BACKGROUND

- A. Natomas Oaks Park is a 12.8-acre community park located at 2230 River Plaza Drive in South Natomas (Council District 4).
- B. Ray and Judy Tretheway are activists that have championed for parks, open space, civic engagement, and healthy neighborhoods in Sacramento. Ray helped found the Sacramento Tree Foundation and he is a former Sacramento City Councilmember for District 1.
- C. Naming Natomas Oaks Park after the Tretheway family is consistent with the City of Sacramento Facility Naming Policy adopted by the City Council on February 26, 2008 (Resolution No. 2008-112).
