LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:

Longview Oaks adjacent to Del Paso Regional Park, Council District 2

RECOMMENDATION: This report recommends the City Council, by resolution: 1) amend the Del Paso Regional Park Master Plan to incorporate the "Longview Oaks" parcel which is City property and is adjacent to the existing park just north of Longview Drive (Assessor's Parcel Number 240-0330-004), 2) ratify the Mitigated Negative Declaration and 3) adopt the Mitigation Reporting Plan for the "Longview Oaks" site.

SUMMARY:

Longview Oaks is a 7.45 acre site immediately north of the existing Del Paso Regional Park. The Longview Oaks parcel is north of Longview Drive and south of Interstate-80 within the City of Sacramento. The site is owned by the City of Sacramento, is undeveloped and contains an oak savanna. Staff recommends this site be incorporated into the boundary of Del Paso Regional Park, that the Mitigated Negative Declaration for the site be ratified, and the Mitigation Reporting Plan be adopted.





COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:

On January 3, 2002, the Parks and Recreation Citizen's Advisory Committee approved the addition of the "Longview Oaks" parcel to the Del Paso Regional Park Master Plan.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Longview Oaks is a 7.45 acre parcel north of Longview Drive and south of Interstate-80 (Assessor's Parcel Number 240-0330-004). See site map attached as Exhibit A. The parcel features a tributary to the Arcade Creek which flows through seasonal wetlands and an oak savanna. The City's General Plan land use designation is for Parks and Recreation - Open Space. The project site is currently vacant and undeveloped and will be restored and enhanced through a State Department of Water Resources grant. The restoration and enhancement of the site includes restoring a vernal pool area, constructing a new detention wetland, removing existing asphalt road spurs, planting oak seedlings, removing non-native grasses, installing a pedestrian loop path, establishing a native grassland area, and repairing an on-site culvert. Longview Oaks is a beautiful open space area that staff recommends be incorporated into Del Paso Regional Park.

A revised Del Paso Regional Park Master Plan was adopted by the City Council on January 22, 1985 and included the Sacramento Softball Complex, which is a four-field lighted softball complex, a 500-space parking lot, a warm-up area and a picnic area. The Master Plan also preserved the natural habitat west of Watt Avenue. The 1985 revised Master Plan did not include the "Longview Oaks" site as part of the park.

The addition of the "Longview Oaks" site into the Del Paso Regional Park Master Plan will not change the City of Sacramento's General Plan. Staff recommends that the Del Paso Regional Park Revised Master Plan be amended to include the "Longview Oaks" site and that the Mitigated Negative Declaration for the site be ratified and the Mitigation Reporting Plan be adopted.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

None with this report.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The City of Sacramento, Environmental Planning Services, has determined that the project, as proposed, will not have a significant impact to the environment; therefore, a Mitigated Negative Declaration has been prepared. In compliance with Section 15070(B)1 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, the City has incorporated mandatory mitigation

measures into the project plans to avoid identified impacts or to mitigate such impacts to a point where clearly no significant impacts will occur. These mitigation measures are included in Attachment A (Mitigation Reporting Plan) and address impacts to Geology, Water, Air Quality, Biological Resources, Hazards, Noise, and Cultural Resources.

The Mitigated Negative Declaration was distributed through the State Clearinghouse (SCH #2002052092) and available for public review during the period of May 21, 2002 through June 19, 2002. One public comment letter was received during the public review period. The comments received relating to the Mitigated Negative Declaration were not considered to substantially revise the document per CEQA Guideline Section 15073.5. Staff recommends that the City Council ratify the Mitigated Negative Declaration and adopt the Mitigation Reporting Plan for the project.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

This project is consistent with the City's approved strategic Plan, City Strategies, enhancing the quality of life for present and future generations and preserving and enhancing park and recreation amenities.

ESBD CONSIDERATIONS:

No ESBD considerations are applicable at this time as no goods or services are being procured as a result of the approval of this recommendation.

Project Location:

The project is located north of Longview Drive and south of Interstate-80. This project includes the addition of 7.45 acres of Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 240-0330-004 to the existing Del Paso Regional Park, located south and adjacent to Longview Drive.

Project Description:

The City of Sacramento, Parks and Recreation Department, is proposing to amend the Del Paso Regional Park Master Plan to add 7.45 acres of APN 240-0330-004, located north of Longview Drive and directly south of Interstate-80, to Del Paso Regional Park. This project also involves enhancing and restoring the site by implementing a vernal pool restoration area, constructing a new detention basin, removing existing asphalt road spurs, planting oak seedlings, removing non-native grasses, establishing a native grassland area, and repairing an on-site historic culvert.




NEGATIVE DECLARATION

The City of Sacramento, California, a municipal corporation, does hereby prepare, make, declare, and publish this Negative Declaration for the following described project:

Del Paso Regional Park Master Plan Amendment to Incorporate the "Longview Oaks" Site (#LL06, 7208) — The City of Sacramento, Parks and Recreation Department, is proposing to amend the Del Paso Regional Park Master Plan to officially add 7.45 acres of APN 240-0330-004, located north of Longview Drive and directly south of Interstate-80, to Del Paso Regional Park. This project also involves enhancing and restoring the site by implementing a vernal pool restoration area, constructing a new detention wetland, removing existing asphalt road spurs, planting oak seedlings, removing non-native grasses, installing a pedestrian loop path, establishing a native grassland area, and repairing an on-site culvert.

The City of Sacramento, Planning and Building Department, has reviewed the proposed project and has determined that the project, with mitigation measures, as identified in the attached Initial Study, will not have a significant effect on the environment. An Environmental Impact Report is not required pursuant to the Environmental Quality Act of 1970 (Sections 21000, et seq., Public Resources Code of the State of California).
