NOTICE OF CORRECTIVE ACTION

RE: JAMES MANGAN PARK RIFLE AND PISTOL RANGE 2140 34TH AVENUE, SACRAMENTO, CA 95822

The Sacramento County Environmental Management Department, Environmental Compliance Division (EMD), the Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) in the County of Sacramento, was recently informed of lead contamination in and around the James Mangan Park Rifle and Pistol Range that exceeds the State standards for lead. EMD has delegation authority from the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) for oversight of environmental assessments and corrective action.

As was discussed in our first meeting on April 13, 2016, the attached Corrective Action Order (Order) is issued pursuant to section 25187 of the California Health and Safety Code (H&SC) for the abatement and remediation of lead contamination and releases at the James Mangan Park Rifle and Pistol Range.

Our process allows of an appeal to the Order which may be requested by completing a written request for a hearing postmarked within 15 days after receipt of the attached Order (Attachment 1). This must be done by completing the attached **Notice of Defense** (Attachment 2) including a statement of the reason(s) why the City believes it should not be subject to the Order.

H&SC section 25187 authorizes EMD to assess administrative penalties for contamination caused by the release of a hazardous waste/constituents or failure to comply with this Order. EMD does not waive any further enforcement action, including penalties, by issuance of this Order.

CORRECTIVE ACTION ORDER

) [California Health and Safety) Code section 25187]) Case File No. 16-RO0001707

The Sacramento County Environmental Management Department, Environmental Compliance Division ("EMD"), the Certified Unified Program Agency in the County of Sacramento, hereby issues this Corrective Action Order ("Order") pursuant to California Health and Safety Code (H&SC) section 25187 to the CITY OF SACRAMENTO ("Respondent") for lead contamination at the JAMES MANGAN PARK RIFLE AND PISTOL RANGE ("Facility") located at 2140 34th Avenue, Sacramento, CA 95822.

APPLICABLE AUTHORITIES

H&SC Section 25187(b)(2) and (b)(3) provide in relevant parts:

- 1) The order shall include a requirement that the Respondent take corrective action with respect to the release of hazardous waste or constituents, abate the effects thereof, and take any other necessary remedial actions.
- 2) The order shall require that corrective action be taken beyond the facility boundary, where necessary to protect human health or the environment.

CORRECTIVE ACTION ORDER

28 CORRECTIVE ACTION ORDER

STATEMENT OF FACTS

EMD received an inquiry on April 4, 2016, about a release of lead from an indoor gun range located at the Facility.

On April 13, 2016, EMD received documents that verified the Facility was contaminated with lead. The documents also indicated that the roof around the ventilation system was contaminated with elevated levels of lead.

On April 15, 2016, EMD received documents that indicate elevated levels of lead on the building exterior and in the soil outside the building. These levels exceed State standards for lead.

DETERMINATIONS

Based on the above Statement of Facts, EMD has determined that lead contamination in and around the Facility is a release of hazardous waste and warrants corrective action pursuant to H&SC section 25187.

DIRECTIVES

All compliance timelines are determined from the service date of the Order unless otherwise noted.

1) Within ten (10) calendar days, Respondent shall submit sample results to EMD that will be used by Respondent to determine the extent of hard surface contamination outside of the fence area at the Facility. Test areas shall include, but are not limited to, the sidewalks in front of and leading to the entrance of the Facility building and sidewalks across the street from the Facility. For this directive, wipe samples may be used as the screening tool. A sample plan must be approved by EMD prior to samples being collected.

2) Within <u>fourteen (14) calendar days</u>, Respondent shall submit a workplan for EMD's review and approval that identifies how Respondent will prevent lead dust inside the Facility from migrating outside the Facility.

- 3) Within <u>fourteen (14) calendar days</u>, Respondent shall submit a workplan for EMD's review and approval that describes the measures Respondent will take to reduce and mitigate the potential exposure to the public from contamination outside of the Facility building and on hard surfaces other than soil, to a level that meets California Department of Public Health (CDPH) standards. The methods may include, but are not limited to, cleaning, removal and/or encapsulation. Measures used must comply with the CDPH standards for Lead Evaluation and Abatement, California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 17, sections 36000 and 36100.
- 4) Within thirty (30) calendar days, Respondent shall submit a site characterization plan for EMD's review and approval that identifies how Respondent will further characterize the nature and extent of metals contamination outside of the Facility building. The site characterization is limited to contamination that originated from the Facility. The site characterization plan shall be consistent with Department of Toxic Substance Control (DTSC) Preliminary Endangerment Assessment (PEA) Guidelines as they pertain to this Facility.
- 5) Within <u>one hundred twenty (120) calendar days</u>, Respondent shall submit a soil remediation plan for EMD's review and approval that identifies how Respondent will remediate the lead contamination from the soil

outside of the Facility building to levels that meet the California Office of Environmental Health and Assessment (OEHHA) levels for lead in soil.

- 6) General directives:
- a. The fence and signs around the Facility building shall be maintained in a manner to discourage unauthorized access until it is determined by EMD that the hazard has been mitigated and poses no threat to public health and the environment.
- b. All waste generated on site must be characterized by Respondent to determine if it is a hazardous waste. If determined to be a hazardous waste, Respondent shall handle, store and disposed of the hazardous waste pursuant to the requirements of H&SC Division 20, Chapter 6.5.
- c. All workplans shall identify all tasks and timelines for completing each phase of the corrective actions.
- d. All workplans shall identify compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
- e. Respondent shall notify EMD within thirty (30) calendar days of Respondent making a final decision regarding disposition of the Facility, for example, reuse or demolition.
- f. All submittals required by this Order shall be addressed to Charley Langer, Environmental Specialist, Sacramento County Environmental Management Department, 10590 Armstrong Avenue, Mather, CA 95655.

As used in this Order, the date of issuance shall be the date of this Order and the date of service, whether by personal service or by certified mail, shall be the date the Order is served on the City of Sacramento.

ATTACHMENT 1

EMD reserves the right to make such modifications to this Order and/or to issue such further order(s) as it may deem necessary to protect public health and safety. Such modification may be issued as amendments to this Order and shall be deemed effective upon issuance.

Nothing in this Order relieves Respondent of its obligation to meet the requirements of any law, regulation, standard, permit, or order issued thereunder.

PARTIES BOUND

This Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent, its officers, directors, agents, employees, contractors, and assignees.

<u>SEVERABILITY</u>

The Directives of this Order are severable, and Respondent shall comply with each and every provision hereof, notwithstanding the effectiveness of any other provision.

FURTHER ENFORCEMENT ACTION

H&SC section 25187 authorizes EMD to assess administrative penalties for contamination caused by the release of a hazardous waste or failure to comply with a Corrective Action Order. EMD does not waive any further enforcement action by issuance of this Corrective Action Order.

RIGHT TO A HEARING

Respondent may, within 15 days after service of this Corrective Action Order, request a hearing pursuant to H&SC section 25187(d) by completing and filing with EMD the enclosed Notice of Defense. A Notice of Defense shall be deemed filed within the 15 day period if it is postmarked within that period.

If Respondent requests a hearing, Respondent may select as a hearing officer either an Administrative Law Judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings, Department of General Services, State of California, or a hearing

officer designated by EMD. If a Notice of Defense is filed, but no hearing officer is selected, EMD may select the hearing officer.

If Respondent requests a hearing, a hearing decision will be issued by an Administrative Law Judge or by the hearing officer designated by EMD. Pursuant to Government Code section 11440.10, H&SC 25187(g), and section 6.60.030 of the Sacramento County Code, the decision of the Administrative Law Judge or hearing officer will be accepted as final by EMD following the hearing.

If the Notice of Defense is not filed within the specified time limit, this Corrective Action Order shall become final.
