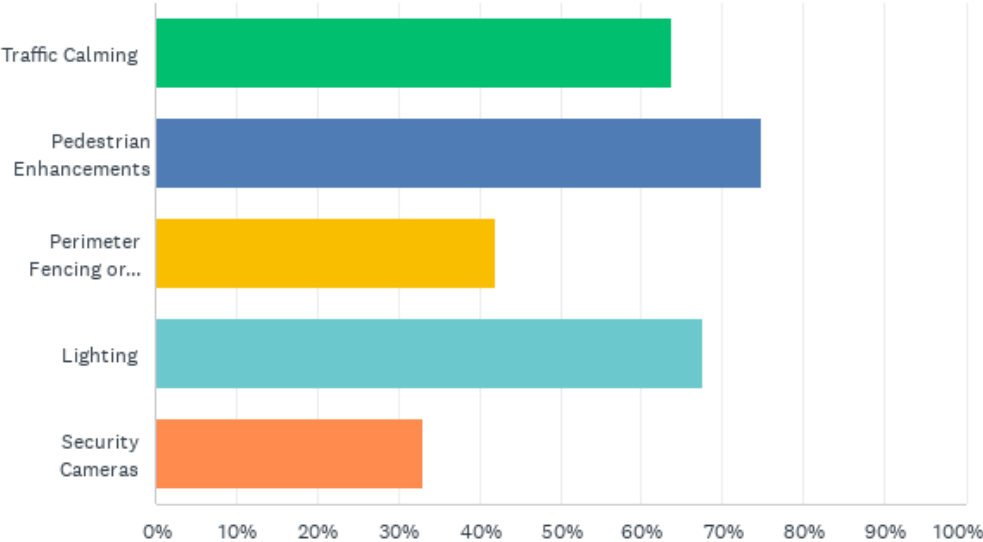
Question 6: Are there any amenities not listed that you would like to see in this park?

This was an open response question which generated a word cloud. The word cloud was used to determine words used in analysis. Based on the written responses to what amenities were not listed the community would like to see, the majority of responded a dog park. Although walking paths were also included in the responses, this item is highlighted in question 2.

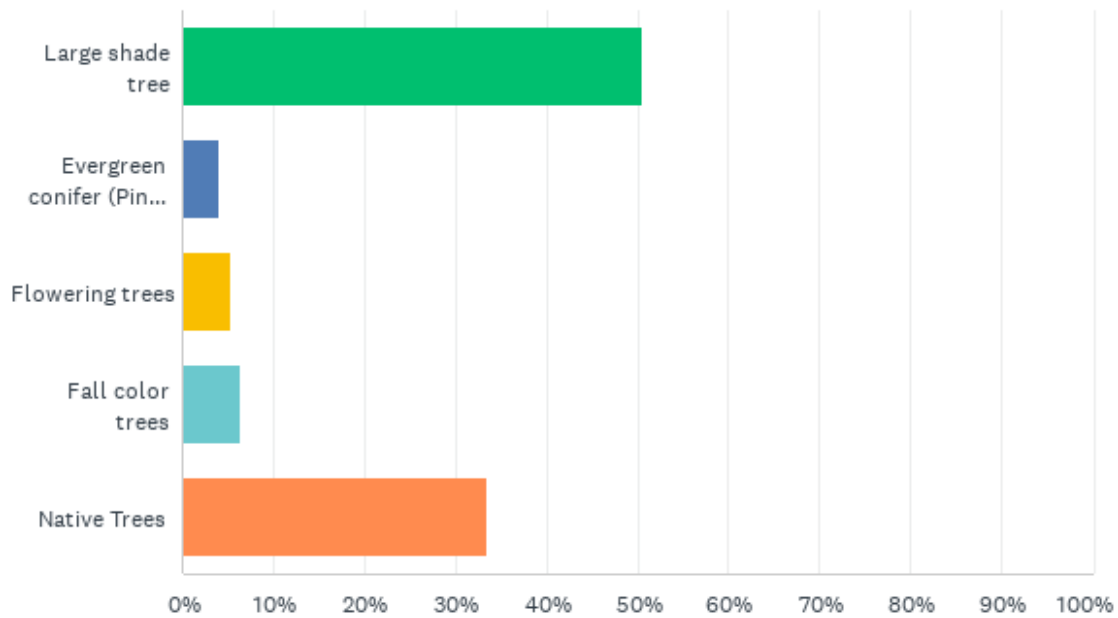


Question 7: What types of safety improvements would you like to see at this site?

Based on the results of this survey the community supports safety improvements that assist access to the park site. The community would also like to have safety features that deter dangerous activity.

Conclusion:

The conclusions drawn from the survey suggest that the community is strongly in favor of this park being developed. They would like an activated park with walking and running paths. They would like to avoid sports courts in general as stray balls and darting children are a concern. For recreational activities it appears they would like a children's playground and possibly a dog park. The community is greatly concerned with safe pedestrian access to the park and would like traffic improvements to increase safe access. The community would also like to incorporate large shade trees or native trees into the design.
